

SHRI HARI IN AHMEDABAD

Shri Hari was given a grand welcome in Ahmedabad and during his stay he showered his divinity upon all...

CULTIVATE FIRM FAITH

It was ekadashi and lunch of falahar foods, like barfi, shrikand, penda, cooked vegetables, puri and shiro, were made for Shri Hari. his devotees and the Kathi royals. First, Maharaj ate and then he generously served the devotees. Though the sadhus had observed a waterless fast, they too served some items to the devotees. Shri Hari saw the sadhus serve and expressed his pleasure (rajipo). In fact, his sadhus, who practised

austerity, were of immense credit and pride to the organization. Dharma is moreso inspired through its practice of dharma than by preaching alone. After serving lunch, Maharaj told everyone to rest for the afternoon.

At night, a satsang assembly was organized at the same place. Shri Hari gave a discourse and thereafter the sadhus sang bhajans till 12 midnight. Shri Hari was pleased with his sadhus' austerity and devotion, and the piety of his devotees. For the next four days the daily programme of spiritual discourses continued. Once, Shri Hari said, "Though you all do darshan of the *murtis* in this mandir and also my darshan, but if you are unable to cultivate firm faith in my divine form your worldly desires will not be totally eradicated and satsang will not become foremost in your hearts. Thus, the more



inclination you cultivate towards listening to spiritual discourses, the more faith in me will be established in your hearts. Additionally, the material desires of lust and attachment will be dissolved and your physical senses will become withdrawn from the material objects and pleasures, and remain stable in your heart."

MAHARAJ VISITS MR JENKINSON'S RESIDENCE

At the invitation of the acting Collector of

Ahmedabad, Mr Jenkinson, Shri Hari visited his home in the Bhadra fort in Ahmedabad. The official collector was Mr Barrington, but he was out on a visit to Australia. Mr Jenkinson and his English officials welcomed Shri Hari at the entrance of his home and led him to his sitting room. The collector garlanded and honoured Maharaj. Thereafter, Shri Hari spoke to them in Hindi, "Greed is a formidable enemy of one's soul. People often have greed for money, and kings, out of their greed, strive to conquer other kingdoms. When one is burdened by greed for money or power, one invites personal destruction. At present, we are witnessing the beginning of British rule in India. You are inclined towards ethical ways and spiritual leanings, but if you become unethical and behave unjustly towards the local people

out of your greed to enhance your powers then your influence will wane and disappear. I am a teacher and an exponent of dharma, therefore it is my duty to inspire whoever comes to me on the path of dharma."

Mr Jenkinson and his colleagues were impressed by Shri Hari's candid and forthright words.

On the full moon (Punam) day of Fagan, Shri Hari showered coloured water and *gulal* on the devotees and celebrated the Holi festival in the mandir. Thereafter, Shri Hari and the devotees bathed in the River Sabarmati to wash off the colours. An assembly was arranged and the *paramhansas* sang festive bhajans of Holi before Shri Hari.

DIVINE OPPORTUNITY IN LIFE

On 13 March 1825 (Fagan vad 9, A.S. 1881), the third consecration anniversary (patotsav) of the Swaminarayan Mandir in Ahmedabad was held. Shri Hari performed the worship rituals of pujan and arti of the murtis of Shri Nar-Narayan. Then, dates and popcorn were offered to the murtis of Shri Nar-Narayan. The murtis were donned with garlands of sugar crystals. A small murti was placed in a decorated hindolo (swing) and worshipped. Maharaj then rocked the murti while the paramhansas sang bhajans. The festive and devotional ambience enthused all.

Shri Hari came to the mandir grounds and sat in an assembly of sadhus and devotees. The sadhus sang the festive Holi bhajans. Soon, Mukund Brahmachari brought vessels of water containing saffron and *kesudo* flowers. Adharanand swami gave an ornate and beautiful *pichkari* (squirter) to Shri Hari. Maharaj sprayed coloured water on the devotees and sadhus. The air became suffused with the sweet aroma of saffron and joyous festivity. Then, the devotees placed basketfuls of *gulal* (vermilion powder) before Shri Hari. Maharaj profusely sprinkled *gulal* on the devotees and blessed them.

The sadhus prayed to Shri Hari, "Maharaj, you have showered coloured water and *gulal* upon us, but we pray that you also colour the *brahmacharis* and devotees who are singing the Holi bhajans and rocking Thakorji in the mandir. Shri Hari immediately went there and coloured the devotees sitting under the mandir dome.

SWAMINARAYAN FESTIVALS INSPIRE DHARMA AND BHAKTI

Thereafter, Shri Hari rode on his horse, accompanied by his sadhus on foot, to bathe in the River Sabarmati. The *kathis* rode on their horses, escorting Shri Hari. The scene turned into a colourful and festive procession with sadhus and devotees singing bhajans and playing instruments. While Maharaj exited the walled city from the Delhi Gate, the local citizens witnessing the long colourful procession thought that Swaminarayan's festivals inspired all with dharma and bhakti.

DARIYAKHAN LIBERATED

Shri Hari was slowly riding his horse and leading the entire group towards the banks of the Sabarmati. Suddenly, Maharaj halted beneath a banyan tree for a few moments.¹ Everyone was surprised. A little while later, Maharaj proceeded and came to a spot by the banks of the River Sabarmati, now called Narayan Ghat. Here, while Shri Hari was changing his clothes to bathe in the river, Muktanand Swami asked, "Maharaj, why did you stop for a while beneath the banyan tree ? Was there any special reason?"

Shri Hari looked at Muktanand Swami and replied, "Swami, you had once resided at the Dariyakhan Dome. That Dome was, in its ancient past, known as Vikarna – one of the brothers of Duryodhan of the Kaurav family. He had

upbraided Duryodhan for instructing Dushasan to undress Draupadi in a public assembly. Consequently, Duryodhan excommunicated Vikarna from his family. After several births, Vikarna became a general of an army and he was called Dariyakhan. Once, he hunted an animal near Dadhichi Rishi's ashram on the banks of the River Sabarmati. The rishi became irate and cursed him, 'You will become a ghost and suffer for your sinful action.' Dariyakhan pleaded to the rishi to forgive him. The rishi then responded out of compassion, 'When Parabrahma Purushottam Narayan will be born on earth in a human form you will have his darshan. By the merit of his darshan and blessings you will be liberated from my curse.' The reason why I stopped under the banayan tree was that Dariyakhan had come to me. I blessed him and sent him to Badrikashram (a divine abode to perform austerities and atone for one's sins)."2

Muktanand Swami recalled his former visit with his group of sadhus to the Dariyakhan Dome and how he had liberated the ghosts residing there. At that time, Dariyakhan had also come, but since he wanted to have the darshan of Shri Hari he choose to remain as a ghost.

Shri Hari then entered the waters of the Sabarmati to have a bath. All the paramhansas and devotees also bathed with Maharaj. The river water cleaned the stained clothes and faces of all, leaving the water red hued. After Shri Hari put on a pair of fresh clothes the devotees arranged a seat by the riverbank for Maharaj. Then, they all performed Maharaj's pujan, offered flower garlands and donations. Thereafter, Shri Hari headed towards Motera with his entourage of sadhus and devotees to give darshan to Purushottam Bhakta and others. Then, Shri Hari left to return to Shrinagar (Ahmedabad). Along the way, the singers and instrumentalists sang bhajans and played instruments. Many bystanders did darshan of Maharaj with great joy and glory

and savoured the bhajans. Soon, they all reached the Nar-Narayan Mandir in the Navavas area of the walled city of Ahmedabad.

GHANSHYAM IS NEAR, YET WHY SO FAR ?

Ever since Maharaj's family (Dharmakul) arrived in Gujarat, Suvasini Bhabhi often cooked Shri Hari's meals. She felt satisfied by serving in this manner. During Shri Hari's childhood in Chhapaiya and Ayodhya Suvasini Bhabhi served and bantered with Ghanshyam. However, now that Ghanshyam had revealed himself as Bhagwan, she found his silence and solemness difficult to comprehend and bear. She thought Ghanshyam was physically so near, yet there was a great distance between them. Suvasini would turn sad at this, but then the fact that he had become revered as God exhilarated her.

A MANDIR WHERE THE SADHUS' DISCIPLINES ARE MAINTAINED


After having his meal, Shri Hari generously served food to his sadhus in the mandir dining area. He lovingly insisted that they all eat more. Thereafter, Maharaj returned to his residence and the devotees who had sponsored the meal performed his *pujan*. Shri Hari spoke to them, "I have built a mandir here so that the pious are spiritually nourished. However, when a devotee decides to build a mandir in his village he should build it in such a way that the sadhus' moral disciplines are fully maintained."

In the evening, Maharaj sat on a high seat arranged under a neem tree by the main gate of the mandir. The sadhus commenced the satsang assembly with the singing of kirtans.

PRE-INITIATION PERIOD The Childhood and Youth of Mahant Swami Maharaj



BIRTH

In 1907, Shastriji Maharaj, the third spiritual successor of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, fulfilled the wish of his Lord by consecrating a *shikharbaddha* mandir in Bochasan. The devotees of Anand and the Charotar region played a pivotal role in the making of the mandir. Among them, Manibhai Narayanbhai Patel of Anand was a prominent devotee. Shastriji Maharaj often stayed at Manibhai's house during his visits to Anand between 1907 and 1929. Manibhai served him with profound devotion and care.

In 1929, Manibhai settled in Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh, with the blessings of Shastriji Maharaj for the purpose of doing business. There, he found many *patidar* settlers from the Charotar region in the tobacco businesses. Manibhai, however, entered into the dairy business. Manibhai lived in house number 23 in the housing society of Napier Town in Civil Lines in Jabalpur. Here, on 13 September 1933 (Bhadarva *vad* 9, V.S. 1989), his wife, Dahiba, gave birth to a divine child.

What name should the child be given? Manibhai decided to wait for Shastriji Maharaj to come and name the child. But prior to that, everyone started affectionately calling the child Vinu. And this name was written on his birth certificate.

SHASTRIJI MAHARAJ'S BLESSINGS AND PROPHESY

Vinubhai was six months old. In March 1934, Shastriji Maharaj arrived in Jabalpur after his pilgrimage to Chhapaiya. With him were Ashabhai and Ishwarbhai of Purushottampura and other

devotees and sadhus. Ashabhai brought the sixmonth-old child, Vinubhai, and placed him in Shastriji Maharaj's lap. Shastriji Maharaj looked at the baby and smiled. He cheerfully initiated the child into Satsang and named him 'Keshav'. Then, placing his hand on his head, he blessed, "Manibhai, your son will grow up to become a sadhu and will render great service to the Sampradaya."

In spite of Shastriji Maharaj having named the child Keshav, the family members called him Vinu because they had become habituated with the name.

Manibhai's neighbours were from different Indian states. One of them was a South Indian named Shyamrao. Another was a pious Punjabi. The room where Shastriji Maharaj had stayed was later rented to a Christian. So, Vinubhai, reticent by nature but very sharp and agile, was raised amidst neighbours of various language and cultural backgrounds. Vinubhai thus conversed with them in English and Hindi. The neighbours were fond of Vinubhai and the latter respected them.

BRILLIANT SCHOOL YEARS

During his childhood years, Vinubhai had a few close friends. But, he was more inclined towards reading books. He used to read in a nearby garden, sometimes in the evening and sometimes in the moonlight.

He studied till 2nd grade at the renowned Christ Church School in Jabalpur. Thereafter, from the 2nd grade to Senior Cambridge (11th grade) he studied at the Christ Church Boys School.

Vinubhai excelled in all the subjects. He studied with unwavering attention and interest in class. He remembered whatever was taught in class. On returning home he would diligently do his homework. He always stood first or second in the class, which surprised everyone.

Vinubhai was exposed to three languages: Gujarati at home, English in school and Hindi outside of home and school.

From childhood, Vinubhai had a very sharp memory. He still remembers incidents and events from the age of four. Even today, around 80 years later, he can fluently recite the poems he had been taught in grades three and four. A couplet of one poem that he often recites is, "He that is down need fear no fall; he that is humble ever shall have God to be his guide."

In the 5th grade, he stood first in the exams. As a reward he was given a book, which he read avidly. Vinubhai, however, was disinclined towards reading the newspapers. Every morning, the *Mumbai Samachar* was delivered at his house, but he never even glanced at it. He preferred to read good magazines and always skimmed through the *Swaminarayan Prakash*. Though he did not know Gujarati properly, he made an effort to read it.

Vinubhai's artistic sense and skill were well developed. He made excellent drawings in school. Football was his favourite sport. He played as left full back.

In school, he was liked by all. He was quiet, thoughtful and ever-smiling, and the entire class admired him.

Mr Robinson, the principal of Christ Church School, was impressed with Vinubhai's radiant personality, intelligence and innate virtues. He once told Vinubhai, "In future, you'll become a priest."

After Vinubhai had completed his Senior Cambridge studies in 1951, Manibhai left Jabalpur to return with his family to Anand for business.

A NEW CHAPTER IN GUJARAT

Jabalpur and Anand were in stark contrast with regards to culture, language and social atmosphere. Vinubhai was fluent in English and Hindi, whereas his communication in Gujarati was weak and patchy. Thus, initially, the ambience in Anand was not conducive to him. However, Vinubhai's arrival in Anand in 1951 turned out to be a turning point in his life. In recollecting the historic moment, he writes, "In 1951, I was 17 years old. My elderly relatives were staunch *satsangis* from the beginning due to Shastriji Maharaj's association.

"At home, the virtues and glory of Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj were sung, but [I did not have] enough clarity about what they were really like. Then, suddenly, one day we got the news, 'Shastriji Maharaj has departed to Dham!' All the relatives were about to leave for Sarangpur. Our whole house and even people from our neighbourhood were leaving. Thus, I, too, left with everyone. When I reached [Sarangpur], Shastriji Maharaj's cremation was over. I was naturally downhearted. From there, we all went to Gadhada. A few days later, the *pratishtha* [of the mandir] in Gadhada was going to take place.

"On the day before the Gadhada *pratishtha* I met Pramukh Swami Maharaj. I was still in a melancholy mood. At that time, he was 29 years old and I was 17. I met him when my life [in Satsang] was beginning.

"Motikaka [Motibhai Bhagwandas] introduced me to Pramukh Swami. He had a flourish of jet black hair before the [monthly] *mundan*. His eyes were active and blinked rapidly. He was gentle and mild, had a round face, was thin and thus looked tall. I can still remember his form. He had a slightly dark complexion. One could see the faint red speckle on the tip of his nose. I looked at him as Motikaka was introducing us to each other. Yes, I was definitely moved by him. My thoughts seemed to have stopped. Pramukh Swami was talking to me in Hindi. I do not remember what he asked me and the answers I gave. However, I felt as if he knew me. I, too, felt that I knew him!

"Within a few moments of his contact I had a wonderful and divine experience. I felt transported from the sultry summer heat of Vaishakh [May–June] to the pleasant [icy] coolness of the Himalayas. Then a leading devotee came and Pramukh Swami had to attend to him. So, he briskly left, smiling. I was left dazed as if someone had snatched away an expensive thing from me.

"Today, I realize what his personality was like at that time. He never wished to impress or overwhelm anyone. He was honest, simple, straightforward and frank. I felt, 'Oh! He is a true sadhu!"

For Vinubhai, his first meeting with the young Pramukh Swami left a deep impression of him.

ABSORBED IN YOGIJI MAHARAJ'S DIVINE LOVE

In 1951, another historic and memorable incident took place which changed Vinubhai's life.

Yogiji Maharaj arrived in Anand. During his stay there, he always visited Manibhai's house. Yogiji Maharaj's thick, coarse *dhotiyas* and rustic demeanour and speech did not interest Vinubhai. The moment Yogiji Maharaj stepped into his house, Vinubhai rushed out through another flight of stairs. Many felt that because of Vinubhai's

youthful whims his father's satsang had failed to appeal to him. Despite having a mandir at home, Vinubhai kept himself aloof from the daily rituals of puja, *katha*, kirtans and celebration of festivals. Sometimes, due to his rational mind, he would often ignore and make fun of devotional practices.

Once, while Vinubhai was leaving his house, Yogiji Maharaj came climbing up the same stairs. Yogiji Maharaj lovingly held his hand and spoke affectionately, "Guru, where are you going? Come back upstairs." Vinubhai returned in a vexed mood with Yogiji Maharaj. Then, Yogiji Maharaj talked to him casually and softly, "Here, put on this *kanthi.*" And Yogi Maharaj placed a *kanthi* around his neck. But Vinubhai, out of his prejudice for sadhus, broke it instantly. In response, Yogiji Maharaj smiled sweetly, gave him a pat on his shoulder and said, "Oh, you are very strong!"

Vinubhai's actions were such that anyone would have got angry and chastised him. But not Yogiji Maharaj. He was of a different mettle. He was an embodiment of love and magnanimity. He kept on showering Vinubhai with his pure, selfless love.

A couple of days later, Yogiji Maharaj was departing from Anand. While he was walking towards the railway station, he saw Vinubhai sitting on the parapet of the village pond with his friends. Yogiji Maharaj hailed him affectionately, "O Vinubhai, come here!" Vinubhai reluctantly came to Yogiji Maharaj, wondering what he would say now. However, to his surprise, Yogiji Maharaj humbly folded his hands, smiled and said, "Now I am going. Forgive me for my mistakes." Then, Yogiji Maharaj blessed Vinubhai with his signature pat and walked away hurriedly.

Vinubhai stood astonished, not knowing what to say or do. Instantaneously, his prejudice dissolved and he was overwhelmed by a wave of remorse. He became lost in thought. He mused about how Yogiji Maharaj was a unique sadhu. He also realized that his personality overflowed with pure love and his smile was ethereal. He was suddenly overwhelmed by a deep desire to be with him. He simply stood there transfixed, with his eyes thirsting for Yogiji Maharaj's darshan.

Sometime later, another soul-stirring incident took place when Yogiji Maharaj was travelling by train from Ahmedabad to Mumbai. The train halted for 10 minutes at Anand Station. Many devotees had gone to the railway station for Swamishri's darshan. The shy and reticent Vinubhai had also gone to the station for his darshan. Yogiji Maharaj started meeting the devotees. Then someone informed him that Vinubhai had come.

Yogiji Maharaj scanned the platform and enquired, "Where is Vinubhai?" After seeing him standing at a distance, Yogiji Maharaj alighted from his carriage and went up to him. Again, Swami showered his infinite love upon him and blessed him with pats. Vinubhai was overwhelmed by Swami's compassionate eyes and saintly virtues. Then, moments later, the train whistle blew and it was time for Swami to leave. Vinubhai did not feel like parting from Yogiji Maharaj. Swami flashed a smile and hurriedly headed towards his carriage. As soon as he put his foot on the footboard, the train started moving. Vinubhai kept his eyes focused on Swami till he was out of sight. Thereafter, he remained standing on the platform, savouring thoughts of the divine encounter. The devotees and others dispersed. Only Vinubhai stood there, totally absorbed in remembering every frame of the divine occasion. The experience of Yogiji Maharaj was so profound that his *murti* pervaded his being. He realized that Swami was not an ordinary sadhu, but God-realized.

Thereafter, for the next fifteen days, Vinubhai returned daily to the railway station, sat on a bench at the same spot and joyfully reminisced about his experience with Yogiji Maharaj. Despite the routine hullabaloo and jostling of passengers on the platform Vinubhai remained unperturbed while recalling the occasion for 45 minutes.

While remembering that experience he states, "On meeting Yogiji Maharaj, I instantly bonded with him. It was as if I was in search of him, but unaware of it. On meeting him I became fulfilled. Everything else became subordinate. Yogiji Maharaj became the centre of my life."

FIRST INSPIRATION TO BECOME A SADHU

Thus, Vinubhai became passionate about Yogiji Maharaj. He started to spare time to be with Yogiji Maharaj during his vicharan and take the benefit of his spiritual association. During his association with the guru, an occasion arose where the thought of becoming a sadhu was sowed in his mind. In remembering that day he writes, "After celebrating the festival of Krishna Janmashtami in Atladara some of us youths departed [a few days later] to go home. We came to the railway station to catch the morning train. It was Shravan vad 11. Pramukh Swami and his companion sadhu were on their way to Ahmedabad by train. All the youths got into the carriages where there were empty seats. I ran and joined Pramukh Swami in a third class carriage. I was the only youth with Swami and his companion sadhu. Pramukh Swami was happy to see me. The train started and he began asking me about my studies. Suddenly, he enquired, 'Do you have a kanthi around your neck?' I said, 'No.'

"Pramukh Swami tenderly explained and said, 'Get it from Yogi Bapa.' By that time the companion sadhu had placed a *kanthi* in Pramukh Swami's hand. So, he placed it around my neck. Then our conversation continued. He spoke continuously in broken Hindi. While speaking he said, 'Become a sadhu. You will be able to serve immensely...' And thereafter he talked spiritedly. There was no intention to force or command in his words. He talked about the miseries of *sansar* and confidently described the happiness associated with God and guru. He was speaking in such a way that the choice was entirely left to me.

"I found a new direction in Pramukh Swami's sweet, humble and loving talks. I felt very peaceful. From that moment onwards I was awakened with the desire to live a sadhu's life.

"After a while, Pramukh Swami began talking about the glory of Yogi Bapa. At that time I felt so peaceful that it seemed as if he had accepted me in his lap. In this way, he instilled [Yogi Bapa's] glory in my soul.

"We soon reached Anand. The other youths came running from their carriages [to Swami]. Pramukh Swami met them all. He had to travel ahead to Ahmedabad. Saying goodbye to the youths he smiled and said, 'Today is *ekadashi*. Don't have anything to eat.' The youths agreed to follow his instruction, and the train proceeded ahead.

"So, it was Pramukh Swami who inspired me to observe my first fast! I repeatedly experienced Pramukh Swami to be a unique and genuine sadhu.

"The task of moulding me was done through his courteous and affectionate speech, which was not an ordinary thing. I had never thought of becoming a sadhu. And neither did [Swami] purposefully talk to me about it. It always happened naturally and spontaneously."

Pramukh Swami's inspiring words left a deep impact on Vinubhai. In fact, they kindled a divine spark in his heart. In 1952, Vinubhai went to Gondal for Yogiji Maharaj's spiritual association.

Bansilal Amrutlal College of Agriculture, Anand, Gujarat

There, in the Akshar Deri, Yogiji Maharaj instructed Vinubhai to become a sadhu. Vinubhai beamed with joy. He decided there and then to dedicate himself totally to the guru.

From then onwards, his life's goal was clear and fixed. He was eager to become a sadhu at the earliest, but Yogiji Maharaj insisted that he graduate in his studies first. So, Vinubhai tried to put his mind in his studies.

EDUCATION IN AGRICULTURE AND BRAHMAVIDYA

Vinubhai decided to study science at the V.P. Science College in Vallabh Vidyanagar. There were two classes in the first year. One was a special class, which comprised of thirty brilliant students. Vinubhai studied in this special class. While attending Professor R.A. Dave's lecture, Vinubhai became acquainted with a brilliant student named Ramanbhai Patel.¹

They became very good friends. After the first year, Ramanbhai went to Mumbai to study medicine and Vinubhai enrolled for a bachelor's degree in agriculture in Anand.

After completing his first year at V. P. Science College, Vinubhai had many other academic options to pursue due to his brilliance. But he chose to do a bachelor's degree in agriculture. The main reason for this was so that he could easily go and stay periodically with Yogiji Maharaj and avail of his spiritual company. In addition, the agriculture college did not have co-education, which facilitated his future plans of becoming a sadhu. His aim of becoming a sadhu was very clear and strong. He was disinterested in worldly matters. So, during the four years in college he studied agriculture and also took lessons in *brahmavidya* from Yogiji Maharaj.

PROFOUND IMPRESSIONS OF YOGIJI MAHARAJ AND PRAMUKH SWAMI MAHARAJ

During his academic years Vinubhai gradually started spending more and more time with Yogiji Maharaj. He would often rush to wherever Yogiji Maharaj was travelling. On many occasions, Yogiji Maharaj blessed Vinubhai with immense spiritual joy and also revealed the disciple's greatness to others. His spiritual bonds with Yogiji Maharaj deepened.

Yogiji Maharaj showered his love and grace on Vinubhai and would also enlighten and inspire Vinubhai with the highest spiritual wisdom. He also moulded his life by instructing him to observe fasts. Sometimes, he told him to fast for two or three consecutive days to test his mental and physical endurance. Yogiji Maharaj also gave him the mantra for realizing *ekantik* dharma. Vinubhai abided by the guru's words with alacrity.

¹ Later, Ramanbhai Patel went to Mumbai and studied medicine. He, too, earned the grace and blessings of Yogiji Maharaj and took diksha from him in 1961. He was named Swayamprakashdas Swami and is fondly known as Dr Swami.

TRIALS ON THE PATH OF SAINTLINESS

Through Yogiji Maharaj's association Vinubhai's life became enriched with saintly virtues. As news percolated in Anand that Vinubhai was going to become a sadhu, a wave of discontent and agitation arose among his relatives. Among them was his seniormost relative, Motibhai Bhagwandas Patel, who

was also a dedicated and mature devotee. But, Vinubhai's father, Manibhai, wished that his son become a sadhu.

One day, Vinubhai was pouring water while Yogiji Maharaj washed his hands by a coconut tree in the compound of Sokhda mandir. At that time, Yogiji Maharaj surprisingly declared, "I will not initiate you as a sadhu because Motikaka has refused. So, get married and go to Africa. You will earn lots of money and fame there."

On hearing this Vinubhai was alarmed, and humbly beseeched, "Bapa, I want to be a sadhu and please you!"

At home, there were offers for Vinubhai's marriage and a generous dowry from seventeen families. But Vinubhai was resolute in his goal to never lead a householder's life. Once, he told Yogiji Maharaj while he was bathing, "Bapa, I want to become a sadhu and please you." On seeing his determination, Yogiji Maharaj became immensely pleased and replied, "Oh, you are very firm and determined." Then, Yogiji Maharaj stalled his bathing ritual by placing the small pot of water aside and embraced Vinubhai, saying, "I, too, am of the same resolve, but I have to side with Motikaka. However, you should tell him explicitly." With these words, Vinubhai felt calmness and joy pervading his entire being.

Soon thereafter, Motikaka came up to Yogiji Maharaj and spoke vociferously, "In our family, four youths took initiation as sadhus, but none of them have remained so. Whereas he [Vinubhai] is from a distant place [Jabalpur] and does not have any satsang knowledge – how long will he remain as a sadhu after becoming one? Tell me Swami, am I not his well-wisher?" And then Motikaka took hold of Vinubhai's arm and spoke sternly, "Come home. A girl

and all other comforts of a married life are ready for you."

However, Vinubhai politely wrested his arm from Motikaka's grip and boldly replied, "I do not want to get married. I want to become a sadhu!" Motibhai was infuriated by the terse reply and so he struck Vinubhai with his hand, and shouted, "I give you three more days to think about it."

The taciturn Vinubhai spoke calmly and with a steely resolve, "I don't need to think any further. My final decision is to become a sadhu."

Yogiji Maharaj blissfully looked at Vinubhai and confidently said, "Motibhai, he wants to become a sadhu. Therefore, allow him to be one, and bless him."

Motibhai reluctantly agreed after hearing Yogiji Maharaj's words and uttered, "Okay, whatever he wishes." Then, he blessed Vinubhai, "If it is your wish, then become a sadhu. I am happy about it." Then, Motibhai walked away quietly.

Yogiji Maharaj exclaimed, "Vinubhai! Motibhai had pleased Shastriji Maharaj immensely. On having received his blessings, you will be victorious."

Vinubhai hurdled over one trial, but there was another major one. His mother, Dahiba, was not happy and willing to allow her beloved son to become a sadhu. KATHA The Bedrock of Satsang

B hagwan Swaminarayan described satsang as a haveli – an ornate wooden building – and *katha-varta* as its foundations. He emphasized *katha-varta* – spiritual discourses and discussions – as the foundation upon which one's personal satsang is built. The more robust one's engagement in *katha*, the higher and sturdier will one's satsang rise.

Such affinity for *katha* is evident in the lives of the Gunatit gurus. Gunatitanand Swami ensured that constant discourses echoed throughout Junagadh mandir, where he was mahant for over 40 years. Bhagatji Maharaj conducted discourses even after performing arduous physical *seva* for many hours during the day. Shastriji Maharaj often discoursed late into the night to the devotees. Yogiji Maharaj discoursed early every morning (*mangal pravachan*), established regular satsang assemblies in all mandirs and centres, and especially encouraged youths to discuss spiritual teachings. Pramukh Swami Maharaj also emphasized the importance of spiritual discourses as a necessity for spiritual growth.

Today, Mahant Swami Maharaj continues

this tradition by discoursing and listening to discourses daily. The following gives an insight into Mahant Swami Maharaj's inclination for spiritual discourses.

After Yogiji Maharaj had initiated 51 youths during the Kalash Mahotsav of Gadhada Mandir, he instructed them to stay in Mumbai, under the leadership of Mahant Swami. Subsequently, for almost two decades, Mahant Swami Maharaj served there as per the wish of Yogiji Maharaj, and later Pramukh Swami Maharaj. During this time, he presided over the daily kathas - both to discourse and listen: at 5.30 a.m., he himself discoursed on the Nishkulanand Kavya; at 8.00 a.m. - after the shangar arti - the morning katha took place; at 1:00 p.m., the post-lunch discourse took place; at 3.45 p.m., the afternoon discourse was held; after the sandhya arti at around 7.00 p.m. the evening discourse took place; and the day's final katha was in the nightly assembly at 9.00 p.m. Mahant Swami never tired in delivering and listening to spiritual discourses.

In 1982, Mahant Swami was in Bamaniya village on the day of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's

birthday – Shri Hari Jayanti. As per Shastriji Maharaj's directive, everyone was observing a *nirjala* (waterless) fast – including Mahant Swami. That day, Mahant Swami completed his morning routine and puja by 6.00 a.m. Then, he sat with Vallabhbhai and several other devotees and became immersed in discussions on numerous spiritual topics. Mahant Swami became so engrossed in the discussions that morning became afternoon and then night. Losing all track of time, the discussions concluded at 12 midnight.

Years later, Mahant Swami was asked, "What topics did you discuss?" He replied, "We discussed on the first two parts of Haricharitramut-Sagar. I still remember one very important point from that day: Honour and insult are both fleeting. So do not let them affect you."

For over four decades, as per the wish of Pramukh Swami Maharaj, he travelled continuously to villages, towns and cities throughout India and abroad to spread the teachings of satsang. Everywhere, he graced the daily assemblies – whether in the heat of summer, cold of winter or the rains of the monsoon – the weather never disrupted his daily discourses.

The following incidents demonstrate Mahant Swami Maharaj's affinity for spiritual discourses.

In 2011, Mahant Swami was in Antarsuba, a town near Godhra, to perform the *murti-pratishtha* of the new mandir there. It was peak summertime. In the assembly, a cooler was set up to give some relief from the sweltering heat, but the cool air did not reach him. When Swamishri began to speak, the wind blew so strongly that the temporary canopy was blown away, and he was exposed directly to the heat. Still, Swamishri continued his discourse undisturbted.

In 2014, Mahant Swami performed the *patotsav* rituals of Atladara mandir and then went for darshan in the *parikrama*. Here, to cool the floor from the hot summer sun, water had been sprayed. But Swamishri was unaware of this and as he walked, he slipped and injured his back.

The doctors assessed him and requested him to rest, but Swamishri refused and still attended the *patotsav* assembly, where he discoursed to the devotees.

In September 2017, Mahant Swami Maharaj was in London, where he expressed his wish that a day-long *chhavni* (a traditional seminar or conference that includes extensive and detailed presentations) to expound on the Akshar-Purushottam Darshan be held.

As per the day's schedule, Swamishri was due to attend at a designated time to bless the gathering. But, totally unexpectedly, Swamishri sat in the *chhavni* sessions for a total of 7 ½ hours. In particular, he arrived in the evening session, five minutes early – when preparations were still ongoing and the first speaker had not yet arrived. Then, he sat attentively and continuously for 4 hours and 10 minutes throughout the entire session, without even taking a bathroom break or drinking water.

Later that night, as Swamishri prepared to sleep, Bhadresh Swami asked, "How much longer can you sit to listen to *katha?*" Swamishri replied, "For about another 2½ hours." Even at the age of 85, Swamishri was able to sit for around 10 hours to listen to *katha*.

4 July 2018, Sarangpur


"Bhagwan and *katha* are one. One who does not have an affinity for *katha* will not develop affection for Bhagwan."

2 July 2019, Ahmedabad

"One must apply the contents of *katha* to oneself. If one assumes it applies only to others, one will never benefit. But if one believes 'the *katha* is for me, and I have to live according to it' then one progresses. As *satsangis*, one must listen to *katha* daily."

22 August 2019, Atladara

"Just as when one chews one's food properly



one enjoys its taste more, if one analyzes and imbibes *katha* one will really enjoy it. So, listen attentively to *katha* and you will learn a lot. If some junior sadhu or a child is doing *katha* and one does not listen to it, that is disrespectful to God. Who is the *katha* about? Bhagwan. Would you not take *prasad* served by children or juniors? So, consider *katha* as *prasad* in the form of Bhagwan's wisdom."

20 July 2021, Ahmedabad

From 8.23 to 8.48 a.m. Swamishri underwent a prostate procedure at the Yogiji Maharaj Hospital. Later, in his room, Swamishri was lying in bed and said, "I want to listen to *katha.*" Even in such circumstances this was Swamishri's first thought. So, an attendant sadhu read from Pramukh Swami Maharaj's *jivan charitra* for over 35 minutes. Then, Swamishri rested.

Swamishri has always placed a sustained emphasis on *katha*. For decades he daily held an impromptu morning *katha* after the *mangala arti* at whichever mandir he was present in. Sadhus eagerly crowded into his room to listen to his soft soothing voice that provided deep and experienced insights into enigmatic and practical spiritual topics. In this approximately 20-minute session he served merely a few drops from the vast reservoir of knowledge he possesses. His astute ability to pinpoint and convey essential spiritual ideas is outstanding.

In addition to the routine daily discourses, over the years, Swamishri has also presented speeches at innumerable seminars, *shibirs* and other events. His sincerity for such events is reflected in the way he often spent several days amid his busy schedule researching and preparing for the topics he was assigned to speak on.

Mahant Swami Maharaj has frequently described the importance and necessity of *katha* in his discourses.

16 December 2021, Atladara

"Katha moulds a person. It informs one about the true teachings and glory of Maharaj, satsang and devotees. *Katha* is the core, but we tend to ignore it. Without *katha* the teachings of satsang do not take root in a person. If the roots are strong then a robust and healthly tree develops."

23 January 2022, Atladara

Today was the date in 1971 that Yogiji Maharaj returned to Akshardham. Swamishri wished to listen to the details of Yogiji Maharaj's last few days from Pujya Viveksagar Swami. So, by phone, Viveksagar Swami narrated the events in detail for over one hour. Swamishri listened with intense attention. Such is his affection for and devotion to his guru.


8 February 2022, Atladara

"If one has a special inclination for *katha-varta*, then one can progress. Otherwise one does not improve. One may be in satsang, perform *seva*, offer devotion, but without *katha-varta*, one does not progress."

PRAMUKH SWAMI MAHARAJ AND MODERN MANAGEMENT (Part 3)

In continuation to the previous installment in this series, which appeared in the March–April 2022 issue, we present the final part that deals with other aspects of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's management.



Peter Drucker (1909–2005), the father of modern management, was a legendary management consultant who guided and mentored executives of corporations like Coca Cola, General Electric (GE) and many more Fortune 500 Companies. Apart from being a consultant, he also authored more than 39 books on multiple topics related to management, many of which were worldwide bestsellers and inspired principles of modern management across the globe. He says, "Great leaders work extremely hard. They take their jobs very personally and are subject to ongoing and often unfair criticism, and pay a price for their success." Let us look at Pramukh Swami Maharaj's life in the context of this statement.

Once, when Swamishri was in Hoboken, New Jersey, Dr J.C. Patel requested Swamishri to sanctify his house at Monmouth County, which was almost 100 kilometres away. Swamishri had travelled all day and was scheduled to continue his *vicharan* the next day. But in spite of that, Swamishri decided to please the devotee and left for the *padhramani* at around 9.30 p.m. and stayed at Dr Patel's home for some time. On returning, the driver missed an exit and Swamishri returned to his residence at 2.15 a.m. The next day, Swamishri resumed his early morning routine as planned.

In 1991, Shri Harkishan Mehta, a renowned reporter, asked Swamishri, "You perform so many social welfare activities based on the principles of dharma. Does criticism bother you?" Swamishri instantly replied, "We introspect on the activities done and if they uphold the principles of dharma for the larger good of people, we do not take such criticism to mind. Instead, we pray to God to help critics understand our objective behind the activities and continue doing them for the greater good of society and mankind."

The two incidents clearly show Swamishri's attitude, who, as a true leader, did not only work extremely hard to please his devotees, but also never allowed criticism to disturb him.

Drucker further states that for real leaders, their motivation doesn't come from the outside, i.e. from sources like money or status, but from within. Such leaders are self-motivated. Swamishri was always self-motivated to do any task or service, small or big, with the sole aim of pleasing his gurus, Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj.

In 1999, Swamishri was having breakfast prior to the inauguration ceremony of a hospital in Dabhoi. A sadhu told him that he was the most photographed person on the earth. Swamishri did not pay any attention to this remark. Someone else added that Swamishri was the most garlanded person on the earth and if all his recognitions were added together, it would be a world record. Then, Swamishri remarked that if he payed heed to all this, there would be no time left for him to do bhakti and bhajan (which was his prime activity).

During another conversation, Swamishri was told that he should be awarded the Nobel Prize. Spontaneously, Swamishri replied that he had already received two Nobel Prizes in the form of his gurus, Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj. Swamishri was contented and satisfied from within and so continued doing countless tasks without any worldly expectations or recognitions.

Daniel Goleman, a Harvard professor who not only wrote about aspects of behavioural science in the New York Times, but is also a two-time nominee for the Pulitzer Prize. He writes about a very important aspect of exceptional leaders in his book, *Focus: The Hidden Driver of Excellence*. He says great leaders have the ability to focus on one task at a time, in spite of external sensory and emotional distractions, and to remain composed under any situation. This trait was visible in all of Swamishri's actions and works.

In 1974, Swamishri travelled by flight from Mumbai to Nairobi for satsang *vicharan*. Then, to everyone's surprise, the whole entourage was instructed to return to Mumbai on the same plane. Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami noted this incident in his report. He asked Pramukh Swami Maharaj how he felt about returning. Swamishri smiled and replied, "When you believe yourself to be *akshar* and *sevak* (servant) of God, these things don't affect you." Swamishri was fully composed and at ease when he returned to Mumbai. Then, the following morning, he heartily discoursed to an assembly of devotees.

Goleman further states that every leader must focus and have firm attention where it is most needed and in things that are most productive. As part of his exhaustive *vicharan*, Swamishri often visited the remote tribal regions with the sole objective of liberating them from the addiction of alcohol and many other vices. It was due to his tireless efforts that he edified 42 out of the 72 tribal villages of Dadra and Nagar Haveli in Gujarat. The extent of transformation was such that every house destroyed the tools and utensils used in making country liquor (*tadi*). The reason was so that their children and future generations would not have an inkling about the addictions their parents and forefathers had.

Jonah Berger is a marketing professor at the Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania, and an internationally acclaimed bestselling author of books like *Contagious, Invisible Influence* and *The Catalyst.* In *Contagious,* he reveals the secret behind the success of word-of-mouth and social transmission. According to him, a product or a service can become very popular, successful and reap great returns if it is spread through word of mouth effort. In 1992, after the inauguration of Akshardham in Gandhinagar, Swamishri blessed, "Akshardham is a divine complex, and whosoever visits it will naturally speak of its beauty to others, thus inspiring them to come." So much was the truth in Swamishri's words, that even after 30 years, there has been a constant flow of visitors round the year.

Steve Jobs, co-founder and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Apple Inc. had a knack of delivering quality products that catapulted his company into a mammoth corporate company. The quality of his products, like the i-Phone, i-Pad and others, is unparalleled to such an extent that as of date, there is a sale of ten i-phones every second on this planet. Similarly, quality and perfection were the hallmarks of every activity of Pramukh Swami Maharaj. In 2001, Gujarat was struck by an earthquake with catastrophic consequences. The epicentre of the earthquake was in Kutch. Immediately, the state government, BAPS and many prominent organizations launched relief activities. Later, BAPS also conducted a rehabilitation programme in which it constructed and renovated 50 schools and nine villages. In all, it built 1,500 concrete houses for the villagers. Mr P. Chino, a Japanese gentlemen and chairman of the Asian Development Bank (ADB), visited one of the reconstructed villages named Ukhad Mora. During his inspection, he was surprised and happy to see the quality of houses constructed by BAPS. In another example, Pramukh Swami Maharaj's emphasis on quality and perfection can be keenly observed in the Swaminarayan Mandir in Neasden, London. It has been hailed as the eighth wonder of the world by Reader's Digest.

One of the most important aspects of Swamishri's work was that he never compromised with values and disciplines. Globally renowned Stanford University psychologist Carol Dweck, in her path-breaking work, Mindset - Changing the Way You Think to Fulfill Your Potential, enlightens about a new psychology of success. She writes, "Some leaders have a closed mindset, i.e. a fixed mindset in certain activities, and an open mindset, i.e. a growth mindset, in case of other activities." Swamishri had these unique attributes. Regarding the principles of agna and upasana he had a very clear mindset of remaining firm and steadfast in observing established codes and principles. He would always insist that if there was any activity that compromised the value system, it would be better not to do it in spite of the humongous gains. On the other hand, he always exercised a growth mindset for activities connected with social welfare and the uplift of people.

Jim Collins is an American researcher, author, speaker and consultant with an expertise in business management, corporate sustainability and growth. His bestselling books include Good to Great, How the Mighty Fall and Build to Last. In his book, How the Mighty Fall, he mentions the prime reason for the downfall of giant conglomerates and mighty personnel: their undisciplined pursuit by compromising on values for attaining more and more. Once, Swamishri was in Gandhinagar. Mr Sunil Parekh, a manager of a newly inaugurated Bank of Baroda branch, requested Swamishri to be the first account holder of his branch. Swamishri informed Mr Parekh that he did not own a single penny in his name and that everything belonged to the BAPS Trust and Thakorji (Bhagwan Swaminarayan). On hearing this, Mr Parekh was astonished and he bowed with deep respect to Swamishri's morals. There are numerous such incidents in Swamishri's life that elucidate the fact that he strictly followed, till his last breath, the moral rules for a sadhu prescribed by Bhagwan Swaminarayan.

On another note, Collins states in *Good* to *Great* that leaders create a disciplined managerial workforce. Disciplined people place the objectives of the company ahead of their own personal successes and consider them as their personal responsibility. During the inauguration ceremony of Akshardham in Gandhinagar in 1992, Shri L. K. Advani was one of the dignitaries invited. When he met the volunteers, he congratulated them for doing such great seva. The volunteers responded by saying that the driving force behind them all was the guidance received from swamis of BAPS. On meeting the swamis and commending them for such a feat, the swamis stated that the ceaseless inspiration came from Pramukh Swami Maharaj. On meeting Pramukh Swami Maharaj he praised him for his work. In response, Swamishri immediately replied that such an event was possible only due to the tireless efforts of the volunteers and swamis and the blessings of God. Advaniji was awestruck by this and he spoke from the main dais about the selfless services rendered by the disciplined volunteers inspired by Pramukh Swami Maharaj. He added that no one wanted to take the credit and that everyone worked for the larger good.

For any leader, the biggest challenge is to create a succession plan to perpetuate the organizational legacy. There have been multiple instances in the world where organizations have achieved unprecedented successes under the leadership of the founder, but once he passes away or leaves, the organization fizzles out. In the case of BAPS, Pramukh Swami Maharaj appointed Mahant Swami Maharaj as his successor in a letter dated 20 July 2012. When the letter was read after Pramukh Swami Maharaj's earthly departure on 13 August 2016, hundreds of thousands of swamis and devotees instantly accepted this letter of declaration with full faith and trust.

Finally, based on all the three articles in this series we can conclude that Pramukh Swami Maharaj's people-based management, servantleadership, value- and faith-based humanitarian activities have set an inspiring paradigm for humanity. We pay our profound tributes to him on the occasion of his birth centenary year celebrations to be held in Ahmedabad from 15 December 2022 to 15 January 2023.

Soon, she realized that her son was destined to worship God and inspire others to do likewise. Finally, she happily agreed to allow her son to fulfil his ardent desire.


Manibhai was not financially sound because of his ailing business. So, other members of the family were not too keen to allow the freshly graduated Vinubhai to join the saffron order. Vinubhai's sister-in-law told Dr Ramanbhai to convey to Yogiji Maharaj, "Since Vinubhai has graduated with a B.Sc. degree it would be better if he worked for a while to earn money and become a sadhu later on." As soon as Ramanbhai conveyed her message, Yogiji Maharaj prophesied, "I will make Vinubhai into such a sadhu that through his wish people will gain lakhs of rupees." Vinubhai thus overcame many trials to become a sadhu. Now that everyone was willing to let him go he waited for the moment to leave home and take *diksha*.

RENOUNCING HOME

In 1956, Vinubhai completed his last year at college. He graduated with a B.Sc. degree in Agriculture. After his last exam, instead of going home, Vinubhai rushed off to Gondal to be with Yogiji Maharaj. That was his moment of renunciation. Thereafter, he never went home again. And surprisingly, he did not even go to receive his graduation certificate. It was indeed the climax of Vinubhai's renunciation. Vinubhai gave up his worldly life with great ease.

Between June and November 1990, Swamishri spent over four months in London coordinating the search for and visiting numerous prospective sites to build a *shikharbaddha* mandir in London, as per the wish of Yogiji Maharaj.

During his stay, on 19 October 1990, Swamishri celebrated the auspicious festival of Annakut – to mark the Hindu New Year.

For that occasion, Pujya Dr Swami, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami and the sadhus in Ahmedabad had sent a stacked triad of traditional *kalashes* filled with hand-peeled rice grains and covered by auspicious red cloths.

Dr Dipak Trivedi, a devotee from Ahmedabad, had brought them. He met Swamishri on Diwali, the previous day – 18 October 1990. Swamishri instructed that the *kalashes* be brought to the assembly after his puja the following day – New Year's Day.

As Swamishri was completing his puja on New Year's Day, Pujya Viveksagar Swami announced, "The wish of the sadhus in India is that a grand *shikharbaddha* mandir be built here and that it is crowned with *kalashes*." At that time, Swamishri was reading the Shikshapatri, but on hearing this, he immediately raised his right hand in acknowledgement, laughed and looked joyously at the senior devotees sitting before him.

Viveksagar Swami then continued, "The sadhus have hand-peeled around 28,500 rice grains (about 50g) – like Kushalkunvarba had done for Maharaj and have sent two prayers, which Dipakbhai will read."

Thereafter, Dr Trivedi read a prayer poem written by Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami and another prayer by the sadhus before presenting the stack of three *kalashes* and

hand-peeled rice grains to Swamishri. Swamishri placed the *kalashes* amid a tray of flowers and garlanded them.

In his New Year's blessings, Swamishri said, "Such is Bhagwan's grace that even before the foundations of the mandir have been dug, the *kalashes* have come." Then, wittily poking fun at the historically miserly nature of Ahmedabad natives, he continued, "And that, too, from Ahmedabad! So, as we have their support, we are now confident that the mandir will be built. Normally, Ahmedabadis don't give [they only take], but they have sent this with great affection!

"So, this is a good omen, received in advance. We want to place *kalashes* like this – one, two and three – so take note. The sadhus from Ahmedabad have sent these with great love, so keep them in one place and preserve them – CM [addressing the chairman of the UK Satsang Mandal, Shri C.M. Patel]. They are antique, not modern imitations. See, they have traditional designs – like in the past. Ahmedabadis would normally send imitations, but they have sent traditional ones; that reflect their inner sentiments. They are in our

support. That's a great thing. Those who have the support of Bhagwan and his sadhus, have everyone's support. It is Shastriji Maharaj's and Yogiji Maharaj's wish that a grand mandir be built and thousands of people benefit.

"They have also sent hand-peeled, unbroken rice." Then, Swamishri narrated the story of Kushalkunvarba who had similarly sent handpeeled unbroken rice grains to Shriji Maharaj with the prayer that he spiritually cleanse everyone.

"So, with this prayer they have sent rice grains,"


Swamishri concluded.

In this way, Swamishri accepted the *kalashes* and grains well before the London mandir construction had begun, and expressed his wish that the *kalashes* be preserved since they serve as a symbol of Bhagwan's and everyone's support to build the mandir.

Pramukh Swami Maharaj subsequently inaugurated the grand *shikharbaddha* BAPS Mandir in London in August 1995. True to his wishes, these *kalashes* are currently preserved there.

These *kalashes* remind us of Swamishri's firm faith that Yogiji Maharaj's vision of a *shikharbaddha* mandir in London would be fulfilled. And that the purpose of building mandirs is to spiritually purify all and enable everyone to experience the bliss of God.

THE TORCH GETS BRIGHTER

As one's knowledge and understanding of God's divine form develops and as proximity to God increases, one experiences a higher level of bliss – both quantitatively and qualitatively. Shriji Maharaj illustrates this using the analogy of a burning torch in Vachanamrut Panchala 1, "Consider the following example: The light from this burning torch which falls a short distance away is not as intense as the light in the vicinity of the torch. Very far away, there is no light at all. In the same way, elsewhere there is only a little bliss, but absolute bliss is only available in the vicinity of God. The further one is away from God, the less bliss

one experiences."

DEATH SENTENCE REDUCED TO A THORN PRICK

Many robbers lived in a particular town. Gangs stalked the streets and stole as they willed. Out of these, one particular thief used to regularly attend the spiritual discourses given by the local sadhu. Once, while on his way to the assembly his foot was pricked by a thorn. It became red and swollen. That night he could not join his team for their nightly loot. His friends, however, carried on without him. They broke into the king's treasury and succeeded in escaping with a lot of money. Overnight, they shared the wealth among themselves and slept as millionaires.

Hearing of their success, the family of the thief scolded him, "Just because you went to the assembly you were hurt, and so failed to join your friends in the robbery. You had to sit here and waste your time and didn't get a single penny!" While they said these words, the king's army arrived. They had tracked the robbers down and arrested all of them for execution. Even the innocent thief was lined up for death. But on seeing him, the sadhu and the local villagers stood up as witnesses and said that the thief had been hurt by a thorn and so he had not gone to steal the king's treasury that night.

The king pardoned him.

The thief thereafter was transformed into a law-abiding citizen. The rewards of engaging in satsang are immense. God protects even if one simply sits in a spiritual assembly. For the thief the death sentence was reduced to the prick of a thorn. These are the words of Bhagwan Swaminarayan in the Vachanamrut and they are the truth.

SPREAD OF INDIA'S CULTURE

Takakusu Junjiro (1866–1945 BCE), a Japanese academic and an internationally known Buddhist scholar, writes in his book *I-Tsing* about the famous Chinese traveller's (I-Tsing, 635–713 CE)



visit to India in 673 BCE. From his records one finds about India's outreach to several neighbouring eastern countries. "The whole coast of farther India from Suvarnabhumi (Indonesia) or Burma to China, and also of the islands of the Malay Archipelago, was studded with prosperous Indian colonies and naval stations, which ocean-liners regularly plying in the eastern waters between India and China constantly used as convenient halting places. I-Tsing refers to more than ten such colonies where Indian manners, customs, and religious practices prevailed together

Takakusu Junjiro with Sanskrit learning. These were Sri-Bhoja (Pelambang) in Sumatra, Kalinga in Java, Mahasin in Borneo (Barhinadwipa), and the islands of Bali, Bhojapara, etc., which had all Indian names, and afforded to Chinese pilgrims to India a good preparatory training."

SANT JNANESHVAR (1275-1296 CE)



Sant Jnaneshvar or Jnanadev was born into the Brahmin family of Vitthala Pant and Rakhumabai of Alandi in 1275 CE, near Pune, in Maharashtra. From a young age Jnaneshvar was intelligent and inclined towards devotion to God.

Once, a Brahmin spoke disparagingly to Jnaneshvar. Then he slightingly told him, "This buffalo is also called Jnanadev."

Jnaneshvar calmly replied, "Yes, the buffalo is also essentially an atman. We are all atmans. Names are temporary and superficial."

The Brahmin sneered, "Is that so?" Then he started hitting the buffalo. To his

surprise he saw welts on Jnaneshvar's back. The Brahmin felt remorseful and apologized to Jnaneshvar.

Once, a yogi named Changadev, believed to have conquered death, came to challenge Jnaneshvar on hearing of his fame. He came riding on a ferocious, wild lion, with a snake as his whip. At that time, Jnaneshvar was engaged in a spiritual discussion with his brother and sister. They were all sitting on a wall. When Jnaneshvar saw Changadev he flew along with his brother and sister to greet him. Changadev's ego dissolved and he humbly offered respects to Jnaneshvar.

Sant Jnaneshvar's fame spread through his discourses, which were a Marathi commentary on the Gita known as *Bhavarthadipika*. It is commonly known as *Jnaneshvari*.

JULY

- 2: Devotees offered devotion by performing the *tula* rituals of Swamishri's Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj.
- 7: Swamishri performed the *shila pujan* rituals for the proposed five-*shikhar* BAPS mandir in Paris and sanctified a mixture of cement and concrete to be used for the ritual.

Under the auspices of Pramukh Swami Maharaj Centenary Celebrations, lectures on the life and work of Pramukh Swami Maharaj were held in several universities of Gujarat in association with AARSH (Akshardham Centre for Applied Research in Social Harmony), Gandhinagar. - 9: Swamishri inaugurated an Aksharpith publication in Sanskrit on the 1,000 names of Nilkanth Varni: 'Shri Nilkanth-Vishwakalyan-Sahasra-Nam-Strotram'.
- 14: On the first day of the month-long *hindola* festival, Swamishri devotionally rocked the *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan in a large decorated *hindolo* in the mandir. Devotees savoured the divine darshan of Swamishri swinging Thakorji.
- 20: The day marked a historic moment that occurred

ten years ago, in 2012, when Pramukh Swami Maharaj wrote a letter declaring Mahant Swami Maharaj as his spiritual successor. Swamishri's morning puja was followed with speeches by Anandswarup Swami narrating the historic moment and Atmaswarup Swami praising the glory of Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj. Thereafter, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami read the historic letter written by Pramukh Swami Maharaj. In conclusion, Mahant Swami Maharaj blessed, "Whatever is being done is done by Maharaj. 26: HONOURING CHILDREN FOR ANTI-ADDICTION AND PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT CAMPAIGNS

Under the banner of the Pramukh Swami Maharaj Centenary Celebrations, BAPS children conducted anti-addiction and protect the environment campaigns for 15 days, during their summer vacation from 8 to 22 May, in Gujarat and other states. Swamishri presided over the evening Sunday satsang assembly to honour their efforts. Hundreds of children carried out a remarkable parade, displaying banners and dressed in appropriate costumes. JULY

■ 1: RATH YATRA FESTIVAL

Annually, the Jagannath Mandir, Ahmedabad, carries out a grand procession of chariots with the *murtis* of Bhagwan Jagannath, Balram and Subhadra through the city streets from early morning till evening. This year, the city witnessed the 145th *rath yatra* festival in which a decorated chariot from the BAPS also rolled on the streets to announce the centenary celebrations of Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

The *rath yatra* festival was celebrated at the BAPS mandir in the presence of Mahant Swami Maharaj. After his morning puja, Swamishri performed the *pujan* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj and thereafter they were installed in a remote controlled *rath* and steered on the stage. The devotees relished

Behind Swamishri's *rath*, swamis joyously sang festive bhajans and played cymbals and *kartals*.

The entire festival was relayed live to devotees seated in the Yagnapurush Sabhagruh.

3: YOUTH DAY



17: CHILDREN'S DAY

A children's day programme was held in today's Sunday satsang assembly. Children and volunteers presented skits, dances and video films based on the theme: Shantilal Is Our Ideal – Childhood Incidents of Pramukh Swami Maharaj. Inspiring stories were enacted of Pramukh Swami Maharaj as an ideal student, his spirit of devotion, resoluteness in obeying *niyams* and his renunciation of home to become a sadhu. The entire presentation was riveting and elevating.

AUGUST

7 (Shravan sud 10) & 13: PRAMUKH SWAMI MAHARAJ DAY


More than 40,000 children and families were inspired by the 'Island of Heroes' children's cultural adventureland at the 'Festival of Inspiration' – a historic 10-day community celebration to mark the birth centenary of Pramukh Swami Maharaj at BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir, London, from 22 to 31 July 2022.

The 'Island of Heroes' was one of the star attractions of the Festival – a fun, immersive experience for children and families to engage through theatrical shows, musical productions, a UV light show, 4D immersive experience, shadow play, escape room, obstacle course, interactive games, and much more.

Children were invited to set sail on an adventure through four distinct terrains – the Jungle of Gajendra, Mountain of Shravan, Sea of Squirrels, and Village of Shanti – and be inspired by heroes of the past and present to become the heroes of the future.

The journey motivated children and their parents to become shining members of our multi-cultural society, drawing upon the timeless wisdom of Hinduism and universal values lived by Pramukh Swami Maharaj. Adventurers also learned about contemporary values and issues, such as respect for Mother Earth and the environment, delivered through a powerful 4D experience in a relevant and practical way for children.

Navigators collected souvenir stamps and other mementos as they ventured through the 'Island of Heroes' and understood the respective values of each terrain, namely, faith, respect, hard work and kindness.



Younger children enjoyed their own journey of learning and discovery at the 'Little Heroes Forest', a fun zone with its own puppet show, wiggle cars, sandpit, arts & craft area, and more.

The 'Island of Heroes' was entirely designed, produced, directed and performed by children and youth volunteers of BAPS UK & Europe. More than 1,200 shows were delivered across the four terrains. The young cast had planned, prepared, and rehearsed for several months and over 450 children performed in these productions over the ten days.

The entire journey was supported by more than 650 volunteers, artists and crew members each day, who provided entertainment, energy and also educated visitors further to enrich their experience.

Visitors departed with renewed motivation and vigour to imbibe noble values in their lives. A ten-year-old girl delivered a handwritten letter to the mandir after her visit in which she wrote: "Me and my family went to the Island of Heroes Adventureland. It was amazing! The set up was just beautiful. It was all inspiring for me and my brother."

Claudio Giambrone, Head of Marketing for Wembley Park, London, one of the largest regeneration projects in Europe, observed, "What you have done here is incredible! It looks like something you would see at Sea Life or London Dungeons – like a Disneyworld. The difference is that those things cost millions of pounds to make. This was done by volunteers."

Professor Chris Butler, Professor of Primary Care at Oxford University, commented, "The involvement of the children that we saw across all the shows – helping around, performing, developing their confidence, developing their sense of citizenship and community engagement of selfless contribution.... That's the kind of person that makes me, as an older person, hopeful about the future."

The Akshar-Purushottam Adhyayan course focused on learning about the history of BAPS, Akshar-Purushottam Darshan, attachment to the Satpurush, learning how to sing Sanskrit verses from the Swaminarayan Siddhant Karika and discussions about the dedication of volunteers.

The Siddhant Sadhana course focused on understanding the Akshar-Purushottam philosophy in depth and its practical daily life applications.

SATSANG DIKSHA HOMATMAK PATH YAGNA 21 August 2022, Adelaide, Australia



As part of the inauguration ceremony of the BAPS Swaminarayan Research Institute, Australia, over a thousand devotees and well-wishers, in person and many more via the live webcast, participated in the 'Satsang Diksha Homatmak Path,' a special *yagna* ceremony that was the first of its kind in Australia.
