


25TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS OF LONDON MANDIR



The essence of all the shastras – Brahma and Parabrahma.


Intensely loved by Mahapurush – Brahma and Parabrahma.



VACHANAMRUT BICENTENARY CELEBRATIONS

Festively commemorated in the presence of Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj 6 to 10 March 2020, Gadhada

he Vachanamrut shastra comprises the divine discourses of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, which he delivered 200 years ago, and were noted and compiled by his *paramhansas*. Once a major part of the scripture was ready the *paramhansas* presented it to Bhagwan Swaminarayan, who checked it and endorsed its authenticity. The discourses were delivered in Gadhpur (Gadhada), Sarangpur, Loya, Panchala, Kariyani, Vartal, Ahmedabad, Jetalpur and Ashlali. The scripture stands out as the paramount spiritual shastra in the Swaminarayan Sampradaya. Bhagwan Swaminarayan delivered the discourses from his divine experience and profound scriptural studies during his childhood years. He revealed, "What is this discourse which I have delivered before you like? Well, I have delivered it having heard and having extracted the essence of the Vedas, the shastras, the Purans and all other words on this earth pertaining to liberation. This is the most profound and fundamental principle; it is the essence of all essences" (Vachanamrut Gadhada II 28).

Kishorelal Mashruwala, a renowned Gandhian thinker, pays glowing tributes to the Vachanamrut, "The collection of the Vachanamruts of Sahajanand Swami is a jewel of the Gujarati language. I feel that for an aspirant who wishes to live a thought-provoking and spiritual life, this text of the Gujarati language cannot be discounted by any means. If he reflects and constantly contemplates upon this text, makes an effort to practise its principles and teachings, he will not fail to be uplifted. There's hardly an equivalent to such a small text, abounding with the secret of spiritual principles and replete with practical advice for realizing them. In many places, the personal experience of the speaker manifests itself."

The grand finale of the Vachanamrut Bicentenary Centenary Celebrations was held in the presence of Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj in Gadhada during the first week of March 2020. A brief report of the celebrations is as follows.

Five-day Vachanamrut Bicentenary Celebrations

6 to 10 March 2020, Gadhpur

he BAPS Swaminarayan Mandir in Gadhpur is perched on a sacred hill by the banks of the holy River Ghela. Decked for the celebrations, the illuminated and decorated mandir seemed like it had descended from a divine abode. It lies on the very spot where 200 years ago Bhagwan Swaminarayan profoundly wished to build a mandir. His dream was fulfilled by Brahmaswarup Shastriji Maharaj, who sanctified the *murtis* of Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj. The mandir was consecrated by Brahmaswarup Yogiji Maharaj and developed by Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

The celebration events held in the presence of Mahant Swami Maharaj were: • Vachanamrut

Bicentenary Celebrations • Inauguration of the bronze *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan on Manki • Opening of Jiva Khachar's restored *darbar* and • Immersion of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's *asthi pushpa* in the River Ghela.

Swaminarayan Nagar, the celebrations venue, hosted the five days of special assemblies.

- The celebrations inspired all to imbibe the lofty teachings of Bhagwan Swaminarayan.
- The celebrations paid tributes to Bhagwan Swaminarayan, a torchbearer of Indian culture and the spiritual ideals of Hinduism.
- The celebrations also paid a devotional tribute to Pramukh Swami Maharaj on the occasion of his centenary celebrations.

SWAMINARAYAN NAGAR

Formerly, the 5-day Vachanamrut Bicentenary Celebrations in Gadhada was planned on a grand scale, however, with Mahant Swami Maharaj's foresight and instruction it was downsized to a local level in view of the emerging coronavirus pandemic.

When more than 100,000 devotees from India and abroad were scheduled to arrive in Gadhada the celebrations now became limited to about 5,000 devotees from Gadhada and its neighbouring villages. The state government ministers and leading lights of Gujarat appreciated and lauded the BAPS's decision to dilute the celebrations.

The celebrations venue, Swaminarayan Nagar, was created after months of intense voluntary effort by sadhus and youths.

During the five-day celebrations, devotees, well-wishers and school students availed of the exhibitions, spiritual and cultural attractions and the light and sound show. Every evening, the assembly hall hosted a variety of programmes and discourses in the presence of Mahant Swami Maharaj.

A brief description of the Swaminarayan Nagar and the evening assembly programmes is as follows.

SWAMINARAYAN NAGAR

The celebrations venue comprised a giant decorative entrance gate, an ornate spot honouring Bhagwan Swaminarayan – the author of the Vachanamrut, four inspiring educational marquees, an enthralling light and sound show, beautiful *murtis* of great saints and seers of India installed in decorative shrines and a fascinating anamorphic art spot.

The four giant educational marquees and other attractions that inspired the visitors were:

1. Sahajanand Hall: Included a wonderful presentation about the glory of the Vachanamrut and how it practically inspires people's lives in a variety of ways.

- **2.** Muktanand Hall: Screened a video based on a true story inspiring the viewers to live an addiction-free life. Outside the hall, visitors took pledges at the anti-addiction hut.
- **3. Bharatanand Hall:** Showed an inspiring video highlighting the themes of keeping India clean, and conserving water and electricity.
- **4. Paramanand Hall:** Portrayed the philanthropic life and work of Pramukh Swami Maharaj through tableaux, photographic panels and videos. Presentations on Swamiji's tireless *vicharan*, daily correspondence, building of mandirs, initiation of sadhus, moral transformations and selfless humanitarian services enlightened and inspired the visitors.
- Bhajananand Mandap: During the five-day celebrations devotees read an allotted number of pages of the entire Vachanamrut, and thus collectively read the entire Vachanamrut 108 times and offered their devotion and tributes to Bhagwan Swaminarayan.
- Anamorphic Art Spot: Thirty-nine 12 feet high laser-cut steel columns were arranged vertically to form an image of Mahant Swami Maharaj, which was visible from a viewing point 100 feet away.
- 3-D Art Spot: The 3-D art spot consisted of laser-cut aluminium pieces arranged to create an image of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's face.
- Blood Donation Camp: During the 5-day blood donation camp 326 donors donated 114,100 cc of blood, which was donated to the local blood bank.
- Light and Sound Show: 'Divya Sankalp Gatha' (Story of Divine Aspiration). The spectacular light and sound show was one of the star attractions in Swaminarayan Nagar. The 100 feet wide stage, with an impressive backdrop of a fort wall, came alive through the mesmerizing performances of 250 children and youths.

'Divya Sankalp Gatha', the central theme of the light and sound show, presented the topography of Gadhada, brief history of Gadhada,

the divine *lilas* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan in Gadhada and the history of how the BAPS Mandir on the hilltop was built. The entire show was created through the tireless efforts of BAPS sadhus and youths. This included the script, lyrics and music, drama, dance, sound recordings, animations, projection, synchronization of light and sound and computer programming. The seamless performances of the dramas, dances and *maha-arti*, and the projection of historical videos were show-stopping and inspiring. The 22-minute light and sound show transported the audience into the corridors of time and history.

The light and sound show was shown daily from 7.00 p.m.

STUDENTS' CULTURAL PILGRIMAGE (SANSKRUTI YATRA)

Two months prior to the celebrations, BAPS volunteers visited the principals and teachers of various schools in the Gadhada region to inspire them to arrange a cultural visit for their

students to the festival grounds. Daily, from 9.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m., the educational halls at the Swaminarayan Nagar were reserved exclusively for the school students. The students were first taken to the BAPS Mandir for darshan and a visit to the audio-visual exhibition, 'Gadhpur jotā re Shriji Sāmbhare.' Thereafter, the students were led to the four educational halls in the Swaminarayan Nagar. They were inspired by the fascinating presentations on anti-addiction, family unity, cleanliness and conservation of electricity and water.

During the five days, a total of 8,000 students from 80 schools visited the educational marques.

INAUGURATION OF SWAMINARAYAN NAGAR: 6 March

From 6 to 10 March, the five-day Vacha-namrut Bicentenary Celebrations were held on the 100 acres of Swaminarayan Nagar, situated on the road leading from Gadhada to Mandavdhar. On 6 March 2020, the festival ground was

inaugurated at 9.00 a.m. with Vedic chantings and *pujan* of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj. Pujya Dr Swami untied the *nadachhadi* and declared the celebrations venue open for all. Also present were Shri Prataphai Khachar (President of Gadhada Municipal Corporation), Shri Sureshbhai Godhani (District President of BJP), Shri Babubhai Jebaliya (Former Chairman of Gujarat Agro Industries), Shri Prataphai Chhaiya (President of Congress, urban region), Shri Kirithai Humbal (Chairman, Gadhada Marketing Yard), Shri Irfanbhai Khimani (Secretary of the Minority Community) and other dignitaries.

Today, at 7 p.m., Pujya Kothari Swami and Pravinbhai Moru (Member of the Legislative Assembly) inaugurated the 3D mapped light and sound show. Thereafter, they briefly addressed the audience.

The inspiring programmes and assemblies held for five days in the assembly hall at the Swaminarayan Nagar are as follows.

WOMEN'S DAY: 6 March

To celebrate the International Women's Day (on 8 March), the Sanstha's women devotees and volunteers organized a Women's Convention at the Swaminarayan Nagar. To demonstrate the potential and talents of women, young satsangi girls, female youths and adult women presented inspiring dramas, mono-acts, speeches and traditional dances. The stage guests, Pujya Nirmalaba – Mahant of Paliyad gadi, members of Dada Khachar's descendants, Lilaba Khachar – mother of Chairman of Gadhada Municipal Corporation and others, lauded the stage performances and presentations. PROCESSION IN HONOUR OF THE VACHANAMRUT: 7 March

On 7 March, the second day of the celebrations, a grand ceremonial procession was carried out in Gadhada to pay tributes to the Vachanamrut. The procession commenced at 2.30

p.m. and included skilled horse riders, youths on bikes wearing decorative headgear, Manki *rath* with a large *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, hundreds of swamis, bhajan groups from various regions of Gujarat, children and teenagers enthusiastically dancing to the tune of bhajans and women carrying the auspicious *kalashes* with coconuts on their heads.

The procession commenced from the PTC College and proceeded to M.M. High School, Botad Jhapo, Mandavdhar Road and finally concluded at the Swaminarayan Nagar. The colourful and devotional procession stretched for one kilometre and was welcomed and appreciated by countless people along the route.

In the evening assembly, prominent citizens of Gadhpur were felicitated on the main stage.

HONOURING LEADERS AND DIGNITARIES OF GADHADA: 7 March

The evening assembly at Swaminarayan Nagar honoured the leading lights and dignitaries of Gadhada. Aksharvatsal Swami gave an enlightening speech on 'Vachanamrut and Gadhada'. Thereafter, the assembly was conducted by Mahavirbhai Khachar, a descendant of Dada Khachar. Some of the invited guests and leaders spoke glowingly about the BAPS and the selfless services and works of Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj.

- Shri Hareshbhai Sodhatare, President of the Bar Association, said, "The BAPS and Pramukh Swami Maharaj have spread the glory of Sanatan Dharma in the whole world. We are all fortunate and blessed that Shri Swaminarayan Bhagwan chose Gadhada for his spiritual works. Because of that, not only the name of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, but the names of Gadhada and Dada Khachar are also being sung all over the world."
- Shri Ashraf Lakhani opined, "Two hundred years ago, a large portion of the Vachanamrut was delivered by Bhagwan Swaminarayan in this Gadhada village. If one were to live a life in

accordance to the teachings of the Vachanamrut, one would become God-realized. Pramukh Swami Maharaj's life was like that. After the terrorist attack on Akshardham he appealed to all to maintain peace. He was impartial towards all and I, too, was a recipient of his grace. I profoundly congratulate and celebrate the Santha's works."

- Shri Pratapbhai Khachar, a scion of Dada Khachar, expressed, "We sincerely acknowledge and thank the BAPS for installing the 25-feethigh *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and the 17-feet-tall *murti* of Dada Khachar. I also thank the BAPS for conducting the anti-addiction drives and tree-planting programmes in Gadhada."
- Shri Sanjaybhai Thakar, President of Gadhada Educational Group, averred, "Bhagwan Swaminarayan's teachings [Vachanamrut] are divine words and lofty, similar to that of the Bhagavad Gita, Ramayan and Shrimad Bhagvat. Though Bhagwan Swaminarayan was a profound Sanskrit scholar he spoke the Vachanamrut in a simple language so that ordinary people could understand. I laud the Sanstha for making great efforts in digitalizing the Vachanamrut. The BAPS, a worldwide organization, could have celebrated this festival elsewhere, but it chose to do so in Gadhada. I thank the Sanstha for this."
- Professor Shri R.G. Pandya, a renowned writer and historian, shared his thoughts, "From the viewpoint of history I would say that the Akshar-Purushottam Sanstha has catapulted the Swaminarayan Sampradaya on to a global level. Bhagwan Swaminarayan has said that one should preserve the sacred places of Bhagwan's lilas. I congratulate the BAPS for reconstructing and preserving the darbar of Jiva Khachar. Bhagwan Swaminarayan inspired literature of global standards and built six mandirs, which were by no means ordinary feats. Similarly, Shastriji Maharaj, Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj tolerated intense hardships to build mandirs."

■ Dr Kalathiya shared his experience, "A few days ago, where an excavator could not be deployed the swamis of the BAPS entered the dirty, mosquito-infested and boggy waters of the River Ghela to clean it. I congratulate the dedication of the BAPS swamis. Bhagwan Swaminarayan prescribes about cleanliness in his Shikshapatri. Pujya Pramukh Swami Maharaj picked up the used datans of the devotees. Oh, how great he was! He gave us the message of cleanliness. By Mahant Swami Maharaj's darshan I have understood the glory and divinity of a Sant. I experienced divinity when I looked at Mahant Swami Maharaj's eyes for the first time. I can never forget that experience. For three minutes I became oblivious to everything around me. The reason being that Mahant Swami Maharaj is the Satpurush belonging to the spiritual succession of Gunatitanand Swami. It is a matter of great fortune when he showers his grace upon us."

Thereafter, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami, Convener of BAPS, honoured and appreciated all the stage guests and then spoke about the glory of the Vachanamrut and the awesome story of how the BAPS Mandir, Gadhada, was built.

In conclusion, Mahant Swami Maharaj blessed the assembly, "Shastriji Maharaj derived the Akshar-Purushottam principle from the Vachanamrut. Gunatitanand Swami, Bhagatji Maharaj, Shastriji Maharaj, Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj emphasized the Vachanamrut, because it is the essence of all the shastras and the divine words of Bhagwan. Through it we can deal with our daily worldly tasks and also attain *moksha*. The Vachanamrut contains everything up to *moksha*. The Vachanamrut being a purely spiritual text, yet it also teaches things that benefit us in our social life.

"The Vachanamrut even contains knowledge related to science. Shriji Maharaj has said in the Vachanamrut, 'Even after splitting the atom countless times one still finds space.' Where there

is space or ether one can still split it. Now we see these words have come true. One has to have faith. By having faith and a subtle vision one can personally understand the Vachanamrut on reading it.

"Gunatitanand Swami, Bhagatji Maharaj, Shastriji Maharaj, Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj had all realized the Vachanamrut. We cannot perceive that all the knowledge of our *brahmand* lies in the Vachanamrut. However, when we explore we can perceive it. So, it is all true.

"Shriji Maharaj has said in Vachanamrut Gadhada I 1, 'One who realizes this knowledge can see the five eternal entities.' The knowledge Shriji Maharaj has given is supreme. One *mukta* runs countless *brahmands* and when such countless *muktas* combine they still cannot equal Aksharbrahma. And Shriji Maharaj is infinitely above Aksharbrahma.

"In this Vachanamrut, Shriji Maharaj has said one should spiritually associate with the

Satpurush. Only then would the essence of life surface and be attained and realized. Thereafter, one will experience joy and bliss."

Finally, Adhyatmaswarup Swami, Kothari of Gadhada Mandir, appreciated the prominent leaders and donors for their presence and gave the vote of thanks. The invited guests came on to the stage and offered their respects to the *murti* of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj and to Mahant Swami Maharaj.

ASTHI-PUSHPA IMMERSION RITUAL: 8 March

The sacred Khalkhaliyo in the River Ghela and the Purushottam Ghat were sanctified hundreds of times by Bhagwan Swaminarayan during his snan lila with his paramhansas and devotees. Today, in the morning, the holy asthi-pushpa of Pramukh Swami Maharaj were scheduled to be ritually immersed by Mahant Swami Maharaj in the River Ghela. Several days before, swamis and volunteers worked











tirelessly in cleaning the Purushottam Ghat and Khalkhaliyo. Then, to facilitate the immersion ritual they constructed a stage in the middle of the River Ghela and a connecting walkway from Purushottam Ghat.

Thereafter, the state government made arrangements to fill the riverbed of Ghela with the fresh waters of River Narmada.


Prior to the actual immersion ritual a mahapuja and pujan of the asthi-pushpa were performed in the morning by Pujya Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami and senior swamis. Thereafter, Pujya Viveksagar Swami spoke about the glory of Pramukh Swami Maharaj and the reminiscences associated with Gadhada. Then, Mahant Swami Maharaj performed the final rituals of pujan and arti of the kalash containing the asthi-pushpa. This was followed by a collective chanting of the Swaminarayan dhun for the fulfilment of many wishes. Thereafter, Swamishri blessed the divine occasion, "Pramukh Swami Maharaj was such a person whose asthi-pushpa could have been immersed in [the rivers] of the whole world, but we have done so wherever proper arrangements could be made. Pramukh Swami Maharaj incorporated Shriji Maharaj in every part of his body." Then, with the chanting of the final ritual shloks in the presence of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj, Swamishri poured the asthi-pushpa and holy water into the River Ghela. In addition, Dr Swami, Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami, Tyagvallabh Swami, Ishwarcharan Swami, Viveksagar Swami, Ghanshyamcharan Swami and senior swamis also offered the asthi-pushpa into the River Ghela. Swamishri then bathed Shri Harikrishna Maharai in the River Ghela and finally took a dip in the holy waters. All felt blessed by the darshan and also recounted how 18 years before Pramukh Swami Maharaj had bathed in the River Ghela (8 January 2002) on the occasion of the Swaminarayan Mahamantra Bicentenary Celebrations.

SANT CONVENTION: 8 March

In the evening, a convention of spiritual heads of several prominent mandirs and religious institutions was held in Swaminarayan Nagar. The many swamis and mahants who were present included Pujya Vishwambhar Bharti Bapu (Mahamandaleshwar, Junagadh), Pujya Vikramgiri Bapu (Mahant of Moghiba ni Jayga, Shihor), Pujya Kanaiyagiri Bapu (Mahant of Dhareshwar Mahadev, Samadhiyala) and others.

After the initial speeches by senior swamis, Shri Maheshdan Gadhvi, a renowned educationist, said, "The tears of the suffering classes in society were gently wiped by Yogiji Maharaj, Pramukh Swami Maharaj and his swamis. One cannot fail to see God in people who serve in this way. He [Pramukh Swami Maharaj] respected people of all religions. He had camaraderie for everyone."

- Pujya Kanaiyagiri Bapu shared his sentiments, "The present age is of science and technology. Only saints show us how to save dharma and sustain one's existence. Saints like Pujya Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj are doing such work."
- Pujya Vikramgiri Bapu praised, "The Akshar-Purushottam Swaminarayan Sanstha has spread the glory of Hindu culture throughout the world. This Sampradaya beholds all sampradayas to be equal. Along with the tradition of worshipping the five principal deities of Sanatan Dharma this Sampradaya has, through this festival, shown and celebrated the traditions of Sanatan Dharma. Today, I am reminded of the Kumbh Mela of Allahabad on seeing so many santos who are like the forms of paramhansas. By virtue of the merits of many births one can have darshan of worshipful and respectful swamis."
- Pujya Jhinaram Bapu explained about the goal of life, "To make our life worthwhile this Sanstha often celebrates such festivals. However, life becomes worthwhile only when we give up

anger, lust, greed, infatuation and take the refuge of God and his Sant. This festival makes our life become worthwhile."


■ Pujya Mahamandaleshwar Bharti Bapu mentioned the divine works of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and recalled his divine association with Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj. He blessed, "More than 200 years ago Bhagwan Swaminarayan delivered the Vachanamrut here in Gadhada. The saints have, through our shastras, explained to us how to live and manage our relationships in this world. The saints have gifted us with spiritual wealth. This can be presently seen in Pramukh Swami Maharaj's sant parampara.

"In 1959, after circumambulating the River Narmada, I had the darshan of Yogiji Maharaj at the Shahibaug Mandir [in Ahmedabad]. He blessed me by giving me a pat. From then onwards my relationship [with this organization] has been alive."

In conclusion, Mahant Swami Maharaj blessed the special assembly, "All these *santos* are highly pure and great. All are endeavouring in their own ways and are of immense benefit to all. I am indeed very happy and pleased. There is nothing greater than *santos* coming together in this way to foster mutual love and give the benefit of their wisdom and presence.

"Bhagwan Swaminarayan has said, 'God resides where there is harmony (samp), fraternity (suhrudbhav), compassion (daya) and moral discipline (maryada).' Bhagwan is so great that even the Vedas cannot describe his glory, but he resides [where these four things exist]. How great this is! So, all should mutually practise samp and suhrudbhav and go to wherever there is sant samagam. Even if you listen to two words, it will benefit a lot. It would not suffice even if one were to touch the dust of these holy swamis' feet to one's head. I pray that we often meet each other with mutual love."

Thereafter, Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami honoured the four *santos* and Shri Maheshdan Gadhvi with shawls. Finally, Swamishri and all the guests performed *arti* of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj.

VACHANAMRUT PUJAN AND TULA RITUAL: 9 March

On the occasion of the Vachanamrut Bicentenary Celebrations a Vachanamrut Pujan ritual was organized. The senior swamis performed the initial *mahapuja* rituals and thereafter Swamishri performed the final rituals. Hundreds of devotees also participated in the *mahapuja* rituals and felt elated.

Swamishri blessed the occasion, "Bhagwan Swaminarayan himself came to earth out of his abundant compassion. He gave darshan, performed many *lilas* and gave his happiness to all. He came here [to Gadhada] because of the devotion and love of sterling devotees like Dada Khachar and Jiva Khachar. Shriji Maharaj stayed in Gadhada for 25 years because of Dada Khachar's love, devotion and sacrifice.

"Now, what remains for us to do? To remain resolute in the *niyams* given to us by Shriji Maharaj. One has to have spiritual faith, but one also needs to be strongly anchored to *niyam* dharma.

"Shriji Maharaj defines those who are steadfast in observing *niyams* as *ekantik* devotees. There were many *ekantik* devotees in Shriji Maharaj's time and there are also many today. These devotees guide us all.

"One should have steadfast faith that, 'Bhagwan is true and he is the all-doer.' I pray that may all observe the *niyams* given by him with the sentiments that he is the all-doer."

Since it was Fagan *sud* Punam the evening assembly celebrated the birthday of Bhagatji Maharaj and a special Vachanamrut Tula ceremony was held. In the first half of the assembly, swamis discoursed about the glory and greatness of Bhagatji Maharaj on the basis of many Vachanamruts: 'Bhagatji Maharaj's unswerving love for the Satpurush and its fruits', 'Bhagatji Maharaj's God-realized state' and 'Bhagatji

Maharaj's passion to spread satsang.' In addition, the *sadguru* swamis also spoke inspiring words. He was introduced as 'One who remains calm and unruffled in the midst of severe insults, then know him to be Bhagatji'. Such was Bhagatji Maharaj, who belongs to our guru *parampara*. Shastriji was a

symbol of guru bhakti, whereas Yogiji Maharaj never tired in taking Shastriji Maharaj's name. And Pramukh Swami Maharaj did not merely talk but accomplished so many works. Pramukh Swami Maharaj totally sacrificed and dedicated his entire life.

"Today, you have offered *pujan* to the Vachanamrut by performing the *tula* ritual. Thus, your *seva* has reached Shriji Maharaj's lotus feet. Now, remain in good spirits and become one with the Satsang-fold."

Then, the *sadguru* swamis honoured Swamishri with a variety of decorative garlands.

Grand Finale Vachanamrut Bicentenary Celebrations

10 March 2020, Gadhada

Samvat 1876, Maghshar sudi 4 (21 November 1819), Gadhada.

On this day, two hundred years ago, a historic milestone occurred in the Swaminarayan Sampradaya. Bhagwan Swaminarayan delivered his first Vachanamrut discourse to his paramhansas and devotees. Thereafter, Shriji Maharaj discoursed for the next ten years at various places in Gujarat, and his paramhansas meticulously noted and compiled them into the Vachanamrut.

The Vachanamrut, born out of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's profound study of the shastras, personal experiences and supreme divinity, contains the essence of all the Hindu shastras and is a repository of spiritual guidance and inspiration to all aspirants.

In December 2018, Mahant Swami Maharaj

announced and launched the Vachanamrut Bicentenary Celebrations in Rajkot. Since then, many events and programmes about the Vachanamrut have been organized to enlighten the worldwide Satsang community. The grand finale celebration was slated for 10 March 2020, (Fagan *vad* 1, Samvat 2076), in Gadhada.

On the evening of 10 March 2020, the celebration assembly commenced on the grounds of Swaminarayan Nagar. The entire event was relayed live throughout India and abroad.

The stage comprised a backdrop of enlarged panels of handwritten manuscripts of the Vachanamrut and a cut-out silhouette of the hillock in Gadhada. The *murtis* of Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj and the Guru Parampara were installed in the centre of these panels. At their lotus feet was arranged the seat of Mahant

Swami Maharaj, flanked on either side by the seats of the *sadguru* swamis.

At 5.15 p.m., the celebration assembly commenced with the singing of *dhun* and prayer by swamis. This was followed by a brief video on the Vachanamrut Bicentenary programmes celebrated worldwide at all BAPS centres in the previous 15 months.

Thereafter, a wonderful drama was enacted, in which characters like Dada Khachar, Vasta Khachar, Jiva Khachar and others from the time of Bhagwan Swaminarayan lavished praises on the Vachanamrut.


Mahamahopadhyaya Bhadresh Swami expounded upon the unique features of the Vachanamrut discourses: subject matter, principle of Akshar-Purushottam revealed by Bhagwan Swaminarayan, simplicity of language and presentation and as the essence of all the Hindu shastras.

A video was shown, portraying the Akshar-Purushotam philosophy propagated by Shriji Maharaj and validations of Gunatitanand Swami as Akshar through references of Bhagwan

Swaminarayan's declarations, experiences of the *paramhansas*, stone inscriptions and *murtis* of Gunatitanand Swami installed in mandirs.

Pujya Viveksagar Swami spoke, citing references from the Vachanamrut and narrating incidents, about the importance and glory of the Gunatit Satpurush as the means to attaining God-realization.

A video displayed testimonials of devotees with reference to the Vachanamrut that the Ekantik Satpurush is present today. They shared

their personal incidents of spiritual bliss, transformation of *swabhavs* and the conviction of attaining *moksha* through the association of the living Gunatit Satpurush.

Brahmavihari Swami narrated the experiences of devotees about their spiritual association with the Satpurush and their experience of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's teaching in the Vachanamrut that the *atma* is different from the physical body.

BAPS children and youths performed a beautiful traditional dance accompanied by a devotional lyrics describing the glory of the Vachanamrut as the essence of all the Hindu shastras.

Pujya Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami inspired all to daily read and contemplate upon the Vachanamrut, and also imbibe its principles and practise the spiritual sadhanas.

Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami's stimulating address emphasized upon reading the Vachanamrut and contemplating about the *mahima* of all.

Pujya Dr Swami explained the special glory and importance of reading the Vachanamrut in order to practise unimpeded bhakti in daily life.

Thereafter, Aksharvatsal Swami briefly

explained about the renovation of Jiva Khachar's darbar, and the 25-ft-high bronze murtis of Bhagwan Swaminarayan on his mare, Manki, Gunatitanand Swami and the 17-ft- high murti of Dada Khachar installed in front of the BAPS Mandir as per the wish of Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

Both the newly accomplished projects were ritually inaugurated and thrown open for all by Mahant Swami Maharaj this morning. Thereafter, an introductory video of Jiva Khachar's *darbar* was shown.

Then, Mahant Swami Maharaj inaugurated 18 Swaminarayan Aksharpith print publications written by scholarly swamis and devotees about the different aspects of the Vachanamrut (see page 29).

Thereafter the *sadguru* swamis and swamis residing and serving in Gadhada honoured Swamishri with garlands.

BAPS children performed a thrilling traditional dance to celebrate the occasion. At that time, Mahant Swami Maharaj performed *pujan* of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj and the historical handwritten manuscript of the Vachanamrut.

Finally, the assembly climaxed with Mahant Swami Maharaj's blessings, "The Vachanamrut explains to us about *agna* and *upasana*. Today's celebration programme was wonderful because of the profound elaborations delivered about the Vachanamrut. The deep mysteries of the Vachanamrut were extracted and served to all. If a staunch atheist imbibed these mysteries he would

become a theist. That is what was discussed and presented here to-day. There is still a lot more *jnan* in the Vachanamrut.

"Once, Yogiji Maharaj arrived in Jinja, Uganda. Yogi Bapa went to the mandir terrace to perform the *kalash* rituals. There, a devotee came to Yogi Bapa and said, 'Swami, I perceive *manushyabhav* in you.' The devotee thought that

Yogi Bapa would show him a miracle so that he would experience divyabhav in him. But Yogi Bapa interestingly replied, 'If there are any lapses in my panch vartmans [moral vows] then strike my head five times with your own shoes. Other than that, it is not my concern that you get manushyabhav [in me].' What a perfect answer! Likewise, one should continuously observe agna. We should consolidate agna and upasana within ourselves. Through the Vachanamrut we will attain the highest realization. We will understand the essence

of Shriji Maharaj's descent on earth through the Vachanamrut.


"Dr Swami stated that we should not see others' faults. Shriji Maharaj also says, 'When a devotee does not look at another devotee's faults but sings his virtues, then he has intensely served me. This is what I believe.' On the other hand Shriji Maharaj says, 'No matter what a *sant*

may be, whether a great person or a scholar, but if he lapses into finding faults in a devotee, he will decline [spiritually].' These are the two essences. On one who sees the virtues of a devotee, Shriji Maharaj becomes intensely pleased [rajipo]. His rajipo means moksha. Thus, such wonderful talks were expressed today. I congratulate everyone."

Since it was also the day of

Fuldol, Mahant Swami Maharaj devotionally sprayed coloured water on Shri Harikrishna Maharaj and Shri Harikrishna Maharaj also sprayed the holy coloured water on Swamishri. The *sadguru* swamis also sprayed coloured water on Shri Harikrishna Maharaj.

Finally, Swamishri, the audience and countless devotees watching the live broadcast from their homes performed the *arti*. The Vachanamrut Bicentenary Celebrations concluded with vibrant *jais* and a traditional dance by children and youths.






Installation of the Bronze Murti of Bhagwan Swaminarayan on Manki

Mahant Swami Maharaj inaugurated the 25-ft-high bronze murti of Bhagwan Swaminarayan on Manki, his mare, along with Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami and Dada Khachar in front of the main steps of the BAPS Mandir in Gadhada

spiritual master in the succession of Gunatit gurus. Thereafter, the mandir was completed by Brahmaswarup Yogiji Maharaj and developed later by Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj. Then, Pramukh Swami Maharaj resolved that a monumental bronze *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan on Manki, his mare, be installed before the mandir. Work on this project began in his time and was finally fulfilled and inaugurated by Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj on 6 March 2020.

In this entire project, colossal efforts were made by Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Ishwarcharan Swami. Along with him, Shrijiswarup Swami, Aksharvatsal Swami and Kirtisagar Swami endeavoured untiringly. Under their guidance and direction a model was made by expert artisans in Ahmedabad. The renowned

artist, Vasudeo Kamath, made the line sketches of the *murtis*.

The *murtis* have been installed in front of the beautifully carved marble archway that lies by the mandir steps. It seems as if Bhagwan Swaminarayan has descended on the hillock with his dear and eternal servant, Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami, with the pious Dada Khachar welcoming him with a garland.

In memory of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's stay in Gadhada for 25 years, the height of the bronze *murti* is also 25 feet. This is the tallest *murti* of Shri Hari in the entire Swaminarayan Sampradaya. Simultaneously, the 17-feethigh *murtis* of Gunatitanand Swami and Dada Khachar are also unique in the entire Swaminarayan Sampradaya.

On 6 March, Mahant Swami Maharaj




performed the initial inaugural rituals of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's imposing *murti*. He offered flowers and rice grains at his lotus feet and untied the *nadachhadi* tied around the pedestal of the *murti*. Inscribed on all sides of the pedestal are the names of 1,041 villages in which Bhagwan Swaminarayan personally visited. On this occasion Mahant Swami Maharaj also gave darshan and blessings to the descendants of Dada Khachar.

On 11 March 2020, Mahant Swami Maharaj performed the *pujan* and *pratishtha* rituals of the *murtis* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan on Manki, *sevak* Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami and Dada Khachar. Prior to that, the senior swamis completed the initial *mahapuja* rituals and thereafter Swamishri performed the concluding *arti* and *mantra-pushpanjali* rituals. Then, Swamishri

performed *pujan* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's lotus feet, Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami's holy feet and of Dada Khachar's and Manki's feet. Swamishri also performed the *pratishtha*

Finally, Swamishri blessed the gathering, "Whoever does darshan of these grand *murtis* and remembers them at the time of death, then Shriji Maharaj will come riding on Manki and liberate his soul to Akshardham."







ike the avatars of Bhagwan Ram and Krishna, Bhagwan Swaminarayan per-Iformed countless *lilas* (divine activities) for the joy and spiritual liberation of incalculable pious souls. Among the many villages and towns he visited or stayed during his travels in Gujarat, Gadhada (Gadhpur) had earned his unprecedented favour and blessings. The reason for this was the profound love and selfless bhakti of the devotees of Gadhpur. The narrations about the love and devotion of Bhaktaraj Abhel Khachar, Bhaktaraj Dada Khachar, Bhaktaraj Laduba and Bhaktaraj Jivuba in the Satsang scriptures are legendary. Bhaktaraj Jiva Khachar was also a dedicated and devout devotee. During his initial years in Gadhada, Bhagwan Swaminarayan resided in Jiva Khachar's darbar and performed many divine lilas.

Jiva Khachar was not only a royal chief who had selflessly dedicated himself at the holy feet of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, but his name and fame had earned him the respect and honour of Maharaja Vakhatsinhji of Bhavnagar, who gave him a prominent seat in his royal court. On several occasions Bhagwan Swaminarayan expressed his joy and pleasure on Jiva Khachar for his virtues of politeness and generosity.

The village of Gadhada was established by Dana Khachar, who had two sons: Jiva Khachar and Unnad Khachar, Since Unnad Khachar was the younger son, his family came to be known as 'Nani Deli or [Small House]', whereas Jiva Khachar and his family came to be known as 'Moti Deli [Big House]'. Jiva Khachar of the 'Moti Deli' had a son named Puja Khachar, and his son's name was Jiva Khachar.1 The latter was deeply impressed when he first saw Bhagwan Swaminarayan during his maiden visit to Gadhada in 1803. He was convinced that Shri Hari was Paramatma. Subsequently, he invited him to his home and requested him to permanently reside in Gadhada. But this did not occur at that time. Later, on 10 February 1805, Bhagwan Swaminarayan arrived

in Gadhada for the second time because of the profound devotion of Abhel Khachar and Jiva Khachar. He then decided to stay there.

Historical texts narrate many accounts of Jiva Khachar's bravery. Though he was a Kshatriya his speech was like that of a scholar. When the doughty Jiva Khachar came into Shriji Maharaj's association he gave up his vices and started turning the *mala* instead of wielding his sword. Furthermore, he gave up his addictions to tobacco and opium and became absorbed in bhakti. Countless Kathi *darbars* were transformed under the divine influence of 25-year-old Bhagwan Swaminarayan.

Jiva Khachar's year of birth is unknown. However, in 1805, when Bhagwan Swaminarayan arrived in Gadhpur, there is a reference of Jiva Khachar's 15–17-year-old eldest son, Bhoka Khachar, of having offered his services in decorating Gadhada. So, when Shri Hari first arrived in Gadhada Jiva Khachar's age must have been between 35 and 40 years.


Jiva Khachar passed away one year before

Shriji Maharaj's earthly departure in 1830. At that time Jiva Khachar must have been about 60 to 65 years old. In context to the details mentioned, we can assume that Jiva Khachar was probably born around 1770.

Jiva Khachar and his wife, Kunvarba, had four children: two daughters – Amulaba and Amriba, and two sons – Bhoka Khachar and Desa Khachar. The entire family, along with Jiva Khachar's younger brother, Mulu Khachar, and his family, were totally dedicated to Shri Hari.

In the Sampradaya's historic texts (like the *Hari-Charitramrut-Sagar*), incidents have been noted about Jiva Khachar's devotion and his daughters' bhakti for Shriji Maharaj. Bhagwan Swaminarayan declared and praised that the two sisters' bhakti was like that of Kushalkunvarba, Laduba, Jivuba, Rajba and Minbai, who were *ekantik* devotees.

In 1805, Shri Hari stayed at Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh* and the latter dedicated his entire family and all his resources in Shriji Maharaj's service. Because of his profound bhakti, Maharaj stayed at

Jiva Khachar's home for three years. Thereafter, Shri Hari went to stay at Abhel Khachar's home and often visited Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh* to bless all with the divine joy of his *lilas*.

Over the past two centuries, swamis and devotees have often visited Jiva Khachar's *darbar* for darshan. However, since the last few decades these visits were barred because of the ruined state of the *darbargadh*. Thereafter, Pramukh Swami Maharaj resolved to rebuild and renovate the holy *darbar* of Jiva Khachar and open it for darshan.

Subsequently, Pramukh Swami Maharaj discussed about renovating the sacred *darbar* with the descendants of Jiva Khachar, who were staying there at the time. The homes and precincts were eventually acquired by the BAPS and Swamishri made appropriate living arrangements for Jiva Khachar's descendants. The task of remaking and renovating the *darbargadh* began thereafter and all the historic and traditional details were incorporated. With the blessings of Pramukh Swami Maharaj and the guidance of Ishwarcharan Swami the renovation work was executed by Adhyatmaswarup

Swami, Kothari of the BAPS Mandir in Gadhada. Aksharvatsal Swami researched about the historic buildings and their locations in Jiva Khachar's *darbar* and the *lilas* of Shri Hari from the Sampradaya's historical texts.

With the references to all these details Shrijiswarup Swami prepared a master plan of the *darbargadh*. Then, the décor and embellishments in each room of the *darbargadh* were accomplished by Brahmacharan Swami, Divyanandan Swami and other swamis. To enlighten the visitors about the divine *lilas* of the *darbargadh* an audio-visual presentation was prepared by Parag Shastri and Parth Gajjar.

On the morning of 6 March 2020, Mahant Swami Maharaj inaugurated the renovated *darbargadh* of Jiva Khachar amidst Vedic chantings and in the presence of Jiva Khachar's descendants. The latter felt honoured to be present and receive Mahant Swami Maharaj's blessings.

In the evening, Swamishri and the *sadguru* swamis took a detailed guided tour of the *darbargadh*. Ishwarcharan Swami and Aksharvatsal

Swami explained the importance and glory of all the places. Swamishri was very pleased and blessed all the swamis who had served in creating the exhibitions and the *darbargadh*.

On 11 March 2020, Mahant Swami Maharaj performed the *pratishtha* rituals of Shri Hari's *charanarvind* installed in a shrine, where Shri Hari used to sit under a neem tree to deliver discourses.

Swamishri went to the veranda of the *darbar* where Shri Hari rode the Manki swiftly from one end to the other. Bhagwan Swaminarayan had also served lunch to his *paramhansas* on this same veranda. A similar ambience was recreated today whereby swamis sat in the veranda and also outside in the open ground for lunch. Swamishri served laddus to each of the swamis seated in the veranda and revived the memories of Shri Hari's divine *lila*.


In the same corridor of this *darbargadh*, Bhagwan Swaminarayan had pulled the ropes of a churn to produce butter from buttermilk. In memory of this *lila*, Swamishri also pulled the ropes of a churn with Tyagvallabh Swami. A beautiful tableau has been created to show the *lila*

of Bhagwan Swaminarayan having lunch on this veranda, while Jiva Khachar and his family are devotionally coaxing Maharaj to eat. Swamishri performed the *arti* of Maharaj's *murti*.

Finally, Swamishri's lunch arrangements were made next to the tableau of Shriji Maharaj having lunch. At that time, Aksharvatsal Swami narrated the wonderful *lilas* performed by Bhagwan Swaminarayan in the *darbargadh*. Finally, Swamishri extolled Jiva Khachar's bhakti, "Jiva Khacher's bhakti was unparalleled. He was a great devotee. So, one should sing his virtues and

glory. Shriji Maharaj says, 'One may not be able to serve me, but I believe that by singing the virtues of devotees one has served me immensely.' Jiva Khachar had done a lot of bhakti and sacrificed so much [for Shriji Maharaj], therefore his faults are of no measure at all. And Shriji Maharaj had accepted his *seva* and dedication. He came to Jiva Khachar during his last moments, stroked his body with his hand [to bless him], and after he passed away Maharaj performed the cremation


rites by lighting his funeral pyre. Therefore, we too should sing Jiva Khachar's glory and offer bhakti to Shriji Maharaj and please him."

In this way, under the auspices of the Vachanamrut Bicentenary Celebrations, the entire Swaminarayan Sampradaya has been gifted with the unique renovated *darbargadh* of Jiva Khachar. It is open for all to have darshan of this unique holy place, where Shriji Maharaj resided and performed many divine *lilas*.

Bhaktaraj Jiva Khachar's Holy Darbargadh

The spiritual abode of Gadhpur is a popular pilgrim place where countless devotees flock every year to have darshan of the places and objects sanctified by Bhagwan Swaminarayan. One such holy place is the newly renovated darbargadh of Jiva Khachar. A brief introduction to the sanctified places is as follows.



1. Seats Outside Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh

Here, one can see the raised platforms (*otla*) outside the main door of Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh*. There were once two neem trees, flanking the *otla*.

In the time of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, the Darbars held *dayra* (music performances, in which people gather to listen to the performer sing bhajans and deliver religious as well as social discourses) under the neem trees.

Here, on these two *otla*, Bhagwan Swaminarayan sat many times and specially discoursed to his sadhus. Sometimes, Shri Hari also slept on the *otla*. Thus, this place, outside the main door of Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh*, witnessed many of Shri Hari's *lilas*.





In the time of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, the darbargadh had a large precinct, which included many houses and a wall encircling it. Bhagwan Swaminarayan performed many divine lilas in the enumerated houses. Let us understand those lilas in numerical order.



2. Bhaktaraj Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh: Inside View of the Main Door

This is the inside of the *darbargadh's* main door. On either side are seating areas as per the royal tradition. Bhagwan Swaminarayan sat here on many occasions to discourse to his disciples. He also sat here and took lunch on many occasions. Shri Hari pleased and showered his divine joy upon his Kathi friends.



3. Bhagwan Swaminarayan Sanctified the 'Muni Limdo', Where He Discoursed Many Times

Bhagwan Swaminarayan sat beneath the 'Muni Limbdo' (neem tree) many times and held spiritual assemblies, and also instructed his *paramhansas* to sing bhajans.

The name 'Muni' before the neem tree is derived from a disciple named 'Muni'. Due to his guru's curse he was reborn as this neem tree. Then, by Shri Hari's association the tree was liberated and it subsequently withered and died. Thereafter, Shri Hari infused another *jiva* into the tree and it became alive and green again. So, in remembrance of this incident, Shri Hari named it 'Muni Limdo'.



4. Stable Where Manki Was Tethered

This is the stable of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's favourite mare, Manki. The stable floor was about three feet below ground level, where Manki was kept. When Shri Hari was residing at Jiva Khachar's home he was gifted with Manki for his travels. Many times, even at night, Bhagwan Swaminarayan rode Manki in the courtyard of Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh* and sanctified the grounds.

4. Sacred Kitchen

Touching the north-facing room in Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh*, this extension was used as a kitchen for Shri Hari. Below this kitchen is Manki's stable. During Shriji Maharaj's three-year stay in Jiva Khachar's *darbar* his meals were cooked here. Bhagwan Swaminarayan also dined in this kitchen many times.



5. Jiva Khachar's Original Residence Where Shri Hari Performed Many Divine Lilas

To the west of the Muni Neem tree and to the left of Manki's stable lies Jiva Khachar's original house with its rooms on a high plinth and an east-facing veranda. In 1805, Bhagwan Swaminarayan came to Gadhada and initially stayed in these rooms. He generously served lunch to his *paramhansas* while they were seated on the east and west verandas.



6. Large Granary in Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh

Jiva Khachar was very generous and charitable. He served food rations in charity to pilgrims and mendicants from his *darbargadh*. This circular granary still exists today, in which four tons of grains can be stored.

Bhagwan Swaminarayan inspired the construction of this granary, and many times he personally served grains to mendicants who came here.

During the grave famine of 1869 Jiva Khachar contemplated on committing suicide because the stock of grains in his almshouse was exhausted. At that time, Shriji Maharaj came and blessed him, saying there would never be a shortage of grains in his granary.

Sometimes, Shri Hari sat by the window behind this granary and donated grains to those who came begging for alms.





7. Longest Veranda Outside the Sacred Six Rooms of Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh

These six rooms were sanctified often by Bhagwan Swaminarayan. In 1805, when Shri Hari arrived in Gadhpur, he stayed in these rooms of Jiva Khachar's darbargadh for three years. During his initial stay in the darbargadh he inspired the construction of these rooms. In each of these rooms, he discoursed, dined, slept and revealed his divinity on many occasions.




8. Shri Hari Rode His Manki on This Eastern Veranda of Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh

One of the most fascinating of Shri Hari's *lilas* in the *darbargadh* of Jiva Khachar was the way he rode Manki with finesse on the eastern verandah.

Because of Jiva Khachar's wish Bhagwan Swaminarayan rode Manki up an incline on the north side to climb up on to this eastern verandah. Then, he swiftly rode it from one end to the other several times, without letting his *chogalu* on his *pagh* touch the beams. The Kathi devotees were greatly impressed by his equestrian skills.

Shri Hari also served lunch to and celebrated the Rangotsav with the *paramhansas* on this veranda.



9. Shri Hari Performed Many Lilas on This Western Verandah of Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh

Here, too, on this western verandah of the *darbargadh*, Shri Hari generously served lunch to his *paramhansas*. Once, he observed the solar eclipse here and revealed his divinity to all. Shriji Maharaj also sat on this veranda and delivered discourses on many occasions.

10. Shri Amulaba's and Shri Amariba's North-facing Rooms in the Darbargadh

Formerly, here (open ground), were located the northfacing rooms of Amulaba and Amriba, the two daughters of Jiva Khachar. Due to their profound bhakti Bhagwan Swaminarayan sanctified their rooms by celebrating festivals, delivering discourses and having lunch.



11. Location of Mulu Khachar's Former Rooms

The rooms of Mulu Khachar, the brother of Jiva Khachar, were once located here (open ground) in the *darbargadh*. The rooms, built on a high plinth, were east and west-facing. This place lies in the southern direction after entering the main door of the *darbargadh*.

Shri Hari celebrated Janmashtami and other festivals here. In this open countyard, Shri Hari organized games like *kabaddi* and *hututu* for the Kathi Darbars to enjoy. Maharaj also rode his Manki here on several occasions.

On the large open ground of Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh* Shriji Maharaj often had a *mandap* set up for the purpose of delivering spiritual discourses or celebrating festivals like Rangotsav and others.



12. Shri Hari's Meditation Room in the Southern Direction of Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh

Here, in the southern direction of the *darbargadh*, were two small rooms in which Bhagwan Swaminarayan often meditated alone on his divine form. Sometimes, he also rested here as well.

This is the location of one of the rooms.





13. Entrance from Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh to the Hillock in Gadhada

From the above entrance of Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh* Shri Hari was often inclined and interested in going to the hillock situated in the southern direction. Formerly, there was a wall around the hillock. In the northern part of the old wall, Shri Hari often entered the hillock to rest in the open. In the southern part of the hillock, Shri Hari rested many times on a turret located in its western corner.

Shriji Maharaj made plans to build a grand mandir on the hillock. His wish was fulfilled by Shastriji Maharaj, and later Pramukh Swami Maharaj developed it according to Shri Hari's wish.

Other Holy Places in Jiva Khachar's Darbargadh

Due to the ravages of time, many of the places in Jiva Khachar's darbargadh no longer exist today. For example, the darbargadh's south-facing rooms, a large kitchen, a big plot of open land behind the darbargadh where temporary accommodations were arranged for the paramhansas during festivals, rooms for senior paramhansas, Shri Ram Khachar's north-facing rooms, Rajba's room, a large rest house for the paramhansas made by Jiva Khachar opposite the darbargadh and many other places were all sanctified by Shriji Maharaj. Details about these places and Shri Hari's lilas are found in the Sampradaya's texts.

Even today, one experiences the divine presence of Bhagwan Swaminarayan in Jiva Khachar's *darbargadh*.



The stage backdrop portrayed a wonderful fusion of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's era, 200 years ago, and the present age. The entire programme highlighted how the Vachanamrut provides guidance and solutions to issues and challenges in our modern life. dances, dramas and inspiring speeches by swamis.

SELFLESS SERVICES BY BAPS DURING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC





since March 2020, the coronavirus pandemic has taken centre stage in the lives of people throughout the world. It has interrupted the 'normal' flow of life and led to many changes in lifestyle. The future course of events is still uncertain and much patience and unity is still required to bring the situation under control.

During these unusual times, support networks of all types have assisted the vulnerable and needy to cope with the circumstances. BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha, through its centres, sadhus and devotees worldwide has contributed in many ways by providing localized and focused social and spiritual support.

Pramukh Swami Maharaj, building on the sentiments of selfless service practised by Bhagwan Swaminarayan, lived his life 'In the joy of others' and inspired many ventures that continue to benefit countless people globally. In the wake of this pandemic, Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj responded to the need of the hour and inspired the many BAPS projects implemented during the pandemic. The following pages present an overview of the main social and spiritual services selflessly performed by BAPS sadhus and devotees worldwide.



Serving hot meals

BAPS RESPONDS TO THE PANDEMIC

As the entire world seemingly came to a sudden halt, the dramatic changes led to much disturbance in the daily lives of individuals, families and communities. Naturally, the financial fallout of the lockdowns was acutely felt and movement restrictions meant that vulnerable groups were disproportionately affected. Devotees at BAPS centres in India, the USA, Canada, the UK, Europe, Africa, the UAE, Australia and New Zealand reached out to help their local communities in various ways. These multi-faceted initiatives have helped the elderly and needy to remain informed, safe and supported.

PUBLIC HEALTH SAFETY AWARENESS

Even before the first case of coronavirus infection was detected in Gujarat, in the interest of public health and safety, BAPS reduced the international Vachanamrut Bicentenary Celebrations, scheduled from 5 to 10 March, into a local festival.

Worldwide, every week, hundreds of thousands of people attend the over 20,000 assemblies for children, teenagers, youths and adults that are conducted at BAPS mandirs and centres. All these assemblies were suspended and the need for social distancing and personal hygiene widely promoted.

Public announcements and publications, including summaries of government guidance, delivering important advice on remaining safe and healthy,

and support people in various other aspects of their lives that have been impacted by the pandemic, were made and provided.

Health awareness videos, seminars and presentations in English and Gujarati to educate the public on its collective responsibility to help stem the rapid spread of this deadly virus.

GLOBAL RELIEF ACTIVITIES

To support the needy amid the pandemic hardships, devotees at BAPS centres worldwide rallied to serve and provide for local communities as required. They provided:

Hot Meals

Daily, hot freshly cooked meals were prepared and packed for distribution to the needy. Also, hot meals, snacks and drinks were delivered to local hospitals, fire brigades, police stations, and other places for emergency workers and frontline personnel.

Fresh Vegetables

During the lockdown, fresh vegetables, such as potatoes, brinjals, cabbage, cauliflower, gourd, tomatoes, chillies, lemons, ginger, etc., were distributed.

Ration Kits

Ration kits containing flour, dal, rice, oil,

spices, gur, etc. were distributed to needy families.

Medical Support

Personal protective equipment (PPE) kits, masks, sanitizer, beds, ventilators, health care packs, and other medical consumables and equipment were distributed.

Financial Assistance

Monetary donations to hospitals, NGOs and other non-profit organizations were made to support their activities during the pandemic.

Emotional Support

Phone calls from sadhus and volunteers to individuals and families provided support, solace and guidance to many using available communication channels.

Community Support

Assistance to the elderly and vulnerable to collect shopping, drop off medications and run essential errands.

Supporting other charitable organizations to deliver fresh fruit and vegetables as well as grocery bags to the needy.

Supporting hospitals and key work places, such as police stations, fire stations, local food banks, local councils, essential schools, care homes, etc., by providing food and other useful

supplies as well as letters and cards of gratitude for their heroic staff.

SPIRITUALITY AT HOME

Due to the restrictions necessary to slow the spread of the coronavirus, in-person gatherings have not been possible. Hence, in place of the weekly assemblies at BAPS mandirs and centres, online assemblies and apps, have enabled everyone to participate from home, provided regular spiritual guidance and reinforced the importance of adhering to the government guidelines to contain the pandemic.

These creative and enjoyable assemblies and apps, presented in various languages, reinforced spiritual, social and moral values and family harmony.

In addition, prayer and *mahapuja* sessions have been held to provide inner peace and strength in these challenging times.

Sabhas

Every week the Ravi Sabha (Sunday Assembly) for all has been broadcast online and, where available, via local TV channels.

Parayans and speech series were also broadcast. These include: Pramukh Swami Maharaj Centenary Lecture Series (11 May to 9 June 2020), Shravan Month Parayan (20 July to 19 August), Adhik Mas Parayan (2–16 October),

Bhakti Parva (17–24 October) and Aksharbrahma Gunatit Satra Vykhyanmala (2–17 November).

Major festivals were celebrated online: Swaminarayan Jayanti,Guru Punam, Pramukh Swami Maharaj Smruti Din, Jal Jhilani, Shastriji Maharaj Smruti Din, Mahant Swami Maharaj's 87th Birthday Celebration and others.

Major milestones were also marked by webcasts that enabled devotees throughout the world to celebrate and participate live in the events with Swamishri: 75th Patotsav of BAPS Mandir, Atladara; London Mandir Suvarna Mahotsav Celebrations; Swaminarayan Akshardham Amalak Pujan Ceremony, Robbinsville; and Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami Murti-Pratishtha Mahotsav.

In addition, weekly local sabhas for *bal-balika*, *yuvak-yuvati*, *sanyukta* and *mahilas* were conducted via social media platforms.

In India, the broadcasts have been in Gujarati and Hindi. In other countries broadcasts have also been in English to especially cater for the children and youths. The content has also been tailored to suit the target audience. Every week there have been separate webcasts for different age groups.

These webcasts offer a unique online experience to all devotees and well-wishers, supplementing their use of social media, conference call *goshthis*, online video platforms and the official BAPS website to help them stay virtually connected with members of the satsang community.

Many of these broadcasts have been pre-recorded, and were possible due to efficient planning and the coordination by sadhus, *karyakars*, the audio-visual department and others. The behind the scenes efforts for speakers to prepare and deliver their content, the high quality video and audio recording, editing, special effects, uploading and other aspects of production was remarkable. It took many hours and late nights to produce each broadcast, especially since each component would often have to be recorded in different locations and then integrated into a continuous presentation.

Such endeavours have been accomplished by teams based in India, the UK, USA, Canada, Africa, Australia, New Zealand and the UAE.

It is truly commendable that such rich, creative, informative, inspiring and spiritually uplifting broadcasts have been provided. They have served as excellent substitutes to in-person attendance.

Swamishri's Puja Darshan

During this time, Param Pujya Mahant Swami Maharaj has been in Nenpur, a village near Ahmedabad. In addition to his daily vicharan photo, video and blessings, Swamishri's puja has been broadcast on specified days at different times for the convenience of devotees worldwide to enjoy his darshan. Daily, prayers continue to be offered for an early end to the pandemic, and the good health, happiness and prosperity of all.

Mandir Darshan

Online darshan of the *murtis* and *artis* at *shi-kharbaddha* mandirs in India and abroad have been arranged for all at specified times during the day.


Adhiveshans


Prayer and Mahapuja Assemblies

The novel coronavirus has been a tough and



BAPS in the UK produced a video, 'Serving Together, In the Joy of Others', paying tribute to




Gratitude messages from BAPS children to Covid Warriors the thousands of key workers serving in the UK during the Covid-19 pandemic.
















SATSANG DIKSHA

A Precious Gift from Guruhari Mahant Swami Maharaj 5 July 2020, Nenpur On the auspicious occasion of Guru Purnima, on 5 July 2020, Guruhari Param Pujya Mahant Swami Maharaj presented a historic gift to the BAPS Satsang community in the form of a book. Written in Gujarati by Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj himself, 'Satsang Diksha' is a concise text which forms a part of the voluminous 'Akshar-Purushottam Samhita'. The Gujarati prose is also presented as 315 Sanskrit verses.

In Satsang Diksha, based on the teachings of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, Mahant Swami
Maharaj concisely describes the philosophical principles to be understood and the daily personal
practices of devotion to be undertaken by all BAPS devotees. Thus, it is a shastra
explaining the principles of agna and upasana as revealed by Bhagwan Swaminarayan.
This text represents a special message directly from Guruhari Mahant Swami Maharaj
to all BAPS devotees, clearly revealing the path everyone must follow to attain
ekantik dharma and experience the bliss of God.

He has requested every devotee to read it daily.

When presenting the Satsang Diksha shastra to the BAPS Satsang community,
Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj dedicated the text at the feet of
Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Gunatit gurus under the auspices of Pramukh Swami Maharaj's
Centenary Celebrations (1921–2021).

upreme Parabrahma Bhagwan Swaminarayan manifested on this earth out of his infinite compassion to liberate countless souls. He established the divine Satsang fellowship, and nourished and fostered the timeless traditions of Hinduism. Through his revelation of the Vedic principle of 'Akshar-Purushottam Darshan' he identified the path for attaining the highest *moksha*.

In his moral and spiritual teachings, detailed in the Shikshapatri and Vachanamrut, Bhagwan Swaminarayan provides a practical guide of spiritual sadhanas for the experience of happiness through moral behaviour, social dealings and spiritual knowledge. Both shastras include the essence of the Hindu shastras. Over the past two centuries, the Gunatit gurus have nurtured the spiritual tradition and knowledge founded by Bhagwan Swaminarayan to inspire and bless countless *mumukshus* with the experience of the highest divine bliss.

A concise form of the spiritual knowledge and sadhanas propagated by Bhagwan Swaminarayan and the Gunatit gurus is presented for all *mumukshus* in the Satsang Diksha shastra authored by Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj.

Swamishri started writing this shastra in Navsari on 30 January 2020 – Vasant Panchmi (Maha *sud* 5, V.S. 2076) – and completed it on 2 April 2020 – Swaminarayan Jayanti (Chaitra *sud* 9) in Nenpur. He wrote this shastra amidst his unceasing and

tireless *vicharan*, daily satsang assemblies and events, personal meetings with sadhus and devotees, and the daily correspondence and administrative responsibilities of the BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha. Quite often, Swamishri wrote until late at night or during the early morning.


Once Swamishri had finished writing the shastra, he involved senior and scholarly sadhus of the BAPS – Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami, Pujya Viveksagar Swami, Pujya Atmaswarup Swami, Pujya Anandswarup Swami, Pujya Narayanmuni Swami, Pujya Bhadresh Swami and others – to enrich its language, wherever required.

The Satsang Diksha shastra forms a part of the Akshar-Purushottam Samhita shastra, a Sanskrit text which expounds the teachings of Bhagwan Swaminarayan's philosophy and bhakti tradition. On Swamishri's instructions, the Gujarati Satsang Diksha shastra he had written was rendered into Sanskrit by the Sanstha's renowned scholar, Mahamahopadhyaya Bhadresh Swami. Thereafter, Swamishri checked the Sanskrit translation with the original Gujarati verses and made necessary changes.

On 5 July 2020, the auspicious day of Guru Purnima, in Nenpur, Mahant Swami Maharaj performed the *pujan* rituals of the 'Satsang Diksha' shastra and dedicated it with profound devotion at the lotus feet of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami, Brahmaswarup Bhagatji Maharaj, Brahmaswarup Shastriji Maharaj, Brahmaswarup Yogiji Maharaj and Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

By gifting this shastra, Swamishri has blessed the present and future generations with a concise version of the philosophy and teachings of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and the Gunatit gurus. It clarifies and inspires everyone's spiritual sadhanas for attaining ultimate *moksha*.


The Swaminarayan satsang is a unique and practical way of life in consonance with the Vedic Akshar-Purushottam principle and has been practised by countless *satsangis* since the



Swamishri performs *pujan* of the Satsang Diksha shastra time of Bhagwan Swaminarayan. For the spiritual nourishment and growth of the Satsang, Bhagwan Swaminarayan inspired an unceasing *parampara* and legacy of Aksharbrahma Gunatit gurus.

Agna and upasana are the two principles of satsang explained and elaborated upon by Bhagwan Swaminarayan in his divine discourses, which have been compiled as the Vachanamrut. These two principles are also reflected upon in the books, kirtans and discourses of his paramhansas.

Aksharbrahma Gunatitanand Swami's discourses consolidate the supreme divinity of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, spiritual sadhanas and principles in the lives of countless sadhus and devotees. Through his discourses, Brahmaswarup Bhagatji Maharaj propagated that Gunatitanand Swami is Aksharbrahma and Bhagwan Swaminarayan is Parabrahma Purushottam. Brahmaswarup Shastriji Maharaj tolerated colossal hardships and opposition to enshrine the principle of Akshar-Purushottam as revealed by Bhagwan Swaminarayan. He consecrated the *murtis* of Akshar-Purushottam in the central shrines of *shikharbaddha* mandirs. Brahmaswarup Yogiji

Maharaj fostered the Satsang with the nectar of samp, suhradbhav and ekta. He established the BAPS children's and youth forums, and Sunday satsang assemblies to nourish the devotees with the principles of agna and upasana. Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj's Herculean efforts developed the BAPS into a global organization. He inspired the writing of shastras, consecrated 1,200 mandirs, blessed 1,000 youths with saffron diksha and organized socio-spiritual services for the uplift of society.

Presently, through the leadership and blessings of Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj, over 1,000 sadhus and countless devotees continue to be enlightened with the fundamental principles of satsang. His teachings that we are the followers of one God, one guru and one principle, and must cultivate humility, harmony and *mahima* for all have nurtured an atmosphere of divinity and love in the Satsang.

Since the time of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, the Sampradaya has seen the creation of shastras that nourish the principles of *agna* and *upasana* among its followers. Further, shastras related to

philosophy, spiritual sadhana, bhakti, *niyams* and dharma, and other aspects of spirituality have helped in disseminating and consolidating the satsang way of life among devotees.

Mahant Swami Maharaj had long wished that a single shastra be written to summarize the teachings of all the shastras of the Sampradaya. He discussed this with the senior sadhus and accepted their request to carry out the *seva* of writing such a shastra himself.

The resulting shastra, Satsang Diksha, includes a wide range of essential topics: Bhagwan Swaminarayan is Parabrahma Purushottam Narayan, supreme, the all-doer, always has a divine form and is forever manifest on earth; the Gunatit guru is Aksharbrahma, the embodiment of Narayan, because he is eternally God-realized, and the ideal for all spiritual aspirants to attain the *brahmic* state; and profound love and *atmabuddhi* for him are the essence of all sadhanas.

The principle of becoming *aksharrup* – to offer humble devotion to Purushottam – is delineated in this shastra. In addition, it advocates daily contemplation as part of one's sadhana on thoughts such

as having attained Parabrahma (*prapti*), Bhagwan's all-doership (*karta-harta*), earning Bhagwan's pleasure (*rajipo*), *atma*, the ephemeral nature of the world, *mahima* through association, perceiving others' virtues, *divyabhav* and introspection.

Satsang Diksha also encompasses aspects such as support (paksha) for devotees, abstaining from discouraging talks and not looking at others' flaws. It includes the purpose of establishing mandirs and bhakti rituals such as darshan and mansi. It also guides on the daily practices for devotees, such as obeying niyam-dharma, having good behaviour, attending the weekly satsang sabha, performing personal daily puja and mansi, conducting ghar sabha, and performing arti and other rituals before the ghar mandir.


The word diksha, which is part of this shastra's

title, means firm resolve, unshakeable faith and total sacrifice. The message of this shastra is to resolve to personally consolidate the principles of satsang related to *agna* and *upasana* in one's life, and to attain firm faith in and totally dedicate oneself for these two principles.

Satsang Diksha contains the quintessence of all that needs to be understood and practised in Satsang as propagated by Bhagwan Swaminarayan and the Gunatit guru *parampara*.

Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj has truly blessed the entire Satsang fellowship by writing this shastra to reveal the satsang principles as taught and established by Bhagwan Swaminarayan and the Gunatit gurus. We will forever remain indebted to him for his contribution and grace.

Satsang Diksha Padhramanis in North America



In a letter referring to the Satsang Diksha, Mahant Swami Maharaj wrote, "My inner enthusiasm is that I visit each home and explain all these talks 'one to one' to everyone. But due to the many limitations, this is not feasible. However, as this *granth* has reached everyone's home, believe that I have visited."

Swamishri has graciously gifted the Satsang Diksha shastra to the entire BAPS satsang family. So, when the printed copies of the shastra became available, everyone was eager to honour and welcome it into their homes. Hence, with the support of the *karyakars*, the Satsang Diksha text was hand delivered to the homes of all devotees in Canada and USA. The devotees devoutly and joyously honoured and received the printed texts at their homes, believing that Swamishri himself was visiting them in the form of the Satsang Diksha.

In total, thousands of *padhramanis* took place in several hundred cities throughout USA and Canada during which many thousands of Gujarati and English printed copies of the Satsang Diksha shastra were delivered.





Satsang Diksha Sanskrit Shlok Memorization Competition

11-13 September 2020, India

As per the wish of *guruhari* Mahant Swmi Maharaj, the Satsang Pravrutti Central Office in Ahmedabad organized separate competitions for *yuvaks* and *yuvatis* to memorize the Satsang Diksha shastra.

After a preparation period of six weeks, a total of over 8,200 *yuvaks* and *yuvatis* from throughout Gujarat and Mumbai participated in the zonal competitions.

Due to the restrictions enforced by the coronavirus pandemic, the participating youths were assessed by the examiners over a WhatsApp video call. A total of 1,237 examiners assisted in

this process.

The participating *yuwaks* and *yuwatis* were graded by the number of *shloks* they recited correctly. Despite the short preparation time, 164 *yuwaks* and *yuwatis* memorized the entire shastra (315 *shloks*), 70 memorized over 250 *shloks*, 100 memorized over 175 and 209 memorized over 125. Many of the remaining memorized over 45 *shloks*.

The enthusiasm of the youths to fulfil Mahant Swami Maharaj's wish was evident in all. Swamishri blessed all the youths by writing a letter, appreciating and rewarding their efforts.



Satsang Diksha: National Complete Shlok Memorization Competition Felicitation Assembly

16 October 2020, India

he *yuvaks* and *yuvatis* who had participated in the zonal competitions and memorized all 315 Sanskrit *shloks* of the Satsang Diksha were eligible for this national competition coordinated by the Satsang Pravrutti Central Office.

A total of 368 yuvaks and yuvatis took part and were thoroughly tested online via video calls by 38 examiners. Of the participants, 273 youths (152 yuvaks and 121 yuvatis) were assessed to have correctly memorized all 315 Sanskrit shloks. A further 28 had correctly memorized 300 shloks and 8 had memorized 285.

For all these *yuvaks* and *yuvatis* a special online felicitation assembly was held in the presence of Param Pujya Mahant Swami Maharaj, who was in Nenpur.

The assembly began with inspiring speeches by Pujya Doctor Swami and Pujya Ishwarcharan

Swami. Then, Atmaswarup Swami, narrated the effort and diligence with which Mahant Swami Maharaj had written this historic shastra.


After arriving in the online assembly, Shri Harikrishna Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj were honoured with *pujan* and garlands.

It was an occasion of immense joy for all Hindus that the construction of the majestic Shri Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, an emblem of faith and spirituality, at Ayodhya, the historic birthplace of Shri Ram, commenced in the presence of the Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi, and revered sadhus from across India.


On the historic occasion of the foundation stone-laying ceremony, due to the restrictions enforced by the coronavirus pandemic, a limited number of spiritual leaders and saints were invited as representatives of the richly diverse culture and tradition of India. Amongst them, Mahant Swami Maharaj, was also cordially invited.

Thirty-one years ago, when the national movement for the construction of Shri Ram Janmabhumi Mandir began, Pramukh Swami Maharaj had sanctified the first Ramshila of Gujarat with Vedic rituals on 16 August 1989. Pramukh Swami Maharaj, who had prayed for many years for the construction of this mandir, had sanctified this first Ramshila on the

auspicious day of Rakshabandhan. Coincidently, on the same occasion of Rakshabandhan, on 3 August 2020, Mahant Swami Maharaj also performed the Vedic *pujan* of the Shri Ram Rakshak Yantra and Shri Ram Yantra for placement in the Shri Ram Mandir foundations and prayed for the earliest completion of the mandir.





The joy was palpable throughout Ayodhya as the city welcomed the mahatmas and dignitaries from throughout India for the historic Shilanyas Ceremony of the Shri Ramjanmabhumi Mandir in the presence of the Prime Minister of India Shri Narendrabhai Modi, Leader of the RSS Shri

Mohanrao Bhagvat, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Shri Yogi Adityanath, Uttar Pradesh Governor Shrimati Anandiben Patel and Head of the Shri Ram Janmabhumi Tirthkshetra Nyas Trust Pujya Mahant Nrutyagopaldasji.

A total of 170 revered mahatmas and dignitaries from throughout India had been invited. The distinguished mahatmas represented 36 Hindu traditions. Among them, Mahant Swami Maharaj, spiritual leader of the BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha, had also been invited. Although he was unable to attend in person, he expressed his profound feelings in a letter to the Prime Minister, "Although I am not able to attend in person, I am present there through my inner spirit."

Representing Swamishri on this auspicious occasion were Brahmavihari Swami and Aksharvatsal Swami. They reached Ayodhya on 4 August. There, they had a meeting with Pujya Mahant Nrutyagopaldasji; Shri Nrupendra Mishra, head of the mandir construction; Shri Champatrayji, General Secretary; Shri Govindgiriji, Trust Treasurer; Shri Dineshji and others to discuss the mandir construction project.

During this meeting, Shri Govindgiriji recalled, "We clearly remember that 31 years ago in 1989, Pramukh Swami Maharaj performed the









January to October 2020

Surat, Navsari, Atladara, Anand, Gadhada, Sarangpur, Ahmedabad, Nenpur



Due to the outbreak of the coronavirus pandemic, and in the interests of public health and safety, Swamishri's planned *vicharan* schedule was halted and since 18 March 2020, he has been residing at Shantivan in the holy village of Nenpur, near Ahmedabad, sanctified by Bhagwan Swaminarayan.

To prevent the possibility of large numbers of devotees gathering for Swamishri's darshan and endangering their health, Swamishri himself decided that his *vicharan* and that of the *sadgurus* and other sadhus should also be stopped.


'Do something new.' For you, this means to study properly. Study so well that you break all records. May Maharaj and Swami bless you all to succeed."

"When you go house-to-house with this message of family harmony, you may face problems. But remember the difficulties faced by Shastriji Maharaj, Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj. In comparison, our difficulties are insignificant. So, engage in this sincerely. Manage your time and talk to one or two people daily. Then, much will be achieved.

"Yogi Bapa had said, 'If we do not announce you, you will not be pleased.' To earn the *rajipo* of the great Sadhu is a big achievement. Everything is included in that. If you engage in their work, then Maharaj-Swami and the Satpurush are always with you. Others may insult you, but resolve 'I want to please Swami.' If you do not announce [Pramukh] Swami, then you are not a true disciple."

Then, Swamishri officially launched the project by using a remote control to draw back the curtains to reveal the *divo*, which was also lit remotely. *Jai naads* filled the atmosphere as flower petals were showered.

A flourishing suburb of Ahmedabad, the weekly satsang *sabha* in New Naroda began in 2007. With an influx of devotees settling from nearby villages, the need for a local mandir arose.

After suitable land was acquired, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami performed the *bhumi pujan*. To celebrate the mandir inauguration, a kirtan *aradhana* by the sadhus and youths was presented on 17 January.

On the morning of 18 January, a *yagna* was performed in which 501 *yajmans* participated and in the afternoon, the *murtis* to be consecrated were honoured in a *nagar yatra*.

On the morning of 19 January, Pujya Dr Swami and Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami performed the Vedic *pratishtha* rituals and consecrated the *murtis* in the new mandir.

Mahant Swami Maharaj had previously performed the Vedic *murti-pratishtha* rituals and *arti* of the *murtis* on 26 November 2019 in Bochasan.

Bhadreshi (Jhalavad Region) 15-16 February 2020

Bhadreshi, in the Jhalawad region, had been sanctified by Bhagwan Swaminarayan. The BAPS Satsang here was established in 1992. In 2018, Shri Raghubhai Patel donated land for a mandir.

On the morning of 15 February, 160 *yajmans* participated in the *yagna*. In the afternoon, a grand *nagar yatra* took place honouring the *murtis*.

On the morning of 16 February, the *murtis* were consecrated with full Vedic rites in the new mandir by Pujya Viveksagar Swami.

Mahant Swami Maharaj had previously performed the Vedic *murti-pratishtha* and *arti* of the *murtis* on 26 November 2019 in Bochasan.

Dolatpara, Junagadh: 15-17 February 2020

The mandir inauguration celebrations featured a wonderful *nagar yatra* of the *murtis* on 15 February.

On 17 February, the *murtis* were consecrated in the new mandir with full Vedic rituals by Yogiswarup Swami.

Mahant Swami Maharaj had previously performed the Vedic *murti-pratishtha* rituals and *arti* of the *murtis* on 7 November 2019 in Rajkot.

ONLINE ZONAL YUVA ADHIVESHANS 17–19 May 2020

During the lockdown in India, *yuvaks* and *yuvatis* from BAPS centres in Gujarat, Maharashtra and other states participated in the online Zonal Yuva Adhiveshans.

Youths competed with others from centres in their zone. They participated in four competitions: Vachanamrut Mukhpath (Memorization),



Sahajanand Namavali Mukhpath, Poster Design and Script Writing.

On 17 and 19 May, a total of 2,155 yuvaks and 3,358 yuvatis took part online in the two mukhpath competitions. Each participant was tested by an assessor over a Whatsapp video call. While reciting their memorized material, the youths were required to keep their eyes closed to ensure fairness.

Youths also submitted their poster design and script entries online to the Satsang Activities Central Office in Ahmedabad for assessment.

Zonewise results were declared separately for *yuvaks* and *yuvatis* for each competition.

VIRTUAL MEDICO-SPIRITUAL CONFERENCE 3–4 October 2020



Over 530 medical students from throughout Gujarat tuned in to participate in the online Medico-Spiritual Conference based on the theme 'Faith: Winning Formula for Life'.

The 2-day conference featured guidance from Pujya Doctor Swami, as well as inspiring speeches by learned and experienced BAPS swamis and other professionals which helped to cultivate faith in God and guru, trust in others and self-belief among the delegates. Special audio-visual presentations reinforced the conference theme. The highlight of the conference was the blessings from Param Pujya Mahant Swami Maharaj.

UK & EUROPE

ONLINE FAMILY SHIBIR 12 July 2020



On 29 December 2019, Mahant Swami Maharaj wrote a letter to the UK & Europe Satsang Mandal explaining the fundamental importance of *ahnik* (daily personal practices of devotion) for one's spiritual progress and as a personal contribution to the 25th anniversary celebrations of BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir, London.

Making this the central theme, a special online one-day family *shibir* was organized to better understand the meaning, method and benefits of these daily devotional practices and how to improve their quality.

The *shibir* covered daily puja, *arti*, *thal*, *mansi* and *cheshta*, as well as the importance of a *ghar* mandir through a series of enlightening video presentations, discourses by senior and learned swamis, demonstrations, and interactive exercises throughout the day. The learning included inspiring examples from the exemplary lives of Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj.

The *shibir* began with *samuh* puja where families performed their personal puja in unison with the aid of an online tutorial. Families

then enjoyed the webcast darshan of Mahant Swami Maharaj's puja that was recorded earlier in Nenpur, India.

The webcast sessions continued thereafter, providing detailed guidance on the various aspects of personal daily satsang and the sharing of best practices. The teachings were supported with worksheets and prepared resources with opportunities for members of the family to participate in these practices at home.

During the afternoon, families held discussions on how to improve the quality of their collective devotion at home. They also had time to enjoy fun family activities.

Following the evening session, families also joined the live webcast of the sandhya *arti* and the *abhishek* of Shri Nilkanth Varni Maharaj in London while joining in at their own homes. The enlightening day concluded with *samuh cheshta*, also webcast from London.

PARENTING WEBINAR FOR ELEVEN-PLUS EXAMS 30 July & 5 August 2020



The Eleven-Plus (11+) is an important examination administered to some students in the UK in the final year of their primary education. It governs admission into secondary schools which rely on academic selection. This typically challenging time for many parents and children has been exacerbated this year due to the current lockdown.

Over 160 families of Year 5 children attended the webinars during which teachers and experts

provided a deeper insight into the competition for school places and encouraged parents to maintain a realistic perspective on their children's potential.

Attendees also learnt how best to prepare for the exams, with specific tips on the exam papers, including the importance of 'quality over quantity' and investing time to practise and learn from past papers.

The webinar also revealed valuable life skills that participants can harness to help them in their future academic and professional lives.

ASIA PACIFIC

SWAMISHRI SANCTIFIES MURTIS FOR DEVOTEES OF AUSTRALIA 4 July 2020, Melbourne



In Nenpur, Pragat Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj presided, via video conference, over the sanctification of 500 sets of metallic *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj for the devotees of Australia to keep in their homes and offer devotion. PUJYA BHAKTIPRASAD SWAMI, Nadiad Passed Away: 20 April 2020, Age: 77

Shri Rameshbhai received *vartman* from Brahmaswarup Shastriji Maharaj. Through his dedicated services he earned the blessings of Yogiji Maharaj, Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj. His father was Shri Mahipatray Dave, a scholar and elder brother of Shri Harshadray Dave. Their ancestor, Veljibhai Dave

was blessed by Gopalanand Swami, "Velji's family tree will flourish."

Thus, as his third-generation descendents, Mahipatray, Harshadray and their two other brothers were staunch devotees of Shastriji Maharaj. These Dave brothers earned the innermost blessings of Shastriji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

So, Rameshbhai was raised in an environment surrounded by satsang. From a young age, he was interested in the Sampradaya's history, philosophy and literature. With the blessings of Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj, he completed a PhD in Philosophy and for many years taught at the SIES College in Mumbai. After retiring from teaching, he served as the director of the Anantacharya Indological Research Institute from 1999 to 2016.

In his student years, he travelled to the villages with Yogiji Maharaj and, as a Brahmin, he served Thakorji and Yogiji Maharaj in the kitchen and in other special ways. From 1960 to 1970, such close association with Yogiji Maharaj strengthened his *niyam*, *nishchay* and *paksha*. As a scholar, he enthusiastically explained the glory of satsang to others. He introduced many leading scholars of Mumbai and India to Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj and explained to them the glory of the Gunatit Sant.

He also represented the BAPS at many academic conferences and seminars, presenting research papers and speeches on Bhagwan Swaminarayan's philosophy. He wrote many articles, books, research papers on topics ranging from Swaminarayan Vedanta to the Sampradaya's bhakti tradition.

Rameshbhai made notable contributions when the *yuvak* and *bal mandals* prepared handwritten magazines to present to Yogiji Maharaj.

By the wish of Yogiji Maharaj and Pramukh Swami Maharaj, Rameshbhai assisted Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami in setting up the Satsang Examinations framework. He wrote the *Ghanshyam Charitra*, *Nilkanth Charitra*, *Sahajanand Charitra* and other exam books. He also contributed notably to the setup of the Pragna exams. Rameshbhai also had deep knowledge of *jyotish* and *muhurt* texts with which he

helped to determine scriptural timings of various important mandir events. When Pramukh Swami Maharaj became the guru in 1971, Rameshbhai met Diwaliba, Pramukh Swami Maharaj's mother, and prepared Swamishri's *janmakshar* (horoscope). In 1980, he accompanied Swamishri on his overseas Satsang *vicharan* during which he delivered many speeches in English.

SHRI ARVINBHAI HIRABHAI PATEL, Trivendram (Kerala) Passed Away: 23 September 2020, Age: 64






