extravagant and fraudulent lifestyle...

WHAT SHALL WE DO WITH GOPI BHATT?

During the satsang assembly the leading devotees of Ahmedabad, Hirachand Choksi, Laldas Gora, Kubersinh Chopdar and others came to pay respects to Shri Hari and listen to his discourse. Shriji Maharaj enquired, "Why are you late today?" They replied, "Because we had gone to see Gopi Bhatt." Shri Hari remarked, "I have not seen Gopi Bhatt since the day I came here. Anand Swami had talked to me about him in Gadhpur." Then, Shri Hari called them closer and asked, "Tell me, what is the state of Gopi Bhatt?"

Hirachand Choksi explained, "Maharaj, Gopi Bhatt is arrogant, greedy and indulgent. He covets things donated for the deities and mandir. He offers thal to Thakorji without spreading ghee on the rotla and the dal curry is of low grade. In fact, he sells the donated food grains and flour and pockets the money." Shri Hari sighed and stated, "It is because of Thakorji that the mandir is sustained. It is sinful to use things meant for Thakorji. We cannot keep him as the pujari."

Hirachand further revealed, "Maharaj, there is more about his son's antics. Liladhar, his son, is also brazen. Every afternoon, he invites gamblers and gambles under the mandir dome." Shri Hari was intensely pained to hear this and told the devotees, "After consulting the senior paramhansas, we will have to terminate the

services of Gopi Bhatt with finesse. The three of you come to my residence tonight."

Once the satsang assembly was over, Shri Hari went to attend *arti* in the mandir. At that time, Gopi Bhatt was climbing up the mandir

stairs. The lavish jewellery and clothes he donned amply mirrored his materialistic tendency. He

wore a shining *pitambar*, gold bangles on his wrists and *chakhdis* (wooden footwear) to perform *arti* in the mandir.

Shri Hari observed his attire and flamboyant style of doing arti. It all smacked of stark ostentation. After the arti was over Shri Hari

told Gopi Bhatt, "Meet me tomorrow after the shangar arti." Gopi Bhatt took Maharaj's words as a compliment and thought Shri Hari wished to give him more responsibility. He thus parted with elation and satisfaction.

That night, Shri Hari called Muktanand Swami, Gopalanand Swami, Nityanand Swami and Shuk Muni to his residence. Shortly after, Hirachand Choksi, Laldas Gora and Kubersinh Chopdar arrived. Shri Hari told the devotees to narrate Gopi Bhatt's unbecoming behaviour. The paramhansas were pained by what they heard. Then, Shri Hari asked them, "Now what should we do?" Muktanand Swami replied, "Maharaj, we should relieve him from his duty. You have built this mandir and installed the murtis for the sake of fostering upasana in aspirants and for the moksha

of countless people. But, if the pujari is greedy and devoid of bhakti, how can the divinities reside in the *murtis*?" Everyone agreed with Muktanand Swami. Then, Shri Hari instructed, "I have called Gopi Bhatt to meet me tomorrow and I want all of you to be present. Also, bring Brahmanand Swami with you."

GOPI BHATT'S EXTRAVAGANT LIFESTYLE

The next morning, after the shanghar arti, Gopi Bhatt came to meet Shri Hari. The senior paramhansas and devotees were also present. On seeing Gopi Bhatt's extravagance, everyone guaged his materialistic inclinations. When Gopi Bhatt saw the leading swamis and devotees he felt his hunch for recognition by Shri Hari would come true. Shri Hari got a seat aranged for him to sit. Then, Maharaj asked him, "Bhattji, how are the mandir affairs running?"

Gopi Bhatt smiled and replied, "Maharaj, by your grace all is well."

Brahmanand Swami opined, "Maharaj, Gopi Bhatt's extravagant lifestyle surprises and shocks everyone. Furthermore, they conclude about the mandir's opulence." Gopi Bhatt was happy to hear this.

Then, Brahmanand Swami informed Shri Hari, "Maharaj, the document of Gopi Bhatt's appointment as the pujari is informal and not legal. We need to ratify it with a stamped seal from the British office and prevent any issues cropping up in the future.

In response, Gopi Bhatt agreed, "Maharaj, if that is so I'll bring the document right now." Shri Hari added, "Bring it and give it to Brahmanand Swami. He will take our devotees with him to officialize the document."

A short while later, Gopi Bhatt returned with the document, gave it to Brahmanand Swami and asked, "How long will it take to get it officialized?" Brahmanand Swami tactfully replied, "As long as it takes for the British official to stamp it." Gopi Bhatt felt satisfied. The next day, Maharaj called Hiraji, a sculptor from Jaipur. Hiraji had offered his services during the mandir construction in Vartal. He was pleased at Shri Hari's call. Shri Hari told him, "I wish to instal a murti of Hanumanji here, therefore you make it for us." Then, Maharaj called Adharanand Swami and said, "Make a line drawing of a murti of Hanumanji according to my instruction." Adharanand Swami brought a piece of paper. Then, Shri Hari stood up on his seat and posed in a standing posture of Hanumanji. Adharanand Swami made a drawing of Hanumanji and showed it to Maharaj. Shri Hari was pleased and gave the drawing to Hiraji to make the murti.

RELIEVING GOPI BHATT FROM HIS DUTY

About three days later, Gopi Bhatt came to Shri Hari to ask for his official document. Shri Hari called Brahmanand Swami and asked him about the document. Brahmanand Swami replied, "Maharaj, Nar-Narayan Dev symbolizes austerity, therefore, a pujari with a materialistic lifestyle is inappropriate. So, I have torn the document Gopi Bhatt gave to me and instead of him we now appoint Anandanand Brahmachari as the new pujari. On hearing this, Gopi Bhatt was shocked and stunned. He looked at Shri Hari, but Maharaj remained silent. Then, he asked Shri Hari, "Maharaj, what has Brahmanand Swami done! He has torn the document of my appointment and decieved me by ousting me."

Shri Hari replied, "You ask him."

Brahmanand Swami remarked, "Bhattji, it is you who has been deceiving Thakorji. You siphoned the money and things donated by the devotees to Thakorji for your own use. In addition, you never provided rations and clothes to sadhus as per their needs. How can Thakorji tolerate your fraud? Hence, whatever decision has been made is appropriate. The only silver lining is that we are not demanding the things you have wrongly accumulated. Thus, be satisfied with our decision."

Gopi Bhatt understood and tamely left the mandir precincts.

WE ARE OBEYING THE ORDERS OF OUR MOTHER

In the evening, Shri Hari was seated in a satsang assembly. Soon after, several performers, who danced, sang, and acted as a profession, came to Maharaj and complained, "Your sadhus perform arti five times daily and sing bhajans aloud. Consequently, it creates a distubance in our residential area. We ask you to order them to stop singing." Shri Hari smiled and answered, "Wherever you go, you sing and dance all night to entertain people. During those late hours thieves ransack their homes and cause great loss to them. Why don't you stop your activities first!" On hearing this, the leader of the group of performers hesitated for a while and then replied, "We perform at the behest of our deity." Shri Hari retorted, "These sadhus sing arti and bhajans at the behest of their deity." The performers turned mute and left.

Shortly after, a Muslim aspirant standing at the doorway experienced *samadhi* on Shri Hari's darshan. The aspirant felt blessed and told his son, Dosamiya, "Son, he is divine, therefore know him. Whenever you get an opportunity to serve him, grasp it."

Several days after celebrating the Fuldol festival, Shri Hari got ready to depart from Ahmedabad on Fagan *vad* 7. The *parshads* and Darbars accompanying Maharaj got ready to leave. Shri Hari told a few sadhus to come with him and instructed the rest, "I wish to celebrate the Hari Jayanti (Hari Nom) celebration in Vartal. Till then, you all go on a satsang tour in the neighbouring villages and return to Vartal on the day of the festival.

The local devotees made preparations to give Shri Hari a grand farewell on his departure from Ahmedabad. Shriji Maharaj mounted Manki, his mare, and was accompanied by a procession of devotees to escort him to the outskirts of Ahmedabad. Soon, the procession proceeded towards Manek Chowk and then towards the city outskirts. Here, Maharaj told the devotees of Ahmedabad to return.

HARI JAYANTI CLEBRATIONS

Shri Hari rode ahead with the Kathis and parshads. There were two canopied bullock carts for his relatives from Ayodhya. Amulaba and Amriba (daughters of Jiva Khachar) were also travelling by bullock cart. In addition, the senior (sadguru) paramhansas were travelling in other bullock carts.

On hearing of Shri Hari's arrival in Aslali, Venibhai and other devotees came forward to honour Maharaj with rose garlands. Then, Shri Hari stayed for the night at the devotees' request.

FRUITS OF SPIRITUAL DISCOURSES

Venibhai made arrangements for an evening meal along with laddus as a sweet item. Shri Hari took his meal and then served laddus to his sadhus. Thereafter, Shri Hari returned to his residence. The accomodation for Maharaj's entourage was arranged in the open by the village lake. Since it was night-time the area was illuminated with torches dipped in oil. Shri Hari arrived and sat on a raised platform. Thereafter, sadhus commenced the assembly by singing dhun and bhajans. In conclusion, Shri Hari discoursed, "Our Satsang has flourished due to the spiritual discourses of sadhus. Their talks have enabled countless to quit addictions and bad habits. All should have a firm inclination to worship and pray to Paramatma. Only then will their satsang become robust. Whatever discourses I give are about Paramatma and I desire that all jivas should bond with him."

Organized by BAPS on the Occasion of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's Centenary Celebrations Year 31 July-6 November 2022, India

he sacred terrain of India has been blessed with the birth of countless pious rishis, and sages, swamis and mahatmas. They have actively protected, preserved and promoted the traditions and beliefs of Sanatan Dharma. Bhagwan Swaminarayan has added to the prestige of the three pillars of Sanatan Dharma by building mandirs, creating shastras and ordaining sadhus.

Bhagwan Swaminarayan's fifth spiritual successor, His Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj, enhanced the prestige of all sadhus and mahatmas through his pristine, saintly life. Pramukh Swami Maharaj had tremendous love, respect and reverence for all mahants and mahatmas and spiritual seekers and accomplished swamis.

Hence, as part of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's Centenary Celebrations, with the blessings and guidance of His Holiness Mahant Swami Maharaj, a series of inspiring Sant Sammelans were held at BAPS Mandirs throughout India in honour of Pramukh Swami Maharaj. Each

of these sacred gatherings of sadhus, mahatmas, mahants, acharyas, pujaris, *kathakars* and trustees of Hindu organizations reflected the deep love and respect everyone has for Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

Between 31 July and 6 November 2022, 30 sanctifying Sant Sammenlans were held at BAPS Mandirs built by Pramukh Swami Maharaj: Ahmedabad, Amreli, Anand, Atladara (Vadodara), Bangalore, Bharuch, Bhavnagar, Bhuj, Bodeli, Dholka, Dhule, Godhra, Gondal, Himmatnagar, Indore, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Kolkata, Mehsana, Morbi, Nagpur, Nashik, Navsari, Pune, Rajkot, Sankari, Sarangpur, Silvassa, Surat and Tithal.

Before each gathering, the resident BAPS swamis and senior *karyakars* of each mandir personally went to cordially invite all the sadhus, mahants and mahatmas at their own mandir, math or ashram.

On the day of the Sant Sammelan, the invited mahatmas were respectfully greeted by senior swamis who applied sandalwood *chandlos* to their

foreheads. Then, they were escorted along the specially laid red carpet, while young traditionally dressed *balaks* welcomed them by showering flower petals on them.

After having darshan of Thakorji in the main mandir and performing *abhishek* of Shri Nilkanth Varni, the mahatmas were escorted to the assembly hall, where they were warmly welcomed by other BAPS swamis.

Most of the Sant Sammelans were held as part of the weekly Sunday assembly, so that local devotees could attend the auspicious gathering of mahatmas.

After the singing of *dhun*, *prarthana* and kirtans, the senior sadhus and mahatmas on stage all participated in the lighting of the inaugural *divo*.

Then, the mandir's kothari swami gave a welcome speech on behalf of BAPS. After this, the

mandirs' swamis garlanded each of the mahatmas, on and off stage and applied *chandlos* and rice grains to their foreheads.

Thereafter, a senior BAPS swami addressed the gathering, highlighting the theme of the occasion. This was followed by a video on Pramukh Swami Maharaj. Then, the senior sadhus and mahatams representing the various mandirs, *maths*, ashrams and denominations all spoke briefly.

The speeches overflowed with their deep respect and reverence for Pramukh Swami Maharaj. Many recalled their memorable interactions with him, while many spoke of his virtues and works. Their words revealed that the works Pramukh Swami Maharaj did for Sanatan Dharma, for humanity and the nation will continuously inspire countless for generations to come.

They were all touched by his humility,

Thereafter, all were served *brahma-bhojan* by the resident BAPS swamis of each mandir.

In this way, hundreds of sadhus and mahatmas graced the 29 special Sant Sammelans.

ancel Air India and go to London by British Airways or some other carrier," devotees requested Pramukh Swami Maharaj while he was in Gondal, Gujarat. "Air India isn't safe right now."

Flight 182, an Air India jumbo jet, exploded in mid-air on 23 June 1985 because of a bomb placed by terrorists. The entire crew and passengers perished. Pramukh Swami Maharaj's Air India flight to England, UK, was on 10 July 1985. Many Air India flights flew empty because the terrorists threatened more bombings. People were afraid to fly the airline.

"No," Pramukh Swami Maharaj replied. "Harikrishna Maharaj (the small image of Bhagwan Swaminarayan that accompanied him everywhere) is with us. What have we to fear? We send devotees to Akshar Deri here in Gondal when they have problems, so should we not believe in the Akshar Deri? We will pray at the Akshar Deri and fly by Air India. Nothing will happen. Bhagwan Swaminarayan is with us."

This was Pramukh Swami Maharaj's spiritual chill pill. It made him ever fearless and cheerful.

Anxiety never touched him.

"People say they have a headache, but I have never had a headache. I don't even know what it feels like," he once shared. Though in later life he had serious ailments, he was always mentally well. It came from his spiritual wisdom. Just as light emerges from the sun and water from the clouds, similarly, mental health blossoms from spiritual health.

"There is no alternate path," say the Purush Sukta and Shvetashvatar Upanishad, "*Nānyaha panthā vidyate yanāya*."

In Vachanamrut Gadhada II 60, Bhagwan Swaminarayan echos this when Muktanand Swami asks him the following question, "Maharaj, in this mundane world, various types of troubles and disturbances arise. Amidst these, what should devotees of God understand so that they experience happiness within?"

Muktanand Swami seems to suggest this question is relevant to devotees of God only. But Bhagwan Swaminarayan hints that troubles come his way, too! Indeed, from a worldly viewpoint, it must have been tough running the

new *sampradaya* that had rapidly grown around him within 25 years of his arrival in Loj, Gujarat: six huge mandirs, two million devotees, and five hundred *paramhansas*.

Following is a compilation of just some of the problem's Bhagwan Swaminarayan faced.

There had been multiple attempts to unseat him, imprison him, and take his life. Jealous elements maimed and murdered many of his sadhus and made life intolerable for others. Devotees were persecuted and excommunicated from their own families and communities. He took them into the satsang family and looked after their social needs. There were famines, droughts and plagues through which he needed to guide and feed his people. Even his own health was fragile. He barely survived several lengthy illnesses and miraculously bounced back as though he was never sick at all.

There were successful efforts to stop Dada Khachar's income and freeze his property so as to strangle his much needed resources in Gadhada. People spread vicious rumours that Bhagwan Swaminarayan was a runaway from a far off land (Uttar Pradesh), from a lower social background (a Shudra), and not of noble pedigree (a Brahmin).

They sabotaged his peaceful and non-violent sacrifices (yagnas without killing animals) in Jetalpur and other places. They threw away the vegetarian food he prepared to feed thousands of guests in nearby lakes.

He revealed Gunatitanand Swami as Akshar (*Hari-Lila-Kalpataru*, 7.17, Verses 49–50), but that was even tougher for many of his sadhus and devotees to swallow than his own supreme divinity. Later, he wished to install his own *murti* at Vartal mandir with the name Sahajanand Swami, but that was opposed by Muktanand Swami, the person asking him the question! Just three months after asking it on 14 August 1824, Muktanand Swami tried to prevent him from installing his *murti* on 3 November 1824, at Vartal mandir.

For Bhagwan Swaminarayan it was deja vu: almost exactly 22 years earlier, in October-November 1802, Muktanand Swami rebuked him for inspiring spiritual visions (samadhi) in Mangrol. Then, on 5 November 1802, Muktanand Swami had a vision of Ramanand Swami who rebuked him! Then Muktanand Swami composed the famous arti that ultimately immortalized him: "Jai Sadguru Swami, Sahajanand dayālu balavant bahunāmi."

Yes, Bhagwan Swaminarayan had certainly seen his fair share of problems, from outside and inside the *sampradaya*. How did he cope?

"I will answer that question in the manner I myself behave," he replied to Muktanand Swami. "That is, [I maintain] unbroken awareness that my own *atma* is distinct from my body, awareness that every physical object is perishable, and awareness of God's grandeur. By these three, no troubles disturb [me]."

In other words, when you realize that you are a spiritual being (atma), you will also realize that physical loss is not a great loss. When you realize that physical objects and people are inherently short-lived, you will also realize their destruction or death was not unexpected. When you realize that you have the all-doer of the universe (Bhagwan Swaminarayan) in your life and in your atma, you will also realize that you have won the highest lottery in the universe. You will enjoy spiritual self-esteem, gratitude, and amazement. (Vachanamrut Kariyani 8. Please read the last paragraph. It's truly amazing.)

When you feel anxious or depressed about something, swallow the above pill to brighten your day. It should be taken at least once a day, with a glass of bhakti (devotion). It is a 30 second introspective meditation that has no side-effects.

The darkness of anxiety and depression are additionally fought with the light of wisdom and joy.

"It is the nature of the world," said Pramukh Swami Maharaj. "Life is like riding a camel – up and down, uncomfortable, and back-breaking – unless you learn how to move with the camel. Then you will be ok."

Pramukh Swami Maharaj often navigated through unspeakable and intractable difficulties. Throughout his life he laboured to preserve, nurture, and grow the garden of BAPS his beloved guru Shastriji Maharaj had planted.

Despite the relentless outer turmoil, his poise was magnificent. His peacefulness, profound. His joy, boundless.

Such a condition of mental wellness is remarkable. How did he acquire it?

One night, when Shastriji Maharaj was very ill in his final days, Pramukh Swami Maharaj was in Sarangpur. He was perplexed with the responsibility of completing the all-marble mandir that Shastriji Maharaj had begun building on a hilltop in Gadhada.

"How can I fulfil my responsibility to complete the mandir without Shastriji Maharaj?" Pramukh Swami Maharaj thought as he fell asleep.

That night, Shastriji Maharaj appeared in his dream and said, "Don't worry about responsibility. That's my job. You just remember Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Gunatitanand Swami and keep working."

Pramukh Swami Maharaj awoke with immovable faith. A huge burden lifted off his shoulders. "From that day on," he said, "many challenges reared their heads but I never felt any burden."

He worked day and night in extreme conditions to complete the Gadhada mandir and build a thousand more after it, each more beautiful than the previous. He never experienced despair again.

"Even great avatars and devotees of the past have gone through pain," he explained. "Even Dada Khachar, who gave everything to Bhagwan Swaminarayan and received his blessings numerous times that 'all will be well', went through failure after failure, downturn after downturn. But they never lost faith. They carried on.



"If you carry a bucket of water on your head, how much weight will you experience? It will feel heavy. But if you dive into the ocean and thousands of tons of water pass over your head, do you feel its weight? No. Similarly, do not carry such burden on your head. Leave it to God. Immerse yourself in his devotion. He is the all-doer. You will never feel burdened."


The Bhagavad Gita says, "Yā nishā sarva bhutānām." Meaning, "All living beings are asleep." Who? Those who think they are the doers. Those who know Bhagwan Swaminarayan is the all-doer and undoer are awake.

The bigger reality is that we are all – males and females – already his babies lying in his lap. But we are asleep. All we need to do is awake, like Pramukh Swami Maharaj did that night in Sarangpur, and our nightmares will also disappear. Let us all awake in his lap on the occasion of his 100th birthday celebration. Nothing will bring him – and us – greater joy.

Forms of Loving Wisdom



ethod makes a difference. This is undoubtedly true.

Many play cricket from the street to the cricket ground, but only those who play in a

During an examination many fill up their answer books, but only those who write in a disciplined way have gold medals adorning their necks.

disciplined way seem to acquire real competence.

Many run businesses, but only those who conduct them in a disciplined way mint money.

Naturally, the garland of success is attained because of discipline. Defeat results from undisciplined work habits. To carve a stone into an attractive work of sculpture, to carve out an attractive form from a piece of wood, to make a pot from sand or make a rough diamond into a precious one requires appropriate method.

The world seems to be with the young, and many are interested in shaping their lives and

making them admirable. However, the stumbling block is always the method they use. Even when thousands of persons have made innumerable attempts to shape the lives of the young, often the result has been dismal failure. Why?

One can try to polish a rough diamond, but it does not shine. Why?

One can tap on a pile of sand, but that doesn't make it a pot. Why?

The reason is: The number of those who break stones has gone up, but the number of those who can sculpt has gone down. Woodcutters have become a huge majority, but those who can carve wood have become a minority. Diamond-polishers are increasing in number, but diamond-carvers are becoming fewer.

In our ancient India, we had Taxashila Vidyapith. *Shila* means 'stone', *taxan* means 'to shape into form, to carve'. Wherever the young are shaped, wherever they develop, that place is

Taxashila. Pramukh Swami Maharaj was a mobile Taxashila, shaping the lives of generations of young men and women. Understanding this method is bound to transform anyone worried about the young today – a sculptor from a mere stonebreaker.

OTHER-WORLDLY METHOD OF LOVE

Childhood in itself is naturally a helpless state of being; it is a stage without experience or thought. One can control it by bribe or threat. We can make a child walk around us just by showing the child a chocolate. But for the young in the liminal stage this trick is not useful.

The young have logic and intelligence. They are strong and competent. They know enough about the calculus of profit and loss. They also have become self-dependent. Under such circumstances bribe, threat, advice are bound to seem dull weapons. In that context, order or threat does not by itself improve anyone; but if there is the warmth of a loving heart, that is bound to succeed.

This is the only art that can lead to success.

Questions are bound to arise here:

"Have the elders withheld their affection from the young so that they do not obey them?"

"Have the teachers not given their love to the students so that they refuse to respect them?"

"Is there a lack of care in the attitude of social workers and leaders so that the young show their utter disrespect for them?"

"Have the sadhus not given much love to the young so that they simply turn their noses up at them?"

Rather than saying 'Yes' or 'No' in response to such questions, it is best to hold a mirror up to them, because one cannot argue against what the mirror shows. It shows things as they are.

The parents of a young man in New Jersey did a grand expensive ceremony for their son's marriage in India. But then the son refused to invite his wife to the USA from India. The relatives

endeavoured to persuade him, but to no avail. The parents were hardly in any shape to say anything.

At that time, Pramukh Swami Maharaj happened to plan in New Jersey the Cultural Festival of India. During this festival, the young man met Swamishri. His exposure to Swamishri's boundless love began to impress the young man.

One evening when Swamishri asked him about his marriage, the young man responded without hesitation: "I am willing to do whatever you tell me. If I have your blessings, I will call her."

A troubling problem was resolved within moments. We naturally ask this question: How did the love of the parents and elders fail to match with Swamishri's love?

In 1988, SSC (tenth grade) examinations were taking place in India. On a particular day, students were taking their examination in mathematics. At one exam centre, students were simply copying answers from their books right in the presence of their supervisor. At that time a young man, Himanshu Poonambhai Patel, was trying to remember some details for an answer. The supervisor simply started advising the young man: 'It is a matter for your future... Everybody is using their books...Why don't you do that?' But the young man refused to budge.

The young man simply said: "Pramukh Swami is my guru. His guru, Yogiji Maharaj, used to say that copying in an examination tantamounts to cheating God. I will not copy answers."

A SHADOW PASSED OVER THE SUPERVISOR'S FACE

Pramukh Swami Maharaj nourished moral values that neither laws nor specific provisions for punishments can provide. How did the love of teachers or social workers fall behind that of Pramukh Swami Maharaj?

No doubt, we have love for the young, but it is important to state again: "Method makes the difference."

The method of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's love

is something special. In the following discussion we will drink, so to speak, the nectar of his otherworldly love.

CONTACT AT THE RIGHT TIME

People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care.

The essential point is that one can reach someone's heart only on the bridge of caring.

Saying that "Caring is the barometer of love," Erich Fromm says, "To love a person productively implies to care and feel responsible for his or her life not only for his physical existence but for the development of all his human powers." Love means caring for a person in every possible way.

Martin Buber also held the same view. He says: "Love means being fully responsible for the person one loves."

In Pramukh Swami Maharaj such love was natural, spontaneous, and ceaseless.

On 14 July 2007, a camp for the young was organized in Gainesville, Florida. More than 2,000 young men and women participated in it. During a programme at the camp, it was announced, "From the young men sitting here those whose names Swamishri himself had given in their infancy are requested to stand up or those young men whose children's names Swamishri had given are requested to stand up." Many got up.

After that another announcement was made, "Those whom Swamishri had given guidance through letters are requested to stand up." Many got up.

Again, another announcement was made, 'Those whom Swamishri had guided by phone are requested to stand up.' Many got up.

This was followed by yet another announcement, "Those whom Swamishri had guided in matters of education are requested to stand up." In response to this too, many got up.

As it happened, virtually every young man in the assembly hall had got up in response to one or another announcement. This was Swamishri's abiding love for the young. He always heard the young. It is because of such loving attentiveness the young today are stalwartly resisting temptations and overcoming obstacles.

LOVING CARE FOR THE SICK

In 2003, Yogi Trivedi, a young devotee in New York, had come to India for Swamishri's darshan and to participate in satsang activities. However, in the second week, he got jaundice, along with a high fever. He told Swamishri: "Since my relatives live in Ahmedabad, I should go live with them, so that our sadhus don't have to worry about me."

At once Swamishri told him, "You don't need to go anywhere. Just stay here with us. Yogicharan Swami will take care of you."

He, then, told the sadhu taking care of him also to take care of this young man.

Two days later, when the young man came for darshan, Swamishri asked him: "How are you now?" Yogi said: "Bapa! It is now unbearable. I feel I am going to die."

On hearing this, Swamishri looked straight into his eyes, saying firmly: "I am here! How can you die?" He then placed his hand on Yogi's head and blessed him.

Within about three to four weeks Yogi recovered. When he came for Swamishri's darshan, he was eating. Seeing Yogi Swamishri asked him to come nearer and gave him *prasad* from his wooden bowl and said, "Eat all of this. You haven't had much food for a month."

Such loving care brought tears to the young man's eyes.

A year later, when Swamishri came to New York, seeing Yogi he immediately asked, "How is your health? Is it good now?" Hearing this the young man was awestruck, thinking that "During this whole year Swamishri must have met countless persons. He must have heard innumerable things from them. And yet he remembers me!" So deeply moved, he had tears

flowing out of his eyes.

"When did I ever desire anything from you? And still you consecrated me with rain from clouds.

When did I ever ask for anything from you? And yet the rising sun always inquires about me.

No, O Lord! I want nothing!"

Swamishri's loving care leaves the young naturally moved. The lines quoted above seem highly appropriate for the events described below.

On 12 February 1995, Swamishri was in Atladara. The *thal* offered to Thakorji at noon had already been placed before him. Suddenly, the news reached him that Dinesh, Bhavnagar's dedicated young devotee, had an accident and had been taken to a hospital. He had suffered brain injury and was unconscious.

On hearing this, Swamishri right away started reciting the Swaminarayan mantra. Intensely focused and with his eyes closed, he prayed for the young man's health and then only placed a bit of *prasad* in his mouth.

Swamishri's care was always so loving that even one's illness becomes sweetly memorable.

Once, Swamishri had gone to the Sushrusha Hospital in Mumbai to inquire about the health of a devotee, Vajubhai Khatri. There, he heard that Arvind, the son of Mumbai's then-Mayor Shri Ramesh Prabhu, had suffered an accident. Immediately, Swamishri went to see Arvind. His father gave Swamishri details about the accident. Gently running his hand over the young man's head, Swamishri said, "Your father has told me everything. God has protected you, and we are praying for you. You will be fine. Have confidence."

With Swami's loving care the young easily overcame the blows of illness.

Harshad Chavda had served for years in numerous construction activities. When he suddenly suffered a serious accident, Swamishri wrote four letters to him within a month and showered so much loving care on him that we are all left deeply moved.

Swamishri wrote to Harshad Chavada: "Your news gives me pain. I pray to Maharaj and Swami for your quick recovery. You are like our hands and feet, so your illness causes pain to me, too. I should serve you in this time of your suffering because you have served us with great understanding. Whatever we can do for you is not enough. When I am not able to serve you in such circumstances, it naturally pains me... Do not worry about expenses necessary for your recovery. We can never forget the seva you have done for us all. Even if we must spend hundreds of thousands of rupees or much more than that, that is nothing. Your life is more important than that of even a sadhu. You are a quiet, true, and faithful worker for our institution. Whatever we can do for you is never enough...."

The loving care that Swamishri showered on the young was so evident on innumerable occasions that they were inexorably drawn to him. It is impossible to resist selfless love. It has the capacity to affect us in the innermost sources of our being.

On 3 March 2008, a devotee from Sydney, Australia, had come for Swamishri's darshan. The car taking him from Ahmedabad to Bhavnagar had an accident. A young woman from Dallas travelling in the car suffered some injury, but because of her intense desire for darshan she disregarded the injury and reached Bhavnagar. When informed about this, Swamishri said, "Since she has come here arrange for her medical treatment." He even asked a devotee doctor to provide all necessary treatment.

TAKING CARE OF THEIR FOOD

A young man from Toronto wished to receive diksha from Swamishri. Hearing about this, Prakash Patel, the brother of this young man, felt the shock that "I have lived like a friend with my brother for 18 years. If now he becomes a sadhu,

what will I do alone by myself?" Prakash decided to inform Swamishri about his anxiety.

Before long an opportunity arose to deal with this issue. He got a chance to go with his father to meet Swamishri. The brother planning to take *diksha* in future was also with them. Swamishri immediately asked Prakash, "If your brother becomes a sadhu, is there any objection from you or your mother?"

Prakash instantly responded: "No, I have no objection."

Awed by being in the presence of Swamishri, Prakash could not say a word. Perhaps catching what was there in his innermost being, Swamishri said: "Do not worry. I will be your mother, father, and brother."

What an other-worldly assurance!

This is such a concrete substantiation of Victor Hugo's prescient remark, "The supreme happiness of life is the conviction that we are loved."

Many young men have experienced Swamishri's loving care at such an unforgettably right time.

Kanti (now Yogeshdas Swami) and Suresh (now Yagneshdas Swami) had done tremendous amount of running around bringing stones from Rajasthan to Gandhinagar for the construction of Akshardham. Once, they came for Swamishri's darshan in Ahmedabad. During their seemingly casual conversation Swamishri asked them, "When you go by train, do you take some snacks to eat during your journey?"

The two of them remained silent in response. Swamishri understood right away and told them, "You must ask for them. You still have a lot of work to do. Make a reservation in the sleeping compartment. Money spent for this is not wrong. When we run around so much, health is likely to suffer. If we are careless about health, we end up spending money for treatment and work also doesn't get done. So you must reduce fasts also."

Swamishri never failed to consider the smallest

details for the well-being of the young.

Once, Harshad Chavada came to Mehsana for Swamishri's darshan. During the conversation he told Swamishri about the stone-cutting work going on in Rajasthan. He said, "Right now the workers have gone to their native places to celebrate Holi. Kanti has been taking care of everything. He is also running the machine by himself."

Hearing this Swamishri immediately told his attendant sadhu, "Kanti is there. Send some packages of *prasad* to him so that he will have more food."

Swamishri's love for these young devotees had something deeply maternal about it.

Once, Swamishri had come to Ahmedabad in 1977. It happened to be winter. The young men accompanying Swamishri had their stay on the first floor in the mandir complex. Swamishri stayed on the ground floor. When they reached Ahmedabad, Jagdish, a young man who had joined Swamishri's vicharan (now Narayancharandas Swami), had become ill. Rajendra (Narendraprasad (Acharya) Swami) looked around for a blanket for the ill young man, but he couldn't find one. It was already midnight. While Rajendra was wrestling with what to do, Swamishri himself showed up with a blanket, saying, "Cover him up with this," and left.

Next morning, everyone came to know that the blanket Swamishri had given was meant for himself. On that bitterly cold night Swamishri had only his upper cloth (*gatariyu*) to cover himself, but he made sure the ill young man slept in comfort.

The young who experienced such deeply maternal affection from Swamishri naturally became gentle, compassionate and kind. No difficulties or challenges could prevent such young men from developing in ways that Swamishri desired for them.

Equality

Pramukh Swami Maharaj treated everyone with equality: rich or poor, young or old, no matter what caste, creed, colour or country



n 1984, Swamishri was on a spiritual tour of the Navsari district in South Gujarat, India. In one such village, an assembly was held with Swamishri seated on a raised platform. Just then, his eyes caught the sight of a very thin, poor man standing at the back of the assembly with a flower garland in his hands. He was dressed in rags. The man wanted to offer his garland to Pramukh Swami Maharaj but felt hesitant. Swamishri saw the purity in his heart and called out, "Come here, brother, take this sanctified flower. Don't be afraid, come nearer." The man acknowledged Swamishri's compassionate eyes. With shyness creeping all over him, he slowly reached the front, and immediately placed his head in Swamishri's lap, who put his hands on

top of the man's head and softly caressed him. Until now, he had always been treated like a slave, people had called him scornfully, they had looked down on him with despise, and if ever they had touched him, it was only to slap him. But today, it was different. One of the swamis took the garland from his hands and gave it to Swamishri, who in return garlanded the man. He experienced greatness which he had never felt before. He forgot that he was from a lower caste. He stood upright and felt, "I am also a human, after all."

Someone has put it nicely, "The greatness of great people is known by the way they treat others who are lesser than them."

In 1986, Swamishri was in New Delhi. A

meeting had been arranged with the President of India, Gyani Zail Singh, at the Presidential Palace (Rashtrapati Bhavan). But before leaving to meet the president, Swamishri had a few minutes, so he decided to stroll in the garden for a few minutes where he saw two gardeners working. He called them over and talked to them about their livelihood and families. He asked them if they had any addictions. The gardeners had rarely been treated so lovingly before by a visitor. They felt Swamishri's love in their hearts. They vowed to give up addictions and spend time and money for their children.

After the meeting, as he was leaving the Presidential Palace, Swamishri asked his driver to stop the car at the gate. He rolled downed his window and called the gatekeeper. He asked him his name and gave him a brochure about the organization and spoke to him for a few minutes. In his eyes, everyone was equal.

On 23 July 2004, in Houston, the Mayor of Stafford, Mr Leonard Scarcella, presented the Key to the City to Swamishri. He was happy, grateful, and pleased that Swamishri had built such a beautiful Hindu mandir in Stafford. Swamishri said, "We were only able to do this due to your support and cooperation."

The mayor responded, "But I didn't do anything myself. My team actively helped. Indeed, you chose us and gave us the opportunity to serve you."

But Swamishri insisted, "You have a wonderful team."

The mayor smiled and said, "But your team is better. We need your peaceful teachings and values here to help us progress in life."

The next day, Swamishri remembered the mayor and said, "When we asked him to offer the Key to the City to God, he became silent for a while, as if he was in deep prayer and talking to God in person. He offered his devotion like a true devotee. Also, when we said that he has given us so much support, he gave the credit to

his team. That shows his humility." Swamishri praised and appreciated the mayor. He truly embraced people of all backgrounds, beliefs, cultures and countries.

When Swamishri was in Houston, Texas, on 1 August 2004, someone introduced a volunteer who was in-charge of housekeeping in the mandir. Swamishri asked, "What's your father's name?"

"Naranbhai," came the reply.

"You mean Jethabhai's son, Narayanbhai?" asked Swamishri again.

Bhupendra's eyes lit up and he said, "Yes, my grandfather was Jethabhai."

Swamishri then said, "Jethalal's father was Ambalal. They were staunch followers and always served with big hearts. They were an ordinary family, but their dedication was extraordinary." Swamishri not only remembered the family but praised their sacrifice and service.

On July 25, 2004, a traditional stone mandir was inaugurated in Houston, Texas, and everyone was happy. Someone commented, "Swamishri, today Houston is rejoicing like never before."

"But why did you mention only Houston? Is there no joy elsewhere?"

"Yes, of course. There is joy everywhere," came the reply.

"Good," said Swamishri. Then he revealed, "If we talk and think about the greatness of others, our own will increase."

He was always thinking globally and giving importance to others. In that, he saw joy, progress and happiness for oneself.

Servant-Leadership

Pramukh Swami Maharaj's servant-leadership was an outstanding attribute of his saintly life. Despite being the spiritual leader of countless devotees he always strived to serve all.

1970, American management consultant Robert Greenleaf coined the term "Servant- Leadership" in his essay titled "Servant as Leader". This ushered a new trend of working in corporate companies. This concept is still widely used in the corporate world with even lectures and seminars on it. Numerous people still willingly adopt this method in their organizations. Bhagwan Swaminarayan, who is an exemplary example of such a servant-leader, said that it is a fact that no one likes an

arrogant person. In the corporate world, the arrogant and conceited often seem to be the first to be replaced or eliminated. The corporate structure needs a low-profile and sensible leader. This is because such a leader creates a conducive environment in the office, which in turn results in the employees being productive manifold times.

According to the Hindu shastras, Sage Durvasa had a temperamental nature and it was difficult for others to tolerate or adapt to his anger. Thus, no one invited him to their homes. Once, he arrived as a guest in Dwarika at Bhagwan Krishna's palace. Krishna served him happily. During his stay at the palace, the sage would sometimes singlehandedly eat thousands of portions of food, and at other times he would eat very little. Sometimes, he would



run away from the palace and at other times he would weep uncontrollably. Everyone was exasperated with his erratic and troublesome behaviour. However, Bhagwan Krishna did not tire or get irritated. He continued to serve him with dedication and sincerity. One day, the sage said that he wished to eat kheer. Bhagwan Krishna offered him some delicious kheer. After eating the kheer, the sage asked Krishna to smear kheer on his own body, to which Krishna obliged. On seeing the smearings of kheer

on Krishna's body, Rukminiji laughed. The sage then told her to smear kheer on her body too. After this, Bhagwan Krishna and Rukminiji were harnessed to a chariot in which the sage then sat. Durvasa told them to pull the chariot and often struck them to pull harder. Bhagwan Krishna and Rukminiji did not get angry at the sage's astringent behaviour. Sage Durvasa, who was testing them, became extremely pleased on witnessing their humble devotion and blessed them for their service. He blessed Bhagwan Krishna with a boon that wherever he had applied kheer, those parts of his body would never get hurt or damaged. He then turned to Rukminiji and blessed her by saying that she would be the best and most famous among her husband's queens. Since, Bhagwan Krishna had not applied kheer on the soles of his feet, he was later fatally shot by a hunter's arrow.

In brief, a humble servant is dear to everyone. That is why Bhagwan Krishna was also such an able leader in the Mahabharat war.

Pramukh Swami Maharaj was always humble like a servant. From the very beginning, he exhibited the traits of a true servant-leader through his behaviour. On the very day when Pramukh Swami was made the president of BAPS by guru Shastriji Maharaj, he washed the dishes of the devotees. Even prior to that, when he was appointed as the chief administrator (kothari) of Sarangpur mandir, he sincerely fulfilled all his duties and humbly served everyone. Whether it was cleaning and maintaining the gaushala, utensils, kitchen, pantry, etc., he took care of all these tasks with great devotion and humility. Despite his highranking position, he never had an iota of ego or arrogance. Seeing him, those around him became inspired to be a part of these services and that too by humbly doing their all.

In 1971, after Yogiji Maharaj left his mortal frame and returned to Akshardham, Pramukh Swami Maharaj became the spiritual master and beacon to thousands of devotees.

Later in the same year, devotees celebrated Pramukh Swami Maharaj's 51st birthday in a village called Dharmaj, in Gujarat.

On the morning of his birthday, Swamishri was cleaning his teeth. He saw some chewed *datan* sticks used by devotees lying near the trash can. He collected all the chewed sticks and put them into the dustbin.

Performing *seva* was natural to him because he was a humble servant.

Once, Swamishri was paying a visit to the rooms of elderly sadhus in Bochasan mandir. Thereafter, while returning to his residence, he noticed that one of the bathrooms on the way needed cleaning. Without telling anyone about his intention, he pretended to visit the bathroom. The sadhus and devotees were left wondering why


Swamishri took so long. After quarter of an hour, they inquired and found Pramukh Swami cleaning the dirty bathroom!

Through such service Pramukh Swami Maharaj demonstrated the true duty of a leader: leading by example.

In 1981, during the bicentenary celebrations of Bhagwan Swaminarayan in Ahmedabad, Pujya Bhadant Anand Kaushalyayan, a senior Buddhist saint, was taken aback after seeing BAPS swamis picking and cleaning the dirty dishes of the devotees. During the Delhi Akshardham festival in 2005, Chandubhai Patel had come to serve from Mehsana as a volunteer. At that time, the drainage pipes were blocked because of the massive waste flowing into it. When Chandubhai saw the swamis cleaning the blocked drainage, he joined them. He continued doing this tirelessy for seven days despite the stench and dirt.

Thus, Pramukh Swami Maharaj's servantleadership inspired countless volunteers and devotees. In addition, thousands were inspired to wash dishes or do menial services even when they had never done them before. In addition to this, they even cleaned toilets, washrooms, etc. Even when the kitchen tasks were very heavy and demanding, no one hesitated to join in and help out. In the United States, Canada, England and other foreign countries, there is a system whereby volunteers wash the dishes and throughly clean the kitchen after their weekly assembly and meals. Dr Rajiv Vyas, a well-to-do and respected doctor in Cherry Hill, New Jersey, had a staff of 800 and 38 doctors as his assistants, and was also the director of a renowned hospital in New Jersey. Yet, for years, he regularly cleaned the toilets and bathrooms of the BAPS mandir in Cherry Hill after praying to Thakorji every morning. All these and many more such examples are a testament to the glory of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's unique servant-leadership. He set a gold standard for the entire world.

Question Time with Pramukh Swami Maharaj



umbai, 4 March 1978. Pramukh Swami Maharaj attended a *yuvak* assembly on the rooftop of the BAPS Mandir in Dadar. Swamishri replied to their questions.

Q: What should we do when we face insurmountable miseries and difficulties in life?

Swamishri: Associating with the Gunatit Sant will give you peace. He will help you to overcome them.

Q: What should youths bear in mind when promoting satsang to others?

Swamishri: You must be living it. If you have conviction you can pass it on. If you live by the *niyams* and imbibe the *jnan* then others will

accept them.

Q: When you call us and give *prasad* we feel good. But do you still have affection for us if we fail in our exams?

Swamishri: The Satpurush's affection is not reduced. He does what is good for everyone. Two people can be highlighted, but not 50. But he has affection for all, no animosity. There is no distinction. In some circumstances, someone may be highlighted, but that does not mean his affection for others is less.

Q. Those who do not have association with the Satpurush excel, but often blessings given to us do not bear fruit. Why?

Swamishri: If God or His Sadhu do not do what we want that does not mean they are not

God or His Sant. They will certainly liberate the *jiva*. There is no doubt in that. Worldly wishes may sometimes be granted, and sometimes not. Maharaj cured the illnesses of others, but Muktanand Swami remained ill. They are focused on doing what is for our *jiva's* benefit. If one practises satsang for one's *jiva's* liberation, then worldly problems will not distract. Their blessings may not bear fruit, but their affection for us does not waver.

Q. The Satpurush is omniscient (*antaryami*). So why is it necessary to confess one's mistakes to him?

Swamishri: The Satpurush is all-knowing, but Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj used to say, "Tell the *antaryami* seven times." We know him as omniscient, but a barrier remains. By confessing, that barrier is removed and one experiences inner peace and joy.

Q. What if one develops animosity while doing *seva* for satsang?

Swamishri: If things do not happen as per our wish then animosity arises. If the aim is to please God and guru then animosity will not develop. Those who want to please them have no problems.

Q. You and the sadhus observe celibacy. So how will women be liberated?

Swamishri: Shriji Maharaj has said, "If the women believe me to be *antaryami* and offer devotion, I will liberate them." The sadhus and householders need not worry about the liberation of women. That can lead to problems, even if one has attained the *brahmic* state. The liberation of women is in the hands of Bhagwan. If you try to mediate, you will encounter problems.

Sankari, 5 February 1973, Swamishri satisfactorily answered the questions posed by a youth.

Q. How can a *mumukshu* recognize a true guru?

Swamishri: A guru who fully observes the five qualities – *nirman, nirlobh, nisswad, nissneh and nishkam* – and is engrossed in devotion to God is a true guru.

Q. To recognize such a guru one has to stay with him and that requires time. By what quality can a guru be recognized from the outset?

Swamishri: If his darshan gives you inner peace, know him to be a true guru. Otherwise, one still has to seek his company and that requires time. Such qualities may not be obvious from the outset, but by associating with him his qualities become fully known. Also, someone may at first seem imposing, but by associating with him, such virtues may not be seen. So, keeping his company is necessary to identify him.

Q. If a guru is no longer alive, but has imparted *jnan* (spiritual wisdom) to people and records of his discourses and beliefs are available, can liberation be attained by reading them and attaching with the guru?

Swamishri: Liberation is attained only through a manifest guru. Because that guru dispels doubts, removes spiritual ignorance and destroys one's drawbacks. Reading the wisdom of the gurus and bonding does benefit, but does not lead to *moksha*. The Gita, Bhagvat and other shastras are written by such distinguished personalities, but merely reading them does not remove the ignorance of spiritual aspirants. So, only through a manifest guru does one attain *kalyan*.

Q. India is home to many devas, dharmas and avatars. There are many conflicts as a result. This causes disputes and divisions. So, what is the need for this new dharma and avatar?

Swamishri: Dharma is *sanatan* (eternal) and all the avatars are of one Bhagwan. The disputes are due to incomplete knowledge. A true guru sees all equally. My guru has visited all mandirs, honoured everyone and for him wherever he

looked, he saw God. So one who is wise should associate with such a guru.

* * *

Ahmedabad, 21 August 1976. A questionanswer session was held with Swamishri during the *yuvak* assembly.

Q. How can youths decrease their worldly desires?

Swamishri: If one has true affection for the Satpurush then one will not do what displeases him. In that way, desires will decrease.

Q. For just a one-day celebration, why spend lakhs of rupees for accommodation?

Swamishri: In one day, the *atma* can find peace. In one day, one's life work can be realized. The spiritual benefits are immense. If the arrangements are good, people appreciate it and progress spiritually. It is to encourage people to tread on the spiritual path.

Q. From ill-gotten wealth, if one donates to God, is it purified?

Swamishri: One should not have such an attitude. If one has made a mistake, atone for it. But to do it purposefully is not right.

Q. Purushottam Narayan is supreme, so why does he make us observe fasts and austerities?

Swamishri: We do not like to live in a dirty home, similarly if our *antahkaran* is not pure, then joy is not experienced. So, to purify us and make God the prime focus of our life, Maharaj specifies fasts and austerities. If you want to go abroad, you need a valid passport. Similarly, if one's *antahkaran* is pure, then one attains God's abode.

Q. Gunatitanand Swami sat Bhagatji Maharaj in dhyan for nine days and he became God-realized. Why is this not done by the succeeding gurus?

Swamishri: The Satpurush does not act as we may think. Shastriji Maharaj engaged people in construction and manual work and guided them to the *brahmic* state. When the manifest (*pragat*) Satpurush is kept at

the forefront one has attained the elevated spiritual state.

Q. When someone lapses in observing the five *vartmans*, what can we do to avoid taking *abhav-avgun*? Do *satsangis* have a responsibility in that?

Swamishri: Do not harass one who lapses in observing the five *vartmans*. If one has a rapport with them then one can tell them, otherwise do not keep their company. Do not spread any talks about their misdeeds. Bhagwan will give them the appropriate fruits of their actions. We are not responsible for them. Everybody is liable to make mistakes. We are here [in satsang] to become pure. If you focus on this, there will be no problems.

Q. In the Vachanamrut it is said that a gangrenous body part should be amputated. What does this mean?

Swamishri: This work should be handed over to the Satpurush. A doctor does his work. He operates, gives medicine and makes others well. Similarly, the Satpurush does what he has to; it is not our role. It is beyond our jurisdiction. It is the duty of devotees to do in a way that reflects positively on the Satpurush.

Q. Before Shriji Maharaj's manifestation was *atyantik kalyan* (ultimate liberation) possible?

Swamishri: Not in this *brahmand*. But it was in the other *brahmands*.

Q. What is your most memorable occasion with Shastriji Maharaj?

Swamishri: All occasions with Bhagwan and his Sant are joyous. (Then Swamishri laughed and revealed.) The most memorable occasion is when he made me a sadhu.



PERSONAL RITUALS Mansi Puja

In the sixth part, we discussed the personal daily morning worship ritual of nitya puja.

In this seventh article, we discuss the personal ritual of mansi puja. Mansi puja means performing puja mentally, without recourse to any physical offerings such as flowers, leaves, chandan or food.

One performs puja mentally with intense devotion (bhav).

In Vachanamrut Gadhada III 23, Bhagwan Swaminarayan meticulously describes how devotees should offer mansi puja. He describes the details applicable to the three seasons in India, namely summer, monsoon and winter. These details will not be discussed here. At the end, he reveals two benefits of mansi puja, namely, that a devotee "increases his love for Bhagwan and his jiva benefits tremendously".

If one has not seen Bhagwan, how can one do his *mansi puja* and increase one's love for him? Here the Svetashvatara Upanishad (6.23) guides us:

Yasya deve parā bhaktih yathā deve tathā gurau, Tasyaite kathitā hi arthāh, prakāshante mahātmanaha.

"If one who offers devotion to Bhagwan similarly offers devotion to the guru, then one attains *moksha*."

Similarly, Bhagwan Swaminarayan enjoins such equal devotion to the Aksharbrahma Satpurush in Vachanamruts Gadhada I 54, III 26, 35, 38, and Vartal 5 and 11.

From these Vachanamruts one can also glean

the meaning of the phrase, 'his *jiva* benefits tremendously', which is eradication of *swabhavs* and *vasana* and attainment of *moksha*.

In BAPS, Shastriji Maharaj and the subsequent gurus have also advocated performing *mansi puja* five times a day. This is equivalent to minimeditations of about five minutes. In these one visualizes offering delicious foods appropriate to the time of day and also praying to Bhagwan and the guru to accept *yog-nidra* which is a more appropriate phrase for sleep or rest – in the afternoon and at night.

Singing the *nitya cheshta* at night is also a form of *mansi* in which devotees visualize the daily and seasonal activities of Bhagwan Swaminarayan. This includes the minute description of his persona and mannerisms as poetically verified by Premanand Swami. It lasts about 25 minutes and acts as a de-stressor and also serves as a spiritual balm. In Vachanamrut Gadhada II 48, Bhagwan Swaminarayan praises Premanand Swami when he composed and sang the "Vandu" poems, to the extent that he wished to prostrate to Premanand Swami. Moreover, he revealed the immense fruit of such visual contemplation of Bhagwan's

lila by a devotee, stating, "He has attained the highest state of enlightenment while alive... and has become fulfilled and has nothing more left to do."

Having briefly discussed the spiritual benefits of *mansi puja*, we now briefly discuss its physical and mental benefits. This inspires us to motivate ourselves to sincerely do *mansi puja* since we are more attached to the body and mind than we are with our *atma*.

Mansi puja is ultimately meditation, but rather than trying to achieve a state of 'nothoughts' which is very difficult for lay people, it is easier, visually feasible and fulfilling. Researchers have noted greater benefits of meditating with meaningful syllables, words, mantras or vivid imagery. Here we cite the combined results of such meditation studies as well as those of Transcendental Meditation (TM).

BENEFITS ON THE BODY

If *mansi puja* or mental imagery is performed diligently, it induces a state of relaxation which affects many systems in the body.

It decreases metabolism – the rate of chemical reactions that are ongoing in the body. This leads to a decreased need for oxygen and increased elimination of carbon dioxide. It increases the secretion of melatonin at night. This hormone boosts sleep and immunity. A deficiency of serotonin, which regulates mood, leads to depression. TM practitioners have high levels of serotonin.

Benefits on the cardiovascular system

Relaxation leads to a decrease in heart rate and blood pressure.^{5,6,7} Indian researchers have discovered that meditation also improves cholesterol levels.⁸

For people with ischaemic heart disease, it improves exercise tolerance.⁹ It decreases the risk of heart attack and stroke.¹⁰

BENEFITS ON THE MIND AND BRAIN

Meditation decreases stress, anxiety and depression and hence lessens the need for medications. 11 People who meditate achieve better relaxation and alert states of mind. This is reflected in brain electroencephalograms (EEG) and fMRI. They have higher alpha and theta waves. The latter waves induce the ability to process information faster. Anxiety-prone individuals have lower alpha and theta waves. 12 The secretion of stress hormones such as adrenaline and cortisol decrease.13 These hormones are secreted during the 'fright, fight or flight' situations in daily life which cause 'burnout'. Perhaps the greatest and most welcoming benefit, especially during middle age and later, is that long term meditation actually increases blood flow to the brain and increases brain 'cortical thickening'. 14, 15 This means one can still increase the brain's efficiency, especially memory and concentration in certain daily activities. 16, 17

Mental imagery is being increasingly used by psychopathologists to treat mental and emotional disorders such as phobias, obsessive compulsive disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder and social anxiety. ^{18, 19}

The vivid visualization involved in *mansi* puja boosts right brain function. In turn this boosts creativity and facilitates greater neuronal connections to the left brain which increases overall brain function and power. This helps delay or even prevent mental decline in old age. The more vivid the visualization with the 'mental senses' of sight, sound, smell, touch and taste, the greater the beneficial effects on the body, mind and *atma*.

Mansi puja then is an extremely important daily ritual with powerful benefits to the body, mind and atma. It has a holistic effect on the body by regulating or boosting its major systems, such as metabolism, stress hormones and cardiovascular system. Secondly, it boosts brain function, especially concentration


and memory, and delays the effects of aging. Finally, its most important effect is spiritual in that it aids aspirants to develop profound love for Bhagwan and the guru. This leads to eradication of *swabhavas* and *vasana*, which then help aspirants to become *brahmarup* and attain *moksha*.

In the next, eighth article, we shall discuss the personal rituals of *prayashchitt* – atonement and *upvas* – fasting.



Fairgrounds in Pleasanton, CA, for the grand celebrations of the 100th birth anniversary of His Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj.



HIGHLIGHTS OF PRAMUKH SWAMI MAHARA I NAGAR

1. Festival Venue

5. Exhibition Marquees

Five immersive shows - 'Sahajanand', 'Muktanand', Nityanand', 'Bharatanand' and 'Paramanand' - comprise of films and live performances themed on topics taught and promoted by Pramukh Swami Maharaj, like antiaddiction, family harmony, pride for India and community service.

6. Children's Cultural Village (Bal Nagari)

Before entering the main Concert Hall, attendees walked through an exhibition showcasing the life, work and incredible impact of His Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

Hindu Representation at G20 Religion Forum

2-3 November 2022, Bali, Indonesia



Mahamahopadhyaya Bhadreshdas Swami represented BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha as a traditional scholar of Hinduism at the inaugural G20 Religion Forum – or 'R20', reinforcing His Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj's lifelong advocacy of global religious harmony.

R20 Summit: Background and Significance

R20 is a ground-breaking new global initiative that brings together religious leaders from G20 member states to discuss and respond to wider global challenges of the 21st century.

Founding co-chairs of R20, Kyai Haji Yahya Cholil Staquf (General Chairman of Nahdlatul Ulama, Indonesia) and His Excellency Sheikh Mohammad bin Abdulkarim Al-Issa (Secretary General of the Muslim World League, Saudi Arabia), explained that the objective of R20 is to mobilize global leadership to help ensure that religion functions as an open and dynamic source of solutions.

His Excellency Joko Widodo, President of Indonesia, addressed the opening session of the R20 summit by welcoming the 400 esteemed faith leaders and religious scholars.

In his address to the distinguished forum, Bhadreshdas Swami paid tribute to Pramukh Swami Maharaj in his centenary year by invoking his message of religious harmony from the United Nations Millennium World Peace Summit in New York City in 2000.

Bhadreshdas Swami then cited the motto of Indonesia, "Bhinneka Tunggal Ika," and explained, "We are different. Yet, we are one. One human race.



One family of One home. Just as the ancient Rig Veda proclaims: *Yatra vishvam bhavati eka needam*."

He drew upon the universal timeless wisdom of the Vedas, Upanishads, Shrimad Bhagavad Gita, Bhagwan Swaminarayan and the great schools of Indian thought to encourage a more universal definition of 'dharma' and unpacked several universal dharmic values – such as peace, love, friendship, respect and compassion – that can help facilitate peaceful conflict resolution and foster global religious harmony.

He said that through active dialogue "we are able to accept the existence of other faiths – accept them as they are, without needing to discriminate or disparage. Then, there can be mutual respect among faiths – respect of human dignity and spiritual integrity, without inciting hate or hurt. 



SHILANYAS MAHOTSAV OF BAPS SHRI SWAMINARAYAN MANDIR

SATSANG DIKSHA HOMATMAK PATH YAGNA 19 September 2022, Auckland, New Zealand



Hundreds of devotees gathered at BAPS Swaminarayan Mandir, Auckland, in the presence of Pujya Doctor Swami for a special *yagna* ceremony known as the 'Gruh Shanti Homatmak Yagna'. High in the azure-blue skies and amid the feather-like clouds above Cairns in Northern Queensland, Australia, Pramukh Swami Maharaj's centenary was celebrated in various ways based on the theme "In the Joy of Others – Celebrating the Spirit of Service."

Celebrating Pramukh Swami Maharaj's life of selfless service for the joy of others, a giant 5 m wide BAPS and Pramukh Swami Maharaj centenary flag, fluttered through the sky in a sky dive between 15,000 and 8,000 feet.

Pramukh Swami Maharaj's *murti* was taken 5,000 feet in the air hang-gliding with a view over the horizon of the Gold Coast. *Pujan* and prayers were offered by swamis before sending the *murti* up into the air.

BAPS swamis took the *murtis* of Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj, Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj 5,000 feet in the air over the iconic hinterland in Queensland in a hot air balloon and performed their *pujan* and *arti*, and offered *mantra-pushpanjali* and *thal*. Narok County, Nairobi, Kenya 14 October 2022




The Horn of Africa is experiencing the worst drought in 40 years. For many, this is the fourth drought period in a row. In some areas, over 90 per cent of water sources have dried up. As crops fail and families lose their livestock – which, for many, is their only source of income – more than four million people are grappling with acute hunger. Moreover, aid groups and authorities predict the next rains in the Horn of Africa will also likely fail, hurting communities.

BAPS Charities, in conjunction with the office of Her Excellency Pastor Dorcas Rigathi, the 2nd Lady to The Republic of Kenya, provided 12 tons of rice, beans, maize, porridge, and cooking fat. The food aid was distributed to the residents of Narok County, with her Excellency personally being present to distribute the food aid to affected families and individuals.

The food aid will benefit approximately one thousand affected families. Her Excellency appreciated the prompt response and support from BAPS Charities.
