


SHRI HARI IN GADHPUR

The paramhansas and devotees listened eagerly to Shri Hari's discourses in Gadhpur. Once, devotees from a village came to request Shri Hari to send a swami to discourse in their village...



Shri Hari arrived in Dada Khachar's *darbar* and sat in the verandah outside Sombai Foi's room. Muktanand Swami, Nityanand Swami, Brahmanand Swami, Chaitanyanand Swami and other *paramhansas* sat before him. Shortly thereafter, Mulji Brahmachari brought lunch and placed it before Maharaj. Shri Hari said, "You should have taken the lunch to Akshar Ordi!"

Mulji Brahmachari replied, "I brought it here so that the *paramhansas* could have your darshan and receive your *prasadi*." Shri Hari smiled at Mulji's reply and remarked, "Brahmachari has no personal wish for *prasadi* or darshan. He simply remains passionately engaged in *seva*. He understands my glory as well as the glory of the sadhus and devotees in equal measure." Then, Maharaj took lunch.

THE THORNY TREE IS FORTUNATE

While Shri Hari was having lunch his eyes fell on a thorny tree before him. He commented smilingly, "This thorny tree is also fortunate because Purushottam Narayan's eyes have seen it." A little while later Maharaj added, "And this neem tree is also very fortunate and blessed because I have sat under it many times and held spiritual assemblies and performed many *lilas*." The *paramhansas* were listening avidly to Maharaj's words. Shri Hari continued, "You all swamis and devotees, who are associated with me, are indeed most

fortunate and blessed. Even the milk of cows, curd, fruits and flowers that have been used by me – all are very blessed and fortunate. They will all be liberated after one or two births."

I DO NOT LIKE THREE THINGS

On hearing this, Muktanand Swami asked, "Maharaj, still another birth will be required to attain *moksha*?" Shri Hari explained, "Those who have understood and realized my divine form will be liberated in this birth." Then, Maharaj praised, "You are all very fortunate and blessed, but you'll have to understand my wishes and inclinations. You should abide by what I like and abstain from what I don't. Now listen, I don't like three things: Firstly, one who is stiff and arrogant and does not bow down to anyone; secondly, he does something for the sake of becoming great; and lastly, one who behaves out of ill-will towards swamis and devotees. I am not pleased with these three things. So, a devotee must always remain humble and straightforward."

Then, Maharaj got up to leave. Mulji Brahmachari gave him *mukhvas* to eat. Shri Hari added, "In Satsang, one finds nectar (*amrut*) as well as poison. So, drink *amrut* and become immortal, but never taste poison." Muktanand Swami and Dada Khachar fully understood Maharaj's words, whereas others took them to be sound advice for all.

PLACE YOUR HOLY CHARANARVIND ON MY CHEST

A few days later, devotees of Shri (now Shi) village of the Jambusar Bara (coastal) region of Gujarat arrived in Gadhpur. They had Shri Hari's darshan and narrated how Vignananand Swami had inspired satsang in their region. Thereafter, they requested, "We wish to organize spiritual discourses (*parayan*) on the Shrimad Bhagvat by a swami in our village so that aspirants can benefit."

Shri Hari called Vignananand Swami and instructed, "You have to accompany these devotees to their village and discourse on the Shrimad Bhagvat."

Vignananand Swami humbly replied, "Maharaj, I have studied the Shrimad Bhagvat, but I do not have the skill and intelligence to do *katha*."

Shri Hari was pleased with his modesty and commanded, "Swami, go on my instruction. I am the bestower of intellect and powers, so be confident and go with the devotees." Vignananand Swami had no option because it was Shri Hari's wish. He humbly acknowledged, "Maharaj, since it is your *agna* I will go, but press your holy *charanarvind* on my chest and I shall do darshan of them while delivering the discourses."¹

Shri Hari was pleased with Swami's devotion and so he asked for a bowl of sandalwood paste (*chandana*) mixed with saffron (*kesar*). Then, Maharaj dipped his feet into the bowl and pressed them on swami's chest. Vignananand Swami was overwhelmed with joy and felt divine energy coursing through his body. He then asked, "Maharaj, when shall I leave?"

"Leave tomorrow after lunch."

CELEBRATION OF FESTIVALS IN GADHPUR

The Indian New Year of 1825 (A.S. 1881) had

set. Shri Hari celebrated the Dev Podhi Ekadashi (July) festival in Gadhpur. Maharaj gave the *paramhanas* special *niyams* to observe for the four holy months. Thereafter, Maharaj also celebrated Janmashtmi in Gadhpur.

Shri Hari told Brahmanand Swami to return to Vartal and complete the mandir construction, "I will be residing in Gadhpur till you arrange the *murti-pratishtha* rituals in the month of Kartik (October). As soon as you inform me I shall come there a little earlier."

SHRI HARI GOES TO BOTAD TO SEE BHAGA DOSHI

A few days later, a *parshad* came to Dada Khachar's *darbar* and informed Maharaj, "Bhaga Doshi is suffering from an interminable illness. He is lying on his deathbed and is eager to have your darshan."

On hearing this, Shri Hari instantly stood up. He called Naja Jogiya and instructed, "Prepare Manki and bring her to me. I want to leave for Botad right now."

In the meantime, Jiva Khachar arrived. On hearing the news about Bhaga Doshi he said, "Maharaj, wait for a while. I, too, will join you." Shri Hari looked at him and said, "Be quick, I shall be at your house soon."

Jiva Khachar immediately returned home. When Maharaj arrived with Naja Jogiya he saw Jiva Khachar sitting on a cot in his compound talking with relatives. Shri Hari asked, "You have as yet not got ready!"

Jiva Khachar replied, "Maharaj, you might as well not go, because I've just received the news that Bhaga Doshi has passed away."

Shri Hari looked into Jiva Khachar's eyes and questioned, "Bapu, are you informing me that Bhaga Doshi has passed away?" Then Maharaj added, "Bapu, if you do not wish to come it's

1. From the oral tradition in Satsang it is believed that Vignananand Swami kept his eyes on the impression of Shri Hari's *charanarvind* and discoursed for seven days and pleased the devotees. While he took his daily bath he cleaned the surrounding area of the impression with a wet towel to make sure that it remained as it was.

okay. I am going.” And Shri Hari galloped away towards Botad.

When Shriji Maharaj reached the outskirts of Jotingda village there was a sudden shower of heavy rain. Shri Hari’s silver threaded clothes and Manki’s saddle became drenched and spoilt. Naja Jogiya spoke with utter discontent, “How bad it is!” Shri Hari spiritedly replied, “Bhaga Doshi is a devotee of such high calibre that if 100 such clothes and saddles were drenched or spoilt I would not have minded one bit!” Naja Jogiya remained mute and repaired his understanding.

Thus, Shri Hari entered Botad in his wet clothes and came to Godad Khachar’s *darbar*. Here, he removed his wet clothes and put on a pair of fresh ones. Manki’s saddle was removed and placed in the sun to dry. Then, Maharaj proceeded to Bhaga Doshi’s house. Bhaga Doshi was lying on his bed, chanting Maharaj’s name and eagerly awaiting for his darshan. When Shri Hari arrived he sat on a chair by Bhaga Doshi’s bed, and gently started stroking his head. Bhaga Doshi opened his eyes. Shri Hari spoke aloud, “Bhaga Doshi, look here. I have come because you have been remembering me!”

Bhaga Doshi turned his eyes towards Maharaj, and he was filled with emotions. A torrent of tears flowed and Shri Hari calmed him, “Do not cry. This is not the time to cry.” Bhaga Doshi replied in a chocking tone, “Maharaj, these are tears of joy, in celebration of your love and compassion for me. I do not fear death. My soul will leave this body and receive a divine body to ascend to Akshardham and eternally sit before you.”

Shri Hari remarked, “But I do not wish to send you to Akshardham now. I want you to have darshan of the constructed mandir and *pratishtha* ceremony in Gadhada.” Then, Maharaj asked, “Bring a bowl of millet soup with sugar for him to drink.” After Bhaga Doshi drank the bowl of soup Shri Hari went to Godad Khachar’s *darbar*, took lunch and departed for Gadhada.

SUCH DECEPTION WITH ME?

On arriving back to Gadhada Shri Hari went to Jiva Khachar’s house. There, he found Jiva Khachar engaged in a casual conversation with his friends and relatives. On seeing Maharaj he got up. Shri Hari dismounted and gave the reins of Manki to Naja Jogiya. He came near to Jiva Khachar and declared, “Jiva Khachar, Bhaga Doshi is now much better. Who gave you the news that he had passed away?”

Jiva Khachar remained silent for a while and then spoke softly, “Oh, it was a rumour, so I merely informed you.”

Shri Hari replied emphatically, “Should one believe a rumour related to someone’s death! Shouldn’t you have enquired further? It was about an esteemed businessman of Botad and not an ordinary person. Furthermore, he is a great devotee. Thus, to float such unfounded news about him is most improper. You believe me to be Bhagwan and yet you tried to deceive me!”

Jiva Khachar had nothing to say. Shri Hari then mounted Manki and came to Dada Khachar’s *darbar*. On seeing Shri Hari’s grave face Dada Khachar asked, “Maharaj, how is Bhaga Doshi?”

Shri Hari replied, “He is well.”

Then Muktanand Swami explained, “We got news from Jiva Khachar’s house that Bhaga Doshi had passed away.”

Shri Hari replied with a tinge of pain on his face, “He had also told me, ‘Bhaga Doshi has passed away, so there’s no need for you to go.’ Jiva Khachar is a prominent figure. He knew that I had once promised Bhaichand Sheth [Bhaga Doshi’s father] that I would take care of his son, but now with his departure my pledge has proved to be wrong. Such was Jiva Khachar’s bad intent. But I’ve kept him alive. I have not given up my support and responsibility towards Bhaga Doshi.”

BAPS Satsang in the UAE

A BRIEF TIMELINE



The United Arab Emirates (UAE) is a federation of seven emirates or kingdoms. Since its inception in 1971, the principles of tolerance and harmony of the founding fathers have guided its growth as a nation. The UAE is home to people of over 200 nationalities. In particular, Hindus have resided in the UAE for decades and have contributed significantly to the economic progress of the country. They form the largest expatriate group in the country.

Pramukh Swami Maharaj visited the UAE in 1982, 1985, 1997 and 2001 and over the years BAPS devotees have faithfully gathered to conduct weekly satsang assemblies. Their satsang has been further nurtured by the regular visits of *sadguru* sadhus and other BAPS sadhus from India.

The following is a brief history of satsang in the UAE leading up to the Shilanyas Ceremony for the BAPS Hindu Mandir in Abu Dhabi.

1974



Bhagwanjibhai Bhatia, Rohitbhai P. Patel, Bachubhai Trivedi, Rajendrabhai Dave, Dineshbhai Thakkar, Jaynarayanbhai Patel, Ramnikbhai Luhar and others welcomed Swamishri at Sharjah International Airport. Swamishri was hosted at the home of Shri P.D. Patel, father of Rohitbhai P. Patel, in Dubai, and Khimjibhai Depala in Abu Dhabi.

19 March: Swamishri graced the BAPS Satsang Bhuvan in Dubai.

20 March: Swamishri visited the 100-year-old Vaishnav Haveli for darshan.

21 March: Evening assembly at Indian Social Centre in Abu Dhabi; Ambassador of India to UAE HE Lalit Mansingh attended.

23 March: Consul General of India in Dubai Praveen Lal Goyal came to meet Swamishri.

Swamishri also visited Abu Dhabi, Sharjah, Ras Al Khaimah and Fujairah.

Inspired by Pramukh Swami Maharaj's visit, devotees began a weekly satsang *sabha* in Abu

Dhabi at the residence of Rajendrabhai Dave on Guru Purnima. After six months, weekly *sabhas* continued at the homes of Khimjibhai Depala, Nandlalbhai Depala and Rajendrabhai Dave, in rotation.

Also, frequent *sabhas* were held in labour camps on Saadiyat Island, Abu Dhabi. New Year Annakut celebrations held at the home of Rajendrabhai Dave.





2015



16 August: The UAE Government graciously decided to allot land for a Hindu mandir. Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi publicly appreciated the Government's decision at an assembly of more than 60,000 people in Abu Dhabi. He tweeted from the Grand Mosque: "I am very thankful to the UAE Govt for their decision to allot land in order to build a mandir in Abu Dhabi. This is a great step."

23 March: HE Sheikh Nahyan attended the launch in Sharjah of *Transcendence: My Spiritual Experiences with Pramukh Swamiji* – a book by Dr APJ Abdul Kalam on Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

4 September: Allotment Order from the Crown Prince's Court to grant 5 acres of land.

BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha and Mandir Limited were chosen and entrusted by the governments of both the UAE and India to construct, develop and administer the mandir project.

2017



8 April: Brahmavihari Swami discussed with Prime Minister Narendra Modi about the initial ideas for the BAPS Hindu Mandir.


May: Pujya Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami and sadhus visited the UAE.

24 October: In place of the 5 acres of land granted in 2016, the Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed al Nahyan issued an order and generously gifted a 13.7-acre plot of land at Abu Mureikha, between Abu Dhabi and Dubai, to enable the building of the BAPS Hindu Mandir and cultural complex.

2018



18 January: Brahmavihari Swami discussed detailed designs of the BAPS Abu Dhabi Mandir with Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

26 January: In the Akshar Deri, Gondal, Mahant Swami Maharaj performed *puja* of the *shilas* for the BAPS Hindu Mandir, Abu Dhabi.

10 February: For the first time ever the Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi HH Sheikh Mohammed Bin Zayed Al Nahyan used his Presidential Palace to receive a head of state and other visitors. Following his meeting with the Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi, and the formal signing of eight MOUs between the UAE and India, announcements in Arabic and English invited the BAPS delegation to approach the two leaders. The Crown Prince and the Prime Minister both stood up to warmly welcome Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami and Brahmavihari Swami, and the BAPS Hindu Mandir committee members. As the BAPS Hindu Mandir in Abu Dhabi was officially announced in the royal court, a golden Amrut Kalash and an elegant commemorative book were presented to each leader amidst a standing ovation.

11 February: Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi, in the presence of over 1,700 Indian and Emirati dignitaries at the Dubai Opera, unveiled a model of the traditional stone mandir to be built in Abu Dhabi. Simultaneously, the auspicious Vedic Shila Puja was performed by Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami at the mandir site in Abu Dhabi, which was streamed live at the Dubai Opera. In his address, the Prime Minister thanked the Crown Prince HH Mohammed bin Zayed al Nahyan for providing the land and permission for building a traditional mandir.

Mandir Limited received the necessary government approvals and official licenses to fund-raise for this community project of love, tolerance and harmony.

The process of surveying land and discussions on the design of the master plan began.

9 November: Grand Diwali and Annakut celebrations in Abu Dhabi attended by over 10,000 dignitaries, devotees and well-wishers.

20 November: Crown Prince Court approved the Mandir master plan concept.

10 February: Official permission granted to the proposed BAPS Hindu Mandir as a place

of worship.

18 to 29 April: Mahant Swami Maharaj visited the UAE. Hosted at the homes of Rohitbhai P. Patel in Jumeirah Park and Amitbhai Patel on the Palm Jumeirah.

18 April: Mahant Swami Maharaj received at Al Maktoum International Airport (DWC) in Dubai as a State Guest of the UAE by HE Sheikh Nahyan Bin Mubarak Al Nahyan, Cabinet Member and the Minister of State for Tolerance.

Devotees of the UAE had been devoutly preparing and eagerly waiting for several months for Mahant Swami Maharaj's visit.

Today, 18 April, marked the end of their wait.

Dr B.R. Shetty, a highly respected Indian-origin businessman and philanthropist in the UAE, went to Ahmedabad with his private plane to bring Swamishri and other sadhus for their 12-day visit to the UAE.

At 10.53 a.m. (IST), the flight departed from Sardar Patel International Airport in Ahmedabad, and landed at the Al Maktoum International Airport (DWC) in Dubai at 12.15 p.m. (local time).

As the plane came to a halt on the tarmac, a red carpet was laid out to greet Swamishri. First, Brahmavihari Swami came out with Shri

Harikrishna Maharaj. Then, Swamishri descended the steps. At the bottom, on behalf of the UAE government, His Excellency Sheikh Nahyan Mabarak Al Nahyan, UAE Minister of Tolerance, welcomed Swamishri with a warm handshake and embrace.

Conveying Swamishri's sentiments, Brahmavihari Swami told HE Sheikh Nahyan that Swamishri had brought God and his blessings for him, and the entire UAE and surrounding region.

His Excellency Sheikh Nahyan Mabarak Al Nahyan responded, "Yes, we have been waiting. I feel blessed, our country is blessed, the whole region is blessed with your presence and purity. Consider the UAE as your home. We are welcoming you to your home."

Then, Brahmavihari Swami said to His

Excellency, “If you remember you had asked me to hold your hand and take you to heaven. Well, he is the person who can. Hold his hand and he will lead you to heaven.”

Then, holding Swamishri’s hand, His Excellency Sheikh Nahyan Mabarak Al Nahyan escorted him along the carpet to the airport terminal. Inside, *balaks* dressed in traditional costumes honoured them both with a shower of flower petals.

As they conversed, Mahant Swami Maharaj said, “You have come here from far, and I am sorry that we are a little late and kept you waiting.”

His Excellency Sheikh Nahyan Mabarak Al Nahyan said, “I would have waited for weeks to see you and greet you.” Then, still holding Swamishri’s hand, he added, “You are a very spiritual person. I can feel it in my heart. You have blessed the world.”

After a photo session, Sheikh Nahyan Mabarak Al Nahyan again held Swamishri’s hand and escorted him outside to the waiting car, where he bid him farewell.

Thus, with this official welcome, Swamishri’s 12-day visit as a State Guest of the UAE government began.

From the airport, Swamishri went to Jumeirah Park, where his stay had been arranged at the newly built home, named ‘Mansavovar’, of Shri Rohitbhai Patel and his sons.

Across the road from here, a large air-conditioned marquee had been erected for the morning

and evening assemblies. Smaller marquees adjacent to the rear had been erected to provide dining areas for the devotees for the duration of Swamishri’s stay.

Swamishri arrived in the welcome assembly at around 1.15 p.m. Hundreds of devotees from the UAE, Middle East and other countries were present. Everyone was delighted to have Swamishri’s darshan. After brief speeches by Brahmavihari Swami and Atmaswarup Swami, Swamishri was welcomed with garlands. Then, he departed from the assembly.

Swamishri reached ‘Mansarovar’ and before entering he performed the ritual inauguration of the home in the presence of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj.

For nine days, this would be Swamishri’s base. Thereafter, Swamishri would be staying for three days at the home of Shri Amitbhai Patel. ◆

GRAND Shilanyas CEREMONY

BAPS Hindu Mandir, Abu Dhabi


Located at Abu Mureikha, a short drive from Exit 366 off the E11 expressway between Dubai and Abu Dhabi, the 27-acre site of the BAPS Hindu Mandir was the venue for the historic Shilanyas (Foundation Stone-Laying) Ceremony. For many weeks, the dedicated volunteers had been devoutly planning and preparing for this momentous occasion.

Flags of India, the UAE and festive messages decorated the entrance path to the site. On one side, atop a high sand dune, a large cutout of the Mandir was displayed welcoming all.

Two large air-conditioned marquees had been erected – the larger one, 40m by 90m, housed the excavated foundation area (W: 16m, L: 11m, Depth: 1.6m) where the main Shilanyas Ceremony would take place, the main stage (Width: 14m, Length: 6m, Height: 1 m), and approximately 2,500 dignitaries, well-wishers and devotees who would be participating in the Vedic *shilanyas* rituals. The other marquee, 40m by 60m, accommodated around 2,500 devotees and well-wishers who had come for darshan of this auspicious occasion.

Before sunrise, volunteers began to arrive to make the final preparations. From 7.30 a.m. devotees from the UAE, Oman, Bahrain, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, India, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, South Africa, UK, France, USA, Canada, Australia, Singapore, Thailand and other countries began to arrive for the ceremony. Eager with excitement and dressed in traditional attire, the participants took their seats in the main marquee. Before each, on a stool, were a *murti*, a small *shila* (stone) and worship items for the *shilanyas* rituals.

At the front of the marquee was the stage, with a 45 ft wide by 15 ft high LED screen as a backdrop on which a variety of slides, videos and live visuals were displayed throughout the ceremony and assembly. In front of the stage, below ground level, was the elegantly decorated excavated foundation area. Here, the primary *shilanyas* rituals

would be performed and the main foundation stones would be ritually placed into position. The area had been meticulously prepared with a red carpet, and flowers and other decorations.

At 9.00 a.m., a short video of the mandir project – from Pramukh Swami Maharaj’s prophecy in 1997 to the present – was shown.

Two large LED screens had also been set up for the audience – one at the front of the marquee and the other in the middle.

Then, Shrutiprakash Swami with his team of sadhus and pandits led the Vedic *shilanyas* rituals.

Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami performed the worship of the central foundation stone while Vedic mantras were recited. For the benefit of participants who were new to this ceremony, the rituals and instructions were also explained in English.

In the excavated foundation area, worship of the other eight main foundation stones was performed by Atmaswarup Swami, Anandswarup Swami, Jnaneshwar Swami, Gurudev Shri Rakeshbhai Jhaveri (revered Jain guru), Ambassador of India HE Navdeep Suri, Consul General of India Vipul, Dr B.R. Shetty, Shri Sudhir Shetty, Shri Vasu Shroff, Shri Yogeshbhai Mehta, Shri S.M. Rao, Shri Harshadbhai Mehta, Shri Bakulbhai Mehta, Shri Ramesh Ramakrishnan, Shri Mayank Patel, Shri Rohit Gupta, Shri Mahendrabhai Patel, Shri Lai Huen Poh, Shri Somasundaram Lakshman, Shri Rohitbhai P. Patel, Shri Manubhai P. Patel,

Shri Ghanshyambhai Pagrani, Shri Maheshbhai Patel, Shri Amit Patel, Shri Kiran Asher, Shri Binay Shetty, as well other senior BAPS devotees and dignitaries.

Outside the foundation area, on the floor of the marquee, were many distinguished guests participating in the rituals: Mr Nazeem al Kudsi (grandson of former President of Syria), Shri Ram Buxani, Shri Vinodbhai Adani, Mr Michael Magill, Mr John Wong and others. Many Emiratis from throughout the UAE were also present.

At 10.30 a.m., Shri Harikrishna Maharaj and

Param Pujya Mahant Swami Maharaj were welcomed into the ceremonial marquee. Everyone was overjoyed to have this darshan as Swamishri took his seat by the central foundation stone to continue the *shilanyas* rituals.

Brahmavihari Swami applied a *chandlo* to Swamishri's forehead and tied a *nadachhadi* to his right wrist. Then, Swamishri performed *pujan* of the construction implements and the engineers who will be overseeing the construction.

Thereafter, as Vedic chants continued, Swamishri placed the *nidhikumbh* and main foundation stone into position, and using a trowel

poured white cement on the main stone. Other dignitaries also poured cement on the main stone.

After the conclusion of the rituals, Swamishri and all others came up from the foundation area. Swamishri went to the adjacent majlis (reception area) to receive the government ministers who had come to participate in the ceremony: His Excellency Dr Mugheer Khamis Al Khaili, Chairman of the Department of Community Development and Member of the Executive Council, His Excellency Dr Thani Ahmed Al Zeyoudi, Minister of Climate Change and Environment, and His Excellency Dr Ahmad Bin Abdullah Humaid Belhoul Al Falasi, Cabinet Member and Minister of State for Higher Education and Advanced Skills. Swamishri warmly met the guests, who expressed their delight to be present for this auspicious and historic celebration.

Then, Swamishri returned with the guests to the ceremonial marquee and at the entrance they unveiled the 'Gift of Gratitude' (see box on p. 20) – a special artwork celebrating the Year of Tolerance to be presented as a gift on behalf of the Indian community to the Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi HH Sheikh Mohammed Bin Zayed Al Nahyan for his generosity and support for the BAPS Hindu Mandir project.

then entered the excavated foundation area for the concluding rituals.

As Vedic mantras were recited, Swamishri and all others placed sanctified small *shilas* on the main *shila*, poured white cement and showered flower petals on the central foundation area. Finally, they collectively poured water from three *kalashes* containing water from three of India's most holy rivers – Ganga, Yamuna and Saraswati.

Thereafter, Swamishri and all others made their way to the stage. The celebration assembly began with everyone standing for the national anthems of the UAE and India. Swamishri then welcomed and honoured the guests with garlands. Thereafter, the assembly featured a series of speeches, culminating with Swamishri's blessings.

“At the beginning of my welcome address, I would like to tell especially the king, His Highness Khalifa Bin Zayed al Nahyan, the

Crown Prince His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan and also all the rulers and leaders who have expressed lots of love, shown so much faith and extended their complete support

GIFT OF GRATITUDE

The artwork consists of two major parts, ‘the base’ and ‘the frame’. The base is created using seven large sandstone blocks representing the seven Emirates of the UAE. These blocks interlock with each other creating a strong foundation for the frame. The interlocking symbolizes unity and harmony in governance, in communities and in the growth of all seven Emirates. Pink sandstone from Rajasthan, India, has been used for the base – the same stone from which the BAPS Hindu Mandir will be hand-carved by 2,000 stone craftsmen.

The frame is made of 4,875 metal fins having unique lengths which cast shadows of various lengths. The fins are organized in such a way that they cast long and short shadows to render a beautiful portrait of the late HH Sheikh Zayed Bin Sultan Al Nahyan. This portrait of the Father of the Nation represents

the inherent values of peace and humanity throughout the realm.

Small metal fins reflect the cultural diversity and prosperity of the evolving UAE. As the viewer moves away from the fins, the large artwork articulates into two images – The Founding Father of the UAE on one side and the ghaf – the symbol of the Year of Tolerance – on the other.

to what we are experiencing this morning, that I have no words to express my joy. It is ineffable for me to express how much joy we feel together, not just as the Hindu community and not just as the Indian community, but as the community of the world. We thank the rulers of this nation for reposing so much faith and love in everyone. Today, this day is auspicious and special because to all the Excellencies who are present on the stage and to everybody who is listening across the globe, this is the beginning of a long-standing dream of the Indian community to have a temple, a traditional temple in this land. I believe that the UAE, which people from more than 200 nations call their home, is more than just a summary of humanity; it is not just a place that talks about tolerance, but we have experienced it first-hand.

“When the temple land was allotted [in 2015] and our beloved Prime Minister announced it to a packed audience of 60,000 in Dubai, all stood up to give a standing ovation, which was an expression of our enormous joy. Today, when the first *shila* was being worshipped here, a leading member of our community, who is unfortunately not present here today because of an illness, sent

me an SMS that summarizes the love that the Indian community has. He expressed, ‘Swami, I have been living here for almost 70 years and it has been our dream [to have a temple] as a community. So, the news of the temple transported me to my childhood days as you are starting the temple construction in Abu Dhabi.’

“The mandir will create an environment and a set of values that will celebrate humanity. A great American, Indologist, historian, writer and speaker, Dr David Frawley, who is known as Vamadeva Shastri, told me in Abu Dhabi, ‘Till now, the BAPS has built 1,200 mandirs worldwide and they all are inspirational. After making Akshardham, your work became generational. But one single mandir in Abu Dhabi will be civilizational, because it will bring civilizations together.’”

“The Mandir will not only bring two countries, two cultures, two communities, two religions, but the entire humanity together; and that is the beauty this country has been able to do. The news of the allocation of land for the Mandir sent a signal of global inclusiveness, cultural and spiritual inclusiveness around the world.

“People and the media ask me as I travel in

this part of the world about what I think of the Year of Tolerance? I want to correct and say that in the UAE the celebration of tolerance is not just for one year, it is a lifetime message continued from the founder, His Highness Sheikh Zayed. The message of tolerance, love and harmony has been passed down from one generation to the next. Here, tolerance is no longer just a noun. It is a verb that we can see in action. Which country doesn't believe in tolerance? Which culture or religion does not talk about tolerance? Who doesn't value harmony? The UAE has established a Ministry of Tolerance and have created laws, bylaws and sublaws. The UAE has created programmes and have shared and opened its heart to the entire world. That is the reason why people across the world consider it a home. It is because of this reason that over 3.3 million Indians are here and continue to stay here permanently. That's the love the UAE has shown to all of us.

“When Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami and I were welcomed at the Presidential Palace in 2018, we took the two different designs of the Mandir to the Crown Prince. One was a closed design, whereby the Mandir would be inside a normal building and the other was the traditional open-to-the-air Mandir. In front of 400 senior Arab delegates, the Crown Prince selected the open

traditional Mandir design. The Crown Prince said that the whole world should be able see it.

Our Prime Minister, Shri Narendrabhai Modi, had talked to the Crown Prince that he would like to have land for a Hindu Mandir, and so, through the generosity of the Crown Prince and the request of Shri Narendrabhai Modi the land for the Mandir was allocated. I believe it is very important that the spirit of friendship begins with the leaders. His Highness Sheikh Abdullah Bin Zayed Al Nahyan personally came to Delhi to see Akshardham and spent two hours. Initially, the land allocated was 2.5 acres. I requested for more land, since to create a Mandir for the entire Hindu community, we would require multiple halls, so that everybody could practise their faith in the best way possible. So, we requested for more land. They gave 13.5 acres.

“And His Highness Sheikh Abdullah said, ‘If the temple premises will have halls, a vegetarian kitchen, a library and an exhibition, then the whole world will come there. So, the land from the road to the border of the temple is yours.’ Thus, he gave another 13.5 acres for parking, so that everybody can celebrate their own faith in a genuine way. However, this generosity gives us more responsibilities.

“Pramukh Swami Maharaj in 1997, had

lovingly prophesied in a desert in Sharjah that there would be a Mandir in Abu Dhabi. When God wishes, everything happens naturally. Everything started coming together. Some of the strongest support and greatest love has come from HE Sheikh Nahyan Mabarak Al Nahyan. When I went to him, he said, 'Write a letter.' We wrote a letter and he said he would take it to the Crown Prince. He has shown so much love. That's one of the reasons that everybody who is present on this dais, the Minister of Education, the Minister of Environment, and also Dr Mugheer who takes care of Community Affairs, created a special cell to accommodate our needs. Thereafter, the first building permission, Number 001, was given the BAPS Hindu Mandir. Thank you very much to the entire community and all the leaders who have been with us. But the story doesn't end here.

"Harmony generates harmony. The entire Indian community has come forward: the Hindu Samaj, Vasu Shroffji, Kandhariji, the Sikh Samaj, people like Dr B.R. Shetty, Harshadbhai Mehta, S.M. Rao, Ramesh Ramkrishnanji, Yogeshbhai Mehta, Rohitbhai Patel, Mr Lai Poh of RSP and all have joined hands together in this project of creating this wonder.

"The inner spirit of my guru Pramukh Swami Maharaj was, 'In the joy of others, lies our own.' Yes, the makers are the BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha. But, people will forget those who make the Mandir. The Mandir belongs to those who use it. Nobody remembers who made Stonehenge, nobody remembers who made the Kedarnath and Badrinath mandirs. The faithful who go there reap the benefits.

"Mahant Swami Maharaj, who is softly spoken, is the inspirer of this Mandir project. His blessings have worked wonders.

"When we ask him what is the biggest problem of this world? He says it is lack of harmony. We asked him what is the solution to that problem? He said one word – Harmony. We asked how

we can achieve harmony? He said, 'By being in harmony with everyone and everything around you.' Then we asked, 'How we can be in harmony with everything around us?' He said, 'By being in harmony with yourself, inner harmony.' Then we asked, 'How can we have harmony within ourselves?' He said, 'Be in harmony with God. Be in harmony with the religion that you practice. Generating harmony inside will generate harmony outside and everywhere.'

"Today, more than 2,500 people from all communities and creeds have come and been seated since 8 a.m. We deeply thank you from our heart. Around 2,500 are watching this from another tent. The message of this mandir is that it is a spiritual oasis of harmony. And this spiritual oasis is on the banks of three rivers: Ganga, Yamuna and Saraswati. The three holy rivers will flow through this land and bring the energy of love and creativity. Let's make this beautiful Mandir as a gift to this nation and express our appreciations."

Then, a two-minute video depicting an animated rendition of the proposed mandir complex was shown on the LED screens.

"We couldn't have reached where we stand today without two absolutely critical elements.

"First, it is the determination of the sagacious leadership of UAE to make this temple a manifest symbol of UAE's spirit of tolerance. That clarity of purpose ensured that the temple project moves forward rapidly despite the challenges that arose due to very simple reason that there has never been a temple before in Abu Dhabi. New rules had to be written, new precedents had to be created, and at every step where there were hurdles, the leadership stepped in and said that we want this done. A big thank you to the leadership for this.

"HH Sheikh Abdullah Bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Minister of Foreign Affairs, conveyed to me the

gist of his conversation with the Crown Prince HH Sheikh Mohammed Bin Zayed Al Nahyan. He said (quoting HH Sheikh Mohammed), ‘We agreed that we will have a Hindu temple at Abu Dhabi. Then, it should look like a Hindu temple. Why it should look like anything else?’

“The second, and equally critical element in this journey, was the absolute commitment and vast management capacity that BAPS has brought to this project, taking it forward as a sacred mission and duty.

“Over the next century, perhaps the next millennium, our future generations will look back on this historic day and recall the vision and


leadership of those who helped in making the Indian communities dream of a Hindu temple in Abu Dhabi a reality.”







All these celebrations were reflected together in the *shilanyas* programme. The reason being there was a spiritual atmosphere. On that day, Hindus, Muslims, Sikhs, Christians, Jains, Buddhists were present because this mandir will not belong to one, but to all! However, the question was what is the common denominator between all those who came there? What was it that pulled everyone there? After studying [what I saw], I was reminded of one thing. It has been written that cows may be of different colours but their milk is white. When we were all there – Jain, Hindu, Muslim, etc – all belonged to *sampradayas* [sects] but their dharma was one. 

When you take something after doing *seva*, then it is not said to be *seva*. But I believe, in spite of taking a reward [or money] for doing *seva*, it is still *seva*. When you have a sweeper, domestic helper or an office worker, though he may not be an expert his services should be considered to be *seva*. And one should value his *seva* because it makes one’s life better.

“Whatever we do, our child observes us the most. And his observation becomes his impressions [*sanskars*]. If you wish your child to serve you and also serve others, then it is necessary that you should serve too. When you have addictions, never think that your child will listen to you when you tell him not to [smoke]. But when you do *seva*, your child will also do *seva*.”





Finally, Swamishri felicitated all the guests and blessed them. (*Translation of blessings in Gujarati.*) ♦



VOLUNTEER DEDICATION

The BAPS Hindu Mandir planned for Abu Dhabi has captured the attention of people all over the world.

Its steady progression from a cherished dream into an impending reality has been possible due to the blessings of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, Pramukh Swami Maharaj and Mahant Swami Maharaj and the generosity of the rulers of the UAE.

However, the backbone of the project is the volunteer force – male and female, young and old.

The Satsang Mandal in Dubai is relatively small compared to the size of the project it has been tasked to complete. Yet, the dedication and enthusiasm of all to contribute in whatever way possible is a major factor that has enabled the completion of daunting targets.

The visit of Mahant Swami Maharaj to the UAE from 18 to 29 April 2019 was primarily to perform the Shilanyas (Foundation Stone-Laying) Ceremony for the BAPS Hindu Mandir in Abu Mureikha, Abu Dhabi.

With less than three months to prepare, the limited volunteer force was mobilized by the department leaders to thoroughly plan and prepare for the 12-day visit of *guruhari* Mahant Swami

Maharaj and all the events that would be taking place in his presence.

Although the mandir site is in Abu Dhabi, the majority of UAE devotees live in Dubai and Sharjah, with a few in other states. Thus, the centre of planning and preparation was the BAPS Mandir in Dubai.

To put the task into perspective: the site of the Shilanyas Ceremony was a barren desert strip of land 100 km from Dubai and 45 km from Abu Dhabi. Surrounding the site is acres of sandy desert. So, it was imperative that detailed planning be undertaken in terms of what needed to be done on the site and what equipment, materials and manpower would be required to accomplish the tasks. Since, the omission of even the smallest item would mean a 200-km round trip to fetch it!

Serving in over 20 departments – construction, transport, kitchen, decoration, facilities, security, outreach and others – lead volunteers held meetings to plan and then initiate the execution of their necessary tasks.

Throughout this period, volunteers managed their time efficiently – attending to their personal jobs and businesses by day and joining in the *seva*

in the evenings. Often, they would serve till past midnight to meet the schedules. Despite the inevitable fatigue, their desire to serve and please guru Mahant Swami Maharaj motivated them to continue amid numerous challenges.

As Swamishri's arrival date approached, the intensity of the *seva* increased, yet the teamwork and willingness to serve enabled all challenges to be met.

Throughout this entire period, the volunteers were guided and encouraged lovingly and meticulously by the resident sadhus of the UAE – Aksharatit Swami and Paramvandan Swami.

The number of available volunteers peaked for the day of the Shilanyas Ceremony – around 400 men and 275 women served throughout the day.

Thereafter, core teams attended to the wind-up of the arrangements set up on the mandir site, while other volunteers served from morning till night at the Pramukh Swami Mandapam (marquee) and dining areas at Jumeirah Park, where over 2,000 devotees daily came in the mornings and evenings for the assemblies in the presence of Mahant Swami Maharaj.

In addition to volunteers from Dubai, Sharjah, Abu Dhabi, Al Ain, Ruwais, Ras Al Khaima and Ajman, volunteers from Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, USA, UK and Australia also came specially to help in whatever capacity was required.

Also, volunteers from local communities, such as CAPSS, Friends of India, ISKCON and others, and well-wishers from nearby labour camps, also helped.

The following is a brief overview of some

of the salient tasks accomplished by some of the departments.

CONSTRUCTION

- Levelling the mandir site to enable erection of the marquees and parking arrangements.
- Digging the 16m by 10.8m by 1.6m foundation area and reinforcing the walls to ensure its safety.
- Volunteers spent innumerable hours every day in the blazing sun without shade, to level the land and excavate the foundation area in preparation for the Shilanyas Ceremony.

FACILITIES

- Erection of the marquees and set up of required amenities on the mandir site for the Shilanyas Ceremony and at Jumeirah Park for the daily *sabhas* and dining.
- Housekeeping – ensuring daily, prompt removal of waste.
- Provision of clean toilet facilities.

KITCHEN

- The women devotees had prepared and stored in advance 15,000 *parothas*, 18,000 *theplas*, 13,000 *kachoris*, 3,500 *samosas* and 3,500 spring rolls.
- Daily meals – morning, afternoon and night – were prepared at Dubai mandir and transported to Jumeirah Park.
- For the Shilanyas Ceremony, over 4,300 full-meal *prasad* packets were prepared to give to the participants.
- Daily washing of utensils and preparing vegetables, grains, etc. for cooking.

DECORATION

- Preparing and erecting decorative welcome gates, flags, stage props, etc. on the mandir site and at Jumeirah Park.
- Decorating Swamishri's residence.
- Preparing decorative garlands and *artis*.

SECURITY

- To ensure security of materials and people on the mandir site and the marquees at Jumeirah Park.

MEDIA

- Contacting print and electronic media houses to provide them information about the Shilanyas Ceremony.
- Receiving and assisting the journalists, photographers and videographers who came to cover the event.

TRANSPORT AND PARKING

- Arrange cars, vans, trucks and other vehicles to transport volunteers and materials as required for all departments.
- Assist visitors from outside UAE by arranging cars for commuting to and from their lodgings to the events.
- Mark out parking areas on the mandir site and guide cars, buses, etc. to efficiently use available spaces.
- Manage the numerous parking areas in the vicinity of the Jumeirah Park marquees and guide all visitors accordingly.

Volunteers of each department contacted well-wishers who generously supported the events by providing many items in kind and by giving their expert guidance whenever required.

Throughout Swamishri's stay as the State Guest of the UAE government, 17 government-appointed security personnel were present day and night to safeguard Swamishri and to ensure the smooth completion of his daily itinerary. They, too, sincerely carried out their duties and were touched by Swamishri's saintliness and the cordial nature of the devotees and all visitors.

Prior to Swamishri's visit, many devotees offered their devotion to please Swamishri by undertaking austerities for several months – observing fasts and abstaining from favourite foods.

All the guests who attended the Shilanyas Ceremony and the satsang assemblies thereafter abundantly praised the dedication and services of the volunteers. ◆



THE VACHANAMRUT

An Introduction, Part 2

In this second article of the series we discuss Bhagwan Swaminarayan's adornments described in the first paragraph of each Vachanamrut and the language of the Vachanamrut.

ADORNMENTS

Bhagwan Swaminarayan adopted the garb of the local people by wearing simple white garments, such as a dhoti on the lower body and *kediyu*, *dagli* or *gatariyu* on the upper body. The *dhoti* and *gatariyu* are long, unstitched garments. On the head, he wore various types of *pagh* and *safo* common in contemporary Kutch and Saurashtra. This traditional garb endeared him to the devotees. On rare occasions, such as festivals, as instructed by Ramanand Swami, he wore richly embroidered garments offered by devotees.

The *Harililamrut* (6.15.58–59) cites the first occasion on which he accepted and wore such rich garments brought to Dhoraji by devotees of Surat in 1807, during the festival of Fuldol. He wore a *jamo* of *jari*, *surwal*, other *shangar* and a *mugat* on his head.

“*Māvāne shir mugat dharāvio, hato Suratnā sanghe karāvio;*

Pelvelo evo shangār, dharyote din Dharmakumār.”

“The devotees of Surat had made a *mugat* (crown), which they placed on his head. These were the first such ornaments offered to Bhagwan Swaminarayan.”

The simple white garments he usually preferred to wear reflected

his *vairagya* and austere life. This all the more established and strengthened the bond of devotional attachment of devotees for him. This bond prepared them to receive spiritual instruction whenever imparted by him, especially during the period of the Vachanamrut.

The description by the *paramhansas* of his apparel is of importance since it gives readers a vivid impression of his persona. This exciting journey back in time also provides information about several aspects of life in early 19th century Gujarat, about Bhagwan Swaminarayan himself and the intense love of the devotees who visited the places of the Vachanamrut, to offer him puja and to listen to his divine *katha*. It provides details of handwoven fabrics and golden embroidery in the absence of power looms and sewing machines. It provides valuable information about the flora in Saurashtra and Gujarat then,

the simple varieties in the former compared to the many fragrant varieties in the latter. Such details help readers to visualize the *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, which calms the hyperactive mind. Calming the mind is necessary to listen to *katha* and absorbing its salient principles.

Of the 273 Vachanamruts, Shriji Maharaj has adorned simple white garments on 234 occasions and coloured or rich garments on 39 occasions. All white garments, described as ‘*sarva shvet vastra*’, were worn 161 times; other white garments, described as ‘white *khes*’, 66 times; and ‘white *surwal*’ 7 times. This



means that he wore white garments on 234 occasions (161+66+7).

In the first paragraphs of the Vachanamruts, the following types of garments are cited: *khes*, *dhotiyu*, *dagli*, *chadar*, *chofal*, *rajai*, *pachhedi*, *shelu*, *rento*, *surwal* and *angarkhu*. Head adornments include *pagh*, *feto*, *bokani* and *moliyu*,

The labelled photograph shows most of the above.

The flower *shangar* (adornments) cited include: *tora*, *bajubandh*, *gajara* and *berkha*.

All these were probably adorned on Maharaj by a personal *sevak*, such as, Mulji Brahmachari or a *paramhansa*.

The flowers in the Gadhada *kathas* were specially grown by Sachchidanand Swami on a plot of Dada Khachar's land on the outskirts of Gadhada.

KHES

The word 'khes' needs some clarification. It denotes either an upper garment – *uparno* – known today as *gatariyu*, or it describes a *dhotiyu* worn on the lower body. Whether it refers to a *gatariyu* or *dhotiyu* can be gleaned from the verbs *odhio* (ઓઢવો હતો) and *paheryo* (પહેવો હતો). When the verb *odhio* is used for *khes*, it means a *gatariyu*, and when *paheryo* is used, it means a *dhotiyu* (Vaghela 1988:121). This is evident in Sarangpur 3. Maharaj has adorned two *khes*; a *khes* with a black lining as a *gatariyu*, because *odhio* is used, and also a *khes* as a *dhotiyu*, because *paheryo* is used. This meaning is further supported in Gadhada III 23, when Maharaj describes the ritual of *mansi puja*. He advocates offering, “a washed, white *khes*.” Since he uses the verb *paherva apvo* (પહેરવા આપવો), it means a *dhotiyu*. If he had used *odhva apvo* (ઓઢવા આપવો), then it would mean a *gatariyu*. Only in one Vachanamrut, Gadhada II 43, is the word *dhotiyu* used to mean a *dhotiyu*. Otherwise in all cases in the Vachanamrut, the word *khes* is used. When the word *chadar* is used with the verb *odhi*, it also means a *gatariyu*, as in Vachanamruts Gadhada I 14 and 17.

EYE-CATCHING SHANGAR

On rare occasions in the Vachanamrut *kathas*, Shriji Maharaj is adorned in special ways: a *mala* of *moti* (pearls): Gadhada I 13; a new tulsi *kantthi*: Gadhada I 64, Gadhada II 48; turning a tulsi *mala* with the hand: Gadhada I 70, Panchala 4, Ahmedabad 5 and Jetalpur 2; a *rakhdi* on his wrists: Gadhada II 9 on Shraavan *sud* 14, instead of the usual Shraavan Purnima. Also, in his hands, he has clasped a pomegranate in Vartal 13 and Jetalpur 3, a lemon in Jetalpur 1, 3 and a handkerchief in Jetalpur 2. In Gadhada I 32 and 59, his forehead is smeared with *kesar chandan* paste and in Jetalpur 4 his upper body is anointed with *kesar chandan*.

VACHANAMRUT'S PROSE ENRICHING GUJARATI LITERATURE

The Vachanamrut is written in Gujarati, since Bhagwan Swaminarayan delivered his discourses in Gujarati. As a written language, Gujarati was evolving and continued to do so until the end of the 19th century.

In 1865, the famed Gujarati poet Narmadashankar Dave, popularly known as Kavi Narmad, systematized Gujarati grammar. This led him to write the gist of the *Iliad* in good Gujarati prose in 1870. The year 1887 witnessed the first classical novel, *Saraswatichandra* by Govardhanram Tripathi, in accurate Gujarati. From this we glean that the Vachanamrut's linguistic excellence was far ahead of its time.

Not surprisingly, scholars of modern Gujarati have lauded the shastra's prose.

The renowned Gujarati litterateur, Umashankar Joshi, eruditely scrutinized the intricate modes of expression used by Shriji Maharaj in the Vachanamrut, which he detailed in *Swaminarayan Sant Sahitya*. He eulogizes its unique lingual excellence and contribution to Gujarati literature of the early 19th century, “Vachanamrut is a pinnacle of Gujarati prose's excellence” (Chaudhary 1981:14).

Chandravadan C. Mehta, another renowned

scholar of Gujarati literature, lauded the Vachanamrut, especially its contribution in enriching Gujarati grammar, “Extinct grammatical expressions have been revived and can be read throughout the Vachanamrut, such as the absolute locative – the *sati-saptami* of Sanskrit: “*Pachhi Nāradji gānvidyā sheekhavtā havā ane Bhagwān āgal gātā havā*” (Gadhada I 4). Similarly, some verbs and nouns have been used in a unique manner, without obstructing the meaning. Bhagwan Swaminarayan’s contribution in enriching the language is substantial. Mehta further considers the following usages and expressions as novel:

- *Potānā swarupne jovāno ādar karyo ane na dithu?* (Gadhada I 20). “It is noteworthy how well the word *ādar* has been used here.”
- *Bhagwānno nishchay ane mahātmya rupi jene khatāi chadi hoi* (Gadhada I-24).
- *Ashtāng yogne sādhave karine chittno nirodh* (Gadhada I 25).
- *Samjanne kefe karine chhaki pan javu nahi* (Gadhada I 25)
- *Dhruvajie Bhagwānni stuti karvā māndi, tyāre Vedādiknā arthni saheje sforti thai* (Gadhada I 29).

Eminent scholars of Gujarati literature have commented on the Vachanamrut’s language:

“In this manner one comes across words enriching Gujarati prose on every page of the whole text... He [Bhagwan Swaminarayan] has explained the most abstruse concepts of *adhyatma*, yoga, meditation and *tapas* in the most simple and straightforward sentences in the Vachanamrut... His statements have the weight of experience... There are no ambiguous statements, nor complicated constructions which are not understandable. There are only sayings which easily penetrate the heart of the sympathetic reader. This is Bhagwan Swaminarayan’s important contribution to Gujarati prose.”

Vachanamrut: A Note

In 1974, John Carman was invited for the inaugural function of the English version of the Vachanamrut translated by Shri H.T. Dave held in Pramukh Swami Maharaj's presence in New York. His speech on this occasion is presented below

Your Holiness, distinguished leaders of the community, and all those gathered here for this special occasion. It is an honour for me to be invited to take part in this ceremony.

It is a pleasure to be able to assist in a very small way in this important translation and publication [of the Vachanamrut]. You have been good enough to ask me, a professor of religion at an American University and a Christian minister, to take part in this event. That you have included one who is not a member of your religious community, I find highly significant.

I appreciate the invitation and I stand here as one who has tried to make a respectful and sympathetic study of other religions and one who is especially interested in the religious history of India. My own special study has been on the thought of the great acharya Ramanuja. There is a story, perhaps the favourite story at the present time among the followers of Ramanuja in South India, which I think is appropriate for this occasion. Many of you have heard it before, but I think it is a story that doesn't suffer from repetition.

Ramanuja had already been chosen to be the head of the community following the death of Yamunacharya, but because he had not been able to receive instruction from Yamunacharya, he had to go to five principal disciples of Yamuna, each of whom gave him instruction in some aspect of the faith. When he went to the one who was himself

a guru known as Tirukacchi Nambi, the great guru of Tirukottiyur, a town in what is now Tamil Nadu, he had to take a great oath that he would not reveal the secret that was to be entrusted to him. No sooner had he left the guru's presence, however, he went to the Vaishnava temple and walked up to the balcony on an upper story. This temple is unusual in South India because there are three shrines, one above the other. From the balcony outside the shrine on the top story he called down to Shri Vaishnavas assembled in the courtyard below and shouted out the secret explanation of the mantra that had been given to him by the guru. Of course the guru very quickly found out, and he angrily summoned Ramanuja back into his presence and asked him, "Do you not know what the penalty is for disclosing this secret?" Ramanuja then replied, "Yes, surely I know that I must go to hell, but is it not better that I go to hell and that all of these others receive liberation through hearing the special words that you have revealed to me?" Upon hearing this, teacher Tirukacchi Nambi saw the great love and compassion that filled Ramanuja. Recognizing that this was indeed the grace of the Lord filling Ramanuja, he embraced him and said that henceforth he would be Ramanuja's disciple since God's great love and God's desire for the liberation of mankind was so perfectly expressed in Ramanuja.

Why is this story about a brash disciple who broke his guru's command and disclosed his

secret important to us this morning? Because with the English translation and publication of this volume you are disclosing to the world – at least to those who can read in English – the teachings of Swaminarayan. This is a bold step you are taking, for in traditional Indian fashion, religious teaching ought to be imparted from teacher to pupil after various requirements are met. In other words, the one who receives such important teaching must be an *adhikari* – ‘suitably qualified’. When a book is put in a bookstore, however, it can be picked up by anyone who wishes to read it. That brings the risk that the book may be misunderstood. There is certainly a danger of controversy, but perhaps the greatest danger is the one-sidedness of a merely academic understanding. The knowledge of the head is sometimes separated from the knowledge of the heart so that one gets some kind of intellectual grasp of the teaching without really entering into it fully with body and soul. These dangers are quite real, but the fact that you have gone ahead with this publication shows that you are taking seriously the teachings of your founding guru, of Swaminarayan himself, the teachings that his divine messages should be made available to the world. The entire devotional movement in India down through the centuries has been a process described in the Bhagvat Puran as a great stream in which bhakti flows from one part of the country to another, in which the carefully guarded teaching of the ancient rishis is now made available, in a new devotional form, to millions of Hindus. Each devotional movement, including your own, has taken the risk of making religious secrets available to the masses.

Now yours is not the only religious community that has been willing to take this risk. The Christian community, of which I am a member (and the particular Protestant denomination to which I belong) has for long faced this problem with respect to its sacred books, especially with respect to the Bible and with respect to the teachings of Jesus. If the

scriptures are freely distributed, anyone can read them and anyone can misunderstand them. There are those who have held that the Bible should not be read by ordinary people because of this risk of misunderstanding; it should only be carefully explained by those priests or professors who can be confidently expected to understand its meaning. My Protestant forebears, however, long ago decided that there was a message in that book that was sufficiently important, that it was worth taking the risk to disclose its message to the world. They believed that such a risk could be taken because of their confidence that the same Spirit that inspired the words of the sacred book would guide those who read it. That is why Christians translate and distribute their scriptures. I am sure that you feel the same way about the translation of the discourses of Swaminarayan. That is the reason why you are willing to put this book, the Vachanamrut, into bookstores and give it to those who may not be members of your community. You also believe that the same Spirit who inspired its author will also guide its readers.

I should also like to comment on a few things that struck me in the book itself. One is so familiar to you that you may be surprised I mention it. Yet students of Indian religious history are constantly faced with the difficulty of the lack of firm and definite dates in this history. In this book, however, every discourse is precisely dated. This is a chapter of religious history which one might say is in the full light of day as far as our knowledge of history is concerned. It is a common Western misunderstanding of India that there is no sense of history in India. I think that in what you hold dear as a community and what is called the guru *parampara*, the succession of the gurus, one sees that special sense of history which is important for the religious people in India.

I should like again to refer to Ramanuja, not to something in his own writing but to one composed in his honour by one of his disciples (Amudanar). Here, a verse is quoted from the ancient Tamil

saint and sage Nammalvar in which it is said that the power of Kali will be broken. The disciple says in his verse in praise of his guru that today this prophecy has been fulfilled – the power of Kali has broken. Now you know that according to the Hindu view of history we are living in the worst of the four ages – that we are living in the Kali-yuga – in the age of darkness. This is an age when the cow of dharma has to try to stand on only one leg. What does it mean that in this age, in this Kali age, the power of Kali has been broken? Surely it means this, that when the teacher, who is filled with the grace of God and the truth of God, speaks the full dharma – dharma standing on all four legs – is in that teaching, and in the community that practises that teaching, the full dharma is manifested again. In the world in which we live it is quite clear that the powers of darkness are rampant. That is not any the less so because of the teaching of Ramanuja or because of the discourses and the light of Swaminarayan. Nevertheless it is still possible within a world of darkness to have a point of light; indeed, to have more than a point of light – to have a growing circle of light. Surely the history of your movement and of many other religious movements has been the ongoing effort to foster that growing circle of light. A sense of history is the recognition that specific things that have happened on specific days have meaning because from that specific day all the way up to the present, the Divine light has remained from guru to guru. Perhaps it is appropriate to read in this connection just a few lines from one of Swaminarayan’s discourses in which he says something precisely on this subject:

“He similarly assumes human form out of great commiseration for the ultimate redemption of *jivas*, and suppresses His infinite greatness and profundity of powers. He thus becomes accessible to all human beings who desire to offer Him worship. One who was so far noumenon became phenomenon in the form of the human God, an

insignificant form as compared to His vast and infinite greatness. The assumption of the insignificant human form by Lord Purushottam is for easy assimilation by human beings who desire to seek His contact and feel congenial with Him.

“Just as a small ant requires only a small means for its subsistence, as a bigger means would spell its death rather than growth, similarly Lord Purushottam assumes a human form for fostering spiritual growth in the *jivas*. When the god of fire is invoked, he appears before human beings in a serene human form subduing all his fiery flames, similarly, Lord Purushottam also suppressed His infinite powers, greatness, divinity, etc., and assumes human form with great commiseration, for the ultimate redemption of the *jivas*. However, those devoid of intelligence who do not have the requisite knowledge of the attributes and working of God callously ask, ‘Why does not the Lord exhibit His powers?’ But they cannot realize that the suppression of His divine powers is for the ultimate redemption of the *jivas*. If, however, He exhibits all His powers and manifests His fullfledged divinity, even millions of macrocosms would pale into insignificance before such greatness of His. How can the *jivas* stand such greatness? One, who has so realized the knowledge of the infinite greatness, divinity and glory of God in human form is beyond the influence of *kal*, karma and *maya*. For him there remains nothing more to attain.”¹

The assumption, I repeat, of the insignificant human form by Lord Purushottam is for easy assimilation by human beings who desire to seek His contact and feel congenial with Him.” The Lord is the Lord of cosmic powers and those powers have been manifested and will be manifested again, but for the redemption of human beings it is essential that the Lord comes, we may say, in human disguise, so that we should not be overwhelmed by His power but should be attracted by His love. ◆



SWAMINARAYAN ASHRAY DIKSHA MANTRA

Initiation Mantra for Taking Refuge of Bhagwan Swaminarayan



धन्योऽस्मि पूर्णकामोऽस्मि निष्पापो निर्भयः सुखी ।
अक्षरगुरुर्योगेन स्वामिनारायणाऽऽश्रयात् ॥

Brahmaswarup Mahant Swami Maharaj gifted the ‘Swaminarayan Ashray Dikshamantra’ for spiritual aspirants seeking refuge of Bhagwan Swaminarayan. When we seek refuge of Parabrahman Bhagwan Swaminarayan through association with the present Brahmaswarup Gunatit Guruhari, we become blessed (*dhanya*), fulfilled (*purnakam*), free of wrongdoing (*nishpap*), fearless (*nirbhay*), and blissful (*sukhi*). Clarifying this principle, His Holiness Mahant Swami Maharaj inspired the creation of this mantra. On the 238th

celebration of Bhagwan Swaminarayan’s birth, Swamishri conferred this new mantra for the first time upon all devotees present during his morning puja. He also announced that, henceforth, all new spiritual aspirants will attain refuge under Bhagwan Swaminarayan through this mantra.

*Dhanyo’smi pūrṇakāmo’smi niṣpāpo nirbhayaḥ sukhī,
Akṣara-guru-yogena Svāminārāyaṇ-āśrayāt.*

Through the association of the manifest Aksharabrahman Gunatit Guruhari, I have attained refuge under Parabrahman Purushottam Bhagwan Swaminarayan. By this, I have become blessed (*dhanya*); I have become fulfilled (*purnakam*); I have been released from wrongdoing (*pap*) that has bound me over countless births; I have been freed from the fear of *kal*, karma, and *maya* and have become blissful by the limitless, divine happiness of Sahajanand Shri Hari.

Upon reciting this mantra, the following mantra should also be recited:

*Akṣaram ahaṃ Puruṣottama-dāso’smi.
“I am Akshar and the servant of Purushottam.”*



INDIA

YUVAK ANTAR JAGRUTI PARVA 2019 8–16 April 2019, India

A total of 95 youths from this year’s first batch of the BAPS Yuva Talim Kendra undertook *vicharan* to 187 villages in Gujarat.

Divided in 23 groups, each of four youths, they visited a total of 2,673 homes, inspiring young and old devotees to perform daily personal puja, visit



the local mandir for darshan, attend the weekly

satsang assembly, daily read the Vachanamrut and Swamini Vato, conduct a regular *ghar sabha* (family assembly), observe a fast on *ekadashi*, etc.

The youths conducted 187 satsang assemblies, 125 children’s assemblies and 28 assemblies in schools – in which over 5,900 children participated.

They arranged evening *bhakti feris* (processions through the villages) in which over 4,400 devotees participated. In addition, they encouraged around 830 people to refrain from addictions.

UK

BAL-BALIKA KARYAKAR LEADERSHIP TRAINING CAMP

More than 60 selected children’s activities *karyakars* from across the UK attended a leadership training camp to help enhance their skills. Senior volunteers and experienced swamis guided



delegates through discourses, interactive sessions, teamwork activities and role-specific guidelines based on the ideal values of leadership gleaned from the life of Pramukh Swami Maharaj.

The three-day camp served to strengthen many important attributes required to understand and nurture children and to serve them more effectively with humility and care.

BAL-BALIKA MANDAL SPRING CAMP

29–31 March 2019, Kingswood Grosvenor Hall, Kent

More than 100 children from The Swaminarayan Sunday School, accompanied by volunteers from BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir, London, participated in a three-day educational activity camp.



The camp was designed to build self-confidence, unity and leadership skills, and required many months of meticulous planning.

Over the three days, the children challenged themselves through a variety of tasks specially designed to harness their abilities and overcome personal fears.

Children learned to enrich their daily morning prayers through *samuh* puja. In the evenings they participated in *arti*, *thal*, various group activities and cultural programmes.

Some of the funds will also be donated to various local charities to support their outstanding work in their communities around the UK.


Participants walked, jogged or ran the designated 10 km route in the various centres to complete the Challenge.

The youths were guided on the topic through speeches by swamis relayed live from India, workshops, audio-video presentations, skits and other activities. The *shibir* inspired the youths to daily read and study the Vachanamrut. The youths also participated in various devotional rituals which they were encouraged to continue in their daily lives.

AFRICA

SATSANG VICHARAN BY BAPS SWAMIS 6-11 March 2019, Ghana

A team of four BAPS swamis based in Nairobi, Kenya, visited Ghana. It was the first time BAPS swamis had undertaken *vicharan* there.

Jigneshbhai Soni (Surat), Jayeshbhai Patel (Master), Jigneshbhai Patel (Dar-es-Salaam) and other devotees have been holding satsang assemblies over the past five years.

During their six-day stay, the swamis performed *padhramanis* in Accra, the capital of Ghana, as well as Kumasi and Tema, visiting the homes of and spiritually guiding over 60 devotees and well-wishers.



The swamis also conducted a 'Shri Swaminarayan Mahapuja' in which senior devotees and other well-wishers participated.

Two evening public satsang assemblies were held at the Osu Sanatan Mandir, which were attended by a total of over 350 people. Pujya Satyanand Swami, a disciple of Swami Shivanand, and leading representatives of the Gujarati Samaj also attended the assemblies.

SATSANG VICHARAN 9-13 March 2019, Guyana



For the first time, BAPS swamis, Priyaseva Swami and Yogikirtan Swami, undertook *vicharan* in Guyana, strengthening the faith of devotees and the Hindu community.

The swamis conducted a satsang assembly in Georgetown at Pravinbhai Dave's residence in the presence of His Excellency Mr V. Mahalingam, High Commissioner of India to Guyana. Also present was Dr Yesu Pershaud, Chairman of Demerara Bank Ltd.

During their stay, the swamis paid their respects at several Hindu mandirs, performed *padhramanis* to the homes of devotees and addressed an assembly of over 500 students emphasizing the importance of spirituality in their lives. ♦

Review Essay on 'An Introduction to Swaminarayan Hindu Theology'

Harvard Theological Review, one of the oldest scholarly theological journals in the United States, is a prestigious quarterly journal that has been a central forum for scholars of religion and theology since 1908. It publishes compelling original research that contributes to the development of scholarly understanding and interpretation in the history and philosophy of religious thought in all traditions and periods.

Its website states, “*Harvard Theological Review* does not publish short book reviews.... On occasion, we do commission a review essay of a significant book or set of books recently published.”

Hence, the inclusion in the January 2019 issue (pp. 126–32) of the *Harvard Theological Review* of a review essay by Catherine Cornielle, Professor of Comparative Theology, Boston College, Massachusetts, USA, on the book *An Introduction to Swaminarayan Hindu Theology* (Author: Paramtattva Swami, Publishers: Cambridge University Press, 2017) is especially noteworthy.

The review essay is notable in that its author has accurately identified and lucidly stated the key philosophical tenets of the Akshar-Purushottam Darshan that are presented in the book: Swaminarayan is Parabrahman the *avatari*, *pragatpanu* through Aksharbrahman, Aksharbrahman as distinct from Parabrahman, Aksharbrahman as the living guru, the centrality and essentiality of the guru for *moksha*, the necessity of becoming *brahmarup* and offering devotion to Parabrahman, that the Akshar-Purushottam Darshan is a distinct school of philosophy from Vishishtadvaita, and other aspects of the Akshar-Purushottam Darshan.

She writes, “The book provides a clear and coherent exposition of the




principal teachings of the tradition. The author demonstrates an impressive command of the texts and the materials, both those deriving from within the Swaminarayan tradition,... also the broader Hindu textual tradition... represent[ing] an invaluable resource for those belonging to the tradition. And for outsiders, it offers a very helpful introduction. It... succeeds in offering a remarkably clear and comprehensive overview of the central teachings of the tradition.”

She also writes, “Like many other Hindu traditions, the Swaminarayan tradition is strongly centered on the worship of the guru... Swaminarayan is himself regarded as the full and sole manifestation or form of the highest reality, Parabrahman. However, one of the unique theological features of the tradition is the recognition of a second ultimate reality, Aksharbrahman, which is the source of the succession of living gurus (Brahmasvarupa gurus) in the tradition. Liberation can only be attained through the grace of the guru.

She further highlights, “A more distinctive aspect of Swaminarayan theology is its notion of Ishvara. The term does refer to the traditional personal gods of Hinduism (Brahma, Vishnu, Shiva, Surya, etc.), but they are closer to sentient beings than to Parabrahman... Their role in the process of salvation or liberation is entirely overshadowed by the importance of Parabrahman, Aksharbrahman and the living gurus.”

Thus, as stated in this review essay by a distinguished scholar, *An Introduction to Swaminarayan Hindu Theology* provides an excellent overview of the Akshar-Purushottam Darshan revealed by Bhagwan Swaminarayan. ◆
