SWAMINARAYAN BLISS


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
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In April 1978, Pramukh Swami Maharaj inspired and inaugurated the first issue of *Swaminarayan Bliss* in Ahmedabad, Gujarat. The bi-monthly magazine serves to enlighten BAPS youths, seniors and well-wishers about the glory of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, the Akshar-Purushottam philosophy and the Gunatit guru *parampara*. It also seeks to inspire the universal values and traditions of Hinduism to pursue a happy and peaceful life by serving God and humankind.





PRE-PROGRAMME

Before the celebration assembly commenced, a video showcased the various programmes and events held throughout the year at BAPS satsang centres to felicitate *karyakars* and commemorate the Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav (KSM). The video featured key milestones such as the KSM launch assembly in the presence of Mahant Swami Maharaj, *karyakar jnan-satras*, *sant-karyakar* discussions, *sant-karyakar* get-togethers, *karyakar* online exams, *karyakar din* events, inauguration of the Karyakar Talim Kendra in Sarangpur, and the Divya Sannidhi Parvas – special *karyakar* conventions in the presence of Mahant Swami Maharaj.

Also, the traditional drum band from Dhule, Maharashtra, played rhythmic tunes as the gathered *karyakars* responded joyfully.

STAGE

The vibrant, mesmerizing main stage, accompanied by two satellite stages, beautifully depicted the celebration assembly theme of seeds, trees and fruits. The main stage featured murtis of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj and the guru parampara floating on clouds around a magnificent kalpavruksh tree, under which Mahant Swami Maharaj was seated. Complementing this was a resplendent rainbow, clouds, the Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav logo and other designs portraying the theme.

GRAND FINALE CELEBRATION BEGINS

The programme commenced at 5:00 p.m. with the chanting of the Swaminarayan mahamantra by BAPS youths, and was followed by a melliflous rendition of the Sankalp Geet – the karyakar anthem, 'Ame sau Swāminā bālak jivishu Swāmine māte...' The resounding chorus of 100,000 karyakars joining in this anthem of seva filled the stadium with divine joy, leaving many in tears of bliss and gratitude.



WELCOME ADDRESS: YAGNAPRIYA SWAMI



Welcoming the volunteers who had come from throughout India, USA, UK, Europe, Africa, Australia, New Zealand, the Middle East, and many other parts of the world, Yagnapriydas

Swami, head swami the BAPS Satsang Pravrutti Central Office, said, "From the start, Mahant Swami Maharaj has shown his immense enthusiasm for this celebration to pay tributes to the *karyakars*. He expressed his wish to personally meet every *karyakar*, and if his health had permitted, he wished even to visit the home of every *karyakar*. Inspired by his deep regard for *karyakars*, the year-long events were organized to honour and appreciate their contributions, culminating in this grand event at the Narendra Modi Stadium as a fitting tribute to their many decades of dedication.

"In a heartfelt letter to the *karyakars*, Mahant Swami Maharaj wrote, 'I remember you every day.' When asked why he had such enthusiasm for greeting the volunteers, he replied, 'Because of the dedication of the *karyakars*.'

"BAPS karyakars have consistently prioritized selfless service over their personal comfort. Pramukh Swami Maharaj often told the karyakars, 'Be righteous and create a righteous society.' To fulfil this vision, BAPS karyakars visit villages, towns and cities regularly, inspiring people to refrain from addictions and lead virtuous lives rooted in honesty and self-discipline.

"The international children and youth development activities by BAPS are also conducted by these committed volunteers. The *karyakars* also take the lead in organizing and executing festivals and relief work in the aftermanth of earthquakes, cyclones, floods and other natural disasters. They actively participate in and lead social campaigns such as tree plantation drives, cleanliness initiatives and tribal welfare projects.

"To ensure the success of these activities, *karyakars* dedicate significant amounts of time, by adjusting their personal commitments and social responsibilities. They seek no comfort, reward or recognition but remain steadfast in their *seva*.

"These volunteers are truly the hands and feet

of the Sanstha. Both Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj have often praised them, calling them, 'Like sadhus,' 'Like a moving mandir,' and 'More valuable than gold."

MAHANT SWAMI MAHARAJ'S WELCOME

At 5:30 p.m., Mahant Swami Maharaj was welcomed into the stadium, seated on a chariot decorated with flowers. While he circumambulated the perimeter of the ground, he gave darshan and offered his humble *pranams* to all the volunteers.

Around 550 children, donned in five-feet tall rose petals were lined up on both sides of Swamishri's circular path. As the chariot advanced, the rose petals swivelled to transform into golden petals, symbolizing that the association of the Satpurush has a transformative effect on people's lives. Also, five-feet diameter *mala* beads scattered around the central ground unified into a circular rosary signifying that the Satpurush unites people of different backgrounds to serve with purity and goodness. This heartfelt tribute and welcome

beautifully expressed the volunteers' connection with Mahant Swami Maharaj.

This unique presentation was performed by 955 children and youth *karyakars* dressed in handcrafted floral petals and beads.

Subsequently, as Swamishri exited the stadium to make his way to the main stage, the Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav anthem, 'Sevā ki Ek Param Jyoti Mahān...', echoed throughout the stadium while the performers created magnificent floral patterns and formations of diyas, homes and the word 'Swagatam' (Welcome) in Hindi in a scintillating visual display on the central ground.

ADDRESS BY ANANDSWARUP SWAMI



Anandswarup Swami narrated short storied about the selfless dedication of volunteers who have served the nation and society over the past five decades, "These volunteers have been serving selflessly with devotion, without any expectations of money, position or recognition. They serve with love and dedication to please their guru and God. In the Vachanamrut, Bhagwan Swaminarayan extols such *seva* as a form of devotion. Inspired by the lives of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj, these volunteers have achieved unimaginable spiritual heights through their *seva*.

"For example, during the 34-day Yogiji Maharaj Centenary Celebration in 1992, which included the inauguration of Swaminarayan Akshardham in Gandhinagar, millions of devotees visited the festival site. Impressed by the grand scale and impeccable management of the festival, an IIM professor met Doctor Swami to understand the management. Doctor Swami explained that the success of such a massive event was due to one key factor: the selfless services of the volunteers, whose sole aim was to please Pramukh Swami Maharaj.



"Once, Pramukh Swami Maharaj remarked, 'Even if I offer a million prostrations to these volunteers, it would still not suffice.'

"We are deeply thankful to Mahant Swami Maharaj for granting us this incredible opportunity to felicitate 100,000 volunteers together."

Thereafter, Adarshjivan Swami shared the words of Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj in praise and acknowledgement of the invaluable contributions of BAPS *karyakars* over the years. They are as follows.

On 22 August 2001, during a speech in Bharuch, Pramukh Swami Maharaj said, "Every *nirdeshak*, *sah-nirdeshak*, and *nirikshak* (*karyakar*) of BAPS is a mandir personified. Every *sant*, devotee, and *karyakar* of BAPS is a pilgrim place personified."

On 21 June 2001, while addressing *karyakars* in Tithal, Pramukh Swami Maharaj expressed, "Your sacrifice is as significant as renouncing a great kingdom. I hold all of you, who have imbibed Akshar-Purushottam *nishtha* in your hearts, in the highest regard."

On 3 July 1990, during a Karyakar Shibir in

New York, Pramukh Swami Maharaj described BAPS *karyakars*, "All those who are involved in the *seva* of this satsang are like our crown jewels."

Many dignitaries also expressed their admiration for the BAPS *karyakars*. The late Shri K.K. Doshi, who served for many years as the Indian ambassador in numerous countries, conveyed his appreciation to Pramukh Swami Maharaj in Delhi, "Having such *karyakars* is a great blessing for society. We often hear that India will become a superpower in the 21st century. When I see the BAPS *karyakars*, this future seems truly achievable. I feel proud to be an Indian because Pramukh Swami Maharaj has nurtured such selfless *karyakars*."

Similarly, B. Swaroop, from India's Settlement Commission, remarked, "I am amazed by the organizational capabilities and dedication of BAPS *karyakars*. I am deeply impressed by how these volunteers accomplish great tasks without the need for formal offices and without any conflicts."

MAHANT SWAMI MAHARAJ AND DIGNITARIES ARRIVE ON STAGE

Ishwarcharan Swami, International Convenor of BAPS, welcomed Mahant Swami Maharaj on the stage with a garland. He also warmly welcomed the Honourable Union Home Minister Shri Amitbhai Shah and the Honourable Chief Minister of Gujarat Shri Bhupendrabhai Patel with garlands.

Additionally, on the two stages flanking the main stage, senior swamis of BAPS honoured the other ministers with garlands and mementos.

LIGHTING THE INAUGURAL LAMP

Following this, Mahant Swami Maharaj, Honourable Union Home Minister Shri Amitbhai Shah, and Honourable Chief Minister of Gujarat Shri Bhupendrabhai Patel ceremonially lit the inaugural lamp to mark the commencement of the grand finale celebration.

Simultaneously, as the lamp was lit on stage, a digital lamp and giant Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav

logo, placed on the opposite side of the stadium, illuminated. The bright displays, surrounded by the national flags representing volunteers from 30 countries captured everyone's attention.

Moments later, the entire stadium became alive with the sparkle of fireworks that illuminated the ground periphery, creating a breathtaking spectacle. The electrifying atmosphere was amplified by the enthusiastic cheers of 100,000 *karyakars*, celebrating this extraordinary moment with great delight.



'Nadiyā na piye kabhi apnā jal, Vriksh na khāye kabhi apnā fal.



"Pramukh Swami Maharaj's love and blessings have been a cornerstone in my life. His affection felt like that of a father and his guidance has shaped me even before I was in public life, and afterwards during my tenure as Gujarat's Chief Minister and India's Prime Minister. I cherish moments like the Narmada water reaching Sabarmati when Pramukh Swami Maharaj came to bless that occasion, and also organizing the Swaminarayan Mahamantra and Mantra Lekhan Mahotsav under his leadership. These ideas of promoting *mahotsavs* of 'Mantra Lekhan' are unique in themselves. I have always received his blessings in all the social welfare activities.

"I, as a *karyakar*, can feel the divine presence and memories of Pramukh Swami Maharaj today. In our culture, it is said, 'Seva Param Dharma' – selfless service is the highest dharma. "Pramukh Swami Maharaj championed Indian family culture and strengthened the concept of joint families and family harmony through the 'Ghar Sabha' initiative. I urge you to carry forward this legacy. As India aims for development by 2047, the next 25 years are equally crucial for every BAPS *karyakar*.

Thereafter, Doctor Swami addressed the gathering with his inspiring insights, "What I am witnessing today in this Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav is truly a first-of-its-kind event.

This has been made possible through the inspiration of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and the Gunatit gurus. The purer we are, the more God works through us. We must align our lives and work with the conscious understanding that God is omniscient. We should honour our parents and gurus and treat every individual with respect. As stated in the Gita, we must perform our duties with integrity. Pramukh Swami Maharaj was able to achieve the unimaginable because of his pure heart. Every festival ultimately imparts the lesson to lead a virtuous life. I pray to Bhagwan Swaminarayan that we may gain the strength to lead such a pure and virtuous life."



MAIN PROGRAMME: PRESENTATIONS ON SEEDS, TREES, AND FRUITS

Thereafter, the central theme of the programme, 'Seeds, Trees, Fruits', was brought to life through enthralling presentations. The 160x140-metre field area of the stadium was transformed into a stunning presentation arena, featuring a series of mesmerizing performances by 2,000 youths and visual projections through 70 projectors. In sync with the presentations and projections, the preprogrammed 100,000 LED wristbands given to the volunteers seated in the stadium lit in 17 different colours and numerous designs such as the Indian tricolour, BAPS logo and many other thematic patterns.

THE SEEDS

FIRST SEGMENT: THE SEEDS - THE BEGINNING OF VOLUNTEER ACTIVITIES

In this segment, performers were dressed as seeds of various fruits, grains and flowers to depict the inception and nurturing of the BAPS selfless volunteer tradition over the past 117 years. The performers danced and performed to the music and commentary and brought to life the idea of seeds. As the seeds sprouted, they became united, disciplined, and organized. After the performance, a video presentation highlighted a brief history of BAPS volunteer activities.

The presentations depicted how the seeds of volunteerism were first planted by

Brahmaswarup Shastriji Maharaj, the founder of BAPS, and later nurtured by Brahmaswarup Yogiji Maharaj, leading to their gradual growth and development.

Pramukh Swami Maharaj established a central administrative office and structure for volunteers in 1972, in Mumbai, to guide and engage volunteers in large-scale service activities. Later, he also inspired a parallel central office and structure for BAPS women's activities.

ADDRESS BY ISHWARCHARAN SWAMI



In his address, Ishwarcharan Swami, a witness to the growth of the BAPS volunteer activities since its inception, shared, "During the time of Shastriji Maharaj, thousands of

volunteers came together to build mandirs. Later, when Yogiji Maharaj became the spiritual head of BAPS in 1951, he initiated the children's and youth activities. Through thousands of letters and personal counselling, he established hundreds of children's and youth forums and inspired thousands of satsang assemblies. Pramukh Swami Maharaj then nurtured this seed into a mighty tree, tirelessly travelling and inspiring millions globally. Today, under Mahant Swami Maharaj's

love, guidance and inspiration, these activities have flourished further.

"May we always remember our gurus and continue engaging in satsang and seva. Let us purify and transform ourselves, and, as PM Shri Modiji urged, make a firm resolve to contribute to society. Let us seek the blessings of Param Pujya Mahant Swami Maharaj to guide us on this virtuous path."

THE TREE

SECOND SEGMENT: THE TREES - A VALUE-**BASED VOLUNTEER FORCE**

This segment illustrated how the tiny seeds of selfless service grew into flourishing and sturdy trees, which symbolized how the BAPS volunteer activities spread across India and the world. The presentation also highlighted the inspiring stories of volunteers who remained steadfast in their duties despite facing adverse circumstances and challenges.

Videos showcasing the personal experiences of volunteers were displayed, narrating how Pramukh Swami Maharaj inspired individuals to engage in various service activities such as education, cleanliness drives, literacy campaigns, anti-addiction activities, family unity and more.

The video testimonials highlighted his care for volunteers' personal growth, his teachings on human nature and management, and his ability to instil qualities like truth, service, faith, and humility in volunteers from all walks of life – be they farmers, scientists or professionals from both India and abroad.

The *karyakars* whose video testimonials were showcased: Shri Jayendrabhai Vinchhi, Surat, Gujarat; Shri Rajeshbhai Gandhi, Amreli, Gujarat; Shrikrishna Pandya, Gondal, Gujarat; Shri Kanubhai Patel, Robbinsville, USA; and Shri Dineshbhai Patel, London, UK.

Thereafter, the central ground was filled with volunteers dressed as flourishing trees and blooming plants to symbolize the robust growth of these volunteers as selfless *karyakars*. Using laser projection the words *satya*, *seva*, *namrata*, and *shraddha* were projected in Hindi letters on the ground. In addition, to portray the volunteers' resilience in *seva* during adverse situations visual projections and physical portrayals of lightning, cyclones, and storms were presented.

STORIES OF WOMEN VOLUNTEERS

Thereafter, Jayesh Mandanka narrated some incidents from the lives of women volunteers of BAPS, highlighting their unwavering commitment to *seva* even in challenging circumstances.

Anandiben, Khadalpur, North Gujarat

After losing her husband, Anandiben became the sole breadwinner for her family, caring for her two sons, aged eleven and nine. Despite her limited primary education and numerous hardships, she took up cooking for five to six families to support her household. Over time, she learned to use a mobile phone and a vehicle to facilitate her *seva*. She also developed leadership and communication skills, enabling her to help others in need.

Lataben Chaudhari, Vyara-Mandvi, South Gujarat

Lataben serves as a sanyojika in the BAPS karyakar cadre. Her day begins at 7 a.m., working on a farm for two hours, followed by teaching at a school from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. After completing her household chores, she travels up to 60 km to visit villages, inspiring people about education, health, de-addiction, and value-based living. This relentless seva often requires her to return home late at night, sometimes causing difficulties in finding transport. She continues even on Sundays and holidays. Lataben also extends financial support to women in need while skillfully balancing her family, work, and seva commitments.

Damyantiben, Karcheliya, South Gujarat

Despite the challenges of transportation, Damyantiben, a farm worker, walks 6 km daily to carry out her satsang *seva*.

Saraswatiben, Kaparada, South Gujarat

Working in a factory to support her livelihood, Saraswatiben walks 8 to 10 km on foot regularly to perform *seva*.

Sangeetaben Pithadiya, Mumbai

After her husband tragically passed away in a workplace fire, Sangeetaben resumed *seva* as

a *karyakar* just seven days later. Her courage and devotion have been a source of inspiration for many in her community.

Sarojben, Rajpipla, South Gujarat

Even in the face of personal loss, Sarojben exemplifies selflessness. The day after her father's passing, she inspired people in four pre-planned assemblies, encouraging them to lead value-based lives.

Lakshmiben Gadhiya, Surat

For the past five years, Lakshmiben has been caring for her husband, who has been in a coma, while also leading volunteer activities as a dedicated *karyakar*. Her ability to manage her family responsibilities alongside her *seva* is truly commendable.

Other stories of volunteers who serve selflessly, by overcoming financial hardships, remote terrains, and life-threatening situations, were shared through speeches and video testimonials.

STORIES OF MEN VOLUNTEERS

Jiteshbhai, Gandhinagar

Jiteshbhai, an engineer in the Gandhinagar Electricity Board, has faced numerous personal challenges. His father has been battling kidney-related issues for years, and his mother suffers from leg and back ailments. After eight years of marriage, he was blessed with two children, only to discover after a year that one of them had muscular dystrophy, an incurable condition. Later, he himself was diagnosed with a health condition. Amidst all this, his job location was changed, requiring him to commute 110 km from home. Despite these overwhelming difficulties, Jiteshbhai remains committed to *seva*, continuing his selfless service every week.

Omprakashbhai, Agra

Omprakashbhai works in Jhansi from Monday to Saturday. After completing his job each week, he travels back to Agra and dedicate his time to organizing *bal sabhas*. His commitment to nurturing young minds, despite his hectic schedule, exemplifies his devotion to *seva*.

Bachubhai Rathva, Chhota Udepur

Hailing from a remote tribal village, Bachubhai walks through treacherous jungle paths to perform *seva*. Often encountering wild animals on his way, he remains undeterred. His *seva* involves visiting small homes to help individuals overcome addictions and inspiring them to lead pure and value-based lives.

Ketanbhai, Bharuch

When Ketanbhai discovered that his colleague had contracted COVID-19 and needed immediate treatment in Vadodara, he didn't hesitate. He personally accompanied him to Vadodara and ensured he received proper care. Despite the life-threatening risks, Ketanbhai continued his *seva*, supporting his colleague until he fully recovered.

DOCUMENTARY DRAMA VIDEO

A documentary drama video was presented showcasing the inspiring story of BAPS karyakar Nileshbhai Rathod, a senior children's activities karyakar in Lathidad, Gujarat. Faced with the immense challenge of managing a significant sum for the cancer treatment of Naresh, a close family member, Nileshbhai made the difficult decision to sell his clothing shop, vehicle, and jewellery. Despite being in a grave financial situation, he started working as a vegetable vendor to sustain his family, but never let these hardships affect his seva.

Even when he endured the heartbreaking loss of Naresh, Nileshbhai remained steadfast in his commitment to *seva* and continued his responsibilities as a *karyakar*. Fellow *karyakars* suggested that the Sanstha could provide him with financial assistance during such a difficult time, but he declined, stating that his role was to serve, not to seek anything in return from the Sanstha.

Remarkably, Nileshbhai prioritized *seva* for the mandir construction over the income he could have earned from selling vegetables. His unwavering dedication exemplifies the selfless spirit of a true *karyakar*.



THE THIRD SEGMENT: FRUITS - A SACRED AND PEACEFUL WORLD

This segment highlighted the sweet fruits of the selfless services rendered by BAPS volunteers, which have touched and transformed the lives of millions in society.

A video showcasing BAPS's global humanitarian initiatives highlighted the remarkable efforts of its volunteers. Symbolic depictions of fruits growing in the sky and cloud formations illustrated the extraordinary accomplishments achieved through their selfless services.

Flags representing 30 countries, where BAPS volunteers actively engage in humanitarian work, were prominently displayed, symbolizing their global reach and dedication. The presentation mesmerized the audience, especially with the synchronized illumination patterns and colours of the LED wristbands the volunteers were wearing.

POWER OF MANY BAPS VOLUNTEERS



Following this, Brahmavihari Swami described what many BAPS volunteers together can achieve, "There is no better day and time to honour volunteers than today – the auspicious

occasion of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's birthday. When volunteers are selfless and the fruits of their service benefit all, humanitarian efforts on a global scale become possible.

"Normally, a stadium is divided – one team wins, and the other loses. One side celebrates, and the other mourns. But today, we are one team

 a team of oneness. There is no competition here; instead, this is a moment of completion.
 This is a programme of enlightenment, not entertainment.

"PM Modi once shared that whoever met Pramukh Swami Maharaj, regardless of their professional capacity, left as a greater person than before.

"What can 100,000 volunteers accomplish? We saw during the Pramukh Swami Maharaj Shatabdi Mahotsav what 80,000 volunteers achieved. They transformed 600 acres of land into heaven. It became a land of ideas and inspirations – a town of transformation. That was the power of many."

Then a video showing highlights of the one-month Pramukh Swami Shatabdi Mahotsav held in Ahmedabad (2022–2023) was shown. Over 600 acres of barren land were transformed into a verdant festival site, where 12.1 million visitors gained moral, cultural and spiritual inspirations. Volunteers served with humility, feeding lakhs of people daily, and inspiring many to take

pledges to give up addictions and foster family unity. The 80,000 volunteers devoted themselves completely, offering their time, energy, and resources selflessly.

POWER OF FEW BAPS VOLUNTEERS

Continuing his speech, Brahmavihari Swami said, "Does the power of BAPS volunteers lie in numbers? No, it lies in 'Samp, Suhrudbhav, Ekta.' It lies in unity. Because we live and work for one, we can truly experience the power of unity.

"On 27 February 2022, PM Shri Narendrabhai Modi called at 12:30 a.m. requesting our help. Following his request and with the blessings of Mahant Swami Maharaj, BAPS mobilized 64 volunteers from 11 countries to serve in Poland on the border with Ukraine, from where Indian students were being evacuated due to the war. PM Modi was well aware of the practical challenges of mobilizing volunteers in a war zone, but he had even greater faith in the BAPS *karyakars*. That is why he made that call at midnight.

"You have earned this trust. Those 64 volunteers served in freezing conditions, sharing just 10 beds among themselves and taking 3-hour shifts to sleep. Let us now reflect on the extraordinary power of just a few BAPS karyakars."

The next video highlighted the BAPS relief work in the Ukraine war zone. It showed how within a day after PM Shri Narendrbhai Modi requested for help, relief camps were operational to provide food, warmth, and shelter to over 3,700 stranded Indian students. A summary:

- 64 BAPS volunteers from 11 countries, collectively travelled 89,000 km to reach the relief camp
 - 3,700 students evacuated from Poland
- Over 10,000 hot vegetarian meals cooked and served.

POWER OF ONE BAPS VOLUNTEER

In the final part of his speech, Brahmavihari Swami shared, "Even a single BAPS volunteer has the power to lead change and transform an entire village. It took just one Neil Armstrong to step on the moon, and the world began exploring space. It took just one Thomas Edison to invent the light bulb, and our nights were illuminated. It took just one Mahatma Gandhi for the world to realize that non-violent revolutions are possible. It took just one Edmund Hillary to climb Mount Everest, and suddenly we all felt elevated. It took just one Sardar Patel to unite India and make it strong.

"The darker it gets, the more important a single candle becomes. Each BAPS *karyakar* shines with the light of Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj. This is because of their character, calibre, charisma, and above all, their guru-bhakti. Let us witness the power of just one BAPS *karyakar*."

The third video featured stories of the transformative work accomplished by individual BAPS volunteers:

Shashikantbhai Patel, Bavli-Vankaner

Shashikantbhai (1948-2023) inspired transformations of four villages near his native Bavli-Vankaner tribal region of South Gujarat. These villages were once plagued by rampant addiction to alcohol and cigarettes, along with deep-rooted superstitions and widespread domestic violence. The testimonials of locals depicted the dire state of these villages, where life was engulfed in darkness. People feared entering the area after 6 p.m., and domestic violence affected nearly every household. Even children were addicted to tobacco and cigarettes, with many neglecting school. Festivals were marked by animal sacrifices, and in times of illness, villagers turned to bhuvas (local shamans) instead of seeking medical care.

Over four decades of tireless effort, Shashikantbhai brought about a remarkable change. A well-educated and experienced lady teacher shared how his work enabled many to pursue higher education, and today, they are helping students in these same villages. An elderly woman expressed that the transformations inspired by Shashikantbhai led them to adopt a pure vegetarian lifestyle rooted in devotion.

Another villager described how Shashikantbhai's efforts created devout, happy lives for the community, where even the children became righteous. Reflecting on the joyful faces of these children, he remarked, "In their smiles, I see the face of Shashikantbhai."

Dr Dilipbhai Patel, USA

In a jail in California, where 1,500 out of 3,000 prisoners had tested positive for COVID-19, no doctor was willing to enter due to the lifethreatening risks. In this dire situation, he stepped forward, stayed for an entire month, and treated the patients with unwavering dedication.

Shri Subhashbhai Patel, Tanzania

In the village of Lugoba, Tanzania, many girl students were abandoning their studies due to the fear of harassment. Witnessing this, Subhashbhai built the Lugoba Girls Hostel, with a capacity to accommodate 1,500 students, providing them with a safe environment to continue their education.

In addition, he arranged free heart surgeries for 250 children born with congenital heart defects at the Jakaya Kikwete Cardiac Institute, giving them a new lease of life.

Due to his selfless service, over 5,000 African people attended Shri Subhashbhai's final rites to pay their last respects, a testament to his profound impact on their lives.

Shri Nileshbhai, Australia

He has spread the message of family harmony and spiritual values to more than 300 families.

Shri Kuldeepsinh, UK

In just two years, he helped over 550 Indians overcome addictions and inspired them to adopt a vegetarian lifestyle.

Dr Vaghani, Saurashtra, Gujarat

Since 1987, he has provided free medical treatment to thousands of underprivileged individuals.

Shri Kailashbhai, Ukai, Gujarat

For over three decades, he has offered free education to thousands of students in the tribal regions of Ukai.

Shri Dhanjibhai Ghelani, Bhavnagar, Gujarat

For the past 20 years, he has upheld a personal vow to abstain from eating a meal at home until he has helped at least one person overcome their addiction each day.

SHRI BHUPENDRABHAI PATEL, CHIEF MINISTER, GUJARAT




through his life and actions. The contributions of the Swaminarayan tradition in education, character-building, and societal transformation are truly remarkable.

Following Mahant Swami Maharaj's blessings, senior swamis honoured him with garlands on behalf of all the volunteers. The festival concluded with the *maha-arti* performed by 100,000 volunteers.

Finally, children, and youth karyakars performed a vibrant dance on the lyrics, 'Kāryakaranam Abhivandanam, Samarpitanam Abhivandanam...,' to express reverence and gratitude to all the volunteers.

The grand finale celebration concluded with a spectacular fusion of sensational wristband lighting effects and a stunning fireworks display.

Spirited chants of 'Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav ni Jai' concluded the celebration event. The volunteers were overwhelmed and privileged to have witnessed this historic occasion. They all bid adieu with a profound sense of fulfilment, inner joy and a renewed spirit to serve more. The

Gearing Up for the Grand Finale



The spectacular four-hour International Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav Grand Finale Celebration was a mesmerizing mosaic of colourful costumes, delightful sights, melodious sounds and inspiring presentations. The smooth execution of the event was possible due to the many months of meticulous planning and preparations and the combined and coordinated efforts of swamis and volunteers serving in 38 departments. The following provides a brief account of some of the background efforts that ensured the success of this historic occasion.

SABHA PROGRAMMES DEPARTMENT

Planning for the grand finale celebration assembly began in May 2024. After several rounds of discussions, the 'Seeds, Trees, Fruits' theme was finalized. Thereafter, the script was written and each element of the programme was visualized in detail. The programmes team coordinated with the cultural, decoration, audio-visual, and other teams to plan the presentations of each element including dances, displays, videos, visuals, lighting, projections and other features. A key decision was to set up the main stage, two satellite stages to seat invited dignitaries, and a performing stage in front of the media pavilion. Also, excluding the area of the pitches, the entire grass outfield would be used as a performing arena. A large projection screen would cover the pitches.

CULTURAL DEPARTMENT

Based on the theme and script on the assembly, the cultural programmes team designed the dances and displays appropriate for each element. They choreographed the presentations to match the lyrics of the specially scripted songs and other messages.

The cultural presentation team was tasked to identity and select 2,000 performers. In past celebrations, around 200 would be used for stage performances, so this was a tenfold increase in performers and a larger performance area.

Due to the large size and weights of the props, the children and youths had to meet certain physical requirements. With great support from the BAPS hostels, *vidyamandirs* and youth centres, the required number of performers were selected from the BAPS *vidyamandirs* in Gondal, Sarangpur and Atladara, the BAPS *chhatralayas*

in Nadiad, Vidyanagar and Atladara, and BAPS youths centres in Ahmedabad, Atladara, Surat, Anand, Rajkot, Mumbai, Tithal and Bhavnagar.

Choreography

The creative designers and choreographers were BAPS youths: Yogin Gajjar, Nayan Chhaniyara, Manoj Solanki (Gandhinagar); Kalpesh Patel, Yogesh Kantharia (Surat); and Harsh Bhatt (Bhavnagar). One of the challenges for them was to ensure that the patterns were clearly visible and obvious to the audience sitting at various heights in the stadium periphery.

They divided the ground performance area into quarters and designed dances and displays to match the lyrics, music and mood of the programme. Six weeks prior the grand finale, practices started in Gondal, Surat, Atladara, Anand and Ahmedabad. This team of six youths went regularly to the practice locations, and with the help of other youths, guided the selected performers, many of whom had no dance experience and so were patiently trained. The selected performers at each location were assigned particular portions of the performance, which they practised locally. Due to the large number of performers for each performance, big grounds for practices were required. Where these were not available, that group was further divided to take turns in practising their part of the performance.

The props to be used by the performers were designed and tested by the swamis and lead volunteers. They adjusted the structure and used material that minimized the weight so that the performers could comfortably carry them and perform their routines.

The participants practised without the actual large props they would be lifting, since they were still being made. So, to mimic the size and weight of the props, each performer held six-foot sticks to help gauge positioning and carried sandbags.

Only on 1 December 2024 were all the performers able to gather at the Narendra Modi Stadium to practise together on the actual performance arena. When all the groups practised in the stadium for the first time, confusion ensued, since the scale of the performance arena was vast and no ground-positioning markers were possible. However, the trainers patiently guided the children and youth performers to orient them in the required ways.

To prevent undue damage to the special grass of the outfield, the practice times were carefully managed to allow the ground maintenance staff to water the grass. Also, the performers practised and performed in bare feet, to minimize damage to the ground.

The presentation was divided into the welcome, seeds, trees, fruits, *maha-arti* and concluding sections.

The cultural presentation team also liaised closely with, among others, the decoration team to ensure that the large, bulky props would be suitable for lifting and performing; the audio-visual teams to ensure proper capture of the dances and displays from multiple angles; and the projection team for the visuals projected onto the ground screens.

DECORATIONS DEPARTMENT

The decorations team were responsible for erecting and embellishing the main and other stages and preparing all the props for the performers. The structure and outer designs of all the props were made using metal rods, cloth, fibre reinforced plastic (FRP) and other materials. Props were designed to be visually striking yet manageable for performers, aligning with the choreography and themes. The following main props were made:

Mala beads: 225, 4 ft (H) x 5 ft (W).

Petals: 570, ranging in size from 4.5×3.5 ft to 15×8 ft.

Trees, shrubs, bushes and grass: 294, ranging in height from 5 ft to 12 ft.

Seeds of kidney beans, wheat, maize, peanuts and *chana* (gram): 50, ranging in size from 5 to 8 feet.

Fruits – mangos, pineapples, strawberries, grapes, bananas: 60, up to 8 feet high.

Big fruits (each housing around 2,000 balloons for release during the performance) – pomegranate, guava, mango, orange: 6, each 10 feet high.

Flowers of various types: 52, ranging in height from 5 to 15 feet.

Chinese fans: 120 Bird wings: 108 BAPS flags: 100,000

Maha-artis: 200, each with up to 32 diyas.

TAILORING DEPARTMENT

The Darji (Tailoring) Department achieved several important tasks:

- 1. Various costumes for all 2,000 performers.
- 2. Stitching the 190 by 262 ft stretchable projection screen. This was a special non-creasing fabric that also allowed the grass to breathe. The Sky company in Lathidad gave much assistance in accomplishing this task.
- 3. The 80 by 110 ft Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav logo that was placed at the centre of the ground during Swamishri's welcome parade.
- 4. Triangular 50 ft wide by 80 ft long welcome banners for hanging on the outer wall of the stadium.

The dedicated efforts of scores of tailors working in shifts successfully completed the tasks in the relatively short time available.

LIGHTING AND PROJECTION DEPARTMENTS

The majority of the grand finale programme took place after sunset. Hence, a variety of conventional and laser lighting and projection was used to enhance the atmosphere and accompany the various performances.

The lighting, projection, cultural, audio-visual, screens and LED wristband teams coordinated the

ambient lighting and the different lighting effects and intensity for each element of the programme to ensure that the images and messages displayed on the large ground projection screen were properly visible.

The in-house lighting and projection teams learnt how to operate the required software and consoles and pre-programmed the sequences as required.

The coordinated efforts of the various departments created an immersive experience that highlighted each element of the programme while maintaining clarity for the audience seated across the stadium.

LED WRISTBANDS

To create static and moving lighting patterns and coloured sequences among the seated 100,000 volunteers, LED wristbands were used. Each of the stadium seats was individually counted and the seats were divided into sections. Then, computer simulations of the various displays and colour patterns were prepared and finalized.

The wristbands were programmed to display various colours, hence each seat was assigned a particular wristband from the 20 programmed variations. Each seating section had combinations of the 20 types to produce the required patterns and colour sequences for that section.

The mammoth task of setting, labelling and

packing the LED wristbands for each seating section took one week. A map for each seating section was prepared, specifying which type of wristband to give the occupant of a particular seat. These meticulous preparations were matched by the efficient and accurate distribution by the Sabha Arrangements Department volunteers. Since this exercise could not be rehearsed, everyone was delighted when the LED pattern and colour sequences were reproduced exactly as planned.

BROADCAST DEPARTMENT

The challenge of filming and broadcasting this event was that, in addition to the main and satellite stages, the performance arena was the 555 by 465 ft ground. Therefore, 360-degree coverage was required.

An experienced team of youths from India, UK, USA, Africa and Australia planned for the event. The team built on its experiences from the Pramukh Swami Maharaj Centenary (2022–3), Robbinsville Akshardham opening (2023) and the Abu Dhabi mandir *murti-pratishtha* (2024), deciding the type and quantity of equipment required, how the visuals would be captured and other operational aspects. Broadcast cameras, Steadycam, Spydercam, drones, and an Agito Dolly on Stage with Mag Track were among the equipment used to ensure a successful broadcast.

ACCOMMODATIONS DEPARTMENT

The Accommodations Department arranged lodgings for over 14,000 volunteers. These included:

- 1. Volunteers who helped for many weeks in the preparations for the grand finale celebration.
 - 2. The 2,000 performers.
- 3. Volunteers attending from outside Gujarat. Around 10 builders provided 900 flats of different capacities at 20 locations to accommodate the volunteers.

The builders accelerated their building completion schedules and ensured that the required amenities and permissions were obtained.

KITCHEN DEPARTMENT

Swamis and volunteers of the Kitchen Department operated out of the BAPS Vidyamandir in Raisan, midway between Ahmedabad and Gandhinagar. From 24 November till 8 December the department cooked all the food there and set up a system to supply the required amounts of food for breakfast, lunch and dinner to the volunteers serving at the stadium and at the various accommodation locations.

The department also cooked, packaged, transported and distributed the 100,00013-item *prasad* dishes for the volunteers on 7 December.

HOUSEKEEPING DEPARTMENT

Prior to the event, the Housekeeping

Department cleaned the entire stadium – sweeping every nook and corner and wiping each seat clean. The stadium staff were impressed by the volunteers' efficient methods – which saved time and water. After the event, the stadium was cleaned in one day to the complete satisfaction of the stadium staff.

CONSTRUCTION DEPARTMENT

The Construction Department set up temporary office and storage spaces for the various departments active at the stadium, as well as extra toilets and bathrooms. They also cleared and levelled large swathes of land on the Sabarmati Riverfront adjacent to the stadium for parking.

OTHER DEPARTMENTS

The services of the Transport, Parking, Security, Sabha Arrangements, Medical, General Stores and other departments were instrumental in ensuring the smooth execution of the celebration.

SPCO AND BPCO

The swamis of the Satsang Pravutti Central Office (SPCO), led by Yagnapriya Swami, and the Bal Pravrutti Central Office (BPCO), led by Vishwaswarup Swami, were jointly responsible for the projects carried out during the yearlong celebrations and every aspect of the grand finale celebration.

During the last month, they coordinated the daily inter-departmental meetings to review the completed and remaining work and resolve any difficulties.

They meticulously identified past *karyakars* and ensured that, together with present *karyakars*, they attended the the grand finale. They issued QR-coded entry passes to each of the 100,000 *karyakars* who attended, coordinated their arrival and departure modes and timings, and accommodation, if required. The logistical challenges were admirably tackled enabling all to enjoy the occasion without difficulty.

The Grand Finale Celebration was attended

In particular the day-to-day support and guidance of Anilbhai Patel, GCA secretary, and Kashyap Rawal were instrumental in ensuring the timely completion of all preparations and the smooth Grand Finale Celebration.

CONCLUSION

The grand finale of the Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav transformed the Narendra Modi Stadium into a vibrant canvas of lights, colours and sounds embodying the profound theme of 'Seeds, Trees, Fruits,' representing growth, dedication, and the fruits of collective effort. Each department played a crucial role in creating a seamless and aweinspiring event that was a testament to the power of collaboration and unwavering dedication. The harmonious interplay between the various teams ensured every detail - from the intricate costumes and dazzling props to the flawless projection and lighting - came together to leave an indelible mark on all the attendees. This event not only celebrated BAPS karyakars but also showcased what their unity, devotion, and excellence can achieve.





The BAPS Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav, hosted at the same Narendra Modi Stadium where the World Cup Final was held, has garnered attention worldwide. instance, he recalled how a single call from him mobilized BAPS volunteers to assist during the Ukraine crisis.

The programme was unparalleled. I was present at the event, and I must say, even the biggest concerts cannot match what I witnessed there. The entire stadium floor was transformed into a giant screen, showcasing breathtaking visuals of BAPS's history, *seva* and guru *parampara*. The combination of magnificent lighting, projections and storytelling created an atmosphere like no other. The light show, followed by fireworks, left the audience spellbound.

Adding to the experience, each attendee wore a synchronized wristband that lit up in various colours, controlled centrally. This level of coordination and grandeur rivalled even the biggest rock star concerts, and all of this was done to honour the volunteers.

BAPS volunteers never shy away from *seva*, no matter how challenging the situation. During the Gujarat earthquake, over 6,500 volunteers served tirelessly, providing meals to 40,000 people daily for 45 days. They built 655 tin shelters for 3,000 people and distributed medical services to 45,000 individuals through mobile medical vans.

Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, 1,000 sadhus and 5,000 BAPS volunteers served tirelessly. They distributed over 600,000 meal packets and ration kits; and extended medical support to the needy.

BAPS also played a critical role during the Ukraine crisis, helping evacuate thousands of Indian students and arranging meals for over 1,000 refugees.

The programme was inaugurated by Amit Shah, the Honourable Union Home Minister, alongside Mahant Swami Maharaj, followed by a spectacular cultural presentation.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi shared an incredible story during the event: When thousands of Indian students reached Poland during the Ukraine war, he personally called BAPS sadhus around 1 a.m., requesting their help. Within hours, BAPS volunteers mobilized to provide critical assistance, ensuring the students' safety.

This event was not just a celebration; it was a testament to the power of selfless service, unity, and devotion demonstrated by BAPS volunteers."



Mahant Swami Maharaj's Profound Respect and Glory for Karyakars

For over four decades Mahant Swami and Dr. Swami, as sadgurus, had addressed karyakars (volunteers) during the annual three-day shibirs (training camps). For all the shibirs, Mahant Swami diligently contemplated, noted and prepared for his speeches by spending at least a week in a quiet satsang centre or mandir. He thoroughly cares for, appreciates and respects the volunteers for their long-standing selfless seva and sacrifice in times of calamity and societal needs, and also for their efforts in satsang projects like ghar sabha, anti-addiction, family harmony, and character- and faith-building in children and youths. When the proposal to celebrate 50 years of seva rendered by the karyakars and to felicitate them was made, Mahant Swami Maharaj enthusiastically approved of it and emphasized that it should be done. Thereafter, the year-long Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav was formally launched in 2024. The following incidents reflect Mahant Swami Maharaj's care, love, and respect for the karyakars.

HAILING THE JAI TWICE (Bochasan)



On 22 November 2023 in Bochasan, the swamis of the Satsang Pravrutti Central Office (SPCO) and Bal Pravrutti Central Office (BPCO) sat with Mahant Swami Maharaj to inform him about the year-long Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav programmes for appreciating the seva of karyakars. During the meeting, Swamishri underscored the importance of karyakars by raising his hands and said, "If there were no karyakars we would be handicapped." Thereafter, when Swamishri was requested to be present during the Divya Sannidhi Parva he replied emphatically, "I have (and want) to remain present. Because of other work this is left out." In the concluding part of the meeting,

Swamishri stressed that the (grand finale) Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav should be celebrated supremely. And then Swamishri hailed the *jai* of the Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav three times.

Once, Swamishri's attendant swamis asked him whether he hailed the Mahotsav *jai* twice on every occasion so that he could remember it. Swamishri replied, "No, I do so because of their [immense] sacrifice and efforts."

LAUNCH OF KARYAKAR SUVARNA MAHOTSAV (Surat)




On 28 January 2024, the year-long Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav was launched by Swamishri in a grand assembly of *karyakars* in Surat. Swamishri

was asked in what way he wished to felicitate the *karyakars*. Swamishri responded, "With pure, unbroken rice grains. Swamis will, on my behalf, peel the husks of rice grains and shower them on the *karyakars* to honour them." Later, Swamishri himself at the age of 91 years peeled 10 rice grains.

On 3 February 2024, Swamishri wrote a letter to swamis from Surat regarding how they should peel the rice grains. One very important point Swamishri mentioned was that while peeling the rice grains they should think about the *mahima* of *karyakars*.

MY MIND IS IN YOU (Abu Dhabi)



On 14 February 2024, Swamishri consecrated the historic BAPS Hindu Mandir in Abu Dhabi, which gained global interest and praise through the international media coverage. It was through Swamishri's blessings that the mandir was accomplished.

Once the *murti-pratishtha* was over, Swamishri retired for his morning rest. After waking up, Swamishri wrote a letter addressed to all the *karyakars*. He instructed his attendant swami to arrange for the letter to be delivered to all the *karyakars* on that

very day. Then, Swamishri added that he should be informed once the letter had reached all the *karyakars*. The content of the letter is as follows.


"Today is the festival of Vasant Panchami. It is the birthday of our guru Shastriji Maharaj. It is the *murti-pratishtha* celebration of the grand and divine mandir in Abu Dhabi. I remember you daily and I have also remembered you today. I just cannot forget the *seva* you all do. Today, while I was performing the *pratishtha arti* in the mandir I was remembering you all.

In my mind, you are all grand and divine Akshardhams created by Pramukh Swami Maharaj, because you are dedicated devotees of Akshar-Purushottam, observe *niyams* and dharma and serve [selflessly].

Your mind is focused on the Abu Dhabi mandir and my mind is focused on you.

May you be victorious, [truly] victorious."

SWAMISHRI'S WISH TO GIVE LABH (Ahmedabad)



On 23 February 2024, Swamishri returned from Abu Dhabi to Ahmedabad. Here, at the BAPS Yogiji Maharaj Hospital, Swamishri was recuperating after his hectic schedules and exertions in Abu Dhabi.

During his stay at the hospital, Shrutipriya Swami informed Swamishri that for the Divya Sannidhi Parva (camp for *karyakars*) organized in Sarangpur, he would have to go twice each day to the assembly to give *labh*. Swamishri responded emphatically, "I will definitely go."

Then, on the last day of the *karyakar* camp, it was decided to serve *dudhpak* and mango juice as *prasad* for lunch to all the *karyakars*. Similarly, Swamishri, would also be required to have *dudhpak* and mango juice for lunch. So, Shrutipriya Swami asked whether it would be conducive to him to first have mango juice and then, fifteen to twenty minutes later, drink *dudhpak*. Swamishri agreed to have both the items and said, "Serve me only rice from the *dudhpak*."

To please the *karyakar*s Swamishri agreed, even though having mango juice and *dudhpak* one after the other was not suitable to him.

One day, during Swamishri's stay at the hospital, he noticed that a swami was not present for peeling rice grains for the *karyakars*. He then revealed, "If my health was good I would have peeled heaps and heaps of rice grains."

Such was Swamishri's spirit to honour the karyakars.

I WOULD GO TO ALL KARYAKARS' HOMES (Sarangpur)

On 11 April 2024, the day prior to the Divya Sannidhi Parva in Sarangpur, the swamis of the satsang activities central office sat in a meeting with Swamishri. At that time, Swamishri gestured with both his hands, "If my legs were well and strong I would go to all the *karyakars*' homes and embrace them."

Swamishri's profound inclination to please all the *karyakars* is apparent from his words.

HIS ABUNDANT LOVE AND APPRECIATION FOR KARYAKARS (Sarangpur)

Earlier, Swamishri's attendant swamis had asked him about what sweet item he wished to be included for lunch for the *karyakars* on the concluding day of the Divya Sannidhi Parva. Swamishri had answered, "Dudhpak."

On the penultimate day of the Divya Sannidhi Parva (11 April 2024) in Sarangpur, Swamishri came to the mandir kitchen at 1.45 p.m., where



the dudhpak was being made for the karyakars for the following day. Then, Swamishri put 12 rice grains, that he had peeled in Surat, into the large vessel containing milk. Then, he added saffron (kesar) and dry fruits, and mixed them with a ladle.

Shrutipriya Swami asked Swamishri, "Tomorrow, this sanctified *dudhpak* will be consumed by the *karyakars*, so how will it benefit them?"

Swamishri instantly replied, "They will become pure." Then, Swamishri was asked how much *dudhpak* he would like to drink the next day. He replied one spoonful.

The next day, 12 April 2024, the sanctified dudhpak was brought to Swamishri during lunch. Swamishri called the sadguru and senior swamis to serve him, and he drank five teaspoons of dudhpak. Normally, Swamishri drinks only half a teaspoon or less, but he drank more and beyond his wish in appreciation of the karyakars' seva and devotion.

SPECIAL LABH OF CHARAN SPARSH TO KARYKARS

On 11 April 2024, during the welcome sesion, Yagnapriya Swami went to Swamishri to offer an ID-card. At that time, Swamishri said, "I want to give *labh* of *charan sparsh* to all the *karyakars* after this session." Yagnapriya Swami explained that it would not be possible to arrange it so soon, but Swamishri insisted strongly. Subsequently, after due procedures, arrangements were made for the

lead karyakars to touch Swamishri's holy feet.

Later, the attendant swamis asked Swamishri as to when he had decided to give this *labh* to the *karyakars*. Swamishri replied, "At the first meeting held in Bochasan." The swamis gently said, "Then, you could have informed us." Swamishri replied, "If I had told you then, you would have cancelled it altogether. That's why I said it at the right time."

HIS PROFOUND WISH TO EMBRACE ALL



Swamishri's profound respect and desire to please the *karyakars* was evident from his words.


PRANAMS TO KARYAKARS (Sarangpur)



On 24 April 2024, Swamishri came on stage during the first Sant Shibir in Sarangpur. As he was about to sit down on his seat with the support of his attendant swamis the compere hailed the *jai* of the Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav. Instantly, Swamishri let go of the support of his attendant to his left and raised his hand out of respect. Then, he sat on his seat, joined his hands and bowed.

Narayanmuni Swami asked, "Swami, to whom did you offer pranams? Swamishri replied, "The *karyakars*." When asked why he offered pranams to them, Swamishri replied, "[Because] of their dedication and sacrifice."

MADE MOTICHUR LADDUS FOR KARYAKARS (Ahmedabad)



Once, Swamishri rang Brahmatirth Swami, head of the festival kitchen department, and asked him what food items would be packed for the *karyakars* on the day of the Suvarna Mahotsav. Brahmatirth Swami mentioned the items, and Swamishri said he would like to have *motichur* laddus made for the *karyakars*.

On 2 December 2024, Swamishri concluded his morning puja in Ahmedabad in the presence of many swamis. According to Swamishri's instructions a dish containing motichur, which was yet to be made into balls, was brought before him. At the same time, Ishwarcharan Swami, Viveksagar Swami, Anandswarup Swami and Yagnapriya Swami were called onto the stage to make motichur laddus. Swamishri personally made 10 motichur laddus and then got up to leave for his residence. At that time, Adarshjivan Swami requested that since he had specially made laddus for the karyakars he too should eat a little (for lunch). Swamishri halted in his steps and asked for the dish of motichur laddus to be brought back. Then, Ishwarcharan Swami took a whole motichur laddu to feed Swamishri. But, the attendant swamis said that Swamishri would not be able to eat a whole laddu, therefore offer him a little. However, Swamishri willingly gestured that a whole laddu be offered to him. Ishwarcharan Swami placed a whole *motichur* laddu in Swamishri's mouth. Swamishri was ahppy and then walked towards his residence.

Swamishri ate a whole laddu for the first time, solely because of his appreciation for the *karyakars' seva* and to please them.

PUJYA KOTHARI SWAMI OFFERS PRASAD TO KARYAKARS (Ahmedabad)

At around 10.30 a.m., on 7 December 2024, the grand finale day of the Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav, Swamishri rang Brahmatirth Swami and said, "I wish to feed *motichur* laddus to the *karyakars*, but it will not be possible for me to do that. So, I want swamis to personally feed the *karyakars*, on my behalf, when they enter the stadium."

Brahmatirth Swami replied, "With over 50,000 plates already packed with the laddus it will not be possible to do that. However, if you say so, we could feed a chocolate bar each to all the *karyakars*." Swamishri agreed.

Then at 3.00 p.m., as the *karyakars* arrived at the Narendra Modi Stadium, they were given packed food dishes from around 40 counters and Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami, Nararayanmuni Swami and other swamis placed a chocolate bar in each *karyakar's* mouth.

Mahant Swami Maharaj's profound sentiments of love for and *rajipo* on the *karyakars* for their selfless *seva* is apparent from the incident.

Then at 5.30 p.m., the grand finale celebration

commenced. Swamishri had already arrived at the backstage room. He asked for Yagnapriya Swami and gave him a letter he had written with reference to the *karyakars*. Swamishri told him to read the letter in the celebration assembly. It is as follows:

"Today, my joy knows no bounds. I see Yogi Bapa and Pramukh Swami in all the *karyakars*. Since morning, I have been contemplating the *mahima* of and offering *pujan* to all the *karyakars*. I have been applying *chandlo*, *chandan archa* and rice grains, and placing a garland of *mogra* and roses (around their necks) and offering *dandvats* to all. May you all be *raji* (happy) on me.

Jai Swaminarayan with much love from Sadhu Keshavjivandas. All of you, santo and karyakars, are my hands and legs."

Saturday, 7.12.2024, 10.52 a.m.

In conclusion, from the launch of the Karyakar Suvarna Mahotsav on 28 January 2024 in Surat to the grand finale celebration on 7 December 2024 in Ahmedabad, Swamishri's gusto and efforts to offer his respects and express his *rajipo* and love for the *karyakars* was incredible. The incidents mentioned about Mahant Swami Maharaj not only enlighten us about his noble and divine insights, but also inspire all to appreciate and perceive the *karyakars*' perennial selfless *seva* and sacrifices in a nobler and greater light.

Diwali Celebration in Vartal

Shri Hari saves Bhaguji from imminent death and thereafter resumes his travels to Kariyani and Vartal...

NO MATTER WHAT HAPPENS SAVE BHAGUJI

Bechar Chavda beseeched, "Maharaj, no matter what happens save Bhaguji." Shri Hari turned solemn and quiet. After a little while he spoke boldly, "Bhaguji's lifespan is destined to be over by today, but I will stall Kal (Death)." Maharaj then added, "Call Sachchidanand Swami." Swami came and prostrated to Maharaj. Shri Hari instructed him, "Swami,

you will have to remain on guard here tonight. When Kal comes, expel him." Sachchidanand Swami responded, "Maharaj, when I chant your name, how can Kal come near! It can only do so at your bidding."

FIRST SERVE FOOD TO THE PARSHADS

A few days later, Bhaguji and the injured parshads recovered well. Shri Hari bathed them with milk, which is considered to be auspicious, and arranged for kansar and chapatis to be cooked for lunch. Prior to eating, Maharaj first came to serve all the parshads. Nityanand Swami requested, "Maharaj, you have your meal first and then come to serve them."

Shri Hari replied, "Today, for my own satisfaction, I shall first serve food to the *parshads*." Nityanand Swami was touched and his eyes moistened with tears. He thought how greatly Shri Hari cared and loved his disciples. Then, Shri Hari generously served food to the *parshads*. Thereafter, Maharaj washed his hands and returned to Akshar Ordi to have lunch.

The story of Bhaguji's valour soon reached the court of King Vajesinh Bapu of Bhavnagar. The

king was amazed that Bhagwan Swaminarayan had such a brave gem. He knew that once his own Arab platoon had fled from Gadhada

because of the valour and prowess of warriors devoted to Bhagwan Swaminarayan. The king wished to meet Bhaguji, but he postponed it to a later date.

Shri Hari celebrated the Janmashtami festival on 11 August 1826 (Shravan *vad* 8, A.S. 1882) and subsequently the Jal Jhilani

and Dashera festivals in Gadhpur. He, however, wished to celebrate Diwali and Annakut festivals in Vartal. Maharaj declared his desire to go to Vartal after celebrating the Sharad Punam festival. Maharaj announced, "All sadhus and devotees come to Vartal to celebrate the Diwali and Annakut festivals."

After celebrating Sharad Punam, Maharaj instructed the devotees to return home and his sadhus to resume their satsang *vicharan*.

SHRI HARI IN KARIYANI

With eight days left till Diwali, Shri Hari travelled to Kariyani along with his principal sadhus, *parshads* and devotees. Maharaj had earlier instructed Dada Khachar, Jivuba, Laduba and their entire family to come to Kariyani and then to Vartal.

Vasta Khachar, the village chief of Kariyani, was enthused to receive Shri Hari. Long back, his mind had been vitiated by Buddha Dhadhal's disparaging words about Shri Hari. But, soon after, through Shri Hari's association and listening to his discourses, his heart was cleansed of *manushyabhav* (perceiving human traits).

At Shri Hari's behest, the sadhus travelling around Gadhada came to Kariyani. Shri Hari was seated in a late evening assembly decorated with oil lamps.

TAKE CARE OF THE DEVOTEES

He discoursed to his sadhus, "Each group should have five sadhus. No two groups should go to the same village, so that the devotees would not be unduly burdened in sustaining you. Our satsang is now flourishing and more mandirs are being established. The cost of maintaining them is borne by the devotees. Therefore, we should keep this in mind and look after the devotees. Serve them by discoursing to and taking care of them, so that satsang is strengthened in their lives. Discourse to them in accordance to their prevailing social conditions. The manner and content of a sadhu's discourse reflect his dignity and spiritual state. Furthermore, the discourses benefit the devotees who listen, as well as the sadhu who speaks."

Then, Shri Hari added, "We have celebrated many Diwali and Annakut festivals here at Vasta Khachar's *darbar*. He does all the *seva* and bears the burden and expenses out of his faith for and dedication to satsang. When a devotee's faith in satsang becomes robust, he never retreats from doing any type of *seva*. Those who have attained this divine association of satsang are truly fortunate and blessed."

Soon, dinner was ready and Shri Hari went to his residence to eat.

DIWALI CELEBRATION IN VARTAL

Shri Hari departed from Kariyani with his followers and arrived in Rojka. His residence was arranged to the west side of the village lake. Kakabhai and Manbhai, the local Kshatriya devotees, felt blessed at Maharaj's arrival. They and the local devotees happily joined in serving Shri Hari and his entourage. Some engaged themselves in cleaning the grains for cooking, the Brahmins started cooking and the local bards

(chaaran) regaled the guests.

After having lunch, Shri Hari and his group left Rojka and arrived in Ganf. Manubha Darbar of Ganf received Shri Hari and requested him to stay the night. Maharaj agreed. The next morning, Maharaj left and passed by Kamiyala and halted at Bholad, which is near the river Bhogavati. The Kathis' horses quenched their thirst at the village pond, while some sadhus and devotees took a dip to freshen themselves. Thereafter, Shri Hari travelled to Moti Boru and Vaarna. Here, they all had snacks and then proceeded to Galiyana and Varasda. A Patidar devotee stopped the group at Galiyana and offered them a meal with *kansar*.

The next day, Shri Hari travelled to Varasda and Sojitra. The devotees of Sojitra pressed Maharaj to stay for the night. But Shri Hari was in a hurry and thus replied, "I want to reach Vartal today." Then, Shri Hari and his group left and soon arrived in Vartal.

IN VARTAL

When Shri Hari arrived in Vartal, many devotees from various regions and sadhus travelling in their regions had already arrived. Maharaj reached the mandir for the evening arti. While Madhavanand Swami performed Thakorji's arti, Shri Hari stood focused, doing darshan of Lakshmi-Narayan Dev. He also remained standing and absorbed in the murtis while the dhun and ashtak were sung. Then, Maharaj prostrated before the deities and also performed pradakshinas. Thereafter, a seat was arranged for Maharaj to sit. Four oil torches, behind Shri Hari, were kindled. The mellow, serene darshan of Shri Hari in the soft light satisfied and enthused the devotees.

DIWALI CELEBRATION

The day of Diwali dawned in Vartal. There was joy in the hearts of all. That evening, the *paramhansas* sang festive bhajans on Diwali, while the devotees came forward to perform *pujan* of Shri Hari.

On the following day, New Year's Day, a grand

annakut was offered to the deities. Behanjiba, mother of Kuberdas Patidar of Changa village, had sponsored the entire annakut. Shri Hari performed the Govardhan puja and annakut arti. Thereafter, Maharaj ate a little prasad from the annakut and generously served his sadhus, who were seated in rows, by making five rounds.

At night, Maharaj sat in an assembly arranged behind the mandir. He listened to the bhajans sung by his sadhus until midnight. Thereafter, Maharaj retired to bed. Daily, Shri Hari arranged assemblies. One day, Maharaj addressed the assembly, "We celebrate the annual Prabodhini Ekadashi festival here in Vartal. Everytime, we send invitations to the devotees, but from henceforth no invitations will be sent and all the devotees should attend the Prabodhini and Ram Navami festivals. The reason being that we now have a mandir here and the *murtis* of Lakshmi-Narayan Dev. Therefore, these two festivals are reserved to be celebrated here."

On the day of Kartak *sud* Ekadashi, (the day Shri Hari discoursed the first Vachanamrut in Vartal), a large shamiana was set up behind the mandir. Another small *mandap* (small makeshift tent) was set up for Shri Hari's stay, but Maharaj preferred to stay at Vasan Suthar's home.

Shri Hari arrived in the mandir with his sadhus and went straight for darshan of the deities. Thereafter, he went to the large shamiana, where the devotees performed his *pujan*. That evening, because of *ekadashi*, the sadhus sang bhajans till late night. All were contented by the singing and vigil.

Pujabhai Darbar of Dholera was also present during the celebration of Prabodhini Ekadashi and had stayed thereafter. He requested Maharaj, "The construction work of the mandir in Dholera has already begun. However, if you appoint a mahant and send him there, then it will accelerate the construction work." Shri Hari found his proposal to be valid and thus announced to his sadhus, "Is there anyone ready to be the mahant of the construction work in Dholera?" There was no response from anyone. At that time, Muktanand Swami and Adbhutanand Swami were absent in the assembly because they were ill and resting in the sadhus' quarters. Then, Nityanand Swami and Gopalanand Swami went to inform them about Shri Hari's appeal. Adbhutanand Swami declared, "If no one is ready, I'll uphold Shri Hari's words and go. However, no one will accompany me because the drinking water in Dholera is salty and unsuitable to drink." After hearing this, Gopalanand Swami and Nityanand Swami brought Adbhutanand Swami to the assembly. Immediately, Shri Hari saw Adbhutanand Swami and said, "Swami, no one is ready to become the mahant of Dholera mandir, therefore you go."

Adbhutanand Swami got up instantly, and humbly said, "Maharaj, since it is your command, I shall go as the mahant." Shri Hari was very pleased with Adbhutanand Swami's readiness to obey his wish. Subsequently, Maharaj stood up from his seat and took his expensive gold-threaded headgear (moliyu) with a topi and placed it on his head. Then, Shri Hari removed a costly cloth (shelu) wound around his waist and wrapped it around Adbhutanand Swami. In addition, Maharaj gave him the Shaligram he worshipped daily to worship. Thus, Shri Hari exhibited his profound rajipo and donned Adbhutanand Swami with costly headgear and cloth¹, in spite of him being sadhu.

^{1.} Adbhutanand Swami cut the sanctified *moliyu* into twenty pieces and gave one each to the twenty sadhus who came with him to Dholera. Then, he gave the *shelu* to his attendant disciples and the *topi* and Shaligram to Krishnajivandas Swami. Later, the topi and Shaligram were stolen while they were kept in the mandir storeroom. 1 October to 13 December 2024 Junagadh, Gondal, Gandhinagar and Ahmedabad

The *vicharan* report in this issue includes Swamishri's stay in Junagadh (1–13 October), Gondal (13 October to 4 November), Gandhinagar (4–11 November) and Ahmedabad (11 November to 13 December).

OCTOBER: JUNAGADH

1: Arrival

Swamishri departed from Mumbai by flight and landed at Keshod airport. Then, Swamishri travelled by car to Junagadh BAPS Mandir. After eight years, Swamishri arrived in Junagadh. He gave darshan in the *sabha mandap* and the local swamis welcomed him with a 91-feet-long flower garland. 
3: Welcome Day (Swagat Din)

Otherwise, like a child, ignorant of its price, we use it like a toy to play. So, satsang is rare and priceless, and we have to take care of it." Finally, Swamishri performed arti of Thakorji.

4 October

rituals of *murtis* for the BAPS *hari* mandirs of Jalansar and Ranavav. In the evening, Swamishri gave *samip* darshan to 4,000 devotees of Junagadh.

5: Vidyamandir Din (BAPS School)

Prior to Swamishri's arrival, 67 children of BAPS Vidyamandir, Junagadh, performed a symphony. The evening assembly was themed on 'A Perfect Student', and a drama was enacted to portray the all-round development of students in the Vidyamandir. Five parents shared personal experiences about the benefits their children have gained by studying in the Vidyamandir.

Then, Swamishri answered study and life related questions asked by the students. Swamishri said, "To attain very good results it is important to study honestly and with passion. One has to focus one's mind. To conquer one's mind one requires to do bhakti of God. We have attained Bhagwan through the Satpurush, thus through the latter's blessings everything will work out well."

Swamishri was honoured with garlands and a decorative shawl (*chadar*).

Daily, guests and dignitaries came for Swamishri's satsang and darshan and thereafter were honoured on the stage. Hundreds of devotees offered their devotion and pleased Swamishri through observing austerities and *padyatras* (pilgrimage by foot).

Then, nearly a decade-and-a-half later, the need for a residential school arose. Mahant Swami Maharaj fulfilled this need, and on 3 February 2022 Pujya Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami inaugurated a new residential school on the premises of BAPS Mandir, Junagadh.

Mahant Swami Maharaj visited the residential school (BAPS Vidyamandir) for the first time. He sanctified the hostel blocks: Yogi Chhatralaya, Pramukh Chhatralaya and Mahant Chhatralaya. Swamishri inaugurated the Mahant Chhatralaya and cast his eyes to bless the classrooms, computer room, meeting room, admin room, prayer hall and dining hall.

Presently, a total of 1,500 students study in the school, out of which 900 reside in the hostels. In all, there are 100 teachers. The mothers were also honoured with flower garlands for dedicating their sons in the service of the Sanstha and society.



22: Pramukh Varni Amrut Din

The historic Pramukh Varni Din celebrates Shastriji Maharaj's appointment of 28-year-old Pramukh Swami in 1950 as the president of BAPS at Ambli Vali Pol. This year, 2025, marks the celebration of 75 years of Pramukh Varni Din.

Today's evening satsang assembly, held in Swamishri's presence, marked the launch of this milestone year-long celebration. Viveksagar Swami spoke about Pramukh Swami Maharaj's life and work. A drama about the historic event was vividly performed by devotees.

Today's chief guest, Shri Raghuvir Chaudhary,

24: Bal Din






On 6 December, Swamishri performed the *pujan* rituals of the first pillar of the under-construction *shikharbaddha* mandir in Surendranagar.

13: Swamishri Departs for Africa



Swamishri Performs Pujan of First Shila of BAPS Mandir, Paris

9 November 2024, Gandhinagar

After his morning puja, Swamishri performed the *pujan* rituals of the first *shila* (stone) for the BAPS Mandir in Paris, France. The pre-rituals of the *shila* were performed by Ishwarcharan Swami, Viveksagar Swami and Anandswarup Swami.

Ishwarcharan Swami spoke, "Yogiji Maharaj had instructed Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj (in Paris, 1970) to step down from the plane and sanctify the land. Since then, the land was waiting (for a mandir to be built). Mahant Swami Maharaj will fulfil the wishes of Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj. The devotees of Paris have sacrificed immensely for the mandir construction."

Swamishri then blessed Sanjay Kara, who coordinates the project, on behalf of all the devotees of Paris. Finally, Swamishri also blessed the devotees of Europe and the UK.

Murti-Pratishtha Mahotsav BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir

18-22 December 2024, Dar es Salaam, Tanzania



His Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj first established a mandir in Dar es Salaam in 1977, which he re-consecrated in 1999.

Now, in 2024, the mandir has been rebuilt into a multi-storey structure. The grand Murti-Pratishtha Mahotsav of this newly built mandir was held in the presence of Mahant Swami Maharaj, and over 100 swamis from India and devotees from throughout the world.

On 22 December, in the early morning, Shrutiprakash Swami and other learned scholars recited the Vedic verses, while Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami, and Anandswarup Swami performed the *mahapuja* and pre-*pratishtha* rituals.

Thereafter, Mahant Swami Maharaj, performed the consecration rituals for the new *murti* of Ghanshyam Maharaj. The re-consecrated rituals of the original *murtis* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami, and Bhagwan Krishna and Shri Radhaji, consecrated by Pramukh Swami Maharaj in 1999, were performed by Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami and Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami, respectively. They elaborate upon the meticulous planning and logistics involved in constructing a mini-city with diverse facilities in a short timeframe.

During the launch event, Prof. Vishal Gupta expressed, "In September 2022, when I first visited the Pramukh Swami Maharaj Nagar site, it was still under construction. At that moment, I thought, 'The inauguration is set for December, and we are already in September – what could possibly happen in just three months?' But when I saw the completed *nagar* in December, I couldn't believe that such a magnificent place could be built in such a short time. Witnessing the creation of this *nagar* showed me how deeply people can be motivated

to contribute selflessly without any concern for personal gain. Sustaining that level of motivation over time is something no management institute could ever imagine. This *mahotsav*, in my view, symbolizes the limitlessness of the human spirit."


