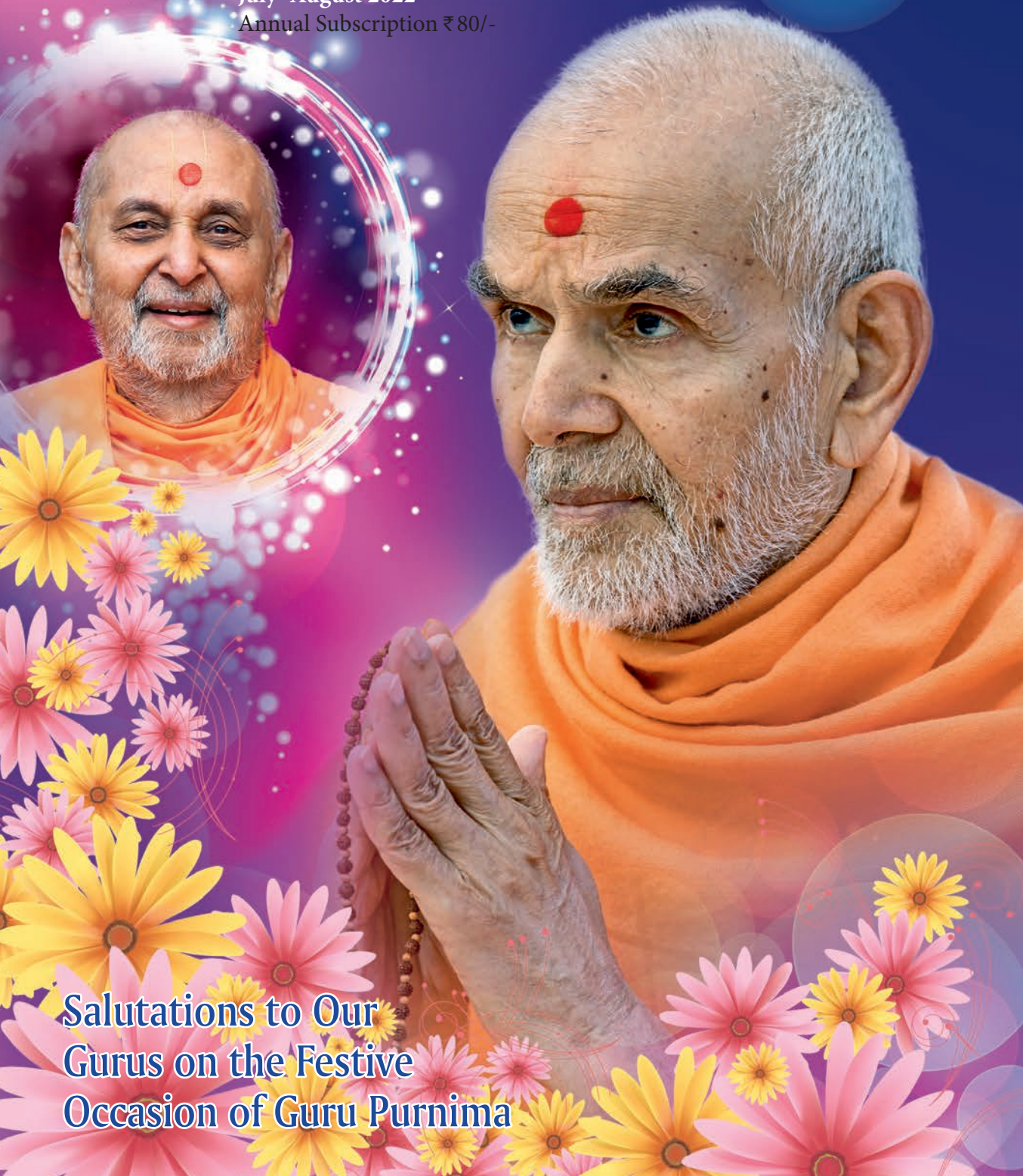

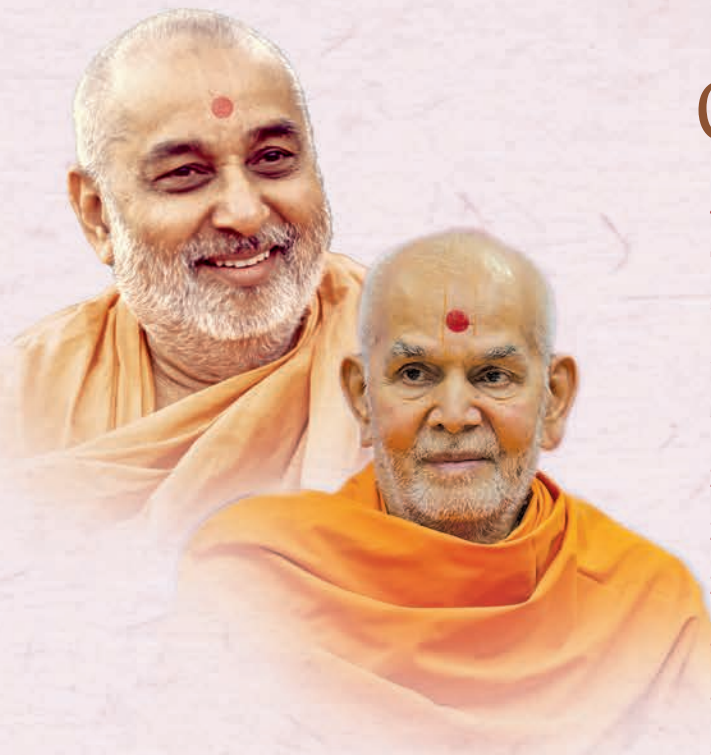
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BAPS RESEARCH INSTITUTES INAUGURATIONS & SEMINARS ON PRAMUKH SWAMI MAHARAJ

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RETURN TO GADHADA

After Dada Khachar's marriage in Bhatvadar, Shri Hari was in a hurry to return to Gadhada...

HE IS PARABRAHMA PURUSHOTTAM NARAYAN

In Hindorda, lived an old disciple of Atmanand Swami. One night, Atmanand Swami appeared to him in a dream and said, "Tomorrow morning, one who will steer a chariot into Hindorda is Parabrahma Purushottam Narayan. Since you have served me I am informing you that he is God. Thus, you bow at his feet and take refuge in him." The disciple was happy with the divine darshan of his guru. The next morning, he went to the outskirts of his village and saw Shri Hari steering a chariot. The disciple bowed to him and took his refuge and became his disciple.

From Hindorda, Shri Hari travelled to Rajula. Here, Nagdan Soni had collected food materials to be cooked for lunch for Shri Hari and his entourage. Nagdan pressed Shri Hari to have lunch, but Maharaj said, "You load all the food materials onto our oxen carts. We cannot stay now, but we will cook our food once we have covered some distance." Once everything was loaded, Shri Hari told the driver of his chariot to steer ahead. Since Maharaj's chariot was moving swiftly the oxen carts in his procession trailed way behind. Soon, Shri Hari arrived at the village of Vavare and settled down in a shrine of Shiv. After some time, the oxen carts had not arrived so Maharaj climbed up the Shiv shrine and saw that the carts were far away. Once they had all arrived, Shri Hari instructed his sadhus to prepare a meal from the food materials provided by Nagdan. Thereafter, Shri Hari and the members of the marriage procession took lunch. Early next morning, Shri Hari travelled to the



villages of Ghanla, Bhamar, Meryane and Goradke, where he halted at the farm of Prajapati, a devotee. Punamati, a female devotee, had a meal prepared by Brahmins for Shri Hari and his entire group. When Shri Hari sat down to eat, Muktanand Swami, Dada

Khachar and others came to do darshan. After Shri Hari had finished eating, Punamati came and donated five *koris*¹ at Maharaj's feet.

Shri Hari smiled, looked at Muktanand Swami, who was seating far away, and said, "This old woman is being dishonest and devious with me. Once, when her son was suffering from smallpox she had pledged to donate seven *koris* after her son's recovery. Today, she has considered two *koris* for the meal she offered and made a donation of five *koris*." The old woman was astonished and felt uneasy at Shri Hari's all-knowing power's, because she had never revealed her pledge to anyone. Hurriedly, she brought two *koris* and placed them at Maharaj's feet and fulfilled her pledge.

OFFER CASH DONATIONS INSTEAD OF A MEAL

Shri Hari departed from Goradke and travelled to the villages of Gadhakde and Pithavadi. Here, he stayed at Bhaga and Mula's house. The local devotees insisted upon Shri Hari and his group to stay for five days. On seeing their resolve, Maharaj called an astrologer and asked him the auspicious day for him and his procession to depart. The astrologer took out his almanac and said, "Maharaj, you can either leave on the day after or five days later. Other than that there is no other auspicious day to depart."

Surprabha Devi pressed, “Maharaj, we cannot stay for more days. Let’s return to Gadhpur at the earliest.” Subsequently, Shri Hari proposed to the local devotees, “If you want to offer us a meal, donate *koris* according to your means. If you donate more than your means, I will not accept them.” The devotees quickly collected 4,000 *koris* from the devotees and offered them to Maharaj. Shri Hari accepted only 2,000 *koris* and departed early next morning.

Shri Hari and his entourage proceeded to the villages of Savar, Liliya, Akalu and Ansodar. Here, Rudo Golviyo, a great devotee, had a feast prepared by Brahmins for the whole group. He also offered gur to eat for the oxen and donated a cartload of gur to take along with them. Thereafter, the procession advanced to Ambardi via Bhurakhiya. Shri Hari camped under a banyan tree on the village outskirt. The local devotees came to serve and offer a meal to the whole group. They also gave eleven carts containing sugarcane to Maharaj. Shri Hari was extremely pleased with their generosity and devotional sentiments.

DADA KHACHAR RETURNS HOME

Shri Hari and the marriage procession finally returned to Gadhpur early next morning. All the family members and others in the house were overjoyed and welcomed Dada Khachar and his new wife. Shri Hari was also enthused because he was happy in the joy of his devotees. He did darshan of the *murti* of Vasudev Narayan and went to his room – Akshar Ordi.

After arriving in Gadhpur, Shri Hari instructed his sadhus to vacate the house they were staying in and reside in the newly constructed Nagmala mansion. Shri Hari resided in the south-facing house where his sadhus once lived. Whenever his sadhus came to Gadhpur they stayed at the house of a Shrimali Brahmin. Shri Hari taught yoga postures to his sadhus and sometimes Gopalanand Swami taught them. Nityanand Swami and others

learnt several yoga postures from Shriji Maharaj. The sadhus’ principal aim was to abide by Shri Hari’s wish and please him.

MAHARAJ SEES THE MURTI OF VASUDEV IN SHVETDWP

The next day, Shri Hari spoke to his sadhus, “Today, all of you must eat generously and bless the newly married Dada Khachar with prosperity.” Then, Maharaj lavishly served laddus to his sadhus for lunch. Shortly after, Adharanand Swami and Dharmatmanand Swami arrived from Surat. They had brought a *murti* painted by the Nawab’s artist. The *murti* was of Shri Vasudev Bhagwan in an austere pose, with two hands raised upwards. Shri Hari was pleased to see the *murti* and remarked, “There is no difference between the form of Shri Vasudev performing austerities in Shvetsdwip and this painted *murti*. This *murti* matches the description found in the shastras.” Then, Shri Hari gave three laddus each to both the sadhus. Thereafter, Maharaj retired to take his afternoon rest in his new house.

In the evening, Shri Hari sat on a bed in the east-facing direction and asked for the painted *murti* of Shri Vasudev to be brought to him. Maharaj showed the *murti* to all his sadhus, who were extremely pleased with the painting. Thereafter, Adharanand Swami gave news about Surat, “The local administrator belongs to the Vaishnav denomination, but he is steeped in addictions and hates our devotees. He does not trouble any one who has become a new *satsangi* (devotee) belonging to a large community. However, he troubles new *satsangis* belonging to a small group and excommunicates them from their community.” Shri Hari replied, “Whoever opposes and is hostile towards my *satsangis* will bear the consequences. Soon, the administrator will reap the fruits of his bad acts.”²

FULDOL FESTIVAL IN SHRINAGAR (1825 CE, A.S. 1881)

After Shri Hari consecrated the *murtis* of

Nar-Narayan in Shrinagar (also Shripur and Ahmedabad) in 1822 CE, no major festival had been celebrated. So, the devotees of Shrinagar wrote a letter praying to Shri Hari to come and celebrate the Fuldol festival. Shri Hari immediately called Muktanand Swami, Brahmanand Swami, Shuk Muni and others and said, “This time, I wish to celebrate the Fuldol festival in Ahmedabad, therefore send letters of invitation to all the devotees. Also, write a letter to the devotees of Shrinagar confirming that we will celebrate the festival there.” Shuk Muni did as Maharaj bidded.

RIVER VASAR BECOMES A PILGRIM PLACE

In February 1825, Shri Hari left Gadhpur with his sadhus, *parshads* and devotees to go to Shripur. Maharaj passed through the outskirts of Sarangpur, Sundariyana and Kanthariya and came to the River Vasar. Here, Shri Hari swam, played and told his sadhus to sing bhajans, and showered his divine joy on all. The River Vasar became holy and blessed as a pilgrim place.³ Thereafter, everyone ate snacks and proceeded to the villages of Shiyani, Tavi, Devaliya, Daduka, Machhiyav and Sanand. Here, Shri Hari stayed the night and travelled the next morning to Ahmedabad. The devotees of Shrinagar came to know that Shri Hari and his entourage had arrived on the outskirts.

DEVOTEES OF SHRINAGAR WELCOME

SHRI HARI

Shri Hari and his group bathed in the River Sabarmati and commenced their morning puja rituals. At that time, the devotees of Shrinagar arrived to welcome them. The leading devotees garlanded Shri Hari and said, “Maharaj, we have brought decorated oxen carts and palanquins to take you and your entourage to Ahmedabad.” Shri Hari thus instructed the senior *sadgurus* and some

devotees to travel in the oxen carts and palanquins. On the opposite bank, many devotees were waiting with musical instruments to welcome Maharaj and his entire group. The devotees of Shrinagar had cleaned and sprinkled water on the main roads of the city. The earthy fragrance made the occasion all the more pleasing. The crossroads were decorated with banana trunks and festoons of mango leaves. The devotees of Shrinagar were ecstatic because Shri Hari, his sadhus and devotees had arrived to celebrate the Fuldol festival. As the procession proceeded, the people of Shrinagar came out into their galleries, on terraces and streets to welcome and cheer Shri Hari.

GRAND WELCOME

A grand welcome was given to Shri Hari as he entered Shrinagar through one of its main gates. Along the way, several prominent well-wishers offered garlands to Shri Hari and thousands showered flower petals on him and his procession. People hailed the victory calls of “Swaminarayan Bhagwan *ni jai*”. Finally, the procession entered into the precincts of the Nar-Narayan Mandir in Nava Vas. The entire mandir grounds were packed with devotees from near and far-off places. First, Maharaj did darshan of the *murtis* of Nar-Narayan Dev in the central shrine of the mandir. At that time, the devotees hailed, “Nar-Narayan *ni jai*.” Thereafter, Shri Hari sat on a platform under the shade of a neem tree in the mandir grounds. The auspicious sounds of instruments percolated through the mandir grounds to create a divine ambience. Thousands of devotees and well-wishers had gathered in the mandir grounds to do Maharaj’s darshan. Some even honoured Maharaj with garlands. ♦

The Guru and the Seeker

The Sanskrit word ‘guru’ has been in use throughout India for many millennia, since the Vedic era. Translated, it means ‘teacher’, but actually represents a meaning beyond the general translation. ‘Gu’ means ‘ignorance’ and ‘ru’ means ‘dispeller’. The guru, thus, is one who dispels ignorance – of all types – and gives knowledge. The original sense in which the title ‘guru’ was used referred to the spiritually accomplished seers of Vedic times who guided the young students living and learning in their ashrams, known as *gurukuls*. The guru tutored his young *shishyas* (students) in a variety of spiritual and secular disciplines. In this way the guru fulfilled many roles: as a teacher, counsellor, father-figure, and even as a bridge to the Divine. The guru was principally all this, and more. In this sense, he is an entity which has no exact equivalent

in Western culture.

Traditionally, the guru is primarily regarded as a personal spiritual mentor. He possesses not only theoretical knowledge but the experience of the spiritual heights to which he leads his *shishyas*. The sages of the Vedic and Upanishadic eras passed on this profound spiritual wisdom to their disciples. And the disciples, in turn, served their guru and, later, they too imparted this knowledge to their students.

In this way, the guru-*shishya* tradition of Hinduism has been nurtured from Vedic times right up to the present day.

THE NEED FOR A GURU

A question naturally arises: Why not directly serve God. Why is the guru required as an intermediary?

The story of Namdev provides the answer. Once, Sant Jnaneshwar, Namdev and other devotees had gathered at the home of Gora the potter. Sant Jnaneshwar, their leader, said to Gora, “Test the pots gathered here to see whether or not they are well-baked. So, Gora took a stick and began tapping it on the heads of everyone present. No one said a word, except Namdev who protested. Hence, he was declared as the only unbaked pot. This insult offended Namdev and so he went for comfort to Lord Vitthala. But the Lord sided with Gora, saying, “One who does not surrender to a *sadguru* is an unbaked pot. When Namdev questioned the need for a guru, the Lord replied, that he too, in his avatars as Ram and Krishna had accepted gurus for guidance. Then, the Lord instructed Namdev to seek the refuge of the enlightened Visoba in the mandir of Mallikarjuna and serve him as his guru. Thus, by serving Visoba, Namdev became properly baked and attained enlightenment.

The following incident from the Swaminarayan Sampradaya also reinforces this point. Girdharbhai, nephew of Kothari Gordhanbhai of Vartal, was a genuine spiritual seeker. He searched throughout the Satsang to find a Satpurush, a true guru, as described by Bhagwan Swaminarayan in the Vachanamrut. However, none could quench his spiritual thirst. Eventually, he prayed before the *murti* of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj in Vartal, which Bhagwan Swaminarayan himself had consecrated. After one month, Bhagwan Swaminarayan appeared before him and directed, “I remain manifest in the Satsang through Pragji Bhakta. Seek his company and I shall dwell forever in your heart.”

Despite this clear instruction, Girdharbhai thought that since Pragji Bhakta was a tailor by profession this was not possible. Again he prayed to Shri Harikrishna Maharaj. Bhagwan Swaminarayan again gave him darshan and repeated his guidance. So, Girdharbhai went to Pragji Bhakta and from the very first meeting he was convinced and accepted Pragji Bhakta as his guru. Under Pragji

Bhakta's guidance, Girdharbhai became a sadhu and also attained the enlightened state.

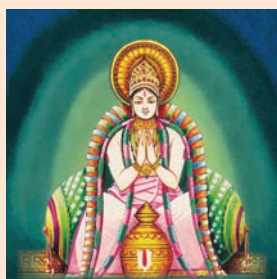
So, to attain spiritual enlightenment, one must surrender to a guru who is similarly enlightened.

CHARACTERISTICS OF A SEEKER

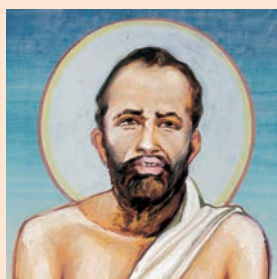
First, let us discuss some of the characteristics of a worthy *shishya*. A *shishya* seeking enlightenment surrenders unconditionally to the guru, submitting to his will without question. This is possible only when the seeker understands the true glory of the guru.

The guru may sometimes respond by subjecting the seeker to harsh, stern, unfair, prejudiced or even physically harmful tasks. This is done not to harass or frighten him but to test his resolve and strengthen him spiritually. It is done with the aim of elevating him spiritually and inspiring him on the path of liberation. Those who follow the guru's commands and tolerate such hardships earn the guru's blessings and experience the bliss of God.

The more distinguished seekers are able to intuitively understand the guru's wish. For example, Yamunacharya was a respected elderly guru of the Srivaishnava Sampradaya. He learnt of Ramanujacharya's outstanding qualities and regarded him as a suitable successor. They had never met, so Yamunacharya sent a disciple to call Ramanujacharya. However, by the time they returned, Yamunacharya had passed away and his body was about to be cremated. Ramanujacharya was disappointed that he was unable to meet Yamunacharya, but accepted him as his guru and felt comfort in at least having had darshan of his physical form. Before the cremation, he

noticed that three fingers of Yamunacharya's right hand were bent into a fist. Other disciples told Ramanujacharya that the guru had three unfulfilled wishes: (1) to write a commentary on Vyasji's Brahmasutras, (2) to promote the glory of Vyasji, Parashar and Nammalwar and (3) to spread the Srivaishnava philosophy. Ramanujacharya resolved to fulfil these three wishes. As soon as Ramanujacharya had made this pledge, the three fingers straightened. This demonstrated the inner bond between guru and disciple. Ramanujacharya later fulfilled all three wishes.

In the Swaminarayan Sampradaya, also, such intuitive understanding was frequently seen between Gunatitanand Swami (guru) and Bhagatji Maharaj (disciple). This is clearly demonstrated when Bhagatji Maharaj watered the mango trees in the orchard of Sankhdavadar and removed the dead dog to re-start the construction work of the haveli in Junagadh.

A dedicated disciple is one who is so united with the guru that he gives up his own resolves and accepts whatever the guru commands. Yogiji Maharaj often said, "I have always acted according to the wishes of Shastriji Maharaj, but not according to the calling of my own mind. So, Shastriji Maharaj has become extremely pleased. And today he gives darshan and I experience bliss."

QUALITIES OF A GURU

Regarding the role of a guru, Shri Ramakrishna Paramhansa said, "He [the guru] brings man and God together, even as a matchmaker brings together the lover and the beloved."

This was experienced by Swami Vivekanand (1863–1902), when, as Narendra, he first met Shri Ramakrishna Paramhansa (1836–1886) in November 1881. Overwhelmed by doubts about the existence of God, Narendra met Shri Ramakrishna at the Kali Temple in Dakshineshwar. Immediately, the bold Narendra asked a question to which he had never previously received a satisfactory answer, "Sir, have you seen God?" Without hesitation, Sri Ramakrishna replied, "Yes, I have. I see him as clearly as I see you, only in a more intense way." This emphatic declaration convinced Narendra, who accepted Sri Ramakrishna as his guru. Expressing this conviction, Swami Vivekanand stated, "The guru must be worshipped as God, he is nothing less than that. As you look at him, gradually the guru melts away, and what is left? The guru's picture gives way to God Himself. The guru is the bright mask which God wears in order to come to us. As we look steadily on, gradually the mask falls off and God is revealed."

Qualifying the eligibility of a guru, Swami Shivanand (1887–1963) explains, "Mere study of books cannot make one a guru. One who has studied the Vedas and who has direct knowledge of the *atman* through *anubhava* (experience) can alone be enrolled as a guru."

Gunatitanand Swami has also described three yardsticks by which to measure the calibre of a guru, "Before accepting him, check the guru's purity in three ways: first, check his own behaviour; second, check the capability of the one he has served (i.e. his guru); and third, know those who have attained (knowledge) through his company (i.e. his disciples)."

Another revered Hindu sadhu, Swami Muktanand (1908–1982) describes the universal comfort provided by the guru, "On the one hand, he (the guru) is adept in spiritual matters and,

on the other, he is exceedingly shrewd in his worldly dealings. Those aspirants who live under the protection of such a master pass through acute crises with ease and meet the most unfavourable circumstances fearlessly.”

For the guru, exterior circumstances do not control his life, since his wisdom, strength and serenity are derived from within – due to communion with God.

The interplay between guru and *shishya* is well illustrated by the Gunatit guru *parampara* established by Bhagwan Swaminarayan. Each guru serves as disciple to his guru and is also mentor to his successor and countless other devotees.

The tradition was set by Bhagwan Swaminarayan himself, who first served guru Ramanand Swami and then, as founder of the Swaminarayan Sampradaya, led people to experience the bliss of God. He himself was revered as God and so, Gunatitanand Swami, the first guru, served him as both God and guru. Gunatitanand Swami renounced home at the wish of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, performed austerities and physical service, and served in the demanding post as Mahant of the Junagadh mandir built by Bhagwan Swaminarayan.

Under Gunatitanand Swami’s guidance, Bhagatji Maharaj experienced the highest state of God-realization. It is often said that Bhagatji Maharaj unquestioningly obeyed every command of Gunatitanand Swami, without concern for his own self or social status. Bhagatji Maharaj, for example, went to call Mt. Girnar, even though he was ridiculed by many claiming that he lacked discretion. Bhagatji Maharaj’s reply, “I have obeyed the command. Now it is up to Girnar whether he comes or not,” reveals the absolute subservience which had earned him Gunatitanand Swami’s inner blessings.

Bhagatji Maharaj, in turn, nurtured Shastriji Maharaj, who boldly proclaimed the true understanding of the Akshar-Purushottam philosophy despite much opposition and hardships.

Shastriji Maharaj, as guru, formally established the Bochasanwasi Shri Akshar Purushottam Swaminarayan Sanstha (BAPS). He guided Yogiji Maharaj, who served with immense vigour to help in the construction of the initial BAPS mandirs and other foundational activities.

Pramukh Swami Maharaj, the fifth guru of BAPS, had served both Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj. As a newly initiated young sadhu, he served under Shastriji Maharaj, engaging in arduous physical services which were the priority at the time. Also, initially under the guidance of Shastriji Maharaj, he expertly and efficiently shouldered the administrative responsibilities of the Sanstha. Then, under the guidance of Yogiji Maharaj, he continued to manage the Sanstha’s administration and also significantly contributed to the rapidly growing Satsang activities.

Pramukh Swami Maharaj had presided over a period of phenomenal expansion of the Sanstha: the number of devotees, sadhus, mandirs, Satsang Centres worldwide, as well as, the wide range of spiritual, cultural, social, educational,

EPIC EFFORTS FOR DE-ADDICTION

(Part 2)



Pramukh Swami Maharaj's campaign for de-addiction was unremitting and epic. An addiction-free life is the foundation of a happy and progressive society. Swamishri tirelessly endeavoured to free people from addictions and instil peace in society. The following article explores the various aspects and ways in which Pramukh Swami Maharaj redeemed many people from the shackles of addictions.

The leaders of Mahuva village invited Swamishri to come and inaugurate the electrification of the nearby Taredi village. Swamishri went there and inaugurated the electricity supply station, which was located near the Bhensla Hanumanji Mandir. Thereafter, a de-addiction programme was organized. Swamishri told the pujari of the mandir that as a priest he should not serve marijuana or opium to anyone.

The pujari said, “What can I do if other sannyasis ask for it?” Swamishri replied emphatically, “If a sannyasi comes and asks for diamonds, will you give them to him when you don’t have them? Similarly, tell them that you don’t consume and keep drugs and then lovingly serve them *rotlo* to eat. Does Hanuman Dada take

drugs? Did Ram ever ask for drugs? Still, people come to have darshan of them in mandirs. If you quit, people will come for your darshan. In addition, preach about offering devotion to God.”

Swamishri’s words inspired the priest to quit smoking marijuana.

Once, a bridegroom went to Swamishri for blessings and then started inspecting his pocket to offer a donation. Swamishri, quick to observe his dark lips and stained teeth, said, “Never mind about that, I want you to take a pledge to give up your addiction.” The groom agreed and quit his addiction to bidis and of chewing tobacco.

Swamishri’s Herculean efforts in morally and socially transforming the tribals of Selvas and Panchmahal regions are noteworthy. Formerly,

almost every home used to indulge in drinking and eating meat. The tribals spent all their financial aid from the government in drinking and other addictions. After quitting their addictions, they became financially sound and built sturdy homes and provided their children with a good education.

In 1987, a 25-year old youth from Ahmedabad met Swamishri in Mumbai. He was addicted to heroin and other drugs. Swamishri endeavoured for two years to redeem him. After two years, the youth went to Sarangpur. He had quit heroin, but had started taking opium and Mandrax tablets. In 1989, Swamishri sat with him in Ahmedabad for half an hour, but he relapsed in his drug addiction. In 1990, when he met Swamishri in Sarangpur, Swamishri made arrangements for him to stay in the mandir and eventually enabled him to discard opium.

For the first four days, the youth's physical and emotional conditions were miserable. He wouldn't eat, banged his legs desperately on the ground, and tossed restlessly and sleeplessly in bed at night. For four days, Swamishri remained firm and gave him much assurance and strength. Thereafter, the youth's mind became strong. Due to Swamishri's blessings, he started liking food and regained his sleep at night. Still, he would occasionally smoke a few bidis secretly and then confess it to Swamishri, "I smoke three. Now, I'll smoke two." Swamishri said, "Where is the need for even two! Quit them altogether. If you experience a craving, take a clove from the kitchen and put it in your mouth and suck it slowly." Then, Swamishri took him to the *murti* of Shastriji Maharaj and said, "Bow down here and pray. Now, no more bidis from today. Take this rose and whenever you feel like smoking a bidi, pluck and eat one rose petal."



And indeed, the youth became addiction-free. Swamishri continuously took care of him for three years and reinstated him on the right path.

This was one of the many stories of Swamishri's unflagging efforts, infinite compassion and unconditional love.

A person once told Swamishri, "Swami, you are so persistent in making me quit cigarettes, but I won't be able to give them up. The reason being that I started smoking before I got married. If you say so, I will give up my wife, but I can't quit cigarettes." One would think that what more could one say to such a person? Still, whenever Swamishri met him, he would talk to him about quitting cigarettes. Finally, Swamishri inspired him to reduce from smoking four packets to two, and eventu-

ally to smoke five cigarettes a day. Then, after one week, Swamishri made him quit cigarettes altogether. Today, that person appreciates Swamishri for helping him quit cigarettes, which subsequently improved his health and saved him money. Swamishri thus

helped him benefit in three ways: physically, financially and spiritually.

Sometimes, Swamishri's effort in de-addicting someone failed to penetrate the person's mind and heart. In the village of Vesma, in south Gujarat, a 75-year-old man was addicted to bidis. His sons requested Swamishri to help their father give up smoking. Swamishri started explaining to him, but the old man did not relent one bit. When Swamishri persisted further, the man said, "Bapji! Please rest a little, because you must be tired." Swamishri broke out laughing at his concern. Swamishri's talk didn't touch him but it left an impression on his mind. The following year, a group of Swamishri's sadhus went there for *vicharan*. The sadhus gave a heartfelt talk on

Swamishri's glory and to everyone's surprise the old man quit his addiction. Swamishri's divine words and blessings had their desired effect on the old man.

In Sarangpur, Swamishri was once meeting some devotees after completing his daily morning routine. A devotee came and Swamishri enquired, "Do you have an addiction?"

He replied, "Yes, I smoke bidis, and I need to. I can't remain without them."

"Quit smoking now," Swamishri urged.

"No. If I give it up, my soul will get hurt. I don't want to hurt my soul."

"The addiction will lead you astray," Swamishri stated.

"Oh! Not at all."

"Even if you are a devotee, it will," Swamishri underscored.

"It might take others astray, but not me!"

"Your mind has surrendered and become weak. That's why you are talking in this manner," Swamishri diagnosed.

"I have been smoking since I was ten. Now, I am sixty-two. I smoked in the brief halts I took while steering my pair of oxen to pull water buckets from the well."

"Do you still steer your oxen?"

"No, not anymore. But I have to keep the bidis with me, because when the labourers come what will I give them? When I give them bidis they start working."

"You will die because of your addiction," Swamishri spoke solemnly.

"Let me die in that way. One has to die one day!"

"Since you smoke two packets every day, why not reduce it to five to six bidis daily?"

"That sounds okay. I will quit gradually."

In spite of the devotee's chronic habit, Swamishri tried his best to unhinge him from his addiction. Swamishri's inexhaustible patience and perseverance are apparent from this incident.

In USA, an American, Ricky Prejacti, who

regularly attended a yoga centre, came for Swamishri's darshan. He sat in *vajrasan*. After enquiring from him, it seemed that he had a fair knowledge of the Upanishads. However, he drank liquor, ate meat and smoked two to three times a week.

Swamishri told him to quit them all. He asked, "I can't quit. With what perspective should I give them up?" Swamishri replied, "Where is the need for having a perspective? It is poison. Will you take poison? See, we don't smoke cigarettes or drink alcohol, still we remain blissful."

He responded feebly, "I will try."

"Don't say try, just quit them. Let me know if there are any benefits of drinking and smoking," Swamishri argued. Ricky remained quiet and started sweating profusely.

Swamishri said, "You have learnt spiritual knowledge and are also studying the Upanishads, yet how odd it is that you drink and smoke."

He said with resignation, "I am bound to my base nature (*swabhavs*)."

Swamishri explained, "Because you are under the influence of addictions, you are unable to quit your *swabhavs*. If you do what I say, you will be able to control your nature. If you continue drinking and smoking, you will not be able to progress on the spiritual path. You meditate on God, but your thoughts about addictions disturb your meditation. Addictions are like shackles. Even a slight thought about it will not allow you to progress spiritually. This disturbance will hinder you in everything you do. So, quit your addictions and bad habits."

Ricky remained quiet again. He cast his eyes downwards and started wiping his sweat. Swamishri enquired, "What are you thinking? At least say something."

He said, "What can I tell you Swamiji! I came here to beg for just a drop of your compassion, whereas you are totally submerging me in an ocean."

Swamishri smiled and said, "Just imagine,

when you give up addictions what will happen to you? What do you think?"

He answered, "If I quit smoking and drinking, I will be gripped by fear, tension, pain and worry."

Swamishri commented, "You are already gripped by them. You are in fear. You worry even at the mere thought of quitting! You should think that nothing will happen to you if you quit."

Ricky said, "If I am not able to follow the pledge, I would incur sin upon myself."

Swamishri emphasized, "You are already sinning by taking addictions. Though you call yourself spiritual, but because of your addictions to drinking and smoking you are committing sins."

He remained silent. Finally, Swamishri asked, "Do you like it when others in the world take drugs?"

"No."

Swamishri said, "Your next step will be indulging in drugs. Will you like that?"

"No."

"Then why not give up your bad habits now!"

For the first time in his life, he had found someone like Swamishri who was lovingly and personally explaining to him. Finally, he gave a promise to make an honest attempt, offered *panchang* pranam and asked for Swamishri's blessings. Swamishri's eyes were full of compassion while blessing him and said, "Write a letter to me when you quit."

Countless were drenched in the river of Swamishri's compassion. Swamishri drastically transformed the life of Mahendrabhai of Surat, who used to spend almost two thousand rupees in drinking and other addictions every month. After a year, Mahendrabhai's father narrated to Swamishri the story of his son's life prior to his transformation, "I am surprised to see my son's change. In 38 years, he had never woken up before 10 a.m., whereas now he daily wakes up at 4.30 a.m., does puja and takes all his friends early in the morning to the mandir. After doing darshan, he sweeps the entire mandir grounds. Formerly,

he was so fond of eating different dishes on all seven days that he would get irate if they were not served to him. But now, he has completely changed and has stopped eating at hotels. Indeed, my family and I are very happy. Only God has transformed him. It was not a small deal that he stopped drinking and started attending satsang."

Due to Swamishri's inspiration, devotees also inspired others to quit addictions. Swamishri had inculcated the lessons of pure living in the lives of devotees such that their conduct ignited change in others.

Most of the people who quit addictions remained firm in their pledges because of Swamishri's spiritual influence and affectionate persona.

In Bhoj village, many Harijans quit drinking and other addictions due to the inspiration of Swamishri and his sadhus. Usually, on the day of Holi, the Harijans celebrated Holi in another village. Every year, according to tradition, they served alcohol to each other. However, the Harijans of Bhoj, after giving up their addictions, declared to their brothers, "We have become disciples of Pramukh Swami Maharaj, hence we will neither serve nor drink alcohol." Drawing inspiration from them, the Harijans of other villages also pledged not to drink alcohol.

In 1985, on the occasion of Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami's Bicentenary Celebrations in Ahmedabad, a de-addiction camp was organized at the Swaminarayan Nagar for 59 days. Thousands of people pledged to give up addictions. Joseph Maturia, a former Kenyan Minister for Lands and Settlement, also took a vow of not drinking beer in the main celebration assembly before thousands of people. Swamishri said, "Maturia Saheb has given up drinking. Our celebration has served its noble purpose. Now, he will take this message of de-addiction to Kenya."

Later, in 1988, during Swamishri's visit to Kenya, Mr Maturiya thanked Swamishri and said, "Swamiji, you have entered my heart since you gave me the message of leading an

addiction-free life. All my thoughts pertaining to addictions have been extinguished. Not only that, whoever I talk to about giving up addictions, he or she wishes to improve his or her life and so quits addictions. Here, in Kenya, we have an 86-year-old retired minister. He is the oldest retired politician in the world, having served the longest tenure in politics. He used to smoke heavily for 70 years. When I explained to him to quit, he gave it up.”

When Mr Maturia was asked what thought he kept in mind while talking to people to quit addictions. He replied, “First, I remember your festival celebrated in India in 1985. Then, I remember Pramukh Swami, and lastly I wish for the good of their souls, and so they are inspired to give up their addictions. This happens due to Swamishri’s inspiration. I have to attend grand parties, but I observe my pledge resolutely. The thought of drinking alcohol doesn’t arise in me; not even when I am in the State House parliament.”

Many people become addicted to TV and it makes even a hardworking person lazy. Today, TV is one of the causes for students to go morally astray. Swamishri made great efforts and took immense care that youths did not become lethargic due to TV.

Whenever Swamishri addressed the youths in a satsang assembly, he emphasized on the deleterious effects of TV. Once, the youths in Ahmedabad performed a drama called ‘Sugar-Coated Poison’. It highlighted the vices of TV. Then, Swamishri blessed the satsang assembly, “People know that TV is like poison, yet they watch it because it tastes sweet; but it ruins lives. How many have become virtuous after watching TV? On the contrary, whatever virtues one has are destroyed. Once you start watching TV, there will be no limits. So, don’t ever install it at home. It will be difficult to control your children from

going to a neighbour’s or friend’s house to watch it. If you have to buy and install one at home, use it with restraint. Limit it to watching the news and wholesome programmes, and then switch it off. If you keep the company of sadhus and remain connected to the mandir, you will be able to save yourself from the poison of TV. It is

also essential to do *ghar sabha* every night for at least half an hour. All the family members should sit together and someone should read a spiritual book and thereafter interact with each other. If the atmosphere in your home remains charged with satsang, then the pollution of TV and other things will not affect you. By watching TV, you often waste time and students spoil their studies. In the long run, it spoils your eyes, mind and intellect. It also delays one’s household work and may lead to quarrels and conflicts. Once you install a TV, you won’t be able to restrain yourself in watching the news only. Eventually, you will start watching everything. The neighbours will also come to watch in your house and it may lead to lapses in moral behaviour.”

Swamishri often discoursed about the harmful effects of TV and inspired countless to exercise restraint in watching it.

What was the secret behind Swamishri’s achievement in redeeming countless from addictions? Mr Lamberty, Mayor of Nora, USA, offered the ‘Key to Our Heart’ to Swamishri and said, “We present this ‘Key to Our Heart’ to a luminary, who is capable of ruling over the hearts of all. This is the key of honouring a highly beloved personality.” Then he added, “I declare today as ‘Pramukh Swami Day.’”

Shortly after, during a conversation with Swamishri, Mayor Lamberty said, “We ask for your special blessings to show us a path of success from the repeated failures we face in our campaigns against drug addiction.”

MAHARAJ AND SWAMI AT THE FOREFRONT

On 18 August 1995, a grand, joyous and vibrant *nagar yatra* was held to honour the *murtis* to be consecrated in the newly built *shikharbaddha* BAPS Mandir in Neasden, London. It was the auspicious day of Janmashtami – Shravan *vad* 8 – the birthday of Bhagwan Krishna.

The procession began from Hyde Park and concluded at Trafalgar Square. Over 12,000 devotees, young and old, men and women, from throughout the UK, France, Portugal, USA, Canada, India, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania and other countries enthusiastically joined in the *nagar yatra*,

dancing, singing and proudly rejoicing on this historic auspicious occasion. Even the discomfort of being in the open, under the blazing 30°C sun did not bother anyone.

The exuberant devotees set off from Hyde Park Corner at 1.00 p.m., with the *nagar yatra* comprising seven floats carrying the *murtis* to be consecrated; three marching bands – from Leicester, Dallas and Nairobi – playing traditional devotional tunes; children, teenagers and youths in traditional costumes performing traditional dances; women devotees carrying coconut-topped *kalashes* as per ancient tradition; and many other

celebratory items. Thousands of passers-by lined the streets to witness this glorious *nagar yatra*.

Then, about 20 minutes after the start, the procession approached Piccadilly Circus. To everyone's utmost surprise, they had the darshan of Pramukh Swami Maharaj seated on a platform in the middle of Piccadilly Circus, a scene that nobody had expected.

This unique darshan of Swamishri enhanced the beaming smiles and joyful expressions of all the devotees as they walked past Swamishri, bowing in reverence, and continued the procession. It was the highlight of the afternoon, a memory that everyone still treasures. Two days later, on 20 August 1995, Pramukh Swami Maharaj performed the Vedic *murti-pratishtha* of the *shikharbaddha* mandir in London, the first traditional stone mandir in Europe.

However, only later did everyone learn that amid the makeshift arrangements made by the volunteers for Swamishri to sit at Piccadilly Circus, nobody had thought to place a *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan.

But Swamishri was prepared, since for him Maharaj and Swami were at the forefront of everything, especially on such momentous

occasions as this. So, when he arrived, Swamishri insisted that a separate *asan* be prepared and the *murti* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj¹ he had brought with him be placed next to him.

This demonstrates that for Swamishri, Maharaj and Swami are his focus. Even amid such an honour – the first time such an arrangement had been allowed at Piccadilly Circus – Swamishri offered his devotion to Bhagwan Swaminarayan.

The *murti* he brought that day is seen in the photograph of Swamishri seated at Piccadilly Circus. This *murti* is presently preserved in the archives at BAPS Mandir, Sarangpur. It is a sacred relic that reminds us all to always follow Swamishri's lead in keeping Maharaj and Swami at the forefront of our lives in every situation. ♦

1. Pramukh Swami Maharaj had kept this *murti* of Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj with him since 1985. Swamishri would take this *murti* with him to every house he visited for *padhramani* (see photo above). This *murti* has, thus, blessed the homes of countless devotees, fulfilled their wishes, accepted offerings of garlands and *prasad*, listened to Swamishri's prayers for devotees and swamis, inaugurated new projects, and much more. It was also the *murti* that Swamishri placed next to him in the London Nagar Yatra at Piccadilly Circus in 1995.

In the Vachanamrut, the most important shastra of the Swaminarayan Sampradaya, Bhagwan Swaminarayan has revealed the Vedic Akshar-Purushottam Darshan – the underlying core understanding with which devotees of the Swaminarayan Sampradaya should offer devotion to attain *moksha*.

Bhagwan Swaminarayan has described that Akshar or Aksharbrahma is the ideal devotee of Purushottam or Parabrahma, and that both are eternally divine and beyond the influence of *maya*. *Jivas* and *ishwars* take birth on earth and strive to transcend *maya* to attain Purushottam. To assist them across this barrier, Bhagwan Swaminarayan has stated that the Gunatit/spiritually enlightened/God-realized sadhu/guru serves as a bridge.

This exemplary Gunatit Guru epitomizes the virtues an aspirant must develop to become eligible for *moksha*. To attain these virtues an aspirant must associate profoundly with Akshar,

whose life and teachings guide him on the spiritual path. This association is the bridge that enables an aspirant to traverse the barrier of *maya* and reach the divine abode – Akshardham – where he forever enjoys the darshan and *seva*/service of Purushottam.

Thus, it is through such guru bhakti towards the Gunatit Guru that *moksha* is attained. And the Gunatit Guru is again the ideal example of such guru bhakti. Each Gunatit Guru excels in devotion to his gurus and serves as the template for all devotees to emulate. Mahant Swami Maharaj has shown us through his life and teachings just how we should offer guru bhakti. Even his apparently subtle actions reflect his deep and constant guru bhakti. The following demonstrate how we, too, should offer guru bhakti to our gurus.

5 MAY 2016, NADIAD

Swamishri was on his way to Yogi Farm in Jigneshbhai Panchal's car.

Jigneshbhai said, “I am building a new house. Please give me permission to name it ‘Keshav Palace’.

Swamishri refused and said, “Keep Pramukh Swami Maharaj’s name.”

Jigneshbhai said, “Up to now all my building sites have been based on Pramukh Swami Maharaj’s name. Now please give permission to use your name.”

Swamishri said, “Everything is included in his name.”

27 MAY 2018, RAJKOT

After puja, Swamishri was taking his medicine, when Brahmavatsal Swami asked, “Swami, when you go for darshan of the gurus, you always climb two steps. Is it to get a closer darshan or because you like to climb steps?”

Swamishri said, “To get closer darshan” Brahmavatsal Swami said, “We do not have such *shraddha*.”

Swamishri instantly remembered Yogiji Maharaj and said, “I have seen Yogiji Maharaj’s *shraddha*. It was the month of Vaishakh and very hot. Yogi Bapa was leaving Sarangpur to go to Jamrala, so he went for Thakorji’s darshan. Then, he went to use the bathroom. After this, before leaving, he again went for Thakorji’s darshan in the main mandir. So, Sant Swami said, ‘This is the way of the Satpurush.’ Only a few minutes earlier he had been for darshan but he went again.”

For Mahant Swami Maharaj, his guru is his ideal.

29 MAY 2021, NENPUR

During a video recording for a question-answer session to be shown during the *kishore-kishori shibirs* in North America, the following questions were asked.

Q: What is the true definition of guru bhakti?

Swamishri: Affection for the guru and to do and live as per his instructions. Also, *divyabhav* towards the guru. This is guru bhakti.

Q: With what thought do you continuously offer guru bhakti? How do you view Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj that you continue to offer them guru bhakti?

Swamishri: Everything is included in the guru. I constantly think that I am Aksharrup and have to offer *upasana* to Purushottam. If you contemplate on this *prapti* and *mahima* that is guru Bhakti.

Q: What joy did you experience in the presence of your gurus?

Swamishri: First, they are like God – through them we have actually attained God. So, that gives so much happiness. This *prapti* (attainment) gives limitless joy.

Q: If the *param ekantik sant* is recognized, then how is guru bhakti offered?

Swamishri: Just as Bhagatji Maharaj offered bhakti (to Gunatitanand Swami) Shastriji Maharaj offered bhakti (to Bhagatji Maharaj), Yogi Bapa offered bhakti to (Shastriji Maharaj) and Pramukh Swami Maharaj offered bhakti (to Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj), we should offer bhakti. Since everything is true; there is not even a trace of untruth. We have attained a pure gold coin.

Q: How can we cultivate *mahima* for our gurus like you have?

Swamishri: First, everything is attained by knowledge and understanding, otherwise everything remains superficial and fleeting. But with resolute *mahima* and *nishtha* in Maharaj and Swami we experience unending joy.

The steps to understanding the guru’s mahima are *shravan*, *manan*, *nididhyas* and *shakshatkar*.

Shravan is to listen and adopt what is useful. Then, do *manan*. Repeatedly recall the talks we have accepted and like. Only then will they become ingrained. Even worldly knowledge has to be repeatedly remembered. And this is spiritual wisdom, it is eternal. It is forever true. Then, *nididhyas* is that it is embedded in one’s *jiva* and is never lost. Doing such *shravan*, *manan* and *nididhyas* leads to *shakshatkar*.

- Mahant Swami Maharaj's words on innumerable occasions reveals his guru bhakti:
 - Pramukh Swami Maharaj has done everything. He has left nothing undone.
 - Pramukh Swami Maharaj's wishes are my wishes.
 - You have Swami Bapa's blessings, and my prayers.
 - Yogi Bapa likes the *thal* of *samp*, *suhradbhav* and *dasbhav*, so I also like them.
 - Yogi Bapa and Pramukh Swami Maharaj are the forms of God.
- Once, Vinu Bhagat was with Yogi Bapa in Nadiad. From here, they were go to their next destination by train. Due to the crowds in train, the possibility of having to fast (if touched by a woman) was high. So, they would have to have a heavy breakfast. On the breakfast menu were *pattarveli*, which Vinu Bhagat liked a lot. But when the server approached him to give him some, Yogi Bapa said, "No , no. He does not like *pattarveli*. He likes *mamra* (puffed rice)." Vinu Bhagat took this one statement from Yogi Bapa to heart and for six decades he did not eat *pattarveli* at all. And in memory to this occasion, he begins breakfast by eating *mamra*.
- In 1956, Vinubhai (Mahant Swami Maharaj before he had taken *diksha*) was with Yogiji Maharaj in Bhadran. One day, Vinubhai suffered from severe stomach pains. So, Yogiji Maharaj treated him with a traditional, tried-and-tested, remedy. As part of the method, Yogiji Maharaj clasped Vinubhai's hands lifted him up to a sitting position. Then he told Vinubhai to grasp the big toes of his feet, while he fetched some balls of ginger, gur and ghee (*soothni goli*). For 45 minutes, Vinubhai sat patiently in this

posture waiting for Yogiji Maharaj to return and followed his instructions to the letter.

- After Pramukh Swami Maharaj's return to Akshardham, Mahant Swami Maharaj continued to visit satsang centres everywhere. In one centre, the youths continually hailed 'Mahant Swami Maharaj ni jai'. Expressing his disapproval, Swamishri told them. "First proclaim 'Pramukh Swami Maharaj ni jai'. He must always be remembered first. I am his *sevak*." Then, further revealing his anguish, Swamishri said, "When you do all this without hailing Pramukh Swami Maharaj, I feel such pain as if both my arms are being cut off!"

Once, he also said, "Without proclaiming 'Pramukh Swami Maharaj *ni jai*' everything is meaningless."

Such is Mahanat Swami Maharaj's guru bhakti. He always respects and keeps his gurus at the forefront.

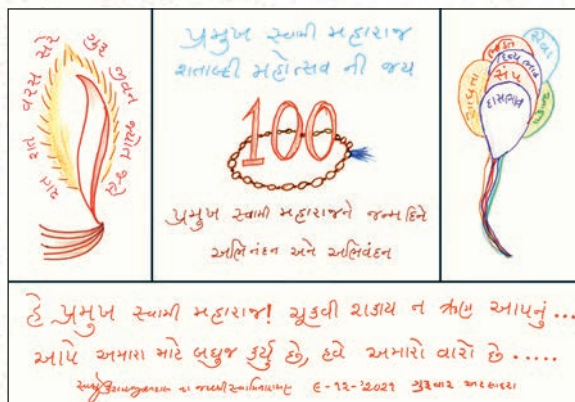
30 SEPTEMBER 2021, SARANGPUR

AN OUTCOME DRIVEN SOCIETY

We live by Newton's third law of motion: For every action in nature there is an equal and opposite reaction. This law of physics is taught to us in high school, and accepted to be logical and ingrained from a young age. We learn to be outcome driven and solution or result orientated in whatever work we do. We work on the presumption that the fruits of our labour will make us happy. We become goal orientated and expect appropriate compensation and rewards for the products of our endeavours. The rewards we expect come in the form of fortune, fame, position, power or prestige.

We assume that acquiring a big house, luxury car and fashionable clothes will result in happiness. To achieve these rewards we work long hours, sacrificing family time and our health in the process. We prepare to be measured in our workplaces on KPIs (Key Performance Indicators) and other outcome driven tools. We run faster on the human hamster wheel by enduring tough working conditions, crazy deadlines and challenging bosses at an intensity that is unsustainable and impossible at times.

We live in a

society that is completely outcome or result driven. From a young age we are wired to compare, compete and be better than the rest. We cajole, fight and manipulate in order to get a particular outcome. This leads to stress resulting in physical and mental illnesses. Medically, it is accepted that many illnesses are lifestyle driven as we chase the fruits of our endeavours in order to feel happy. Our mind sees no other way.

MANIFESTATION OF ILLNESS

It's not surprising therefore that we are seeing an increase in mental illnesses due to work stress.

In 2019, the World Health Organization included burnout in the International Classification of Diseases. More and more people are succumbing to feeling that they cannot cope and cannot keep up. They feel pressured, overwhelmed and overburdened. No matter how hard they work, it never is good enough. As hard as they do work, there are only 24 hours in a day. In Japan, there is a word, 'karoshi', literally translated to mean 'death by overwork'.

The most common medical causes of karoshi deaths are heart attacks, strokes due to stress and suicide, all due to work related stress.



IMPACT ON FAMILY AND COMMUNITY

It is not only in our work that we chase results, but also within our family and communities. Of particular concern within families is the pressure we put on our children to achieve results, be it academically or in sports. It is becoming more common for doctors to treat children with high levels of anxiety due to the expectations their parents impose on them. Living up to parental expectations continues into adulthood; for example, choice of studies and career.



THE PURSUIT OF FREEDOM

Yet we feel that if we achieve our goals, fame and fortune will set us free. We will thus become forever joyful and bask in prestige. Therefore, from a young age we spend our lives chasing goals, from school to university and then the workplace. We are also expected to deal with family and community expectations. It's as if we are running on a hamster wheel that goes around in circles. The wheel turns and we hope it will deliver the results we want. We get caught up in a never-ending loop. We try to step off by running faster, so that we achieve our end goal. However, we all end up exhausted within the wheel.

Today's modern and materialistic society, driven by a winner takes all attitude, brainwashes us into believing that the more we have, the happier we will be. Tons of books, courses and seminars are written on how to achieve our goals and ensure that we get the outcome we desire. Social media drives this insatiable appetite of chasing fame and fortune: the more likes and followers we have, the more we are expected to be happier. We seek constant appreciation to acknowledge we've arrived.

However, not all are guaranteed of a success story. We learn early in life that in spite of all our actions, we do not get the reaction or result we desire. Despite hard work and effort, we do not achieve the fruits of our labour. For every one success story



we hear of, there are a thousand shattered dreams and disappointments. We become slaves to the system and wonder why we cannot break free.

FEAR OF FAILURE

When people are generally asked, what is it they fear the most. The answer inevitably is failure. From the day we start school, it is ingrained that failure is unacceptable. We feel we have failed when we don't accomplish the goals that society, family or we expect. We become stressed due to the pressure we impose on ourselves. One definition of stress is the gap between reality and our expectations. We interpret this gap as failure.

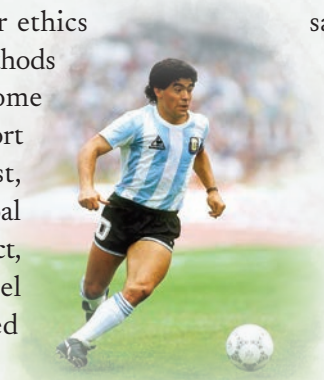
Invariably, frustration sets in. We feel incomplete and unfulfilled. We don't know what to do or where to turn. It's not surprising that we are seeing an increase in mental illness as a result. Stress results in an increase in mood disorders such as burnout, depression and anxiety. We sacrifice who we are and it is no surprise that our values are thrown aside on our path to worldly success. We begin to accept that the end result is more important than the path we take to get there.

DOES THE END JUSTIFY THE MEANS?

Diego Maradona, the famous footballer, scored twice – including the 'hand of God' goal – to knock England out of the 1986 World Cup. The late Argentinian player described his opening goal as "a little with the head of Maradona and a little with the hand of God". The referee did not have a clear view and allowed the goal to stand. Minutes later, Maradona dribbled past a host of England players to score again, a strike that was voted as the goal of the century. Argentina went on to win the World Cup. Now, in May 2022, the shirt Maradona wore when he scored those goals, sold for a record-breaking £7.1 million in an auction.

We become so focused on attaining a winning outcome, be it at school, home or work, that we

compromise or totally sacrifice our ethics and principles. The processes and methods we utilize to achieve outcomes become corrupt. If we are competing, we resort to cheating so that we will be first, even at the expense of others. The goal negates the means. Yet, if we introspect, we will recognize how empty we feel and wonder why we are not fulfilled despite achieving our goals.



AS STATED IN THE SCRIPTURES

The Bhagavad Gita states, – “*Karmanye vādhikāraste mā phaleṣhu kadāchana...* – You have the right to action or work but never to its fruits. Let not the fruits of action be your motive, nor let your attachment be to inaction” (2.47). Our guru *parampara* epitomizes this statement in their words, character and actions. It is a mindset shift in how they approach the work they do. Through their life activities our gurus demonstrate, they do their absolute best and leave the outcome to be determined by Bhagwan Swaminarayan.

Shriji Maharaj in Vachanamrut Gadhada I 2 explains, “A person who has the highest level of *vairagya* engages in worldly activities... is not affected by those activities. He may indulge in the most alluring of the *panchvishays*... but he does so dejectedly and with total indifference towards them. Those *vishays* are unable to entice him; thus his renunciation remains undiminished.”

PRAMUKH SWAMI MAHARAJ'S DESCRIPTION OF RENUNCIATION

Abdul Kalam, in his book, *Transcendence*, describes to Pramukh Swami Maharaj, “Swamiji, when I first launched a rocket it failed, and I became very depressed and disheartened. At the time I thought of becoming a



sannyasi and giving up everything.” Pramukh Swami Maharaj said, “The Bhagavad Gita defines renunciation in a unique way, ‘One must renounce not the performance of deeds, but renounce the desire for the fruits of those actions’... Human effort and God’s grace move this world. Even failure of the first rocket, which you faced, was for your good; it prodded you to make things better.”

Pramukh Swami Maharaj offered a unique and powerful perspective on how to approach all the works we do. It was the same unique principle that drove our guru *parampara* in all the works they did – the principle of complete detachment to the fruits of actions. All they sought was *rajipo* of God and guru.

They were never driven by fame, fortune, power, position or prestige. In 1997, some youths suggested that Pramukh Swami be nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. It would be a great honour and his name would reach all corners of the world. Then, everyone would know about what Swami Bapa had accomplished. However, before they could continue, Pramukh Swami Maharaj stopped them and said, “I have attained Bhagwan Swaminarayan and gurus Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj. For me they are Nobel Prizes.” He then told the sadhus and devotees that worldly awards do not last, and that it is best to worship God. Pramukh Swami Maharaj demonstrated that all he cared and lived for was the *rajipo* of

his gurus. As much as Swami Bapa received and accepted accolades, he had no interest in gaining the key to the cities he was awarded, roads that were named after him or being praised in a grand assembly.

GOD – THE ALL-DOER

Shriji Maharaj is the all-doer. This means that everything, good and bad, that happens is due to Maharaj's wish. Swami Bapa lived steadfastly by this principle and took absolute comfort in knowing that. An example was the court case regarding the Harrow land for the London mandir. Despite the amount of time and resources that Pramukh Swami Maharaj, and the devotees put into the case, BAPS lost the case. All those involved in the UK and in India were devastated at the verdict. Yet, Pramukh Swami Maharaj remained calm on hearing about the outcome. He believed according to Vachanamrut Gadhada I 78 that without God's wish not even a blade of grass flutters. He also told the mandir trustees that whatever Shriji Maharaj had done was for our good and that something better would result from the failure.

Once in Junagadh, Dr Chhaya, asked Swamishri, "I cannot properly manage five staff members in my clinic, yet how do you manage such a large organization?"

"God is the all-doer," Swamishri replied succinctly.

"That is true, but you are the instrument. How do you manage everything?" the doctor persisted.

"By believing God to be the all-doer everyone is inspired to make effort. Because God resides in everyone, therefore he is the inspirer. One should do one's work by understanding the glory of everyone, by pleasing God and understanding him to be the all-doer. One should also pray to God for one's intentions to be pure and to give everyone the strength to work."

DETACHED & STRESS-FREE

Pramukh Swami Maharaj paid no heed to the accolades he received. He had no inclination towards power, position or prestige. Once, an aspirant said to Swamishri, "If you become the prime minister [of India], then I will become the finance minister." Swamishri instantly responded, "Everything is perishable. This world itself is perishable. The type

of joy derived from God's worship and chanting the *mala* cannot be found elsewhere."

In 2003, Dr Mangal Patel, chairman of the Gujarat Legislative Assembly, came for Pramukh Swami Maharaj's darshan and blessings. On learning about the sheer expanse of services performed by Swamishri, he asked in amazement, "How do you manage to peacefully run more than 500 mandirs and the Satsang fellowship that has spread in India and abroad?"

Swamishri humbly replied, "I am not running anything. It is my guru and God who are running everything. I do not believe that I am doing something. God is the doer of everything. However, when one believes that one is doing everything and when things don't work out properly, one becomes depressed. One should make all the efforts, but the fruits of one's actions depend upon God. And if one does not get success, one should firmly believe that it was for one's own benefit.

"Our guruji taught us that if you fill a pot with water and place it on your head, you will feel its burden. But when you dive in water, despite the pressure of 'tons' of water on your head, you do not feel the weight. So, I am not doing anything. God and the guru are doing everything.

"There is no end to pain and misery due to ego and possessiveness. So, I constantly believe that God and the guru are the all-doers. That is how the entire Sanstha is run."

Thus, Pramukh Swami Maharaj was without stress, frustration and irritation in all his endeavours. He taught us not to see ourselves as the doer, be it at school, at university, in our career or in family life. To cope in this day and age we must give our absolute effort, yet not focus on the fruits of our labours. Whatever spiritual efforts and services we perform should be solely to attain Bhagwan's and the guru's *rajipo*. As Pujya Mahant Swami Maharaj has said on numerous occasions, "Do your best and leave the rest," or another way of interpreting the statement is: Do your best and let Swamishri take care of the rest. ♦

Climbing the J Curve

In this article we will review the J Curve theory discussed by Ian Bremmer and how this can be viewed in a personal and spiritual context.

WHAT IS THE J-CURVE?

It resembles the Nike Swoosh and, at a subtle level, even teaches Nike's famous message: 'Just Do It'.

The J Curve is so named because visually it looks like the letter 'J' and is used as a graphical representation of ideas in a variety of fields: medicine, economics, private equity, country status and political science. It takes various forms as shown in the diagrams below.

STABILITY VS OPENNESS

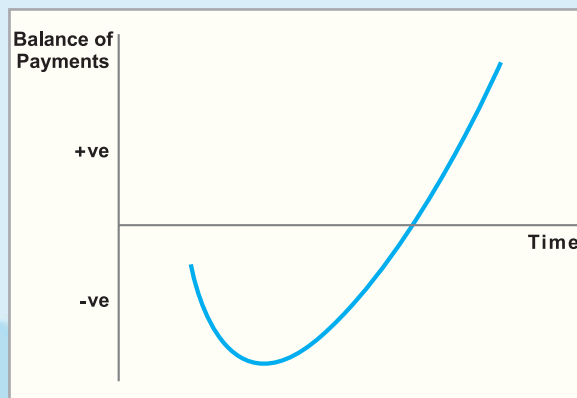
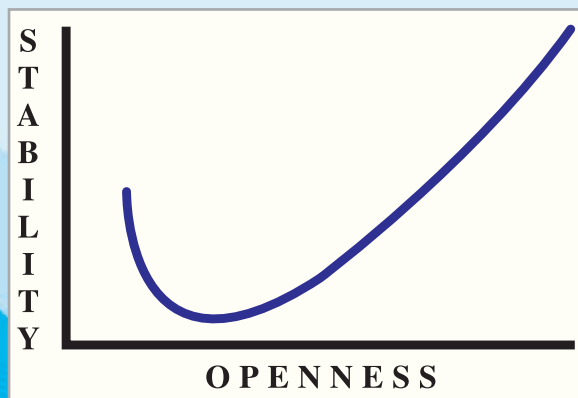
In his thought-provoking book *The J Curve: A New Way to Understand Why Nations Rise and Fall*, political analyst Ian Bremmer proposes the J Curve as a model to describe the stability of countries with respect to their openness.

A plot of the stability of a nation in the face of internal and external shocks on the Y-axis against its political and economic openness results in a J-shaped graph with the following characteristics:

1. Totalitarian states, such as, Iran, North Korea and Saudi Arabia are on the left of

the curve and enjoy a moderate level of stability, due to their authoritarian controls.

2. On the extreme right of the curve are highly open and highly stable countries such as USA, UK, Germany and other established democracies.
3. The right side of the curve results in greater stability if openness is achieved. However, authoritarian countries on the left do attain a modest level of stability due to the controls they impose. Yet these same controls limit the level of stability that is achieved in these countries.
4. The slope on the left side is much steeper than on the right. This means that open societies on the right are very stable and would require tremendous disruptive forces to destabilize them. In contrast, however, autocratic regimes may be stable at any particular point in time, but are fragile and susceptible to becoming rapidly unstable. A sudden challenge from internal or external forces can readily disrupt the status



quo, leading to disorder and confusion and a swift decline in stability.

5. The path from a stable, yet fragile, closed society to a more stable and resilient society is not linear. The period of transition is characterized by a dip in the curve (the dipping point), signifying greater instability. During this period, if the authoritarian regime loses patience and courage, it may forego the potential benefits of long-term stability in an attempt to regain short-term stability by re-imposing its autocratic controls and thus scamper back up the left side of the curve to a position of reduced openness but short-term stability. Thus, this inevitable dip needs to be prudently negotiated.

There are many factors which contribute to the openness or otherwise of a country, and hence its stability. Democracy is not the only factor, as Ian Bremmer writes, “History, geography, culture and other factors give each state its own particular strengths and vulnerabilities. As a consequence, each state has its own J Curve, though each curve retains the same basic shape.”

Now let us consider how the J Curve can be applied to spirituality in individuals.

SPIRITUALITY AND THE J CURVE

Imagine a plot of inner peace and happiness on the vertical (y) axis against observance of spiritual disciplines and faith in God on the horizontal (x)

axis. Such a plot would likely resemble a J curve with a steep left side, trough and a shallower but higher right side.

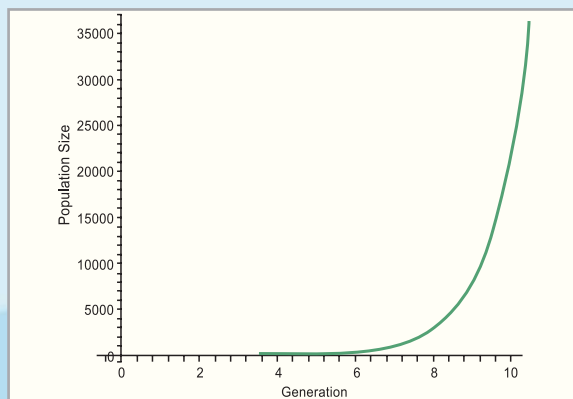
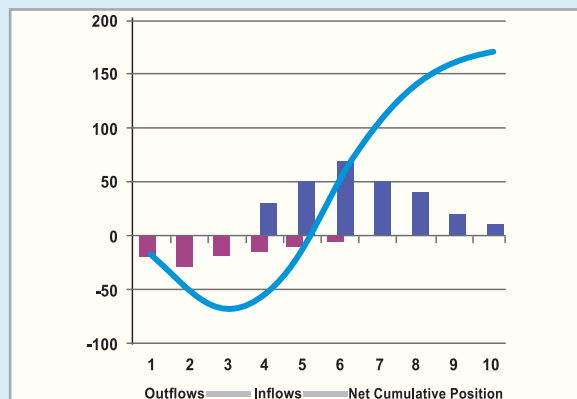
A person who transgresses spiritual codes or does not have faith in God may feel a certain level of inner peace or happiness, but will never reach the level of peace or happiness experienced by one who abides by spiritual codes and has faith in God.

The former has achieved a type of stability that is dependent on perishable, ever-changing material factors and is thus subject to rapid destabilization when these factors are disturbed. For example, a person may be dependent on material pleasures from which a certain level of enjoyment is experienced. But when such pleasures are not available there is likely to be a rapid decline in personal stability and loss of inner peace. This is similar to the situation of authoritarian states that are liable to descend into chaos due to disruptive forces that challenge their autocratic methods.

On the other hand, a person on the right side of the J Curve may encounter disturbances in life, but the steadying power of faith absorbs such disruption and limits the loss of inner peace just as a right side of the J Curve country is able to withstand internal and external shocks.

So, for a non-spiritual person on the left of the curve to develop the spirituality which will raise the level of inner peace and happiness the transition dip has to be successfully negotiated.

The success or failure of this change is



determined by patient, persistent pursuit and proper implementation of the necessary factors.

On the left side of the curve, materially minded people who courageously persist and decide to battle through the inner turmoil encountered during the period of transition emerge on the right side and benefit from higher levels of inner peace and personal stability.

To aid this transition it is important to remain in the appropriate company.

Bremmer mentions, “A state with no stability is a failed state; it can neither implement nor enforce government policy. Such a country can fragment, it can be taken over by outside forces, or it can descend into chaos.”

This happened to Somalia in 1991 when rival tribes tried to oust the dictator and fought each other. This in-fighting resulted in half a million deaths and 750,000 refugees. Further, in August 2005 South Africa expressed concern about the possibility of neighbouring Zimbabwe becoming such a failed state. Since, as Bremmer points out, “When state failure strikes your neighbour, the resulting chaos can undermine your stability as well, as refugees, armed conflict, and disease spill across borders.”

Similarly, avoiding the company of spiritually failed persons is essential to preserving one’s inner peace and happiness. Moreover, the company of spiritually successful people will help one to successfully weather the turmoil of the transition dip and attain greater peace and happiness. In short, the company one keeps is an important contributing factor to one’s own failure or success.

Bhagwan Swaminarayan emphasizes this point in Vachanamrut Gadhada I 70, “By avoiding the company of external *kusangis* (read, ‘failed’ people) and by keeping the company of only the Sant (read, ‘spiritually successful’ people) residing externally, the force of the *kusangis* decreases and force of the Sant increases.”

It is during this critical, make or break, transition period that the right support is

essential. If such support is not attained, a person is likely to revert to the previous state of material indulgence – a state in which he feels at ease, but will not experience long-term inner peace.

OVERCOMING ADDICTIONS

A person dependent on alcohol, drugs, tobacco and other addictive substances lies on the left of the curve, feeling a certain, though limited and fragile, level of happiness. When the substances that sustain this joy are denied – that is, there is a disruptive force – such a person rapidly descends into inner turmoil. If such a person resolves to become free of these addictive substances, it will be necessary to face the period of transition with courage and determination, as well as appropriate moral and social support. If there is a lack of such courage and determination (internal factors) or support (external factors), the person is likely to revert to dependence on addictive substances.

It is of long-term benefit to such individuals, and their families that they shed such addictive habits. They are aware of the fact that freedom from such habits results in greater joy and a more stable life – just as autocratic countries know that open societies are more stable.

DISCUSSION

Each individual has to make a choice. Are they prepared to struggle through the dip and emerge on the other side where they will reap more and better rewards or will they give up and return to their previous state? The J Curve is thus a useful model helping one to visualize the joy of life. Its warning about potential pitfalls of the transition dip enables appropriate preparation to prevent failure.

So, to return to the Nike Swoosh and its famous catchphrase, once one’s goal for attaining greater peace and happiness is set, one has to surmount all problems and do whatever is necessary. That is, one must ‘Just Do It’.

Personal Rituals

NITYA PUJA

In the last issue, we discussed personal rituals involved in five limbs of ashtang yoga. In this sixth article, we discuss rituals of morning worship known as nitya puja.

Hindus practise puja ritual after having their obligatory morning bath. Obligatory because it purifies the body and refreshes the mind. Hence, this ritual is known as *pratah snan* – morning bath.

Many perform a simple puja ritual such as lighting and waving a *diya* or burning an incense stick in front of the deity in the home shrine. Others may offer slightly more elaborate rituals as prescribed in their *sampradaya*.

In the Swaminarayan Sampradaya about 16 rituals constitute *nitya puja* which collectively span about 25 or more minutes. After bathing and wearing washed clothes, devotees sit down facing either north or east – the two auspicious directions for puja. Males then imprint *tilak-chandlo* on their forehead while females apply only a *chandlo*. For the *tilak*, *chandana* (sandwood paste) is used and kumkum for *chandlo*. These are auspicious substances which charge the *agna chakra* on the forehead throughout the day.

Then one meditates (*dhyān*). This involves *atmachintan* – regarding oneself as ‘atma’, ‘akshar’ which transcends the three bodies: physical, mental and causal. Then one contemplates about the goal of life: to become *akshar* to realize and worship Parabrahma Bhagwan Swaminarayan. Mahant Swami Maharaj has also added another important sentiment to introspection, “What have I come to do and what am I doing [to realize this goal]!”

One then does *mansi* – mental visualization



of awakening and bathing Bhagwan and guru Mahant Swami Maharaj, offering them *shangar* of rich garments, garlands and other adornments. Now they are ready to be invoked in puja. The principle of worshipping the Gunatit guru with equal reverence as Bhagwan is advocated in the following *shloks* – *Guru Brahma, guru Vishnu...*, *Guru Govind donu khade...*, and by Bhagwan Swaminarayan in *Vachanamrut Vartal 5*.

One then arranges the puja *murtis* on the cloth *asan* and utters the *ahvan* mantra to invoke Bhagwan and the Gunatit gurus in puja (*Satsang Diksha 64–65*):

*Uttishtha Sahajānanda Shri-Hare Purushottama;
Gunātītā'kshara brahmann-uttishtha krupayā guro.
Āgamyatām hi pujārtham āgamyatām mad-ātmataha;
Sānnidhyād darshanād divyāt saubhāgyam
vardhate mama.*

“O Sahajanand Shri Hari! O Purushottam!
O Aksharbrahma Gunatit gurus! Please shower
compassion [upon me] and awaken. Please

come forth from my *atma*, to accept my puja. I become more blessed due to your divine presence and darshan.”

One then does 11, 25 or more *malas*, chanting the ‘Swaminarayan’ mantra while turning each bead. The benefits of mantra chanting were discussed in article one.

For a detailed explanation of all the rituals of *nitya* puja, see chapter 28 in *Hindu Rites & Rituals: sentiments, sacraments & symbols*, 2010, 2nd ed. Then the *tapni mala* is performed by standing on the left leg, with the right leg bent at the knee, in the same posture as Nilkanth Varni, in remembrance of his austerities at Muktinath during his 7-year *kalyan yatra*.

One then performs 5 or 11 *pradakshinas*, after which males offer six *dandvat pranams* and females offer *panchang pranams*. The underlying sentiment of this ritual is *sharanagati* – accepting Bhagwan’s refuge with total humility. Bhagwan Swaminarayan advocated the sixth *dandvat* in Vachanamrut Gadhadra II 40, as a form of atonement for knowingly or unknowingly maligning (committing *droh*) a devotee.

After *pranams* one sits in *mansi* with both palms facing upwards to offer delicious foods which one likes. Then one offers *prarthana* with palms joined for “protection from one’s *indriyas*, attachments of ‘I’ and ‘mine’, undesirable company (*kusang*) and blessings for any other upcoming stressful event such as an exam, interview, etc.” Then it is time to bid farewell and gratitude by chanting the *punaragaman* mantra (Satsang Diksha 73):

*Bhaktyaiva divya-bhāvena puja te sam-anushthitā,
Gachchhā'tha tvam mad-ātmānam
Akshara-Purushottama.*

“O Purushottam Narayan together with Aksharbrahma! I have performed your puja with devotion and *divyabhav*. Now, please reside within my *atma*.”

One then does *charan sparsh* of the *murtis* with the second and third fingers of the right hand and then touches one’s eyes with them. Then one

reads five *shloks* from the Shikshapatri and Satsang Diksha and for a few moments reflects upon their meanings and how sincerely one is abiding by them.

Then one gathers the *murtis* and other puja objects, folds them in the cloth *asan*, and places them in the puja case. One then offers *panchang pranams* to one’s parents, grandparents and other elders in the home.

SENTIMENTS OF NITYA PUJA

Nitya puja personally connects us with Bhagwan and guru. By their immense *krupa* – compassion or grace – they manifest in puja by our chanting of the *ahvan* mantra. On 28 October 2021, Mahant Swami Maharaj revealed, “In puja, we have a chance to talk with Bhagwan. In puja Bhagwan and the guru *parampara* are specially present. Whether we believe it or not, even if our mind is distracted elsewhere, even then they certainly arrive in puja.”

It is a way of offering *sakhya bhakti* by regarding them as intimate friends to whom one can divulge all personal problems uninhibitedly. It is a most sacred and fulfilling ritual. Seemingly simple, this 20-minute ritual acts like a sustained release medication which invigorates us for the next 24 hours without any side effects. How do we know whether Bhagwan has accepted our *prarthana*? Simple. One feels de-stressed and spiritually charged to face the day’s silent ripples or stormy turbulences.

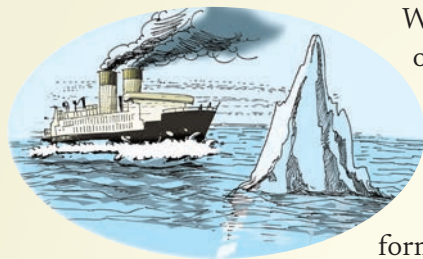
On introspection in the evening after the day’s activities, one may realize how smoothly the day passed despite the potential obstacles one had expected. This indicates that one’s *prarthana* in puja was heard. Yet occasionally, when our wishes during *prarthana* do not materialize we should believe that Bhagwan probably considered it unfavourable for us in the long term.

In the next and seventh article, we shall discuss the personal ritual of *mansi puja*, in which one performs puja mentally. ♦

MURTI MAGNETISM



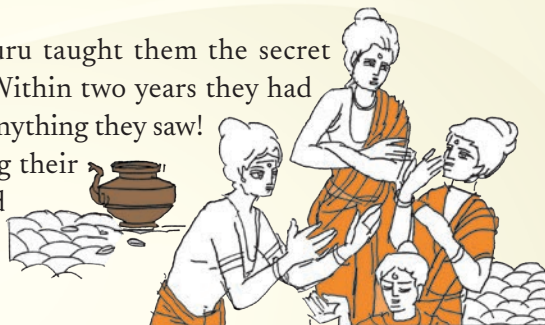
With comprehensive spiritual knowledge, one realizes the divinity of God and his magnetic appeal to all who have faith in him. In Vachanamrut Vartal 13, Shriji Maharaj reveals how engaging in the darshan of the *murti* of God with faith and understanding leads to an experience of divine bliss, “By appearance, God’s form appears similar to that of any human; however, it is an exceptionally divine form. For example, a magnetic rock appears similar to all the other rocks on the earth; yet there is a natural magical property in it – when a ship sails past a mountain of magnetic rock, then all the iron nails of the ship are drawn towards the magnetic rock. Similarly, when a person does darshan of God’s form with *shraddha*, be it the form of a king or the form of a sadhu, his *indriyas* are drawn towards God. Then one attains *samadhi*.”

GIVING LIFE TO THE DEAD

Four Brahmin brothers lived together. Their guru taught them the secret knowledge of Sanjeevani – giving life to the dead. Within two years they had mastered the art and could virtually breathe life into anything they saw!

It was then time for them to return home. During their journey back they found some bones under a tamarind tree. The youngest brother questioned, “Whose bones are these?” The second brother answered, “They look like lion bones.”



“Oh let us try out our Sanjeevani knowledge that guruji has taught us,” the youngest said. Not waiting for approval, he mumbled a mantra and sprinkled some water on the bones.

The bones lying here and there rearranged themselves into a skeleton of a lion. The eldest intervened, “These belong to a lion, so avoid the temptation and let us be gone.”

The third brother warned, “It’s not worth the danger.”

Unfortunately, the youngest could not resist the temptation. He chanted a second spell and the bones were covered with flesh and skin. But the lion was still dead. Seeing this the other brothers climbed the tree and pleaded, “Brother, please leave it at this. The lion will kill us all.”

Yet the third mantra was said and the lion roared alive. And before its revival, the youngest brother, could congratulate himself for his amazing feat, the lion sprang and killed him and dragged him into the forest.

This is just a story, but its message is that the other three brothers were also proficient in the knowledge of giving life, but they were wise enough not to use it over a lion. The youngest was foolish

and used his knowledge indiscriminately and invited his own death. If he had revived a dead man, at least the man would have been grateful for his entire life and served him well. Therefore, we must always be careful how and where we use our knowledge. Whatever we learn from our guru should always be used for good purposes.

CHINESE PILGRIMS TO INDIA



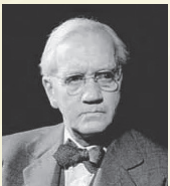
Hsüan-tsang

Two of the most important accounts about ancient India are by two Chinese Buddhist pilgrims. Fa-xian (337–c.422 CE), also known as Fa-hsien or Fa-hien, came to India around 400 CE and Xuanzang (602–664 CE), also known as Hsüan-tsang, came to North India in 629 CE. At the time of his visit, Fa-xian was impressed by the peace, prosperity and noble culture of the Hindus. At that time China was torn by internal wars. Fa-xian saw that the leaders in India fostered commerce, culture and religion rather than destroying large numbers of their population. He wrote that one could travel in India without fear of crime, and that the country was safe, stable and religious.

Xuanzang studied Sanskrit, logic, grammar and Buddhist philosophy at the Nalanda University in Magadha (Bihar), where about 3,000 Buddhist monks and 150 professors resided. Students from all parts of the world came there to study. The academic curriculum also included the Vedas, Vedic mathematics, astronomy, astrology, medical science and literature.

Hsüan-tsang wrote, “Though Indians are of a light temperament, they are distinguished by the straightforwardness and honesty of their character. With regard to riches, they never take anything unjustly; with regard to justice, they make even excessive concessions. Straightforwardness is the distinguishing feature of their administration” (*Müller, F. Max. India, What Can It Teach Us?*).

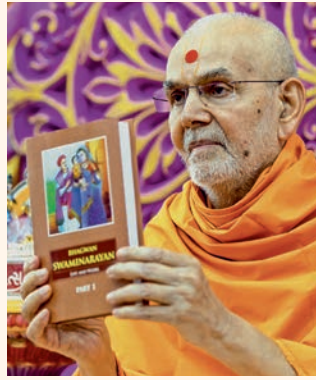


APRIL: KANAD (SURAT)

Every year, thousands of devotees in Ahmedabad pilgrimage for darshan and to offer prayers at the historic Ambli Vali Pol (also Yagnapurush Pol).

To celebrate this occasion, a variety of mangoes were arranged as an offering before Thakorji in the main mandir and in Swamishri's morning puja. The unique darshan enthused thousands of devotees during the puja darshan. The mangoes were later distributed as *prasad* to the devotees.

The evening celebration assembly was themed on 'Pramukh Varni Panchamrut'. After *dhun* and bhajans by the youths, Viveksagar Swami discoursed on the history and importance of Pramukh Varni Din. After Swamishri's arrival, former students of BAPS *chhatralayas* performed a drama written by Adarshjivan Swami. Incidents about Pramukh Swami Maharaj's virtues of

service, sacrifice, love, divine personality and pledge were presented through speeches, videos and dialogues. Then, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami narrated incidents of Shastriji Maharaj's love for Pramukh Swami Maharaj. In conclusion, Swamishri praised the virtues of Pramukh Swami Maharaj, "Swami Bapa followed the pledge he took on Pramukh Varni Din till his last breath. Oh, how much efforts he made! He visited and sanctified countless homes and pleased the devotees. He endeavoured in all the domains of the Satsang fellowship. He has left nothing for me to do. He nurtured swamis and devotees who obey [my word] instantly. Thus, Swamishri has made everything conducive for me."

In conclusion, Mahant Swami Maharaj, the present form of Pramukh Swami Maharaj, was honoured with decorative garlands and a shawl by senior sadhus. The entire congregation experienced divine joy and spiritual elevation.

■ SUNDAY SATSANG ASSEMBLY

5 June 2022

Today's evening assembly theme was '*Ek Same Ahmedabad ma*' – 'One Time in Ahmedabad'. After the customary *dhun* and prayer, Atmaswarup Swami gave a discourse on Bhagwan Swaminarayan's and the guru *parampara*'s contributions to the satsang in Ahmedabad. After Swamishri's arrival, an interesting drama



about the divine *labh* Pramukh Swami Maharaj gave to Ahmedabad was presented by youths and senior devotees. The drama outlined how Pramukh Swami Maharaj celebrated festivals in Ahmedabad and how he gave the benefit of his spiritual happiness to children, youths and the elderly devotees. Bhagatji Maharaj SMRUTI MANDIR

25–27 May 2022, Mahuva

Brahmaswarup Bhagatji Maharaj (Pragji Bhakta) (1829–1897) was born in Mahuva on 20 March 1829. Mahuva is popularly known as the Kashmir of Saurashtra. Pragji Bhakta unflaggingly served Gunatitanand Swami in Junagadh and through the latter's blessings he attained the God-realized state. All his life he spoke about the glory of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Gunatitanand Swami as Aksharbrahma. He gave up his mortal existence and reverted to Akshardham at 68 years of age, on 7 November 1897. Thereafter, his satsang legacy was continued by Shastriji Maharaj.

When Bhagatji Maharaj passed away Kothari Jetha Bhagat (later Nirgundas Swami) and Kothari Prabhudas were present. Bhagatji Maharaj's last rites were performed in a farm owned by his devoted friend, Fulchandbhai Khimji Sheth. Prior to that Fulchandbhai had expressed his wish, "Bhagatji Maharaj's cremation rites should be performed at such a place that it would be preserved in future." And his wish came true. Ever since, thousands of devotees have paid their respects at the small shrine by the River Malan in Mahuva.

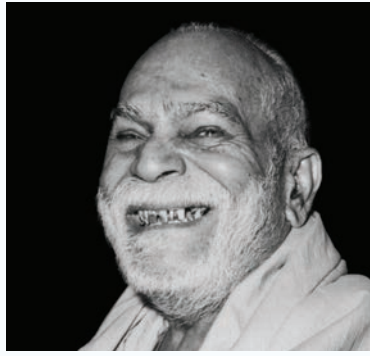
In 1920, when Shastriji Maharaj came to Mahuva for darshan of the cremation spot he asked the owner of a neighbouring garden, "In future, a big shrine will be built here. Will you give some land for it?" The owner said yes and thus earned Shastriji Maharaj's blessings.

In 1951, after Shastriji Maharaj returned to Akshardham, Yogiji Maharaj had come for darshan at the cremation spot in Mahuva. He offered prostrations, chanted the Swaminarayan *dhun* and wished to make a beautiful shrine with a pair of marble *charanarvind* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan installed on it.

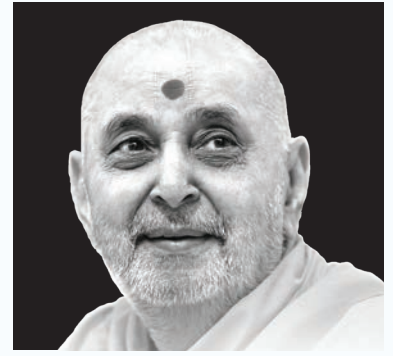
In 1956, Yogiji Maharaj stayed in

Mahuva for three days and gave the benefit of his spiritual association. In one of his discourses, Yogiji Maharaj prophesied, “In future, Mahuva will become a great place of pilgrimage. A big festival will be held and a pair of *charanavind* will be installed.” Thereafter, through Yogiji Maharaj’s inspiration, an official request was made to acquire the land surrounding the cremation spot. But it was rejected. Then, Bhagwanjibhai (the son of Narayanbhai – a nephew of Bhagatji Maharaj), Nagardas Vakil, Mohanbhai Mehta, Popatlal Dani and other devotees of Mahuva made untiring efforts to acquire the adjoining land, but without any success. Another request was made to the collector in Bhavnagar. At that time, Shri Jobanputra, who had deep respect for Yogiji Maharaj, was the collector of Bhavnagar. He thus assisted in acquiring the land.

In 1953 (on Bhadarva *sud* 15), with Yogiji Maharaj’s blessings the foundation-stone laying ceremony for a small shrine was performed by *bhaktaraj* Ishwarbhai Prabhudas. Then, four years later, on 3 June 1957, Yogiji Maharaj performed the ritual installation of a replica of Bhagwan Swaminarayan’s *charanarvind* on the shrine. Thereafter, a memorable *pratishtha* assembly was held in which a letter written 40 years previously by Shastriji Maharaj to Mansukhbhai Mistry was read. Shastriji Maharaj had written asking Mansukhbhai for Rs. 3,000 to build a memorial shrine. Subsequently, due to Shastriji Maharaj’s wish a small shrine was built on the cremation spot and

Bhagatji Maharaj’s glory was greatly heightened. In Mahuva village, the local people popularly addressed Bhagatji Maharaj as Praga Prabhu.

On 9 April 1962, Yogiji Maharaj performed the *murti-pratishtha* ritual of a small mandir on the cremation spot of Bhagatji Maharaj and said, “This place of Bhagatji Maharaj is like Akshardham.” Since 1971, after Yogiji Maharaj gave up his mortal existence, Pramukh Swami Maharaj had visited Mahuva thirty-two times and increased its glory manifold times. From 10 to 13 March 1979, Pramukh Swami Maharaj stayed in Mahuva for three days and festively celebrated the 150th birth anniversary of Bhagatji Maharaj. Pramukh Swami Maharaj made great efforts in developing the birthplace of Bhagatji Maharaj, which climaxed with the construction of a *shikharbaddha* mandir on the outskirts of Mahuva. Pramukh Swami Maharaj performed the *murti-pratishtha* of the *murtis* for the mandir in 2014 and created history.

To fulfil the wishes of gurus Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj, Pramukh Swami Maharaj decided to construct an ornate memorial (*smruti*) mandir on the cremation spot of Bhagatji Maharaj. To make this project possible more land was required. However, the acquisition of land was a difficult and challenging task. Despite all odds, by Pramukh Swami Maharaj’s blessings, the required land was acquired. A little more land was required behind the proposed Smruti Mandir, which belonged to Shri Haribhai Keshavbhai Senta. He sold the required land to BAPS. Thereafter, the

Smruti Mandir construction work commenced. When Haribhai attended the three-day *pratishtha* event of the Smruti Mandir he heard about the sacrifice of the devotees and also did darshan of the sadhus. He was thus overwhelmed and declared, “Though I have taken a price for my land I now wish to donate it to the BAPS.” Then, Shri Haribhai, his sons Tilak and Hiren, donated a cheque to the BAPS of the same amount he had taken on selling the land.

The efforts for acquiring five acres of land for the Smruti Mandir were made by Kothari Adhyatmaswarup Swami (Gadhada), Bhaktitanay Swami (Mahuva), Bipinbhai Sanghvi and other devotees. Thereafter, in 2013, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami drew a rough sketch plan of the Smruti Mandir. Architects prepared a proper plan of the mandir in accordance with his guidelines. In 2015, Pramukh Swami Maharaj performed the *pujan* rituals of the foundation *shilas*. In the same year, Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami performed the *shilanyas* rituals of the Smruti Mandir. The construction work with pinkstone from Bansipahdhpur in Rajasthan was started according to the mandir plans by Akshaymuni Swami, Nirmalmuni Swami and Sanjay Parikh of the BAPS central planning and construction department. Chetanbhai Balkrishnabhai Trivedi also contributed his services as a *sthapati* (traditional architect). Kothari Vinamrayogi Swami and swamis of Mahuva mandir offered their services during the construction work.

On 10 October 2018, Mahant Swami Maharaj visited Mahuva and performed the *pujan* ritual of the *amalsaro* (round stone on the *shikhar*). In this way the mandir was constructed in the Nagaradi style through the concerted efforts of swamis, devotees and experts. The Smruti Mandir is 143 ft long, 101 ft wide and 46 ft high. It comprises 60 ornately carved pillars, 300 carved *murtis*, 35 ornate ceilings, 25 carved *jharukhas* (windows) and 54 *torans* (arches). The Smruti Mandir has a beautifully carved *mandovar* (outer wall) and

intricately carved *samrans*. The main dome has a grand, ornate *samran* surrounded by 15 beautiful *samrans*. The mandir has three different entrances that lead to the main sanctum. In the mandir *garbhagruh* (sanctum sanctorum), are installed the marble *murtis* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami and Brahmaswarup Bhagatji Maharaj.

Beneath the central dome lies a raised round marble platform (*oto*) on which are installed the *charanarvind* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and the *asthi* (sacred ashes) of Bhagatji Maharaj. The Smruti Mandir complex includes beautiful gardens and lawns, bookstore, Premvati snack shop, children’s playground, an exhibition on Bhagatji Maharaj’s life, welcome centre and a pujari’s residence.

The aesthetic Smruti Mandir has become possible through the wish and dream of Pramukh Swami Maharaj, the blessings of Mahant Swami Maharaj and the guidance of Ishwarcharan Swami.

The Smruti Mandir was consecrated with the blessings of Mahant Swami Maharaj. The highlights of the three-day *murti*-installation *mahotsav* are as follows.

SMRUTI MANDIR MAHOTSAV

25–27 May 2022, Mahuva

■ INTRODUCTION

Bhagwan Swaminarayan had consecrated Mahuva during his visit as Nilkanth Varni. The town was further sanctified with the birth of Brahmaswarup Bhagatji Maharaj, the second spiritual successor of Bhagwan Swaminarayan in the BAPS guru tradition.

With Pramukh Swami Maharaj’s wish the memorial mandir of Bhagatji Maharaj was constructed with the blessings of Mahant Swami Maharaj. On 8 April 2022, Mahant Swami Maharaj performed the *murti-pratishtha* rituals of the marble *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj and Bhagatji Maharaj in Kanad, Surat. The devotees of Mahuva, Rajula and Una regions attended the occasion and were blessed by Mahant

Swami Maharaj. The *murtis* were thereafter daily worshipped and offered *thal* for one month at the *shikharbaddha* BAPS Mandir in Mahuva.

On 27 May 2022, the *murtis* were ritually installed in the Smruti Mandir by Dr Swami, Tyagvallabh Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami. As part of the *pratishtha*, a three-day festive programme was held from 25 to 27 May. The volunteer devotees of Mahuva had personally delivered 8,000 invitations to well-wishers and devotees.

On 24 May, the Mahuva municipality paid tributes to Bhagatji Maharaj by naming a town square in Mahuva as 'Bhagatji Maharaj Chowk'. The foundation for a gate, Akshar Dwar, on Pramukh Swami Marg was performed in the presence of the chairman and vice-chairman of the town municipality. On 25 May, Tyagvallabh

Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami performed the *mahapuja* rituals at the newly renovated birthplace of Bhagatji Maharaj.

■ WOMEN'S CONVENTION: 25 MAY

The afternoon women's convention was themed on 'Single Goal of Spiritual Sacrifice', in which *balikas*, *yuvatis* and *mahilas* presented a cultural programme. The convention was graced by local women dignitaries. In memory of Bhagatji Maharaj, *prasad* of *churmu* was given to all the attendees. Over 1,100 women devotees and well-wishers attended the convention.

■ GRAND RELIGIOUS ASSEMBLY: 25 MAY

On the evening of 25 May, a grand assembly of Hindu religious leaders and a felicitation programme of all who had assisted in creating

the Smruti Mandir was held. The religious leaders and socially prominent persons who graced the special assembly were Pujya Vijay Bapu (Mahant of Satadhar seat), Pujya Amardas Bapu (Mahant of Kankach seat), Pujya Rajendradas Bapu (Mahant of Ram Paas Raho place), Pujya Govind Swami (Swaminarayan Gurukul, Mahuva), Shri Bipinbhai Sanghvi (Chairman of Nagrik Bank), Shri Narayanbhai Kachhadiya (MP, Amreli), Shri Rameshbhai Makwana (MLA, Mahuva), Shri Ghanshyambhai Patel (Chairperson of APMC) and Shri Kanubhai Kalsariya (Director of Sadbhavana Hospital). The women dignitaries present were Bhavnaben Makwana (former MLA), Pushpaben Thakar (Chairperson of Mahila Cooperative Bank) and Gitaben (Chairman of the town municipality).

On this occasion, Dr Swami, Tyagvallabh Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami addressed the special assembly. Kothari Adhyatmaswarup Swami (Gadhada) honoured the stage guests and briefly narrated the story of how the Smruti Mandir was constructed and appreciated all those who had helped and offered their services. Then, Govind Swami of the Swaminarayan Gurukul shared his memorable experiences with Pramukh Swami Maharaj. Mahant Vijay Bapu of the Satadhar seat said, “Bhagatji Maharaj offered pure bhakti (to his guru). Shastriji Maharaj accepted Bhagatji Maharaj as his guru because there was something special about him.”

Children and youths performed a traditional dance to honour the Smruti Mandir. Ishwarcharan Swami spoke about Bhagatji Maharaj and added, “In 1954 or 1955, Yogiji Maharaj came to Mahuva. Shri Haribhai, a leading businessman of Mahuva, often came for Yogiji Maharaj’s darshan. Haribhai was between 85 and 90 years old and he narrated to Yogiji Maharaj that he had seen Pragji Bhakta when he was about ten years old. He remembered that the people of Mahuva called him Praga Prabhu because of his bhakti and *seva*. Everyone had love and respect for Bhagatji Maharaj.

“In the old mandir, Bhagatji Maharaj sat against a pillar and gave discourses. Yogiji

Maharaj installed a pair of *charanarvind* on the spot where Bhagatji Maharaj was cremated. Many have experienced *samadhi* here and seen Bhagwan Swaminarayan, Gunatitanand Swami and Bhagatji Maharaj.”

Dr Swami praised Bhagatji Maharaj’s life, “Countless devotees in India and abroad celebrate the birthday of Bhagatji Maharaj. So, what was special about him? He had profound faith in Bhagwan Swaminarayan and that Gunatitanand Swami was Aksharbrahma. To spread their glory he remained fearless and unrelenting. He served all and never spoke ill of anyone. Therefore, we must take such inspiration from his life.”

Over 6,000 devotees and well-wishers were present.

■ YAGNA FOR WORLD PEACE: 26 MAY

On the second day of the three-day festival, Tyagvallabh Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami commenced the *pratishtha yagna* and rituals for world peace at 5.30 a.m. After the chanting of Vedic mantras, Tyagvallabh Swami blessed the participants (*yajmans*), “We are all very honoured to participate in this *yagna*. We pray to Bhagatji Maharaj that we be blessed with the virtues of dharma, *jnan*, *vairagya* and bhakti in our lives. May all be happy in body, mind and wealth and that there be happiness and peace everywhere.”

The *yagnashala* was set up on the Smruti Mandir grounds. In all, 95 decorated *yagna kunds* were created and hundreds of devotees participated in the *yagna* rituals. Thereafter, an illustrated book published by Swaminarayan Aksharpith on the life of Bhagatji Maharaj in Gujarati and English was inaugurated and gifted to all the *yagna yajmans*.

■ NAGAR YATRA (PROCESSION): 26 MAY

The grand and colourful *nagar yatra* was flagged off at 4.30 p.m. It included:

- Bike riders
- Dance troupes

- Devotees in large numbers
- Tribal (Dangi) dancers
- Horsemen
- Youths performing with belts
- Four horse-drawn carriages.

● Three chariots: Manki Rath with the *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj, Sinh Rath with the *murtis* of Bhagatji Maharaj and Mayur Rath with the *murtis* of Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj.

In addition, there were six chariots for swamis, decorated oxen carts, bhajan groups, anti-addiction exhibition and litter-free campaign floats. In the final part of the procession, women were carrying *kalashes* and *pothis* on their heads.

The one-kilometre long *nagar yatra* commenced from Parekh School and terminated at the Smruti Mandir. About 5,000 devotees and well-wishers took part in the procession. Many dignitaries

welcomed the procession along its route.

■ SMRUTI-MANDIR PRATISHTHA: 27 MAY

The Smruti Mandir is nestled among coconut trees near the River Malan in Mahuva. Today, was the auspicious *murti*-installation day, which also coincided with the birthday celebration of Yogiji Maharaj according to the Indian calendar – Vaishakh *vad* 12.

The installation ceremony was carried out on behalf of Mahant Swami Maharaj by Dr Swami, Tyagvallabh Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami. Shrutiprakash Swami recited shlokas for the Vedic *mahapuja* rituals for the installation of the marble *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj and Shri Bhagatji Maharaj in a golden *sinhasan*. Thereafter, a pair of marble *charanarvind* and Bhagatji Maharaj's *asthi* in a pot were installed on the shrine (*oto*) located under the mandir dome.

At 9.30 a.m., after the *murti*-installation rituals were over, an assembly was held in a marquee adjacent to the Smruti Mandir. The assembly programme was as follows:

- *Dhun* and prayer by swamis.
- Video presentation about the divine experiences of and fulfillment of prayers by devotees related to the holy shrine.
- Discourses by Atmaswarup Swami and Bhaktitanand Swami (who lives in Mahuva mandir).
- MLA Shri R.C. Makwana spoke about the glory of Bhagatji Maharaj and the difficulties he tolerated. He also expressed that as citizens of Mahuva they were all fortunate to have been born on the holy land where Bhagatji Maharaj was born.
- Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami said in his address, “Bhagatji Maharaj is always present here and is giving darshan to all. The cremation spot is divine and miraculous. Yogiji Maharaj had blessed

that whoever performs *dandvats* and says *malas*, prays and makes wishes at this place then Bhagatji Maharaj would fulfil them.”

- Children and youths performed a devotional dance as a tribute to Bhagatji Maharaj.
- Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami spoke about how Bhagatji Maharaj served to please Gunatitanand Swami. He said, “Bhagatji Maharaj daily performed 23 hours *seva* and listened to *katha*. He propagated that Gunatitanand Swami is Mul Akshar and Sahajanand Swami is the supreme Bhagwan. Shastriji Maharaj, though a great scholar and very bold, realized the glory of Bhagatji Maharaj and accepted him as his guru. Today, Bhagatji Maharaj is present through Mahant Swami Maharaj.”
- Video blessings of Mahant Swami Maharaj were shown. He said, “Jai Swaminarayan to all. Today is Bhagatji Maharaj’s Smruti Mandir *pratishtha* festival. Bhagatji Maharaj truly pleased

Gunatitanand Swami. Bhagatji Maharaj was the embodiment of Aksharbrahma, yet he became like us and lived on earth. All his actions seemed to be like ours, but he was a God-realized Sant and left lots of inspirations for us. With great courage he propagated the glory of Aksharbrahma to all. He was severely insulted, excommunicated from Satsang, given poison, yet he did not fall back in propagating Gunatitanand Swami as Aksharbrahma.

“Shastriji Maharaj truly realized Bhagatji Maharaj. Due to his wish this Smruti Mandir has been made and it is a divine miraculous place. I wished to come for the *pratishtha* but due to the present circumstances I could not attend. Therefore, all of you be happy and pleased. I pray to Maharaj, Swami, Bhagatji Maharaj that all swamis and devotees attain the spiritual state of Bhagatji Maharaj. May all of you who have offered *seva* for the Smruti Mandir attain *moksha*. I pray that any devotee who makes a good wish with faith is fulfilled.”

- In conclusion, Dr Swami addressed the assembly, “Though Bhagatji Maharaj was of an ordinary background, his glory has spread throughout the world. In spite of the challenges he faced he respected and served everyone. May we be able to please Mahant Swami Maharaj in the way that Bhagatji Maharaj pleased Gunatitanand Swami.”

- Finally, the swamis and devotees who had offered their services for the Smruti Mandir and the festival were honoured by the *sadguru* swamis. In conclusion, Kothari Vinamramuni Swami gave the vote of thanks.

■ SEVA AND BHAKTI

To celebrate the Smruti Mandir *pratishtha* festival many male and female devotees of Mahuva had performed austerities, and reading (*paath*) of Satsang Diksha, Sahajanand Namavali and Pramukh Swami Maharaj’s biography.

As part of the three-day festival, members of the BAPS *bal mandal* carried out an anti-addiction campaign for thirteen days (11–23 May) in various parts of Mahuva and inspired many to give up addictions.

A three-day medical camp was carried out during the *pratishtha* festival with the help of Hanumant Hospital and the urban health centre in Mahuva. More than 355 people benefited from the camp. A blood donation camp was also organized by the Sanstha during the three days.

About 750 volunteers from Mahuva, Una, Rajula, Bhavnagar and Dhari offered their services during the festival under the guidance of Kothari Vinamramuni Swami and other swamis. ♦



PARIVARIK SHANTI ABHIYAN

Pramukh Swami Maharaj's motto was 'In the joy of others, lies our own.' For him the world was his family – 'Vasudhaiva kutumbakam' – and during his 95 years on earth, he relentlessly endeavoured to promote family harmony throughout the world.

Thus, as part of his centenary celebrations, a 'Parivarik Shanti Abhiyan' (Family Harmony Campaign) was organized.

Men and women devotees at BAPS centres throughout India volunteered to participate in this project. These *shatabdi sevaks* were issued ID badges, provided relevant printed literature, including posters with Pramukh Swami Maharaj's inspiring messages for family harmony, and videos to use during their visits to people's homes.

To log their visits, they were provided a mobile

app – Pramukh Setu. Another mobile app – Prerna Setu – was made which they requested members of the families they visited to download and use for daily inspiration.

Before the nationwide Launch, a pilot project was carried out in centres of four cities and five villages from 10 to 17 November 2019, in which 150 *shatabdi sevaks* visited well-wisher families at their homes. After a successful test run, 18,000 *karyakars* were given project details during the Annual Karyakar Shibirs in December 2019.

The project was to last for four months, and each *shatabdi sevak* team would visit 300 families. In the cities, each team would comprise two *sevaks* and in the villages, each team would comprise four *sevaks*. Since everyone would be visiting families they had never met, training was essential.

Over 72,800 men and women devotees had volunteered to serve as *shatabdi sevaks*. So, first a guide booklet was prepared. Then 290 trainers, including sadhus, and men and women volunteers, were trained. During January 2020, these trainers conducted 304 training sessions to give detailed guidance to all the *shatabdi sevaks*.

With the training sessions completed the Parivarik Shanti Abhiyan launch assembly was held on 18 February 2020 in the presence of *guruhari* Mahant Swami Maharaj in Atladara. Swamishri's inspiring words further enthused all the *shatabdi sevaks*.

On the first day of the campaign – 1 March 2020 – Swamishri was in Anand, where he lit the inaugural *divo* for the project. Thousands of *shatabdi sevaks* in the villages, towns and cities began visiting homes and speaking to families about ways to enhance their family unity and harmony.

The *shatabdi sevaks* encouraged the families they visited to undertake one or more of the

following options to strengthen their family harmony: (1) Conduct a regular family assembly (*ghar sabha*), (2) Dine together once every day (*samuh bhojan*), and (3) Daily perform *arti* and prayers together.

At the end of each visit, the *shatabdi sevaks* chanted the Swaminarayan *dhun* for the continued peace, prosperity and happiness of the family.

The campaign proceeded as planned for 12 days, then the COVID-19 pandemic struck, and along with the worldwide lockdowns, this project was also discontinued.

Around 21 months later, on 31 December 2021, the project was re-started. But again, the surge in COVID-19 cases due to the omicron variant necessitated a temporary halt from 6 January 2022.

Then, on 31 January 2022, the campaign was again commenced, and continued for around 10 weeks.

The groups of *shatabdi sevaks* contacted around

200 families, who wholeheartedly welcomed them into their homes, listened to their messages and also pledged to practise one or more of the observances.

10 July to 4 November 2022



As instructed by Bhagwan Swaminarayan in the Shikshapatri and by the wish of *guruhari* Param Puja Mahant Swami Maharaj, devotees should undertake extra spiritual observances during the four holy months of Chaturmas. This year, Chaturmas is from 10 July 2022 (Ashadh *sud* 11) to 4 November 2022 (Kartak *sud* 11). To please Bhagwan Swaminarayan, Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj, the following extra observances should be undertaken:

Reading

The following books should be read throughout the year:

1. Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj Jivan Charitra, Parts 5 & 6 in Gujarati (or listen to their audio on the Akshar Amrutam app)
2. Mahant Swami Maharaj: An Epitome of Saintliness
3. Bhagwan Swaminarayan's Bhaktaratno, Parts 3 & 4 in Gujarati (or listen to their audio on the Akshar Amrutam app)
4. Daily read the Vachanamrut & Swamini Vato

Austerities

- In view of the prevailing pandemic, observe austerities that will help to sustain good immunity. Or observe *ektana* during the month of Shravan.

Listening

- Daily listen to 7–10 minutes of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's inspiring incidents and blessings.

Darshan

- Video darshan of Pramukh Swami Maharaj, 7–10 minutes daily to commemorate his Centenary Celebrations (1921–2021).

Devotion

- Daily turn an extra five or more *malas*. Perform extra *dandvats*, *pradakshinas*, etc. as per one's capacity.
- Inspire one friend to join *satsang*, such that they daily apply *tilak-chandlo* and perform daily puja.
- Contemplate for five minutes every day on the *mahima* of Swamishri – his virtues, work and divine form.

Homage to Guru

- Every week, narrate in person or via letter, email or social media, one incident highlighting the virtues of Swamishri to as many relatives and friends as possible.

Family

- Conduct *ghar sabha*: In commemoration of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's Centenary, gather your family to read about, listen to, have darshan of and contemplate on our guru.
- For one year invite the same one family to your *ghar sabha* once a month.
- Inspire one family to start conducting their own *ghar sabha*.

Note: During Chaturmas, devotees should not eat brinjals, white and red radish, sugarcane or *mogri*.

Under the Royal Patronage of His Majesty King Hamad Bin Isa Al Khalifa of The Kingdom of Bahrain, The King Hamad Global Centre for Peaceful Coexistence won global accolades for organizing this first-ever conference between the European Union and Bahrain, which will serve as a key driver for religious harmony across Europe and the Gulf region.

On behalf of BAPS, Brahnaviharidas Swami addressed the dignitaries and delegates at the conference on the ideas of religion, humanity

and harmony. He spoke of celebrating not just the similarities, but also the dissimilarities between different faiths and religions. Before his speech, delegates were focused on intellectual commonalities and now the focus has shifted to an inspirational human element, and heart to heart connectivity."

Both the Chairman and the Secretary-General of King Hamad Global Centre for Peaceful Coexistence personally guided Brahnaviharidas

Swami and the BAPS delegation, which included Dr Praful Vaidya, Ramesh Patidar and community leaders, through the ‘This is Bahrain’ exhibition that displayed the values of harmony and peaceful coexistence in Bahrain.

On behalf of BAPS, Brahmaviharidas Swami

thanked the Chairman and the organizers for holding this path-breaking conference and appreciated the generosity, inclusivity and hospitality extended by the officials and the royal leadership of Bahrain. ♦

First Historic Interfaith Conference

11 May 2022, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia



During the year of the Centenary Celebrations of HH Pramukh Swami Maharaj and in memory of his historic address at the UN Millennium Peace Summit (in August 2000), BAPS took part in the Forum on Common Values Among Religious Followers. The Forum was organized by the Muslim World League, an Islamic NGO based in Makkah that aims, amongst other things, to extend bridges of dialogue and cooperation with all. The Muslim World League invited Brahmaviharidas Swami to represent the Hindu faith as a part of its historic inclusion of Jewish and non-Abrahamic faith leaders.

A select 90 delegates from 35 countries which included spiritual leaders of eminence attended

the inaugural forum. Brahmaviharidas Swami was joined by Swami Avdheshanand Giriji Maharaj as the two speakers representing Hinduism. Other delegates included United States Ambassadors-at-large for Religious Freedoms, leaders of the Roman Catholic, Coptic and Eastern Orthodox churches, Chief Rabbis from Europe and North America, Buddhist leaders from South Asia and Islamic leaders from across the globe including the Grand Mufti of Egypt.

The event was chaired by the Secretary-General of the Muslim World League, His Excellency Sheikh Dr Mohammed Bin Abdulkarim Al-Issa. Dr Al-Issa proclaimed, “We are pleased to launch the Forum on Common Values Among Religious Followers in Riyadh. We hope the conference will

result in dialogue and practical initiatives that will bring followers of all faiths together on our shared values.”

Four main sections were held throughout the day – the opening section followed by three topic-oriented panels. Brahnaviharidas Swami addressed the first panel titled ‘Human Dignity – Divine Equality between Creations and the Depth of Human Commonalities’.

After reciting Vedic prayers for peace and harmony, Brahnaviharidas Swami remarked that this conference is more than path-breaking; it is path-making! It will guide the conscience of humanity. The Hindu faith has promoted equality and harmony amongst all forms of life, which is echoed by all enlightened religions and philosophies. In order to turn the word ‘harmony’ from a beautiful noun into an active verb, he remembered HH Pramukh Swami Maharaj’s words from the UN Millenium Summit in which Swamshri had asked leaders to have three dialogues to generate more harmony – dialogue with leaders, dialogue with followers, and dialogue with oneself. Integrity in personal belief and action, the faith’s beliefs and actions, and interfaith words and actions can “create here a little bit of the heaven we promise in the hereafter.” He remembered how *guruhari* Mahant Swami Maharaj often reminds us that to find the right answers, we must first ask the right questions. If we ask ourselves to whom creation belongs, we discover that creation is universal and therefore so is its Creator. Therefore, who are we to divide up a universal world.

Addressing the notion that human harmony is only a wishful dream, he stated, “Why is it wrong to dream? Going to the moon was once just a dream but it came true. Colonizing Mars



is a dream but it will come true. So then why should we not dream for a more harmonious world when we know that it will bring a smile to the lips of God who did not create this world to perish in disharmony but to flourish in

harmony.”

H.E. Sheikh Dr Mohammed Bin Abdulkarim Al-Issa was encouraged by the words and shared, “Fabulous speech. How open-minded it was, and highly emotional with academic precision. A truly inspirational presentation.”

Mr Bawa Jain, Secretary-General of The Council of World Religious Leaders and Founder-President of The Centre for Responsible Leadership, who had organized HH Pramukh Swami Maharaj’s visit to the UN in 2000, noted, “A great, thought-provoking speech. Delivered with immense grace and dignity. Such a clear expression of our shared values and in a way that honoured the historic nature and venue of this forum. This is the first time swamis of Hinduism have been invited to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and this was the right first step on a long and unified journey ahead.”

One of the moderators of the panels and the Secretary General of Religions for Peace International, Professor Azza Karam found the points of Brahnaviharidas Swami’s speech to be a key summary of the panel sessions highlighting the importance of not just celebrating similarities but also of celebrating dissimilarities because we have such strong similarities. Also, reiterating the importance of looking within our own faith and its beliefs, Professor Karam on a personal note inquired about the upcoming mandir in Abu Dhabi and offered support for such projects of harmony and tolerance.

Brahmeshanandji and others declared this a

proud moment for Hinduism and many leaders of other faiths from across the world expressed their interest in working with BAPS to further religious harmony around the world, while many others commended the steps taken in the UAE and Bahrain to further the fraternity amongst faiths.

In concluding the forum, the religious leaders agreed upon a Declaration on Common Human Values which announced a collective objective of enhancing cooperation and trust between the global community's spiritual leaders by leveraging the common principles that undergird all faith traditions to more effectively promote the values of moderation and harmony, and advance tolerance and peace.

The forum also allowed for constructive

personal dialogues between leaders. HE Sheikh Dr Mohammed Bin Abdulkarim Al-Issa and Brahmaviharidas Swami had a private meeting where there was a warm, friendly, transparent and truthful dialogue on how members of all faiths may work together for peaceful co-existence.

With special arrangement by the organizers, delegates were also taken to Al Diriyah – the original hometown of the first Saudi Kingdoms and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The event was graciously organized by the Muslim World League with directions from the leadership of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and was held at the Ritz Carlton in Riyadh, the country's capital. ♦

DE-ADDICTION CAMPAIGN BY BAPS BALAKS

8–22 May 2022



To commemorate Pramukh Swami Maharaj's Shatabdi Mahotsav and India's Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, *balaks* of the BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha conducted a large-scale De-Addiction Campaign between 8 and 22 May 2022. During his lifetime, Pramukh Swami Maharaj inspired over 40 lakh people worldwide to give up addictions. Following in his footsteps, these children sacrificed their summer vacation to spread the message of de-addiction and promote a healthier society.

Guruhari Mahant Swami Maharaj blessed these young campaigners with a spirit to 'March Forward' at the inauguration on 8 May 2022 in Surat. With such inspiration, the gallant young children went out to wage a war on the perilous addictions that plague and hinder society.

In total, 16,000 boys in groups of four (total: 4,200 groups) contacted people at their homes, shops, factories, bus stands and many public places during the 15-day campaign. They informed them about the health, financial, cultural and other benefits of freeing themselves from the shackles of gutka, cigarettes, tobacco, liquor and other inappropriate habits. Undeterred by hardships, summer heat, odd hours and other inconveniences, the boys enthusiastically reached out to and

personally met over 1.4 million people throughout Gujarat, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, New Delhi, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal and Karnataka. Of these, over 400,000 people pledged to shun their addictions and that they, too, would convince others to give up their addictions.

Among the benefits of conducting this campaign was that the boys gained confidence and developed communication and leadership skills. Furthermore, the campaign also consolidated their own resolve to never engage in any form of addictions.

ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION CAMPAIGN BY BAPS BALIKAS

8–22 May 2022



Pramukh Swami Maharaj actively advocated for the nurture of nature. During his lifetime, he inspired the planting and nurturing of more than 15 lakh trees worldwide, and encouraged numerous environmental preservation projects.

To commemorate Pramukh Swami Maharaj's Shatabdi Mahotsav and India's Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, young girls (*balikas*), aged between 8 and 14, of the BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha, conducted a large-scale 'Environment Conservation Campaign' from 8 to 22 May 2022. These young girls dedicated their summer vacation, forgoing their leisure time, to spread guru

Pramukh Swami Maharaj's messages of saving water and energy, and to promote environmental conservation. In a world plagued by global warming, deforestation and rapid urbanization, this campaign raised awareness among the public of the perils of not caring for the environment and the earth's resources.

With the blessings of *guruhari* Mahant Swami Maharaj, 14,000 girls, divided into 3,300 groups, conducted this drive nationally. They reached out to people at their homes to give three important messages:

- Stop leakages to prevent wasteful water loss. Optimize water usage during activities like washing clothes and utensils, bathing, and others, and use RO purified drinking water effectively.
- Turn off electrical appliances when not in use. Use LEDs and adopt solar usage where possible.
- Plant and nurture at least one sapling.

These gallant young girls spread eco-awareness among all strata of society, personally meeting and inspiring 1.3 million people nationally. As a result, 1.2 million people pledged to save water and energy, and 7.5 lakh people pledged to plant and nurture a sapling.

By participating in this campaign, the resolve of the young girls themselves to conserve such resources was consolidated, and their self-confidence, and public speaking and communication skills were boosted.

EYE CAMP

15 May 2022, Kolkata

About 470 patients benefitted from the Eye Camp organized at BAPS Swaminarayan Mandir, Kolkata, with the support of Lions North Calcutta Hospital & Medical Centre associated with Badabazar, Shree Dahmi Mata Prachar Samity.

After assessment by expert doctors, around 360 patients received free spectacles and 54 patients were offered free cataract operations.



Special transport arrangements were made for the patients who went for surgery.

DE-ADDICTION RALLIES BY BAPS CHILDREN ON WORLD NO-TOBACCO DAY 31 May 2022



His Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj often warned, "Addictions cause destruction." Thus, as part of his centennial year celebrations, 50,000 BAPS children, participated in the De-Addiction Rallies organized at 100 BAPS centres in Gujarat, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Telangana, Karnataka, West Bengal and others centres across India on World No-Tobacco Day on 31 May 2022.

These rallies included inspiring exhibits, creative floats, stirring rhymes and emotive jingles, encouraging people to quit harmful addictions. During these rallies, the children appealed to all to support social uplift through de-addiction and a healthy lifestyle.

MANAV UTKARSH MAHOTSAV

1-5 June 2022, Rajkot

As part of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's centenary celebrations, the BAPS Swaminarayan



Mandir in Rajkot organized a five-day 'Manav Utkarsh Mahotsav' to inspire people towards an addiction-free, values-based life, and to promote family and social harmony.

The event was held at the vast Racecourse Grounds, and featured exhibitions highlighting the above messages, and the life and work of Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

The highlight of each evening assembly was a series of inspiring and enlightening speeches by Apurvamuni Swami based on the teachings of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and his succession of Gunatit gurus that gave insights and guidance on the event's main messages.

In addition, during the five-day event, blood and organ donation camps were organized in which over 475,000 cc of blood was collected and 1,200 pledged to donate organs.

Inspired by the event's messages, over 100 experienced doctors pledged to treat 20,000 patients and perform 2,500 operations free.

Over the five days, around 35,000 people attended the event.

LAUNCH OF PRAMUKH SANSKRITAM COURSE

2–9 June 2022, Sarangpur

Under the auspices of the Pramukh Swami Maharaj Shatabdi Mahotsav, an online study course, 'Pramukh Sanskritam,' has been launched for *balaks* and *balikas* who have memorized all 315 *shloks* of the Satsang Diksha as well as the 565 Swaminarayan Siddhant Karikas from the Swaminarayan Siddhant Sudha.



Understanding aids long-term retention of what has been memorized. As the understanding of such *shloks* requires a detailed knowledge of Sanskrit, as well as the Akshar-Purushottam Darshan and the Sampradaya's beliefs and traditions, the course is designed to deliver in-depth knowledge of Satsang, Darshanam (Philosophy), Bhasha Kaushalam (Sanskrit speaking, reading and writing) and Kanthapath (Memorization techniques).

A total of 69 *balaks* and 47 *balikas*, aged between 8 and 14, enrolled for this online study course, which will involve one hour of daily study. Of these, 84 are from different states of India and 32 are from Australia.

The launch of this course was held in-person at BAPS Swaminarayan Mandir, Sarangpur in the presence of Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami and Pujya Viveksagar Swami. Those unable to attend joined online. During this eight-day gathering, the children gained an overview of the Pramukh Sanskritam course through classes, breakout sessions, recitation, revision and various other activities.

The children were guided by *sadguru* and learned swamis, as well as by professors, lecturers and students of the Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya.

Every day, the children participated in *samuh puja*. In addition to four hours of daily study classes and discussions with swamis, the children recited *shloks* of the Satsang Diksha and Swaminarayan Siddhant Karikas before the *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj (in the main mandir), Brahmaswarup Shastriji Maharaj (at the Yagnapurush Smruti Mandir and in the Rang

Mandapam) and Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj (at Pramukh Smruti Mandir).

The children also received the blessings of *guruhari* Mahant Swami Maharaj via a live video link from Ahmedabad. Swamishri formally launched the Pramukh Sanskritam course by lighting the inaugural *divo*. *Balaks* presented what they had learnt and asked for blessings. Swamishri conversed with the *balaks* in Sanskrit and gave blessings.

A special session was also arranged for parents in which Pujya Viveksagar Swami and Adarshjivan swami provided guidance on how to support their children during this course.

GOVERNOR OF GUJARAT AT CONVENTION ON NATURAL FARMING

15 June 2022, Sarangpur



On the occasion of the Diamond Jubilee of India's Independence, the Birth Centenary of Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj and an invocation by Hon. The *mahayagnas* at London Mandir were held from 2–5 and 11–12 June. *Mahayagnas* were also conducted at the BAPS mandirs in Birmingham (18–19 June), Leicester (25–26 June) and Manchester (2–3 July).

During these *yagnas*, thousands of participants collectively prayed for peace, protection and global harmony, greater family unity – all values that Pramukh Swami Maharaj embodied and fostered throughout his life.

SOUTH AMERICA

SATSANG VICHARAN IN SÃO PAULO AND BRASILIA

12–17 April 2022, Brazil



BAPS swamis undertook a Satsang *vicharan* tour in Brazil.

On 13 April, the Indian Embassy in Brasilia hosted an event to celebrate India's 75 years of independence in the presence of Ambassador of India Shri Suresh Reddy, local Indian citizens, embassy staff members, and other local officials. First, Uttamshlok Swami recited the Vedic Shanti

Path followed by a speech on tolerance and harmony by Priyaseva Swami.

A family *shibir* was organized on 16 April at the Shiv Mandir between Campinas and Sao Paulo. The *shibir* theme focused on maintaining spirituality together as a family and community. It featured talks, group activities and question-answer sessions led by the swamis.

Delayed by one year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Expo 2020 Dubai was the first ever held



in the Middle East. Each of the 192 participating countries showcased their own unique architecture, culture and inspiring innovations in their specially constructed country pavilions. Over 24 million visitors from all over the world visited Expo 2020 during the six months from October 2021 to March 2022.

India's four-floor pavilion showcased Ayurveda, culture, architecture, yoga, its space programme, and its fast-growing economy.

The Indian Consulate in Dubai invited BAPS Hindu Mandir, Abu Dhabi, to partner and display the rich culture and diversity of India at the award-winning India Pavilion, which received more than 1.5 million visitors. In the pavilion, BAPS Hindu Mandir exhibited a creative real and virtual presentation that comprised of a majestic 3D model of the upcoming BAPS Hindu Mandir in Abu Dhabi. MAHAPEETH PUJAN

ANNUAL KARYAKAR SHIBIRS

11 March 2022 to 8 May 2022

A total of 976 male and 535 female *karyakars*



from 17 African countries, including Malawi, Zambia, Congo, South Africa, Botswana, Kenya, Ethiopia, Tanzania, Uganda, Rwanda and Burundi, participated in the Annual Karyakar Shibirs that took place between March and May 2022 in the inspiring presence of Pujya Viveksagar Swami.

Based on the theme ‘*Avsar*’ (Occasion or Opportunity), the *shibirs* were held in Lilongwe, Malawi (11–13 March) Lusaka, Zambia (18–20 March), Lenasia, South Africa (25–27 March), Nairobi, Kenya (15–17 April), Mwanza, Tanzania (22–24 April), and Kampala, Uganda (6–8 May).
